## Illinois Teacher Testing Requirements

- Basic Skills Test** (required to enter the program)  
**TAP:** Pass each of the 4 subtests  
**ACT Plus Writing's** minimum scores
  - through 8/30/15: 22 with 19 on English/Writing
  - 9/1/15 – 8/30/16: 22 with 16 on Writing
  - starting 9/1/16: 22 with 6 on Writing**SAT's** minimum scores
  - through 2/29/16: 1030 (CR+Math) with 450 on Writing
  - starting 3/1/16: 1110 (ERW+Math) with 26 on Writ/Lang
- Content Test** (required before student teaching; required for program completion)
- edTPA** Completed during Student Teaching (Required for licensure)
