Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 173 total team championships (135 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports, with 131 as of December, 2009. During the 1990s the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

## Vikings excited for 2010 spring season

ROCK ISLAND, Ill. – The Augustana men's golf team has already been busy this fall, competing in four events in preparation for the spring schedule. Coach Grey Giovanine is excited about this year's group and the progress he has seen so far from his squad. "The quys are working hard and already showing improvement," he said.


The best performance for the squad this fall came early on as the Blue & Gold reclaimed the Vike-Fire-Scot Cup after finishing second last season. Augustana edged out Monmouth for the team title and also saw junior Kyle Weigand (**Leyden HS, Franklin Park, Ill.**) win medalist honors with a round of 73. Weigand is one of the top returning golfers this season and "will be counted on to continue to provide leadership with his play this season," said Giovanine. Weigand finished last year with a 79.3 scoring average and finished in the top two during the qualifying rounds with the team earlier this fall. His average remained steady in the fall, finishing five rounds on the course at 79.4.

Junior Ted Keopple (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, III.**) is "a steady veteran," said Giovanine and shot a 76 at both of the first two events this season. He had an 82.2 scoring average last season and lowered that to 80.0 in four five rounds this fall. Junior Phil Litchfield (**Benet Academy, Darien, III.**) led the team at the Creek Creek Invite and "will be a key player this year," said Giovanine. Litchfield finished with an 80.0 scoring average a year ago and sits at 79.0 this season after four rounds on the course. Sophomore Jordan Henry (**Erie HS, Erie, III.**) also returns after leading the Vikings with a 77.8 scoring average last season. Henry was limited to two rounds this fall, but shot an average of 81.5 per round.

Giovanine is also looking forward to watching this year's freshman class contribute to the success of the program. "They appear to be a promising group of newcomers," he said. Drew Wiersema (**Prophetstown HS, Prophetstown, Ill.**) was the medalist for Augustana at the Duane Chaney Invitational to open the fall schedule and currently has a 77.5 scoring average in two rounds of action. Jeff Paustian (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) and Jon Grchan (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) will also compete for a top five spot on the team. Paustian has an 82.0 scoring average in five rounds on the course while Grchan is at 79.0 in two rounds of play.

The fall season concluded with the Red Poling Collegiate Classic in Dearborn, Michigan. "The event is played at a first class TPC facility and is the highlight of the fall schedule," said Giovanine. Keopple led the Vikings with a seventh place finish and the Vikings placed sixth as a team.

The men's golf team will resume competition in the spring with the team gearing up for a strong finish at the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin championship meet at the end of the year. The first two rounds of action will take place on April 16-17 with the tournament wrapping up on April 30 and May 1.

#### **HEAD COACH GREY GIOVANINE**

Grey Giovanine will be starting his 11th season as the head coach of the Augustana College men's golf team. In 2000 Giovanine stepped into the shoes of longtime Viking mentor Dr. Stan Kittleson, who resigned after 15 years as the head coach of the Blue & Gold.

The Vikings finished seventh in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in 2009 after a seventh place finish in 2008 and a sixth in 2007. Prior to that, Giovanine's teams had recorded seven consecutive top four finishes in the CCIW. His teams finished second each of his first three years, fourth in 2003, and second again in 2004. In addition, Eric Johnson was the 2007 CCIW individual champion.

His 2002 team will go down as one of the top squads in school history. The Vikings not only finished second in the CCIW for the third consecutive year but they won the Big Blue Classic with a new school record for one day (285) and two day (583 – 285+298) totals. They also placed second in the Central of Iowa Dutch Classic, Knox Invitational, Augustana Invitational and Illinois Intercollegiate Championships. Augustana was also fourth in the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational and seventh in the Gustie Spring Invitational and one individual, Scott Peterson, was chosen to represent the school in the NCAA Division III national tournament. In his first eight years, Giovanine has watched as his team has compiled an overall won/loss record of 549-246 (.691) in invitationals.

Giovanine doubles as the highly successful coach of the Augustana men's basketball team where his Vikings have had nine straight winning seasons. He has led the Blue & Gold to at least 16 victories in each of the past nine years, including a 23-6 record in the 2005-06 campaign when Augustana won the CCIW title and advanced to the "Sweet Sixteen" of the NCAA Division III national tournament. His 2006-07 team also won the CCIW and the CCIW tournament and again advanced to the NCAA Division III tournament. The 2007-08 squad was 23-6 and won the league title for the third straight time and participated in the

national tournament again. In 2008-08 the Vikings were 18-8 overall and 9-5 in the CCIW, good for second place. He came to Augustana following a six year stint as the head men's basketball coach at Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas, an NCAA Division I institution. He put together an 80-85 record at Lamar, but his first three seasons were spent rebuilding a decimated program. In his first three years Giovanine was 33-48 and in his last three the Cardinals were 47-37.

He led Lamar to three straight winning seasons for the first time in over a decade, including a 17-11 overall record in his last year of 1998-99. It was the Cardinals best record since a 20-11 season in 1987-88.

That pattern of success followed him to Augustana. In 1999-2000, his first season as head basketball coach, Giovanine led the Vikings to a 10-15 record. The next season the Vikings improved dramatically as they went 17-8 overall. During that year, Giovanine led his team to three victories over teams that eventually played in the NCAA Division III national tournament (Benedictine, Illinois Wesleyan & Carthage), to a win over the number one ranked team in the country (Carthage) and to the school's first ever win over a division one institution (Western Illinois). The 2001-02 campaign was also a successful one as the Blue & Gold again went 17-8 overall. A 9-5 CCTW record nabbed the Vikings a tie for second place in the CCTW, which was Augustana's highest finish since 1993-94, when they finished second. In 2002-03 Giovanine led the Vikings to a 20-5 overall record and an 11-3 mark in the CCTW, which gave the school its first league championship since 1992-93. The Vikings put together a 16-9 overall record and a 10-4 conference mark in the 2003-04 campaign and in 2004-05 they were 17-8 overall and 9-5 in the conference. The 2005-06 unit was 23-6 overall and 11-3 in winning the league. In 2006-07, his Vikings again won the CCTW championship at 11-3 and compiled an overall record of 22-6, which included winning the CCTW tournament and advancing to the NCAA Division III tournament. The 2007-08 team won the CCTW for the third straight year and also participated in the NCAA tournament, finishing with a 23-6 record.

In his first 10 seasons at the helm of the basketball team, Giovanine has led the Vikings to a 183-79 (.698) overall record and a mark of 94-46 (.671) in the CCIW.

Giovanine made a name for himself in his early days as a top-notch recruiter. Prior to going to Lamar, he was an assistant coach at Wichita State University for a year from April of 1992 until June of 1993. He was the recruiting coordinator and his first recruiting class was rated as the best in the Missouri Valley Conference and in the top 25 nationally. For the five years prior to that (1987-92) he was the assistant coach at Rice where the Owls put together the school's first 20-win season in 40 years. At both Wichita State and Rice he worked under Scott Thompson. Thompson has Quad City ties, as his father Herb was a highly successful head coach at Moline High School.

Giovanine was an assistant coach at Oral Roberts from 1985-87 and was also an assistant at Valparaiso from 1982-85. He served as a graduate assistant coach at Central Missouri in Warrensburg, Missouri during the 1981-82 season.

He has a degree in psychology from Central Missouri State where he graduated in 1982. Prior to that he received an associate's degree from Highland Community College in Freeport, Illinois.

# Kyle Weigand named "Most Outstanding Player" for men's golf squad; Jordan Henry honored as "Newcomer of the Year" and Phil Litchfield selected as "Most Improved"

ROCK ISLAND, III. – Kyle Weigand (Leyden HS, Franklin Park, III.) was honored as the "Most Outstanding Player" for the men's golf team this season. Jordan Henry (Erie HS, Erie, III.) earned the "Newcomer of the Year" award, and Phil Litchfield (Benet Academy, Darien, III.) was selected as "Most Improved."

The men's golf team finished its season with a seventh place finish at the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin championship meet. The Blue & Gold shot 1,280 for the four rounds of play, finishing ahead of North Park (1,328). Weigand led the squad with a 17th place individual showing. He finished with a total score of 309 (72 + 79 + 78 +80). Augustana's best team finish of the spring came at the Augustana Invitational on April 10-11 where the

Vikings grabbed fifth place in the 16 team field.

Weigand had the second lowest scoring average on the team, shooting 79.3 per round. He competed in 11 rounds at six events and had a pair of topfive finishes. He tied for third in the 33 player field at the season opening Augie Triangular and later placed fourth out of 86 players at the Augustana Invitational. He shot a low round of 72 at the first day of the Augustana Invitational and also in round one of the CCIW championship meet.

Henry compiled the top average on the team, firing a 77.8 per round. He participated in nine rounds of action in five events and had two top-10 performances. Henry was the runner-up at the Augustana Triangular and also took eighth out of 24 golf-

ers at the Red Poling Collegiate Classic. His low round of 73 came at the Augie Triangular.

Litchfield was third on the team with an 80.0 scoring average. He played in four events and had nine rounds on the course, compiling a top-10 showing at the Augustana Invitational. Litchfield was 10th out of 86 golfers and fired his lowest score of the season, shooting a 71 in the second round of action.

# The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 64th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling. Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2010-11 season. Women's lacrosse is not currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 173 total. Of those 173, the men have won 135 and 38 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in men's golf since the league's inception in 1946-47. Since that time the Vikings have won the conference title a total of 16 times.
