Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 172 total team championships (135 men and 37 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 130 as of June, 2009. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. HEAD COACH JIM BARNES



After nine years, it is obvious that Jim Barnes has made his mark on the Augustana College football program. In eight seasons he has compiled an overall record of 67-26, won three College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin titles and participated in two NCAA Division III playoffs. Barnes, who graduated magna cum laude from Augustana College over two decades ago, returned to his alma mater in February of 2000 to become the 17th football coach in Viking history. He replaced Tom Schmulbach, who retired in January of 2000 for health considerations after compiling a fine record of 34-13 including College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin championships in 1997 and 1999.

Barnes was exactly the fit that the College's administration was looking for in Schmulbach's replacement as he made his way back "home" following a five-year tenure as the head coach at the College of Wooster in Ohio.

In 2000, his first year with the Vikings he tied H.V. "Shorty" Almquist, Ralph Starenko and Ben Newcomb for most victories by a first year coach when he led the Blue & Gold to a 7-3 campaign. Almquist was 7-1 in 1928, Starenko went 7-1 in 1964 and Newcomb compiled a mark of 7-2 in 1969. Barnes had the Vikings ranked as high as eighth at one time in the NCAA Division III polls and his 2000 team sported three All-Americans. One of those players - offensive guard Mackenzie Hay - was selected as the NCAA Division III AvoGrower "Player of Year". Hay was also a National Football Foundation Scholarship winner, one of just three NCAA Division III players honored, and a consensus All-American performer.

In 2001 Barnes enjoyed even more success as he guided Augustana to the second round of the NCAA Division III Playoffs and finished the season with a 10-2 overall record. A 6-1 conference record was enough to earn the Vikings their 19th CCIW title. The 2001 team was ranked as high as sixth in the Division III polls and boasted six All-Americans. The Vikings were an offensive machine as they broke eight school records, including most total yards (5,284) and most rushing yards (4,445) by a team in a single season.

The Vikings went 7-2 overall and 6-1 in the CCIW in 2002, dropping the last game of the season to Wheaton and costing themselves the league title and NCAA playoff berth. Augustana spent the last half of the 2002 season ranked in the top 15 of the NCAA Division III national polls. J.D. Sheldon and Bob Paulin made All-American and defensive back Todd Baldwin led three players (Paulin and Adam Guy) in achieving Academic All-America. Baldwin was the second player in Barnes' tenure to earn a National Football Foundation Scholarship.

After an 0-2 start for the 2003 season, Barnes guided his team to seven straight victories before falling to Wheaton by a score of 28-27 in the final game of the year. Once again the Vikings were ranked in the top 30 of NCAA Division III and defensive end Mike Hansen was voted the CCIW's "Defensive Player of the Year". Hansen and kicker Mike Clark were named to All-American teams. The Vikings went 7-3 in 2004 with Clark and offensive tackle Mike Zeifert gaining NCAA Division III All-American recognition.

Overachieving might best describe the 2005 squad that went 10-2, won the CCIW with a perfect 7-0 record, advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs and finished the year ranked 10th in the nation. All-American Mike Zeifert led the way for this team that was picked to finish just fourth in the CCIW by the coaches. Cornerback Tom Anthony was named the CCIW "Defensive Player of the Year" and Anthony and safety Travis Shea joined Ziefert on the All-America team. For his effort, Barnes was named the winner of the CCIW's "Bob Reade Coach of the Year" award. The 2006 campaign saw the Vikings go 7-3 overall and win the CCIW title for the 21st time in school history. Offensive guard Jon Verhelst was named to the NCAA Division III All-America team.

In 2007, the Vikings finished 5-5 overall and 3-4 in the CCIW and led the league in both rushing offense and total defense. Jake Parke and Blaine Westemeyer were first team All-CCIW selections and Jon Verhelst was chosen to play in the Aztec Bowl. The 2008 season saw Augustana go away from the tradition laden wing-T offense to a spread attack and the team never missed a beat. The Vikings were 7-3 overall and 5-2 in the CCIW, good for second in the conference.

None of the success that he has had at Augustana comes as any surprise, especially given his background leading up to being named the Vikings head coach.

At Wooster, Barnes took over a Fighting Scott program that had been 1-9 in 1994. In the following two seasons, he led the team to records of 5-5 and 7-3. In 1997, he pushed the Scots to a 9-1 mark - their best in 74 years - and a share of the North Coast Athletic Conference title. During his last two seasons, Barnes guided his team to identical 8-2 records. During his tenure at Wooster, he compiled a glossy record of 37-13.

A graduate of Willowbrook High School in Villa Park, Illinois, Barnes enjoyed a tremendous career at Augustana. He was a three-year starter at defensive back and served as

team captain as a senior in 1980. In addition, he earned all-conference honors as a senior. The Vikings won the final four games of his senior year, starting a regular season unbeaten streak of 70 games that continued through the 1988 campaign. In the spring of 1981, he was the winner of the Knut Erickson Award, which is given to the four-year athlete with the highest grade point average. After graduating from Augustana with high honors, he went to law school at the University of Illinois, earning his Juris Doctor degree in May of 1985. After serving as an attorney for the law firm of Peterson, Ross, Schloerb & Seidel in Chicago for a year, Barnes decided to return to football, this time as a coach.

It was his Augustana ties that brought him back into football. Mike Hollway, his former defensive coordinator when he played for the Vikings, was the head coach at Marietta College in Marietta, Ohio and Barnes signed on as an assistant coach. He helped lead Marietta to its first winning season in 21 years and then immediately left when Hollway took the job at Ohio Wesleyan. After a nine-year stint at Ohio Wesleyan where he served as defensive coordinator from 1987-91 and assistant head coach from 1992-95, Barnes took over at the College of Wooster.

As a head coach he compiled the best winning percentage in the history of the school and was the first to post three consecutive eight-victory seasons. When the Scots won the NCAC title in 1997 it was the first conference championship since 1959. In his five years his teams established over 40 team and individual records.

TOM SCHMULBACH (Offensive Line)

A familiar face returned to the coaching ranks at Augustana College in the fall of 2002. Tom Schmulbach, head coach of the Vikings from 1995-99, will be in his second year of working with the offensive line. During his five year run, Schmulbach's teams compiled a record of 34-13 overall and 26-9 in the CCIW. Augustana won conference titles in 1997 and 1999 and qualified for the NCAA Division III national playoffs in 1999. He was the CCIW "Coach of the Year" in 1997 and 1999. He coached nine NCAA Division III All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans. He served as an assistant coach under Bob Reade from 1982 through 1994. He left coaching following the 1999 season for health reasons but he is back and will

handle the offensive line.

A native of Belleville, Illinois where he graduated from Belleville Township High School in 1965, Schmulbach was a two way standout at offensive end and defensive end for the Maroons. He was a four year letterwinner at Western Illinois as a defensive end and graduated with a degree in physical education in 1969. He went to work at J.D. Darnall High School in Geneseo and joined Reade's staff there in 1971.

Schmulbach worked his way up through the ranks, starting as a freshman assistant, eventually serving as varsity assistant for the Maple Leafs during three straight Illinois Class 3A championship years from 1976-78. Following that 1978 season he left Geneseo to become head coach at Rockridge High School in Taylor Ridge, Illinois. He was there three years, guiding the Rockets to the 1980 Class 3A playoffs before coming to Augustana during the summer of 1982.



JEFF LINDMARK (Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks)

From ball boy to player to coach, Jeff Lindmark has seen the Augustana program from a variety of angles. When his father worked the chain gang during his boyhood years, Jeff served as a ball boy for the Vikings. After graduating from Pleasant Valley High School in 1988 where he was a multi-sport standout, he played football and baseball at Augustana. During his senior year of 1991 he played an instrumental role in the Vikings 8-1 season that resulted in a CCIW championship.

He joined the staff in a full-time capacity in 2005 and is the offensive coordinator after serving as a part-time coach in charge of offensive ends. He spent

five years as a teacher for at-risk students at Pleasant Valley High School in Bettendorf, Iowa. He was an assistant baseball coach at Pleasant Valley from 2001 through the 2005 season.

He taught physical education and sociology at Sherrard High School in Sherrard, Illinois from 1994 until 2000. Lindmark was the head football coach at Sherrard from 1995 through 1998. He was the head baseball coach at the school from 1994-00.

After graduating from Augustana in February of 1993 with a degree in secondary/physical education he taught in the Riverdale (Illinois) school system and was an assistant football coach in the fall of 1993.



ROB CUSHMAN (Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers)

Rob Cushman will be in his second year as Augustana's defensive coordinator in 2008. Cushman comes to the Vikings from Ithaca College in Ithaca, New York, where he served as defensive backfield coach and special teams coordinator. A graduate of the University of Puget Sound in Tacoma, Washington, Cushman brings to Augustana extensive experience at several levels during a 29 year-coaching career.

In his one season at Ithaca, Cushman helped the Bombers to an 8-3 record and a berth in the 2007 NCAA Division III playoffs. Prior to Ithaca, he spent five years as head coach at Feather River College in Quincy, California, where he had the responsibility of

building the small community college's program from scratch starting in 2002. His first team there went an impressive 6-5 and his teams finished over .500 and advanced to a bowl game in each of his five seasons. His best season was 2003 when the Golden Eagles went 9-2 and won the Tri-Counties Bank Holiday Bowl. Cushman's overall record at Feather River was 34-21, a winning percentage of .618.

Prior to his stint at Feather River, Cushman coached for 15 years at Eastern Oregon University in LaGrande, Oregon. He served as the Mountaineers defensive coordinator from 1987-1996, before becoming the head coach, a position he held for five years. His best season there was 1998 when the Mountaineers

went 6-4, the school's best record in 18 years, and finished the year ranked 25th in the final NAIA national poll. He was also the Mountaineers head baseball coach during his first ten years at the school.

Cushman has also held head coaching positions at St. Helena High School in St. Helena, California and Marysville High School in Marysville, California, as well as stints as an assistant at Butte Community College in Oroville, California, where he was their defensive coordinator, and Cal State-Chico, where he coached defensive backs as a graduate assistant.

Rob is a graduate of Hood River Valley High School in Hood River, Oregon. He moved on to the University of Puget Sound, where he was a four-year letter winner and two-year starter for the Loggers, who went 9-2 during his senior year and were ranked 9th in Division II. He received his Master's from Cal State-Chico.



JIM SANDERS (Running Backs)

A longtime fixture in the Quad City community, Jim Sanders will begin his third year on the Augustana staff in 2009. He will work with the running backs. A member of three Halls of Fame (Illinois Football Coaches Association, United Township High School and Greater Peoria Area), Sanders compiled a 169-65-2 record with 10 conference champions and one undefeated team during his coaching career. He was the head coach at Eureka, Kewanee and United Township High School in East Moline. A native of Urbana, Illinois, he has his bachelor's degree in physical education from the University of Illinois and a master's degree from Illinois State. Jim and his wife Joanne currently reside in East Moline and have five children and 11 grandchildren.



KYLE READE (Defensive Backs)

This name is familiar to any one associated with Augustana football as Kyle Reade joined the Augustana staff on a full-time basis in the summer of 2007. His father Bob was a legendary fixture as the Vikings' head coach from 1979-94, winning four straight NCAA Division III national championships in the mid-1980's. Kyle played quarterback at Geneseo High School and was the Quad City Area's "Player of the Year" as a senior. He played and coached at Augustana during his undergraduate days and came back to his alma mater after coaching at Ohio Northern University. He graduated from Augustana with a degree in political science and history in 2005 and received his master's degree in sports administration from Bowling Green University in July of 2007.



DICK BLAIR (Tight Ends)

A 1975 Augustana graduate, Dick Blair will be in his eighth year as an assistant coach at his alma mater. A native of Savanna, Illinois, his coaching career spans 28 years, starting in Newton, Iowa in 1975. For 10 years (1989 to 1999) he was the head coach at Riverdale High School in Port Byron, Illinois. He was a volunteer coach at St. Ambrose during the 2000 season before joining the Augustana staff in 2001 as the linebacker coach. He has since moved to the defensive backfield and this year will be working with the tight ends. He was a three year letterwinner for the Vikings from 1972-74.



MIKE BREWERS (Offensive Line)

After spending 30 years on the staff of United Township High School in East Moline, Illinois, Mike Brewers joined the Augustana staff in 2004. Brewers retired after serving as the principal at United Township for two years. Prior to that he was an associate principal and before that was a teacher. He coached offensive and defensive lines and was the Panthers defensive coordinator. During his coaching tenure, United Township made 12 IHSA playoff appearances. He graduated from Western Illinois in 1970 with a degree in physical education. He has a master's degree in Educational Administration and has an education specialist degree in Educational Administration. A native of East Moline, he was an all-conference player both in high school at

Rock Island Alleman and in college. He played at Western Illinois with current Augustana assistant coach Tom Schmulbach.



CAM TORRES (Kickers/Punters)
 Cam Torres, whose father Luis was the Augustana equipment manager from 1985 until his retirement in 2000, will be in his fifth season as a part-time assistant coach at his alma mater. Torres will coach the kickers and punters. He graduated from Augustana in 1991 with degrees in political science and Spanish. He was a four year letter winner in soccer from 1987-90 and he captained the 1990 Vikings team. He served as the head boys and girls soccer coach at Rock Island High School in 2001 and 2002 and coached the kickers on the football team for the Rocks from 2001-03. He is currently employed by Illinois Healthcare and Family Services as an official in the Department of Child Support Enforcement.



AARON CALL (Linebackers)
 A native of Wilton, Iowa, Call began coaching the defensive line for the Vikings after using up his final year of eligibility in 2005. He was a first team all conference performer at defensive end in 2005 and helped lead Augustana to the CCIW title and into the NCAA Division III playoffs.



MARK READE (Recruiting Coordinator)
 Mark Reade returned to his alma mater in March of 2008 to take on the role of recruiting coordinator. The son of legendary Augustana head coach Bob Reade, Mark brings a plethora of experience to the position. He held coaching positions on the football staffs of Rice, Clemson, Concordia and Eastern Illinois as well as a two year stint at LaSalle-Peru High School. He served as the head men and women's head track & field coach at Concordia for two years. He also spent time in the private sector, working for Country Insurance and The Home Depot. A Phi Beta Kappa student at Augustana who graduated Magna Cum Laude with degrees in business, finance and economics in 1993, Reade has also done graduate work at Clemson, East-

ern Illinois and Rice. He was a two sport standout in track & field and football with the Vikings, serving as team captain of the 1993 track team and qualifying for the national meet in the 400 hurdles.



TIM PODULKA, (Wide Receivers)
 After completing his four years of eligibility in the fall of 2008, Tim Podulka will join the Augustana coaching staff for his first season in 2009. He was the Vikings' Most Valuable Offensive Player in 2008 after he threw for 1,570 yards and rushed for 529 from his quarterback position. He accounted for 18 touchdowns (six rushing and 12 passing). He earned second team all-conference honors at quarterback and he ranks sixth on Augustana's career passing list with 1,962 yards. A native of Elk Grove Village, Illinois and a graduate of Elk Grove High School, Podulka is on schedule to graduate in November with degrees in history and secondary education.



JAKE SNIDER, (Defensive Line)
 Jake Snider was a stalwart in the defensive line during his last two years and he now returns to help coach that same position. He was a second team all-conference performer in 2008 when he tied for the team lead in tackles for loss with 6.5 and was second in sacks with three. A native of Troy, Illinois and a graduate of Triad High School, Snider graduated with degrees in math and secondary education.



Vikings look to challenge once again after successful season of transitioning into new schemes; Will build on 30 straight years without a losing season

After making a successful transition to new schemes on both offense and defense in 2008, excitement and optimism is once again running high in the Augustana camp heading into the 2009 season. Veteran head coach Jim Barnes, who has a record of 67-26 (.720) at his alma mater, heads into his 10th season. The Vikings were 7-3 overall last year and went 5-2 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin, which was good for second place in the league standings.

Augustana has gone 30 years without a losing season and during that time frame the Vikings have been a fixture at the top of both the CCIW and NCAA Division III. Barnes is justifiably optimistic that the current season will once again see his team contending for top honors.

"We are very excited about what we have accomplished here at Augustana and what the future holds for this program," said Barnes. "We can't wait to build on what we did last year. We think we took a strong step forward as we changed some of our schemes around and our players all bought into what we were doing."

The most obvious of the change came on offense where Barnes installed a spread offense. Augustana had become synonymous with the wing-T and with a "grind-it-out" approach to moving the football. Quarterback Tim Podulka, who is now a member of the Vikings coaching staff, threw for 1,570 yards last year, the second most in school history, and the Augustana attack was more varied and diverse than it had been since the mid-1970's.

"We had to learn to walk before we could learn to run," said Barnes, who masterminded the change and actually tinkered with it the year before (2007). "Our kids took the change well and that is the reason we were successful."

Not that the Vikings abandoned the run completely as they led the CCIW in rushing with an average of 204.6 yards per game. However, they also averaged 165.7 yards passing and scored 29.1 points per game. Augustana averaged 38.5 points in its last four games of the 2008 campaign.

Podulka has graduated so the first order of business will be to settle on a quarterback and Barnes is looking at the luxury of having several outstanding candidates. Junior Steve McGough (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) was the backup last year and he completed nine of 11 passes for 71 yards. He also ran for 125 yards on just 19 attempts. Sophomores David Venegoni (**Carmel HS, Gurnee, Ill.**) and David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) will be in the mix as well. Junior Kyle Hundman (**Bloomington Central Catholic HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) caught three passes as a wide receiver and returned four kickoffs for 68 yards. He was named the team's Most Valuable Offensive Newcomer and because of his athletic ability he could be given a look at the quarterback position.

The runningback position was the one spot that was affected the most by the switch to the spread offense because under the old system the Vikings used three and now they line up with a single back. Josh Galliard performed well in that role last year and his durability will certainly be missed. Galliard rushed for 450 yards on 121 carries and scored three touchdowns. Junior Robert Wood (**Rockford Boylan HS, Loves Park, Ill.**) emerged as an explosive player late in the season and he gained 281 yards on 28 attempts with one touchdown. He could enjoy a fine season if he stays healthy. Senior Andy Klink (**McHenry East HS, McHenry, Ill.**) suffered from injuries last year but he will be in the hunt for playing time. Senior Parker Cleveland (**Providence Catholic HS, Mokena, Ill.**) sat out last year but he is back for his final year of eligibility. There also could be an opportunity for some younger players to contribute here as well.

Seniors Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) and Henry Deters (**Tolono-Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.**) were both starters in the slotback positions last year. Parke was a first team all-conference performer and was a second team academic all-district selection. He was the third leading rusher with 345 yards on 62 carries and scored a team high 10 touchdowns. He also caught a team-high 46 passes for 413 yards with two scores. His 46 catches put him in second place on Augustana's single season list for receptions. Junior Corbet Ball (**Buffalo Grove HS, Arlington Heights, Ill.**) and sophomore Jordan Peart (**Marian Central Catholic HS, Bull Valley, Ill.**) are also contending at slotback.

Senior Matt Downing (**Morton HS, Morton, Ill.**) caught 28 passes for 330 yards in 2008 and he leads the receiving corps. Sophomores Zach McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**), Jason Wagner (**Burlington Central HS, Elgin, Ill.**) and Eric Brunner (**Glenbrook North HS, Northbrook, Ill.**) will all be looking for playing time.

Strong offensive line play has long been a staple on Augustana teams for the past three decades and the outlook is bright for 2009. Senior Blaine Westemeyer (**Blue Valley Northwest HS, Overland Park, Kansas**) is the leader of this bunch from his tackle position. He was a first team academic all-American pick last year and was named to the American Football Coaches Association all-American team as well. Senior David Brickner (**Rock Island Alleman HS, Rock Island, Ill.**) and junior Mark Constantine (**Waubonsie Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) were starters at guard and junior Drew Hansen (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**) bookended Westemeyer in the other tackle slot. The only open spot heading into the year is at center. Junior Tim Day (**Wheaton Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) could claim the center position. Senior Michael Cochran (**Hinsdale Central HS, Oak Brook, Ill.**) and juniors Kelly Clennon (**Joliet Catholic HS, Naperville, Ill.**), Brock Alekna (**Rockford Guilford HS, Rockford, Ill.**) and Kevin Allibone (**Stevenston HS, Mundelein, Ill.**) provide tremendous depth.

While most of the focus on the change last year centered on the offense, there were some major differences on defense as well. Rob Cushman took over as the defensive coordinator and his unit led the CCIW in scoring defense at 16.4 points per game in league play.

"We can't say enough about the job that Coach Cushman did last year in taking over the offense," said Barnes. "He prepared our team well and our kids bought into what he wanted them to do."

The defense allowed just 92.9 yards per game rushing and once again that will be a focus. Losses in the interior line will have to be dealt with as all three 2008 starters are gone.

Junior Adam Bohland (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) moves over to the defensive side after spending a year on the offensive line. He will be heavily counted on. Senior Jeff Daisy (**Thornton Fractional South HS, Lansing, Ill.**), junior Zach Spoor (**Crystal Lake South HS, Crystal Lake, Ill.**) and sophomore Alfonso Herrera (**Waubonsie Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) will be contending for time in the middle. Junior Curt Perschnick (**Dwight HS, Dwight, Ill.**) and sophomores Pete Schimek (**Benet Academy, Naperville, Ill.**) and Matt Franzen (**Niles Notre Dame HS, Chicago, Ill.**) will fight for end positions.

At linebacker senior Eric Meyer (**Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.**) led the team in tackles last year with 79 (54 solo and 25 assists). He was a second team academic all-district performer. Senior Preston Jones (**Bureau Valley HS, Sheffield, Ill.**) was the team's defensive MVP two years ago and he returns for a fifth year of eligibility. Junior John Mago (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) was the fourth leading tackler last year with 45 total tackles (36 solo and nine assists). Those three will form the nucleus of the inside linebacking corps. Also set for inside duty will be senior Brandon McAtee (**Homewood-Flossmoor HS, Channahon, Ill.**) and juniors Brandon Holl (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) and Cody Wickenhauer (**Tri-Valley HS, Downs, Ill.**). On the outside, senior Aaron Setchell (**Amboy HS, Amboy, Ill.**) returns after a fine junior year. He had 20 solo tackles and 14 assists in 2008. Senior Andrew Rosset (**Maine West HS, Des Plaines, Ill.**) was the special teams MVP a year ago and will be looking for playing time along with junior Jeremy Smith (**Sherrard HS, Milan, Ill.**).

The secondary has some losses to overcome as senior Andrew Schweitzer (**Wheaton North HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) is the lone returning starter. Schweitzer was fifth on the team in tackles last year with 37. He will be at one cornerback position. The other cornerback position is up for grabs with four sophomores: Danny Hess (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**), Mack Gray (**Simeon Career Academy, Chicago, Ill.**), Matt Glawe (**Wheaton Warrenville South HS, Winfield, Ill.**) and Aaron Kwasigroch (**Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.**) currently in the hunt. Juniors Alex Schroeder (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) and James Wood (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) and sophomore Ben Hall (**University HS, Normal, Ill.**) will be fighting for the safety spot.

Barnes would like to see more production from his special teams play. Senior kicker Ryan Gibbons (**Peoria Richwoods HS, Peoria, Ill.**) had a fine year in 2007 but struggled with injuries last year. If he can return to his form of 2007 that will ease a lot of the worries. Klink was a second team academic all-district pick at punter the last two seasons.

"There is no question we have some people to replace," said Barnes. "But we had a great off-season and the young men in our program are ready to carry on the tradition that is Augustana football."

GALLANT EFFORT FALLS JUST SHORT AGAINST WEST GEORGIA

Buoyed by a 9-1 season in 1981 which included the first perfect (9-0) regular season since 1934; the first College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin football title since 1975 and just the second NCAA Division III playoff appearance in school history, hopes were high for the Vikings heading into 1982. A bevy of starters returned and head coach Bob Reade's charges did not disappoint.

With a stifling defense that allowed just 8.1 points per game and 80.1 yards rushing per contest combined with the multiple talents of quarterback Lance Hofer, Augustana won 11 straight games before falling to West Georgia. The Vikings dropped a 14-0 decision to the Braves in a defensive struggle in the 1982 Stagg Bowl for the national title.

Hofer, who had played for Reade at J.D. Darnall High School in Geneseo and led the Maple Leafs

to two state championships, was a rugged left hander. He passed for 945 yards and rushed for 527 during the 1982 season. He ran for 15 touchdowns and threw for nine and was nicked for just two interceptions. He was an easy choice for the CCIW "Offensive Player of the Year".

While Hofer and his mates were moving the ball and scoring points, his teammates on the defensive side of the ball were nearly immovable. With linebackers Jon Kuperus and Pete Kasap leading the way, the Vikings allowed an average of just 2.4 yards per carry rushing. The secondary stepped up and intercepted 27 passes as well. Four times during the season the Blue & Gold shut out opponents and only three times did Augustana allow more than double figures. That defense and an offense that would average 274.7 yards per game rushing carried the Vikings to another perfect 9-0 regular season and into the NCAA Division III playoffs for the second straight year.

Once in the playoffs, the first task was a formidable one as Augustana drew number one ranked Baldwin-Wallace on the Yellow Jackets fabled "Magic Carpet" at George Finnie Stadium in Berea, Ohio. Led by Hofer, junior halfback Craig Allison and sophomore wingback Ron Nelson, the Vikings offense battered what had been the number one ranked defense in the nation for 321 yards. That led the way for a 28-22 victory.

One week later the Vikings hosted St. Lawrence at Rock Island Public Schools Stadium and a large crowd witnessed a hard-hitting defensive struggle. Allison scored on a four yard run early

in the fourth quarter. Later in the stanza, St. Lawrence was driving for what could have been the tying score when cornerback Doug McCoy picked off a pass and returned it 92 yards for a touchdown with less than two minutes remaining to seal the 14-0 victory.

That shutout put Augustana in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl and the largest crowd in NCAA Division III championship history (estimated at 10,000) watched a titanic defensive struggle. West Georgia scored on a 71 yard pass with just :19 left in the second quarter for the first score and then tallied with 1:17 left in the game to seal the 14-0 victory.

THE YEAR OF THE COMEBACK AS PENNEY TO SINGBUSH NETS FIRST TITLE

One thing about that first championship - it wasn't easy.

It wasn't easy when quarterback Jay Penney had to drive his team 54 yards with less than two minutes to play and the Vikings out of timeouts to win a hard-fought 23-16 regular season game against Elmhurst.

It wasn't easy when Penney had to bring his team from behind in the first round of the playoffs on a mud-splattered Ericson Field. The Vikings beat Adrian 22-21 with Penney scoring the decisive two-point conversion with just 3:01 left in the game.

And it certainly wasn't easy when Penney had to rally his team from a 17-7 deficit late in the fourth quarter of the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl. Augustana scored two late touchdowns to secure the NCAA Division III title with a 21-17 win over Union College in Kings Island, Ohio.

While there are a multitude of factors why Augustana won the 1983 national championship, one of the biggest reasons was a passing combination that dated back to junior high school. Penney, the cool, hard-nosed veteran signal caller, hooked up with his former school-boy teammate Norm Singbush every time things looked bleak.

It was Singbush who caught the seven-yard pass from Penney to pull out the Elmhurst game. It was Singbush who caught the seven-yard scoring toss from Penney to win the Adrian game. And yes, it was Singbush who hauled in the two-yard pass from Penney to win the Union game.

On a team that averaged 300 yards per game on the ground and boasted two 1,000 yard rushers (halfback Craig Allison and wingback George Velasquez), it was a quarterback who would pass for less than 600 yards and a tight end who would catch absolutely anything thrown his way that eventually made the 1983

Augustana Vikings the champions of NCAA Division III.

Reade's team went 12-0 on the year and for the third straight season put together an undefeated regular season. Reade was chosen national Coach of the Year and tackle Kurt Kapischke, linebacker Pete Kasap, runningback Craig Allison and defensive back Doug McCoy all earned All-American honors.

THE KIDS WIN A TITLE WITH SEVEN SOPHOMORES IN THE STARTING LINEUP

There was no logical reason why Augustana should have repeated its national title in 1984. Head coach Bob Reade started seven sophomores and had 11 first year starters in the lineup when the season kicked off in September.

Win the national championship is exactly what the Vikings did, however. They compiled a perfect 12-0 record for the second consecutive season.

They did it with a fearsome defense despite the fact that seven of the starters on that unit were new.

They did it with a bruising, ball control offense despite the fact that four of the starters were sophomores.

But mostly they did it because they had fun playing the game as Reade so succinctly pointed out. "We were just a bunch of young kids who listened well and played hard all of the time."

Oh, there were some veterans like All-Americans Greg King, Norm Singbush, Ron Nelson and Joe Wheeler, but mostly it was the performance of sophomores Brad Price, Kirk Bednar, Mike Gray, Lynn Thomson and Troy Westerman who spearheaded the charge.

The new faces in the lineup proved to be invaluable in keeping the rest of the team from resting on its laurels of a year before.

It took a while for the defense to get the hang of things but in the last six games the Vikings allowed just 38 points. After breezing through the regular season with a 9-0 record, the Blue & Gold beat Dayton 14-13 in a slugfest in the first round of the playoffs. In the second round the Union Dutchmen came into Rock Island looking for revenge from the 1983 championship game. Instead of revenge, Union got a 23-6 dismantling as an aroused Augustana defense intercepted a school record seven passes.

In the Stagg Bowl, Nelson gained 155 yards and scored three touchdowns. The defense allowed just 18 yards rushing as

Augustana defeated Central of Iowa 21-12 and the Vikings were champions once again.

Nelson was the workhorse of the offense from his fullback position and Price added a breakaway threat from his halfback position. They both wen over 1,000 yards on the season. Senior Joe Wheeler was the leader from his linebacker position and won the CCIW Most Valuable Defensive Player award. Center Greg King was selected as the CCIW's Most Valuable Offensive Player despite playing on the offensive line.

THE LUCKY THIRTEEN - VIKINGS PUSH WIN STREAK TO 37 STRAIGHT

The NCAA expanded the division III playoffs to 16 teams in 1985, instead of the previous total of eight. It didn't really make any difference to veteran head coach Bob Reade, however, as his Augustana Vikings ripped off a perfect 13-0 record en route to a third straight national championship. In the process the Vikings moved their winning streak to 37 in a row.

That is not to say that 1985 did not have its anxious moments. The most nerve-racking occurred on September 28 at McCully Field in Wheaton, Illinois when starting quarterback Kirk Bednar went

down with a season ending knee injury.

The Vikings won that game 26-14 and left the field not knowing what they would do at the quarterback position. After two games of tinkering, Reade finally tapped little known sophomore Greg Wallace to handle the signal calling duties. Wallace had not even gone out for football in 1984, concentrating instead on basketball and baseball. He was not big nor did he possess the strongest throwing arm. He did have the one ability that Reade always put first when searching for quarterbacks. What he could do, and do very well, was win football games. He proved his worth immediately as he threw a touchdown pass in a 9-3 Homecoming win over Millikin in just his second start and then proceeded to get better each week.

With a new quarterback, Reade relied on his vaunted ground game and the Viking runners went wild. Junior Brad Price went over the 1,000 yard mark for the second season in a row and fullback Shane McCormick and wingbacks Bob Guerrieri and Dennis Fraikes all picked up yardage in big chunks.

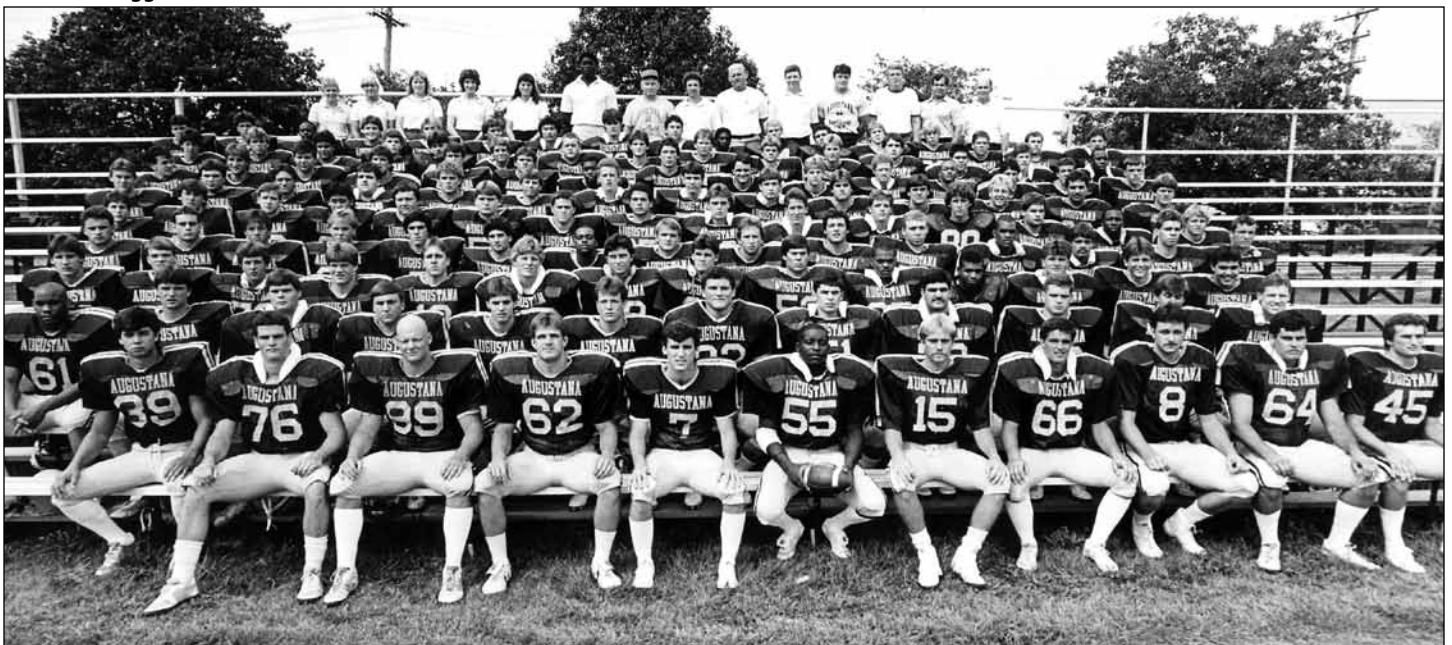
The defense was once again outstanding as senior strong safety Mark Long led the

way en route to an All-American season.

In the NCAA Playoffs, Augustana beat Albion 26-10 in the first round and then survived a scare by Mount Union in the second round before winning 21-14. In the semifinals the Vikings held off revenge minded Central of Iowa 14-7 and then dusted off Ithaca 20-7 for the title.



Just one year earlier Greg Wallace had not even gone out for football. When returning starter Kirk Bednar went down for the season with a knee injury in the third game, however, Wallace took over and went on to lead the Vikings to a 13-0 record and the 1985 NCAA Division III national title.

SIMPLY PUT - THE BEST EVER AS SENIORS END CAREER UNBEATEN WITH FOUR RINGS

As the final gun sounded to end the 1986 Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl the seniors on the Augustana College football team became a part of history. They walked off the field at Phenix City Municipal Stadium in Phenix City, Alabama knowing that they accomplished a feat that can never be topped.

When tri-captains Troy Westerman, Lynn Thomsen and Brad Price picked up the NCAA Division III national championship trophy, it marked the first time collegiate football history that one class had a hand in four straight national titles. The Vikings lost in the 1982 Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl to West Georgia by a score of 14-0. That would be the last time that Augustana would taste defeat until November 28, 1987.

In 1983 the Vikings went 12-0 and beat Union

of New York 21-17 for the title. In 1984 Augustana went 12-0 once again and this time beat Central of Iowa 21-12 for the title. The record moved to 13-0 in 1985 as the Vikings beat Ithaca of New York by a score of 20-7 for the crown. In 1986 Augie smashed Salisbury State 31-3 in the championship game to cap a 12-0-1 season.

The seniors totaled 14 on the 1986 team and they had a hand in a record that can only grow in magnitude. A shocking 0-0 tie to Elmhurst to open the 1985 season was the difference between a 50 game winning streak and a 50 game unbeaten string. No school in college football history has ever sent an entire class through all four years with national championships.

Once again head coach Bob Reade used his usual combination of a punishing rushing attack mixed with a smothering defense to lead the Vikings to a sixth straight undefeated regular season. Price led the Augustana offense for the third year in a row from his halfback position. He picked up 1,218 yards on 226 carries and scored 18 touchdowns for a total of 108 points. His rushing total was his third straight year over 1,000 yards and he finished his career as the school's second leading rusher with 3,399 yards and second leading scorer with 210 points.

A young offensive line continued to jell as the season went along and by year's end the Vikings were averaging 286.3 yards per game rushing and 33.9 points per game. While it took the offense a few games to get into the groove, the defense never missed a beat. Starting a total of seven seniors, this unit allowed a total of just 73 points, which averaged out to 5.6 per game.

In four playoff games against the finest teams in the nation, Augustana allowed a total of just 27 points. Running against the Vikings was virtually impossible as opponents could gain just 331 yards on 398 attempts for an average of 0.8 yards per carry. Passing was equally dangerous as Augustana defenders intercepted 42 passes.

Tackle Lynn Thomsen anchored the defense as he had been doing for four years. Thomsen started all 50 games of his Augustana career and came away with a career record of 49-0-1 as a starter.



Brad Price ended his career with over 3,000 yards and was the Most Valuable Player in the 1986 Stagg Bowl after he rushed for 169 yards and scored three touchdowns in a 31-3 win over Salisbury State.

Although Joe Thompson had one of the greatest seasons in Augustana school history, rushing for a still standing school record of 1,290 yards on 274 attempts, it was a 39 yard field goal by a kicker who was not even used on extra points which may have provided the margin for this first ever playoff appearance for the Vikings. Ben Newcomb was in his eighth year as the Augustana head coach and his team went 7-2 in the regular season and placed second in the CCIW after winning the title a year earlier.

Although the season ended with a crushing 46-7 defeat to eventual champion St. John's in the first round of the NCAA Division III playoffs, it was still a historic first for the Blue & Gold. Sophomore place-kicker Dave Johnson scored his only three points of the entire season when he connected on a 39-yard field goal against Illinois Wesleyan in the season finale in Bloomington. The Vikings beat the Titans 16-13 and it was Johnson's field goal, which came with 10:25 left in the third quarter, which gave his team its first lead of the game at 10-7. Thompson scored with 5:44 left to make it 16-7 and then Wesleyan tallied with 1:06 left in the game to make it 16-13.

That victory was enough to allow Newcomb's team to make the playoffs for the first time in school history but offensively this year belonged to Thompson. Thompson scored 16 touchdowns and led the team in kickoff returns and was second in pass receiving as well. He was selected as the CCIW's Most Outstanding Offensive Player and was chosen to the NCAA Division III All-America team as well.

1981

An undefeated regular season ended with a 19-7 loss to defending NCAA Division III national champion Dayton on a frozen astro-turf at the Flyers Welcome Stadium but the stage was set for Augustana greatness.

This was Bob Reade's third year at the Viking helm and his team just got better and better as the season progressed. The Blue & Gold turned in only the second undefeated regular season in school history - Shorty Almqvist's 1934 team was the first - and won the first 26 - AUGUSTANA VIKINGS FOOTBALL

of what would be a string of eight straight CCIW titles.

Reade alternated backfields constantly during the year with seven different rushers totaling over 210 yards on the season. While Craig Allison led all rushers with 648 yards, it was quarterback Lance Hofer who led the team in scoring with 48 points. Because of a NCAA transfer rule, Hofer was ineligible to participate in the playoffs but sophomore Jay Penney was no slouch. He had started four games the year before and he would lead the Vikings to the NCAA Division III title as a senior in 1983.

Defense was the key to this team as middle guard Tom Losby, linebackers Jon Kuperus and Pete Kasap and defensive backs Pete Vernon and Doug McCoy helped limit opponents to a mere 55.5 yards per game rushing.

1987

The longest unbeaten streak in NCAA Division III history ended in a pulsating 38-36 loss to Dayton at Welcome Stadium and with it went Augustana's hopes of capturing a fifth straight national title. Despite the heroics of the passing combination of quarterback Greg Wallace and wide receiver Eric Welgat, the Vikings fell to the Flyers. The loss ended what had been a perfect 10-0 season up until that point and it also snapped the Vikings unbeaten streak at 60 games - dating back to a loss to West Georgia in the 1982 Stagg Bowl.

This was the year of the offense as Wallace spearheaded the charge for an offensive team that averaged 346.5 yards per game rushing

and 42.5 points per game. Wingback Dennis Fraikes led the team in rushing with 1,134 yards - averaging an unheard of 8.3 yards per carry while Bob Reade's son - freshman Barry Reade - led the team in scoring with 79 points. Wallace threw for 835 yards, mostly to Welgat (25 catches for 605 yards and 11 touchdowns) and tight end Tom Kula (12 receptions for 164 yards). The defense got All-American seasons from defensive end Carleton Beasley and linebacker Mike Ricketts.

1988

The Vikings came within a whisker of playing in a sixth Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, falling to Central of Iowa by a score of 23-17 in a game played in Pella, Iowa in the NCAA division III semifinals. Instead of going to back to Phenix City, Alabama, Bob Reade's Vikings made the trip home to Rock Island but this was a very good season. This team came back from adversity, becoming the first Augustana team to suffer defeat in the regular season since 1980 when Carroll picked up a 24-21 victory in Waukesha, Wisconsin in the fourth week of the season.

That loss snapped a 70 game unbeaten regular season streak, which started on October 18, 1980. From that point on the Vikings were playing for their playoff lives but they came through every week. Senior fullback Erik Burgwald (1,275 yards on 250 attempts) and sophomore wingback Rick Papke (1,087 yards on 148 attempts) formed a 1,000 yard duo and senior center John Bothe was named the CCIW's Most Valuable Offensive Player. The defense, which was tested early in the year, allowed just 24 total points over the final four regular season games.

Only one team was able to defeat the Vikings in this year but it was the same one - twice. Millikin bounced Augustana 33-8 at home on November 4, which snapped a 52 game home winning streak spanning nine years. That came in the eighth week of the season and left the Vikings streak of eight straight NCAA Division III Playoff appearances in jeopardy. In the ninth week

of the season, however, Augustana beat North Central 17-6 while two teams ranked ahead of the Vikings in the North Region were losing. That series of events gave Bob Reade's crew the fourth and final spot in the playoffs.

The playoff opponent was Millikin and although the game was much closer, the Big Blue prevailed 21-12 in a game played in Decatur, Illinois.

Junior wingback Rick Papke, although he did not approach his 1,000 yard season of 1988, still managed to lead the Vikings in rushing with 763 yards on 147 attempts while scoring three touchdowns. Barry Reade, Bob's son who handled the quarterbacking and place-kicking chores, led the team in scoring with 64 points.

1990

Battling uphill odds all year long, the Augustana Vikings ended up surprising all the "experts" during the 1990 season. Coming off a year in which they failed to win the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin for the first time since 1980, and overcoming a potentially crushing mid-season defeat at the hands of Carroll College, veteran head coach Bob Reade's team seemed to thrive on confounding the experts.

In 1989 Augustana ended up 8-2 with both defeats coming to Millikin. The Vikings had been second in the league in 1989 but still managed to make the NCAA Division III playoffs for a record ninth straight year.

In 1990 the NCAA playoff streak climbed to 10 straight years but this time Augustana did it from its familiar perch atop the CCIW. Reade's Vikings finished with an overall record of 8-2 and a 7-1 mark in the CCIW, good enough for the team's ninth league title in the past 10 years and 13th conference title since the CCIW was formed in 1946. The season, which began with a 37-12 win over North Central, ended with a 24-14 defeat at Dayton in the first round of the NCAA playoffs.

for veteran head coach Bob Reade and his Vikings may well have been the first one. After opening each of the last two seasons with losses in the first two games, Reade was concerned about making sure his team got off to a quick start.

That put a premium on the first game - a home contest

with Wisconsin-Platteville. Obviously the Vikings learned their lessons of the past two years as they defeated the Pioneers 34-24, coming from 10 points down in the second quarter. That set off a fine season, one which resulted in Augustana winning the CCIW title for the 16th time in school history - a league record - and saw the Vikings advance to the NCAA Division III playoffs for the 12th time.

Juniors Scott Tumilty at runningback and Rusty Van-Wetzinga at linebacker were named CCIW's MVPs on offense and defense respectively for a team which lost in the first round of the NCAA Division III playoffs to eventual national champion Albion by a score of 28-21.

1999

In one of the most emotional seasons in Augustana history, the Vikings finished 9-2 and won the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin for the 18th time. For the first time ever, the NCAA awarded automatic playoff berths to league champions and the Blue & Gold snatched that up as well. It was the 13th playoff appearance since 1976.

Through it all, the Vikings had to cope with the fact that head coach Tom Schmulbach was sidelined with throat cancer. Longtime defensive coordinator Larry Johnsen took over while Schmulbach was recovering from his mid-August surgery.

It was vintage Augustana football as the rushing attack, led by quarterback Joe Schmulbach - Tom's son and fullback Ben Nelson, finished second in NCAA Division III with an average of 337.7 yards per game. All-American guard Mack Hay and tackle J.D. Sheldon helped pave the way with two freshmen in the offensive line.

Defensively, cornerback Jason Fosdick earned All-American honors and finished second in the nation in

interceptions with 10. Linebacker Jeremy Drish and tackle Josh Johnson also were named to All-American teams.

The Vikings recovered from a home loss to Millikin at the start of the CCIW season to rip off six straight wins. The regular season culminated with a 31-19 win at Wheaton to clinch the conference title and playoff bid.

In the playoffs, Augustana beat St. Norberts 39-32 in the first round before falling at three time defending NCAA champion Mount Union in the semifinals by a score of 42-33.

2001

It was business as usual for Augustana as the 2001 squad won the CCIW title for the 19th time and earned the school's 14th trip to the NCAA Playoffs. The Vikings finished the season 10-2 overall and 6-1 in the conference and set eight new school records along the way.

The Vikings led the nation in rushing with an average of 370.4 yards per game, the highest average in school history. All-Americans J.D. Sheldon and Bob Paulin anchored a powerful offensive line which paved the way for another All-American, Dave Chorney. Chorney set Augustana records with 1,486 rushing yards and 20 touchdowns and was named CCIW Offensive Player of the Year.

Defensively, the Vikings pitched three shutouts and held opponents to only 12.9 points per game. They were led by end Tim Williams, who earned All-American honors and finished the season with 15.5 sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss.

The biggest win of the season came in week seven as the eighth ranked Vikings took on ninth ranked Millikin. With Big Blue leading 17-14 and less than three minutes remaining, safety Matt Furlong recovered a huge fumble to set up the winning drive. After four straight running plays, quarterback Brad Wendell threw a 19 yard strike to All-American tight-end Jim Triveri in the back of end zone to give Augustana the lead with just 1:08 remaining. The defense then held Millikin to give the Vikings a 21-17 win.

Augustana stumbled a bit to close out the season with a heart stopping 34-32 loss at Wheaton, but the

Vikings bounced back with a resounding 54-14 win over Defiance in the first round of the playoffs before falling to eventual national champion Mount Union 32-7 in the second round.

2005

Heading into the 2005 season the Vikings of head coach Jim Barnes garnered little respect. Questions abounded about the defense and the lack of any kind of passing game. For the first time since 1982 Augustana was not included in any preseason top 20 poll and the Vikings were picked for fourth in the CCIW coaches poll.

Confounding the experts, the Blue & Gold shook off a season opening 25-24 overtime loss to Central of Iowa and roared through the CCIW undefeated. With an offense that pounded out 346.3 yards per game rushing, the concerns about the lack of a passing game proved moot. In fact, the Vikings set an NCAA Division III national record for fewest pass attempts in a single season with 33. The 2.75 attempts per game shattered the old mark of 4.00 per game set by Wisconsin-River Falls in 1988.

Fullback Mike Guzman led the team in rushing with 1,089 yards, halfback Aaron Kuzniar chipped in with 932 and quarterback Matt Roe worked his option wizardry to the tune of 692 yards and a team leading 12 touchdowns. All-American tackle Mike Zeifert helped pave the way up front.

A defense that was much maligned in the preseason came of age quickly and after allowing 51 points in the first two games, surrendered just 35 over the next five. Included in that stretch were road shutouts over Carthage (7-0 on October 8) and Millikin (23-0 on October 22). Cornerback Tom Anthony led the nation in interceptions with 13. Anthony was the "Defensive Player of the Year in the CCIW and was a first team NCAA Division III All-America selection. Safety Travis Shea, who had seven interceptions, was also named to the All-America team.

Josh Patterson kicked a field goal with no time on the clock to defeat North Central 20-17 on November 5. That win clinched the 20 conference title in Augustana history and propelled the Vikings into the NCAA Division III playoffs for the 15th time.

After defeating Lakeland 49-22 in the first round, the season ended with a 44-7 loss at eventual national champion Mount Union in the round of 16.

Barnes was named the CCIW "Coach of the Year" after guiding his team to a 10-2 overall record and a 7-0 mark in the conference. It was also the 27th consecutive winning season for Augustana.

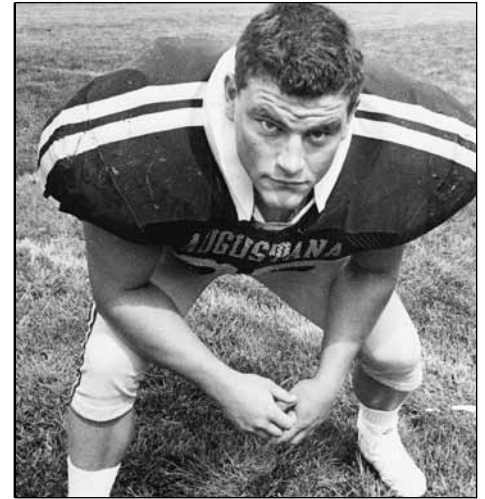

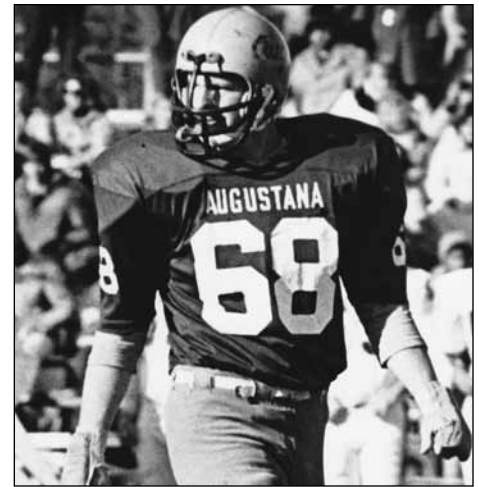

Vikings roll up 7-3 record and second place finish in CCIW; New offense is a hit as Augustana extends streak of non-losing seasons to 30 straight

The legacy left by the 2008 Augustana football team will be one of a team that answered an awful lot of questions. Heading into the year the Vikings were coming off a 5-5 season in 2007 and uncharacteristic 3-4 mark in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. There was also the matter of the implementation of a new offensive scheme and the adjustment of dealing with a new defensive coordinator. Throw in the fact that of the 10 games on the schedule, five would be at night and Augustana had not won a night game since the 2005 season, when the current crop of seniors were freshmen.

When the 2008 season ended on November 15 with a solid 34-13 victory over Millikin, everyone associated with the storied and tradition-laden program could nod with satisfaction. The questions, as plentiful as they were, had all been answered. Veteran head coach Jim Barnes led his team to a 7-3 overall record, including a 5-2 mark in the CCIW that was good enough for second place. The spread offense jelled nicely and Barnes even mixed in some of the "old Augie" attack so that the Vikings once again led the league in rushing while still managing to have three receivers with over 28 catches. New defensive coordinator Rob Cushman fit in nicely and his undersized, yet scrappy unit led the CCIW in fewest points allowed and finished seventh in NCAA Division III in that category.

The night game situation? Not a problem as Augustana went 4-1 under the lights including key road wins at Illinois Wesleyan and Carthage – two places where the Vikings suffered defeats at night just a year earlier.

For a team with questions and considering the transitional phase of the offense and defense, questions were all answered in a positive way.

The biggest change, of course, was the offensive style as senior quarterback Tim Podulka (Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.) was the trigger man of the spread attack. The Vikings experimented with it last year but 2008 saw a complete commitment to the new style and Podulka proved to be the right guy to spearhead the change. Not big by anybody's standard, Podulka was a gritty and gutsy field general who led the team in both rushing and passing. He gained 529 yards on 113 rushing attempts with six touchdowns and he passed for 1,570 yards by completing 140 of 204 passes with 12 touchdowns. The 1,570 yards passing is the second highest single season mark in school history.

While the spread offense was different, the Vikings still stayed with the long-held philosophy around Ericson Field of controlling the game on the ground. They averaged 204.6 yards per game rushing, numbers that paled in comparison to the wing-T days of averaging 300-plus yards per game but healthy numbers nonetheless. Senior Josh Galliard (Orion HS, Orion, Ill.) was the second leading rusher with 460 yards on 121 carries and three touchdowns while junior Jake Parke (St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.) added 345 rushing yards on 62 attempts with a team leading 10 touchdowns. Midway through the season sophomore Robert Wood (Rockford Boylan HS, Rockford, Ill.) caught his stride and he finished with 281 yards on 28 carries, an average of a whopping 10.0 yards-per-attempt.

It helped that the offensive line grew and matured with each game. In the season opening 21-6 win over Coe the Vikings struggled, gaining just 192 yards of total offense with the rushing attack able to generate just 152 on 48 tries. With senior center Jim Tongue (Conant HS, Hoffman Estates, Ill.) and junior tackle Blaine Westemeyer (Blue Valley Northwest HS, Overland Park, Kansas) providing the leadership, the rest of the group made constant progress. Junior David Brickner (Rock Island Alleman HS, Rock Island, Ill.) and sophomores Drew Hansen (Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove Ill.), Adam Bohland (Orion HS, Orion, Ill.) and Mark Constantine (Waubonsie Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.) meshed nicely. In a 41-28 loss at North Central on November 8 with the conference title on the line, the offensive line enjoyed perhaps its finest hour as the Vikings rushed for 304 yards on a Cardinal unit that had allowed just 200 yards in total rushing in five previous league games.

One of the reasons for going to the spread offense, however, was to get more players involved and that certainly happened. Parke led the team in receptions with 46 for 413 yards and two touchdowns and he nearly established a new Augustana school record for catches in a single season. Parke finished just four catches behind the current record of 50, which was set by Paul Ander way back in 1968. Parke wasn't the only threat out on the perimeter, however, as senior Jason Kwasigroch (Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.) chipped in with 33 catches for 561 yards and seven touchdowns and junior Matt Downing (Morton HS, Morton, Ill.) added 28 receptions for 330 yards. Junior Henry Deters (Tolono-Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.) showed his versatility by catching 19 passes for 147 yards and two touchdowns and rushing for 201 yards on 33 attempts with three touchdowns.

While the change in offense drew most of the attention, the defense quietly did its job, keeping the Vikings in games, especially early in the season with team concept of getting everyone involved. Cushman's unit was tough to run against and even tougher to score on. In seven of the 10 games the Vikings held opponents under 81 yards rushing and only two teams (Wheaton and North Central) were able to score more than 20 points.

Junior linebacker Eric Meyer (Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.) was the tackle leader with 79 total tackles (54 solos and 25 assists) while senior cornerback Billy Lynch (Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.) pitched in with 70 (51 solos and 19 assists). Lynch also led the team in interceptions with four. Meyer led a very active linebacker corps that also included senior Wyatt Brieser (Geneseo HS, Atkinson, Ill.) and John Mago (Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.) among the team's tackle leaders. Brieser totaled 54 (29 & 25) while Mago racked up 45 (36 & 9).

The Vikings gave up an average of 13.4 points and 370.3 yards of total offense per game. They allowed just 92.9 yards rushing per game and only 3.1 yards per carry.

Westemeyer was honored at the end of the season by being named to the ESPN – The Magazine Academic All-America team by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He is the 126th athlete in Augustana history to earn Academic All-America honors as the Vikings rank sixth in the nation in number of Academic All-Americans produced. Westemeyer and defensive end Eric Smith (Flanagan HS, Flanagan, Ill.) were both first team Academic All-District. Parke, punter Andy Klink (McHenry East HS, McHenry, Ill.) and Meyer were second team Academic All-District.

Westemeyer and Parke were first team all-conference picks for the second year in a row. Joining them on the first team were Tongue, Lynch and Smith. Senior safety Brad Monier (Bureau Valley HS, Walnut, Ill.), senior defensive tackle Jake Snider (Troy Triad HS, Troy, Ill.), Meyer, Podulka, Galliard and Kwasigroch were all second team all-conference selections.

AUGUSTANA 21, COE 6 on September 6 in Rock Island, Illinois

Junior Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) didn't gain a lot of yards but he found the end three times and the defense forced four turnovers as Augustana defeated Coe 21-6 in the 2008 season opener for both teams on Saturday, September 6 under the lights at Ericson Field.

Parke only gained 15 yards on nine rushing attempts but he scored on runs of five, one and one and senior Ryan Gibbons (**Peoria Richwoods HS, Peoria, Ill.**) booted three extra points as the Vikings defeated a Ko-Hawk team that was 7-3 a year ago and is one of the pre-season favorites in the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

The defense, which is under the direction of first year coordinator Rob Cushman, allowed just 64 yards rushing on 26 attempts and sacked Coe quarterback CJ Feller three times for 22 yards. The KoHawks did throw for 201 yards but only scored once in the game and that came after an Augustana turnover put the ball on the six yard line.

Parke's first touchdown came with 5:07 left in the first quarter and it capped a seven play, 61 yard drive. The Viking defense had turned Coe away on a fourth and one play at the Augustana 38 when Feller was thrown for a one yard loss by linebackers Eric Meyer (**Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.**) and Danny Hilby (**Chatham Glenwood HS, Chatham, Ill.**). Henry Deter's (**Tolono Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.**) 36 yard dash to the five set up Parke's score.

Coe tied the ball with :40 left in the first quarter. Tom Breitbach intercepted Viking quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) at the 18 and returned it 12 yards to the six. On the next play Sam Hammes ran it in for a six yard touchdown. The extra point attempt failed and Augustana held a 7-6 lead. Midway through the second quarter Park returned Cody Kriegel's punt 44 yards to the six and three plays later he scored from the one yard line to make it 14-6.

With the score 14-6 heading into the second half, Augustana was fighting a losing battle in the field position department, starting back-to-back drives its own two yard line. The defense held Coe at bay however and sophomore John Mago (**Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) came up with a big play early in the fourth quarter. The Kohawks had drive to the Viking 24 and had first and 10. After an illegal procedure penalty placed the ball back on the 29, Mago stepped in front of Feller's pass at the 23 to end the drive.

That gave Augustana the ball on its own 23 with 13:01 left and clinging precariously to a 14-6 lead. The Vikings drove to midfield before the drive stalled and Andy Klink (**McHenry East HS, McHenry, Ill.**) was called on to punt. His put was fumbled at the Coe 16 and Deters eventually recovered the loose ball at the 20 with 7:11 remaining. It took six plays to travel the 20 yards but Parke scored for the third time on the evening, this time from a yard out, to make it 21-6. There was just 3:26 left on the clock when Parke hit paydirt.

On the ensuing drive, any Coe hopes ended when Jake Snider (**Troy Triad HS, Troy, Ill.**) came up with one sack of Feller and Hilby and Preston Jones (**Bureau Valley HS, Sheffield, Ill.**) combined on another.

The Vikings were outgained in total offense by a count of 265 to 192 but did manage to dust off the running game to the tune of 152 yards, with Deters leading the way with 54 yards on just eight carries. Josh Galliart (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) had 46 yards on 18 attempts. Hammes led the Coe rushing game with 79 yards on 17 tries.

Senior cornerback Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) and Meyer combined for the team lead in tackles with 10 each and the Augustana offense did manage to control the clock for 34:50 compared to 25:10 for Coe.

AUGUSTANA 30 , GREENVILLE 0 on September 13 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill. – An extremely efficient offensive performance in the second half led the way as Augustana defeated, Greenville 30-0 in non-conference football action on Saturday, September 13 under the lights at Ericson Field. Clinging to a 6-0 halftime lead, the Vikings scored on their first four possessions of the second half with three touchdowns and one field goal. The fifth, and final, drive of the second half ended when the clock ran out with the ball on Panther 12.

Senior quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) was extremely effective at the controls of the offense, especially in the second half. He ended the game with 135 yards passing on 15 of 18 with one interception and he led the team in rushing with 90 yards on 10 attempts. As a team Augustana piled up 449 yards of total offense (289 rushing and 160 passing) with 289 of those total offense yards coming in the second half.**

The Vikings sputtered on their first two drives of the game before getting the ball on their own 22 with 10:03 left in the second quarter. A 25 yard pass from Podulka to Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) on the second play of the drive got things started and eventually Andy Klink (**McHenry East HS, McHenry, Ill.**) hit pay dirt with a five yard touchdown run with 5:00 left before halftime. Ryan Gibbons (**Peoria Richwoods HS, Peoria, Ill.**) missed the extra point and the score was 6-0.******

Greenville drove down the field and went 58 yards on 14 plays before senior cornerback Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) intercepted Greenville quarterback Dominic Kegel's pass in the end zone with just 18 seconds left before intermission.**

The second half belonged to Augustana as the Viking defense limited the visitors to just 54 yards and only 13 offensive plays in the final 30 minutes. On the flip side, the Augustana defense kicked things into high gear, starting with the opening kickoff. Klink scored his second touchdown of the night, this time on a one yard run to cap a 61 yard, 10 play drive. Gibbons drilled the extra point and the Vikings led 13-0 with 9:51 left in the third quarter.

Parke scored on an eight yard run with 2:38 left in the third to make it 20-0 and put the finishing touches on an eight play, 70 yard drive. Sophomore quarterback Stephen McGough (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) tallied on a one yard quarterback sneak early in the fourth quarter (9:20 left) and that made it 27-0 after Gibbons' extra point. On the ensuing kickoff by the Vikings Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Colorado**) the ball landed at the Greenville 24 and was recovered by Augustana. The Vikings drove to the three and on fourth and one Gibbons kicked a 20 yard field goal to account for the final score of 30-0.****

Augustana held the ball for 23:29 of the second half compared to just 6:31 for Greenville. The Vikings forced three fumbles and intercepted two passes and allowed the Panthers just 195 yards of total offense (130 rushing and 65 passing). Eric Meyer (**Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.**) led the team in tackles for the second consecutive week with 10 (eight solo and two assists) while senior cornerback Lynch had seven tackles (six solos and one assist) with a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and an interception.**

While Podulka led the ground game with 90 yards, senior Josh Galliard (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) pitched in with 70 yards on 15 carries and Parke added 42 on five. A total of eight different Augustana players caught passes with Parke leading the way with five receptions for 47 yards and Matt Downing (**Morton HS, Morton, Ill.**) had four for 44.****

Kagel led the Greenville offense with 53 yards rushing and 65 yards passing on eight of 18 with two interceptions.

Augustana is now 2-0 on the season while Greenville falls to 0-2. The Vikings will now have a week off before heading to Platteville, Wisconsin on Saturday, September 27 to take on the UW-Platteville Pioneers in a 6:00 p.m. contest.

UW-PLATTEVILLE 13, AUGUSTANA 9 on September 27 in Rock Island, Illinois

PLATTEVILLE, Wisconsin – In a defensive struggle, the Augustana Vikings fell from the ranks of the undefeated by a score of 13-9 at Wisconsin-Platteville in the final non-conference game of the 2008 season. After allowing scores (two field goals and a touchdown) on the Pioneers first three possessions of the contest, Augustana's defense caught it rhythm. Over the final seven possessions of the game the Viking defenders gave up a total of 71 yards of offense on 34 plays.

It didn't look so bright at the beginning as Platteville scored on its first possession when Tony Smidl kicked a 39 yard field goal to give the Pioneers a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter (6:30). The drive was set up when Augustana punter Andy Klink (**McHenry East HS, McHenry, Ill.**) was intercepted at the Platteville 42 by Eric Jensen on the Vikings' first possession of the game. Jensen returned the ball five yards to the 47 and the Pioneers drove to the 22 before they were forced to kick a field goal.

Augustana came right back and put together a 12 play, 72 yard drive that ended when Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) scored on a one yard run. The big play in the drive was a 26 yard completion by quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) to Parke on a third and 12 situation. Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Col.**) kicked the extra point to give the Vikings a 7-3 lead just two seconds into the second quarter.

Platteville answered with its only long drive of the game, going 68 yards in 12 plays with quarterback Mitch Shadley hitting Nick Grosso from 12 yards away for the touchdown. Smidl's extra point made it 10-7 with 5:41 left before halftime.

When Augustana got the ball back the offense couldn't gain a first down and a short punt went out of bounds at the Viking 46. Platteville moved to the 14 before the defense stiffened again and Smidl kicked a 31 yard field goal to make it 13-7 with 4:07 left before intermission.

In the second half the Vikings drove inside the host's 26 yard line three times but came up empty on each occasion. The first time the drive ended at the 26 on downs and the second one resulted in a missed 32 yard field goal by Prosia. The third time that Augustana threatened was late in the game when the Vikings got to the 13 with less than two minutes to go only to have a fumble thwart the threat.

Wisconsin-Platteville took a safety with :14 left to account for the final score.

Augustana moved the ball on offense, gaining a total of 349 yards (202 passing and 147 rushing) but was unable to translate that into points. Podulka connected on 22 of 31 passing for 202 yards with Henry Deters (**Tolono-Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.**) catching five of those balls for 65 yards. Parke had five catches for 48 yards and Josh Galliard (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) also had five receptions for 26 yards. The Vikings also picked up 147 yards on the ground with Galliard leading the way with 77 yards on 17 attempts.

The Augustana defense gave up just 218 yards of total offense (81 rushing and 137 passing) with 147 of those yards coming in the Pioneers' first three possessions. The Vikings held Platteville to just three of 14 on third down conversions. Senior safety Brad Monier (**Bureau Valley HS, Walnut, Ill.**) led the team in tackles with eight while Jake Snider (**Triad HS, Troy, Ill.**) and Preston Jones (**Bureau Valley HS, Sheffield, Ill.**) each had seven. Augustana sacked Shadley twice and had six tackles for loss in the game.

With the loss the Vikings fall to 2-1 on the season while Platteville moves to 2-1. It also denied Augustana head coach his 100th collegiate coaching victory.

AUGUSTANA 42, ELMHURST 6 on October 4 in Elmhurst, Illinois

ELMHURST, Ill. – Using a combination of precision on offense and a stifling presence on defense, the Augustana Vikings opened the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin season with an impressive 42-6 victory over Elmhurst on Saturday, October 4 at Langhorst Field in Elmhurst, Illinois. The win gave Augustana head coach Jim Barnes his 100th collegiate coaching victory and it continued the Vikings longstanding mastery of the Bluejays.

Barnes, who is currently in his ninth season at Augustana, now has an overall college coaching record of 100-37. He is 63-24 at his alma mater and before that he was 37-13 in five seasons (1995-99) at the College of Wooster.

The Vikings now hold a 50-3-1 series lead over Elmhurst and the Bluejays have not won between the two teams since 1979, 29 games ago. The 1986 game ended in a 0-0 tie so between 1979 and the present, Augustana is 28-0-1 against Elmhurst. This is the third straight year that these two teams have opened the league season and in all three games the Bluejays came in with a 3-0 record.

This was just the kind of start that Barnes was hoping for as his team entered CCIW play. It was a total combination of offense and defense as both units played big roles in the victory.

On offense, quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) led the way as he had 254 of the Vikings' 405 yards of total offense. He rushed for 60 yards on 16 attempts and completed 15 of 18 passes for 194 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

The defense held Elmhurst to just 26 rushing yards on 25 attempts and only 285 yards of total offense for the afternoon. The big story however was the fact that Augustana force four turnovers. Of the Bluejays final six possessions, four of them ended on turnovers (three interceptions and one fumble).

Late in the first quarter Augustana began a drive on its own eight yard line in a scoreless game. After a false start that pushed them back to the four, the Vikings went 92 yards (actually 96 with the penalty factored in) on seven plays before Podulka scored on a 10 yard run on a third and three situation. The big play was on the second play of the drive when Podulka hit Jason Kwasigroch (**Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.**) for 69 yards that put the ball on the Elmhurst 27. Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Colo.**) connected on the first of six straight extra points and Augustana led 7-0 with just :38 left in the first stanza.

Podulka connected on a seven yard scoring toss, his first of the season, to Henry Deters (**Tolono-Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.**) with just 1:17 left before half-time and Prosia made it 14-0. That is the way the score stood at intermission.

In the third quarter Josh Galliard (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) banged over from two yards out to cap a 10 play, 80 yard drive that pushed the lead to 21-0.

Elmhurst answered that score with a 58 yard, 10 play drive that ended when quarterback Chris Kudyba scored on a 14 yard run. The extra point attempt failed, however, and with 4:37 left in the third, the margin was 21-6. The Bluejays forced a three and out on the Augustana offense and started a drive into Viking territory. Kudyba was intercepted by safety Brad Monier (**Bureau Valley HS, Walnut, Ill.**) at the five and Monier returned it 11 yards to the 16 to end the threat.

At the start of the fourth quarter the Augustana defense came up with another big play as Jake Snider (**Troy-Triad HS, Troy, Ill.**) sacked Kudyba at the Elmhurst 33, forced and recovered the fumble himself. With the short field it only took the Vikings four plays to travel 33 yards with Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) scoring from eight yards out. Parke accounted for all 33 yards in the drive, 21 by rushing and 12 by receiving.

The defense continued to turn up the volume. Cornerback Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) intercepted Kudyba at the Bluejay 34 and returned it 29 yards to the five with 7:19 left in the game. Deters scored his second touchdown of the game, this one on a five yard run, to make it 35-6 with 6:33 left.

Ben Hall (**University HS, Normal, Ill.**) picked off Kudyba at the Augie 42 and returned it five yards to the 47 with 4:11 left to play. Reserve quarterback Stephen McGough (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) rushed 41 yards on the first play to put the ball on the 12 and Robert Wood (**Rockford Boylan HS, Rockford,**

Ill.) scored on a 12 yard run with 3:29 left to play to account for the final score.

Kudyba completed 25 of 44 passes but not only did the Vikings intercept him three times, but they also sacked him eight times for 47 yards of losses. Andrew Schweitzer (**Wheaton North HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) led the team in tackles with seven and Eric Smith (**Flanagan HS, Flanagan, Ill.**) had three quarterback sacks and Snider had two.

With the win Augustana moved to 3-1 overall and 1-0 in the CCIW while Elmhurst fell to 3-1 and 0-1.

WHEATON 26, AUGUSTANA 14 on October 11 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill. – Augustana had the sixth ranked Wheaton reeling at halftime, but a strong second half performance by the Thunder resulted in the visitors claiming a 26-14 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin victory on Saturday afternoon at Ericson Field. The result spoiled a beautiful homecoming afternoon for the Vikings, who dropped to 3-2 overall and 1-1 in the CCIW. Wheaton moved to 5-0 overall and 2-0 in league play.

In the first half Augustana rolled ups 215 yards of total offense and took a 14-13 advantage into the locker-room at intermission. That all changed in the second half when Wheaton scored on three of its first four possessions and limited the Vikings to just 41 yards of total offense.

After receiving the opening kickoff, Augustana marched 80 yards on 14 plays with senior quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) scoring on a 20 yard run. Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Col.**) nailed the extra point and with 6:54 left in the first quarter the Vikings had a 7-0 lead. Wheaton came back and cut the lead to 7-3 on a 47 yard field goal by Tim Ellingsen with just 1:59 left in the first quarter. It would be the first of four field goals on the day by Ellingsen.

The Thunder took the lead midway through the second quarter when quarterback Sean Norris hit Alex Pokorny with a 49 yard scoring toss to make it 10-7.

Late in the second quarter senior cornerback Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) came up with a big play when he intercepted Norris at the 43 and returned it 15 yards to the Wheaton 43. Three plays later Podulka scampered into the end zone from 33 yards out and with just :33 left before halftime the Vikings led 14-10.

Wheaton marched right down the field, however, and Ellingsen kicked a 21 yard field goal as the clock expired to trim the advantage to 14-13 at halftime.

In the second half the Thunder grabbed the lead on their first possession when Norris ran in from 14 yards out. That made it 20-14. After an exchange of punts, Wheaton got the ball back late in the third quarter and runningback Rocky Gingg started to heat up. He had been held to just 25 yards on eight attempts in the first half but on this drive he carried it five times for 31 yards and eventually Ellingsen kicked another 21 yard field goal to make it 23-14. With 3:50 left in the contest Ellingsen booted his fourth field goal of the game, this one from 40 yards out, to account for the final tally.

Gingg ended up with 142 yards on 35 carries and Norris threw for 240 yards as he completed 16 of 25 yards.

Augustana got 179 yards passing out of Podulka, who completed 19 of 29 yards but could only manage 77 yards rushing as a team.

Eric Meyer (**Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.**) led the Vikings in tackles with 16 (12 solo and four assists.)

AUGUSTANA 21, ILLINOIS WESLEYAN 13 on October 18 in Bloomington, Illinois

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – An inspired Augustana defense came up big in the second half and Josh Galliard (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) scored a clinching touchdown in the fourth quarter as the Vikings defeated Illinois Wesleyan 21-13 on Saturday night, October 18 in Bloomington, Illinois.

After trailing 10-7 at halftime, Augustana's defense kept a potent Illinois Wesleyan offense at bay for most of the second half, allowing just one field goal on a 15 play, 60 yard drive. Besides that scoring drive, the Titans had the ball for just 17 plays and could generate just 18 yards of total offense in the third and fourth quarters.

The Viking offense did its part, coming up with one touchdown each in the third and fourth quarters. Down 10-7, Augustana began its second drive of the third quarter on its own 34. Pay dirt was reached when senior quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) connected with senior tight end Matt Feece (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) on a 23 yard scoring toss midway through the third quarter. That made it 14-10 after the second of three successful extra points on the night by Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Colo.**) and capped a nine play, 66 yard drive.

After that score Illinois Wesleyan came back and got its only second half points when Joe Duffy connected on a 25 yard field goal to make it 14-13 with just :19 left in the third quarter. Heading into the fourth quarter the game began to parallel the 2007 contest when the Titans came from behind in the fourth quarter thanks to lengthy, time consuming drive. Augustana got the ball back after Duffy's field goal and generated one first down and was forced to punt from the Titan 45 yard line. Punter Andy Klink (**McHenry East HS, McHenry, Ill.**) did his job, dropping the punt on the Wesleyan five yard line.

With 12:04 in the game the Titans were looking at situation that was eerily similar to 2007 when they drive 99 yards to take the lead late in the fourth quarter. This time, however, the Augustana defense made it simple. First, Eric Meyer (**Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.**) smothered Wesleyan running back Bo Lanter for no gain on first down and then Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) cut down Lanter after a five yard gain to set up a third and five from Titan 10. The Vikings forced an incompleteness and a short IWU punt on fourth down set Augustana up in good shape just 40 yards from the end zone.

Thanks to the field position gift from the defense, the Viking offense did not squander the opportunity. A penalty forced a critical third and eight situation and Podulka completed a 20 yard pass to Jason Kwasigroch (**Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.**) down to the 18. From there it took five plays and with 5:17 left to play in the game Galliard banged in from four yards out to make it 21-13.

Now it was up to the defense to preserve the victory. After Galliard's touchdown run to make it 21-13, Illinois Wesleyan took 11 more offensive snaps for the remainder of the game. Of those 11 plays, 10 resulted in two yards or less. The only significant yardage gained was on a fourth and eight situation when quarterback Kraig Ladd hit Martin Ceisel with a 15 yard pass to keep a last-ditch drive alive. That play put the ball on the Augustana 30 but four straight incompleteness and the ball was back in the hands of the Viking offense.

Illinois Wesleyan took a 7-0 lead when Ladd hit Tom Almanzo with a six yard scoring toss on the opening drive of the game. That capped a seven play, 65 yard drive. Augustana answered in a hurry with Podulka finding Kwasigroch from 21 yards out with 8:06 left in the first quarter. Prosia's kick made it 7-7 after the seven play, 60 yard drive.

Podulka was once again his efficient self, completing 15 of 23 passes for 155 yards with two touchdowns. Kwasigroch had five catches for 60 yards and Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) had five receptions for 25 yards. Matt Downing (**Morton HS, Morton, Ill.**) hauled in four for 47. Galliard led the rushing attack with 63 yards on 14 attempts while Podulka chipped in with 53 yards on nine carries.

The Vikings generated 328 yards of total offense (173 rushing and 155 passing) and in the crucial fourth quarter had a mammoth 10:22 to 4:38 advantage in time of possession. Illinois Wesleyan had 293 yards of total offense but 237 of that came through the air as a pair of Titan quarterbacks combined to complete 23 of 42 passes. The Augustana defense allowed just 56 yards rushing on 28 attempts.

Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) had eight tackles to lead the way while John Mago (**Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**), Meyer and Andrew Schweitzer (**Wheaton North HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) all had six.

The Vikings are now 4-2 overall and 2-1 in the CCIW while Illinois Wesleyan falls to 4-2 and 1-2. This was the seventh victory over the Titans in the last eight years.

AUGUSTANA 40, CARTHAGE 16 on October 25 in Kenosha, Wisconsin

KENOSHA, Wis. – A series-long dominance of Carthage continued on Saturday night in Kenosha, Wisconsin as Augustana scored a convincing 40-16 victory over the Red Men. Thanks to a balanced offense and a defense that completely shut down the run, the Vikings beat Carthage for the 33rd time in the last 35 years. It was the 11th victory in the last 12 seasons and it allowed Augustana to move to 5-2 overall and 3-1 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin.

The win also avenged a rare Carthage win in this series, which Augustana currently leads by a wide margin of 59-14. Last year the Vikings turned the ball over five times in a 33-28 loss. This time around Augustana played turnover free football and used a 36:31 to 23:29 advantage in time of possession to secure the win.

Senior cornerback Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) set the tone on the very first play from scrimmage when he intercepted Red Men quarterback Evan Jones at the Carthage 45 and returned the ball 19 yards to the 26. Four plays later Henry Deters (**Tolono-Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.**) bounced into the end zone from four yards out and Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Colo.**) nailed the extra point to make it 7-0. The game was just over three minutes old and Deters had accounted for every one of the 26 yards on the drive.

Tim Merchut kicked a 27 yard field goal on Carthage's next possession to trim the lead to 7-3 but three plays later the Vikings were on the board again. Quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) hit Jason Kwasigroch (**Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.**) with a 58 yard scoring toss to cap a three play, 66 yard drive. Prosia's extra point made it 14-3 with 6:56 left in the first quarter.

After Carthage drove to the Augustana 30, the Viking defense stiffened and held one running play for no yardage and forced Jones to misfire on three straight passes. Augustana took over on its own 30 and marched 70 yards on seven plays with Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) romping over from 20 yards out to make it 20-6 and the game was still in the first quarter. Prosia's extra point attempt was blocked.

With just 14 seconds left before halftime the Red Men cut the margin to 20-10 when Jones completed a four yard scoring toss to Jake Smith on fourth and one. That wrapped up a 61 yard, 13 play drive.

Augustana got the ball to start the third quarter and went 42 yards on 10 plays before settling for a 31 yard field goal from Prosia, his first of the season. That made the score 23-10. He would connect again in the third quarter, this time from 28 yards out with 2:13 remaining to bump the margin to 26-10. Carthage sliced the advantage to 26-16 when Jones hit Jeff Koenenman with a 49 yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the third.

Heading into the fourth quarter the Viking offense made a statement with a 60 yard drive that took nine plays and ate 4:12 off the clock. Podulka and Kwasigroch connected for their second touchdown of the night, this one from 12 yards out. Prosia's extra point made it 33-16 with 12:04 left in the contest.

Andrew Rosset (**Maine West HS, Des Plaines, Ill.**) blocked James McNeice's punt on the next Carthage possession and Augustana was in business at the Red Men's 35. It took two rushing attempts by Podulka, the last one going 29 yards, for the Vikings to reach the end zone. Prosia was again good on the extra point and Augustana led 40-16 with 10:39 left on the clock.

The Vikings, who have now won back-to-back road night games, rolled up 424 yards in total offense (234 rushing and 190 passing). Podulka was right in the middle of it, rushing for 72 yards on 12 attempts and a touchdown and passing for 190 yards on 13 of 18 with two touchdowns. Parke gained 59 yards on nine attempts and Kwasigroch compiled 106 yards of receiving on three catches.

Defensively, Augustana completely shut down any attempt by Carthage to run the football. The Vikings allowed just 65 rushing yards on 19 attempts and three Red Men quarterbacks (Jones, DeBoeuf and Trevor Beazley) put the ball in the air 59 times. They completed 33 of those for 337 yards but Augustana had key interceptions from Lynch and Wyatt Brieser (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**). Carthage wide receiver Jeff Koenenman had a big game, catching 14 passes for 169 yards and one touchdown.

John Mago (**Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) led the Viking defense with 10 tackles while Brieser chipped in with eight.

Augustana scored on its first three possessions of the game and three of its first four in the second half.

AUGUSTANA 52, NORTH PARK 0 on November 1 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill. – Scoring on each of six possessions in the first half helped propel Augustana to an easy 52-0 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin victory over North Park on Saturday, November 1 at Ericson Field. The Vikings built a 42-0 halftime lead and were never headed as they moved to 6-2 overall and 4-2 in the CCIW. Augustana was clicking early and finished the game with 513 yards of total offense, 288 rushing and 225 passing.

Senior quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) was extremely efficient as he completed seven of seven for 171 yards and three touchdowns, two to Jason Kwasigroch (**Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.**). The Vikings used a total of 12 different ball carries to gain 288 yards on 45 attempts.

The tone for this one was set early when Augustana took the opening kickoff and marched 60 yards on six plays with Henry Deters (**Tolono-Unity HS, Tolono, Ill.**) dashing over from four yards out. Phil Prosia (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Colo.**) nailed the extra point to make it 7-0 with less than four minutes (11:41) gone in the game. On North Park's first possession Aaron Setchell (**Amboy HS, Amboy, Ill.**) picked off a pass by quarterback Shelby Wood at the Augustana 42. Podulka went deep on the first play and found Kwasigroch wide open and the result was a 58 yard scoring toss. Prosia made the second of his six extra points and the score went to 14-0 with 7:41 left in the first quarter.

Podulka and Kwasigroch connected again for the Vikings third score, this one for 31 yards to make it 21-0 and it was still in the first quarter. Podulka scored on a 13 yard run with just :34 left in the first quarter to bump the advantage to 28-0. In the second quarter the Augustana onslaught continued. Podulka connected with Jake Park (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) on a 22 yard touchdown pass with 11:33 left before halftime and that made it 35-0.

North Park then drove to the Viking 19 before Wood misfired on four straight passes to turn the ball back over to Augustana. With backup quarterback Stephen McGough (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) now at the controls, the Vikings went 81 yards on nine plays with Parke dashing over from seven yards out to make it 42-0. Linebacker Eric Meyer (**Harlem HS, Machesney Park, Ill.**) intercepted Wood's pass on the final play of the first half and the score at intermission was 42-0.

The third quarter was scoreless and Augustana scored early in the fourth on a 24 yard pass play from McGough to Jason Wagner (**Burlington HS, Elgin, Ill.**) but this time Kory Blair (**Waubonsie Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) kicked the extra point to make it 49-0. Blair booted a 22 yard field goal midway through the fourth (7:39) to account for the final score.

Kwasigroch grabbed three passes for 97 yards and two touchdowns while Parke had three catches for 52 yards and added 33 yards rushing on three attempts. Robert Wood (**Rockford Boylan HS, Rockford, Ill.**) led the team in rushing with 61 yards on eight attempts and Podulka added 50 on four tries. Senior Mike Kilroy (**Lisle Township HS, Lisle, Ill.**) picked up 39 yards on five carries and senior Josh Galliard (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) added 39 yards on six attempts. As a team the Vikings averaged 6.4 yards per attempt.

McGough was three of five passing for 38 yards and a touchdown and David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) was three of three for 16 yards. Collectively the Vikings completed 13 of 15 passes for 225 yards and four touchdowns.

The Augustana defense pitched its second shutout of the campaign and limited North Park to just 31 yards rushing on 20 attempts. North Park did pick up 199 yards passing but had to attempt 49 passes, completing 24, to get that number. Augustana defenders intercepted Wood four times. Setchell, Meyer, John Mago (**Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) and Jeremy Smith (**Sherrard HS, Sherrard, Ill.**) got the interceptions. Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) and Meyer led Augustana in tackles with six apiece.

With the victory, Augustana extended its streak of non-losing seasons to 30 consecutive years. The last time the Vikings had a losing season was in 1978. It was also the third straight victory of the 2008 season for head coach Jim Barnes' team.

NORTH CENTRAL 41, AUGUSTANA 28 on November 8 in Naperville, Illinois

NAPERVILLE, Ill. – Augustana gave second ranked North Central quite a battle on Saturday, November 8 in Naperville, Illinois but the Vikings came up short 41-28. North Central, which is now 9-0 on the year clinched the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin championship with the victory and Augustana fell to 6-3 overall and 4-2 in league play.

Jake Parke (**St. Joseph-Ogden HS, St. Joseph, Ill.**) put Augustana on the board first with an eight yard run midway through the first quarter (6:50). The touchdown, Parke's 10th of the season, capped a 10 play, 76 yard drive and Phil Prosia's (**Mountain Vista HS, Littleton, Col.**) extra point made it 7-0. North Central came right back to tie things up, however, with a 60 yard, 12 play drive that ended when Dominic Sulo scored from six yards out with 2:46 left in the first quarter.

The Cardinals' defense stopped Augustana on a fourth and one situation from the Vikings 33 on the ensuing possession. Working with the short field North Central got to the four before a fumble stopped the drive. An interception put the Cardinals back in business at the 35 and quarterback Aaron Fanthorpe scored on a one yard drive and with 8:42 left in the second quarter it was 14-7.

Both teams missed field goals on their next possessions and at halftime North Central led 14-7. The Vikings got within a point on their first drive of the third quarter when Josh Galliard (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) scored from one yard out to cap a 78 yard, nine play drive. The extra point was no good and with 11:16 left in the third quarter the Cardinals led 14-13.

North Central then scored three touchdowns in a span of 6:17 to build a 35-13 lead. The Vikings were far from done, however, as they opened the fourth quarter (14:02) with a 42 yard scoring toss from quarterback Tim Podulka (**Elk Grove HS, Elk Grove Village, Ill.**) to Jason Kwasigroch (**Carmel HS, Wauconda, Ill.**) to make it 35-19. Podulka ran for the two point conversion and that made it 35-21.

An Augustana defensive stop gave the Vikings the ball back and Podulka ended a 75 yard, eight play drive with a three yard run to trim the advantage to 35-28 with 7:38 left in the game. North Central answered with a five play, 67 yard drive with Hank Johnson scoring on a five yard pass from Fanthorpe with 5:20 left in the contest.

The Vikings rolled up 428 yards of total offense, with 304 of those coming on the ground and 124 through the air. Podulka gained 85 yards on 20 rushing attempts and Robert Wood (**Rockford Boylan HS, Rockford, Ill.**) had 85 yards on just five carries. Podulka completed 15 of 27 passes for 124 yards with one touchdown but he was intercepted twice. Parke caught six passes for 29 yards and Kwasigroch had three receptions for 52 yards.

North Central gained 403 yards of total offense (203 rushing and 200 passing). Dominic Sulo gained 115 yards on 24 attempts and Fanthorpe added 83 on 17 tries. Fanthorpe connected on 18 of 24 passes for 200 yards with three scores. Steve Hlavac caught 10 passes for 98 yards.

John Mago (**Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) and Billy Lynch (**Loyola Academy, Chicago, Ill.**) led Augustana in tackles with 10 each and Wyatt Brieser (**Geneseo HS, Atkinson, Ill.**) had eight.

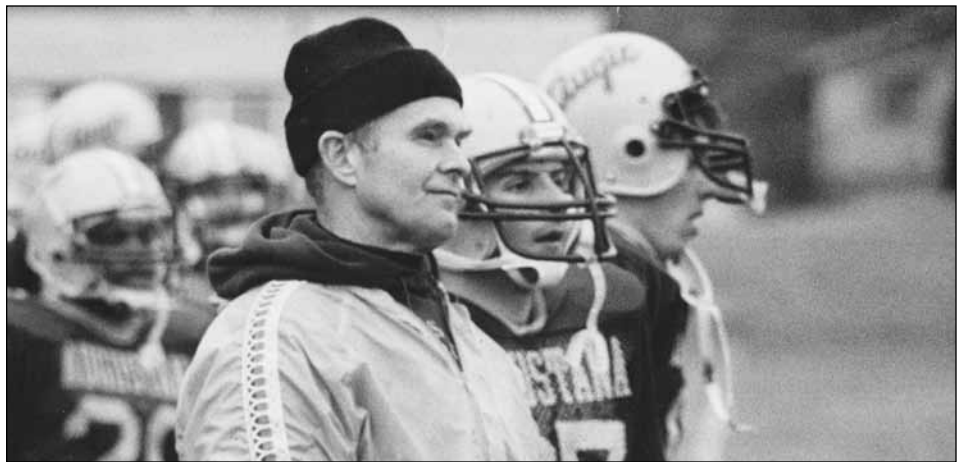
When Bob Reade assumed the reins of the Augustana College football program in the spring of 1979 few people in the administration of the Lutheran school near the banks of the Mississippi River in Rock Island, Illinois could have predicted the success which was going to become synonymous with the Vikings on the gridiron. A look at his past history, however, would have given a pretty good indication that the father of 11 children - he had nine when he took the job - knew how to build a powerful program.

He left behind a powerhouse at J.D. Darnall High School in Geneseo, Illinois where he compiled a record of 146-21-4 in 17 years with the Maple Leafs. His teams had just won three straight Illinois Class 3A championships from 1976-78 and from 1965-71 the Leafs rolled up what was then a state record 52 game unbeaten streak.

In 16 years at Augustana, the success never stopped as Reade compiled a record of 146-21-1 overall and 112-12-1 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. His teams were in the NCAA Division III playoffs 11 times, including a national record 10 straight appearances from 1981-90. The Vikings won four straight NCAA Division III national titles from 1983-86. His legendary senior class of 1987 that was anchored by College Football Hall of Famer Lynn Thomsen on defense and spearheaded by Brad Price on offense, went through its entire career without a loss. That bunch compiled a record of 49-0-1 and had a hand in all four national championships. Augustana won 12 CCIW titles during Reade's time on the sidelines, including eight straight from 1981-88.

In January of 1998 he was awarded the prestigious Amos Alonzo Stagg Award by the American Football Coaches Association and in August of that same year was enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Indiana.

He won four straight national "Kodak Coach of the Year" awards as picked by the AFCA and was chosen CCIW "Coach of the Year" nine times. Starting with the first game of the 1983 season and ending with the second round of the 1987 playoffs, Augustana put together a streak of 60 games in a row without a loss (there was a 0-0 tie with Elmhurst to open the 1986 season) which still is an NCAA Division III record.



Bob Reade's coaching career at Augustana College spanned 16 years from 1979-94 and he won 146 games while losing just 23 and tying one...His winning percentage of .867 is the second highest in college football history, trailing only Knute Rockne's mark of .881 (105-12-5 from 1918-30 at Notre Dame)...He won four straight "National Coach of the Year" awards.

It is also the second longest in NCAA history, regardless of division. His teams won 37 games in a row from the start of 1983 until that tie with Elmhurst and that winning streak was an NCAA Division III record until Mount Union broke it in 1999. It still is the sixth longest in NCAA history, again regardless of division.

His success with the Vikings football program put the Augustana name in front of the national media in an unheard of fashion for a Division III institution. The Vikings appeared on network television seven straight years from 1981-87 and nearly every major newspaper in the country from the Dallas Morning News to the New York Times ran features on the team's exploits. At the 1986 homecoming game the small and cramped press box at Ericson Field had reporters from USA Today, the Dallas Morning News and New York Newsday covering the Vikings and their remarkable run of success. The Wall Street Journal and Rolling Stone Magazine both ran features on the Vikings and Reade also managed to find time to write a book "Coaching Football Successfully" that was completed in the fall of 1983.

His formula for success was simple, but effective. Run the football and play good, hard-nosed

defense. A reporter for the Detroit News once wrote this about the Vikings following a 34-10 blowout of Hope in the 1986 playoffs. "Run down to the railroad tracks and wait for the 7:15 train heading into the city and then step in front of it. You would have about as good a chance as the Dutchmen did yesterday as the steamrolling express that is known as the Augustana Vikings football team ran roughshod over Hope here in Holland."

During his career the Blue & Gold - wearing the trademark jerseys with the long vertical stripes down the sleeves - would routinely average 300 yards per game rushing and give up less than 10 points per contest. His Vikings compiled a 76-7 record at home during his career, with three of those losses coming in the first season back in 1979. 11 times during his tenure Reade's team went undefeated at home. He retired in 1995 with a CCIW home field-winning streak of 18 straight dating back to a 33-8 loss to Millikin on November 4, 1989.

A total of 37 Vikings earned NCAA Division III All-American honors since Reade took over prior to the 1979 season, compared to just 11 in the school's previous years of football that began in 1893. He coached 10 Academic All-Americans and 106 players earned CCIW first team honors in his 16 years. 13 times a Viking was named the league's MVP.

He became the first coach in college football history to win 100 games in his first 10 years as a head coach when the Vikings beat Adrian 25-7 in the first round of the 1988 NCAA playoffs. During the decade of the 1980's, Augustana put together a remarkable record of 103-10-1 for a winning percentage of .908 which is the best single decade mark ever recorded in college football. His teams were always known for playing better as the season progressed, as evidenced by his record of 44-6 during the month of November.

THE VIKINGS RECORD IN THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF ERICSON FIELD

Located in the far northeast corner of the Augustana College campus, Ericson Field is the football and track home of the Vikings. The stadium is named after Senator Charles J.A. Ericson who died in Boone, Iowa in 1910.

Charles Ericson was born in the Province of Calmer, Sweden, and moved to America (and Moline) when he was 12. Although he went to school in Moline, Charles hunted and fished in the area where the stadium that bears his name now stands. After moving from the Quad Cities when he was 19, he moved to Mineral Ridge, Iowa where he opened a general store and eventually helped organize the First National Bank of Boone in 1872.

He became interested in politics and in 1895 was elected as a state senator in Iowa. When he died in 1910, Ericson left Augustana College with 260 acres of farmland in Iowa that was also rich in coal. Then he added \$13,000.00 to help the school buy land for an athletic field.

He placed three conditions on his gift. The land was priced at \$26,000.00 and Mr. Ericson stipulated that Augustana College should raise the other \$13,000.00; that the tract of land at Fifth Avenue and 38th Street be purchased since he played there as a boy and that the field be named Ericson Athletic Field.

The school still uses the site as the home of its athletic teams. The stadium has seating for 3,500 spectators and there are locker room facilities under the south grandstand. During the summer of 1992, a new bright blue nine-lane track was installed from money raised mostly by donations from the Augustana College track alumni.

In the summer of 2002 a new synthetic turf was installed on the playing field and lights were added. The Ericson Stadium lockerrooms underwent an extensive renovation in the summer of 2003.

Obviously, the football Vikings enjoy playing at home as a 253-85-6 overall record down through the years indicates. That mark does include nine NCAA playoff games that were played at Rock Island Public Schools Stadium during the 1980's.

However, a key element is the bridging of the academic and athletic experience through personal development and academic support programs offered by a highly dedicated coaching staff. Ultimately, graduates of Augustana and Augie football are exceptionally well prepared for life after college and enjoy an advantage in the competitive marketplace of job placement as well as graduate and professional school admission.

Academically, in the competitive arena of nationally rated and selective liberal arts colleges, Augustana has earned an outstanding reputation. Ranked a Liberal Arts I Institution by the Carnegie Foundation, Augustana is among the top 70 undergraduate colleges and universities in the entire United States, and among the top 50 liberal arts colleges in the sciences. In addition to its fine reputation and high standards, the cost of Augustana remains a good value and is listed as one of Barron's Best Buys in Education (1998).

Athletically, Augie football ranks as one of the winningest football programs in all of college football over the last two decades. The Vikings have made 15 trips to the NCAA Division III national playoffs, including five straight appearances in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl from 1982-86. Augustana owns four NCAA Division III national championships. The Blue & Gold have captured 21 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin titles, including six during the 1990's and one in each 2001 and 2005. The Vikings have been the winningest team in the league for each of the last two decades. In addition, Augustana has had 28 consecutive winning seasons, which is the ninth highest active streak in college football - all divisions.

Through the years a total of 80 Vikings have earned All-American status and 22 times the CCIW's MVP wore an Augustana uniform. Also, 24 players have been named to the prestigious Academic All-American team. In terms of producing overall Academic All-Americans, the Augustana athletic department ranks sixth heading into the 2008-09 school year with 130 in all sports. Ahead of the Vikings on the list are such institutions as Notre Dame and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

In addition, the unique educational support programs for Augie football players are comprehensive and specifically designed to meet the academic rigors of the challenging academic environment that is Augustana College. Football participants benefit from the seminar and monitoring system that is Augustana Football's Academic Game Plan (AGP). The seminar series teaches young men time-management, organizational and college-level study skills that will help them to achieve success in college and will aid them throughout their professional careers.

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 64th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 172 total. Of those 172, the men have won 135 and 37 belong to the women.

Football was the first sport contested in the CCIW when the league was formed in 1946. Augustana has won more games

(297) and championships (21) than any team in the CCIW during the first 62 years of existence. Not only have the Vikings won 21 league titles, but they have also finished second 11 times. Since 1981 the Blue & Gold own at least a share of 17 of the last 27 championships.
