Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 172 total team championships (135 men and 37 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 125 as of June, 2009. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 12:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

Deeper and stronger group gives Vikings reason for optimism heading into 2009-10

Eric Juergens is excited heading into the 2009-10 wrestling season. The third year Augustana head coach is anxious to get started with a team that he figures to be much deeper and stronger than either of his previous two Viking units.

"We can see in the preseason that we are making progress," said Juergens who was 2-9 in his first year and 4-11 last year at the Augustana helm. "I think this group is physically better and I see a determination in them that is good to see."

The Vikings placed fourth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin during Juergens' first year as the head coach in 2007-08 and third in 2008-09.

"I can't say enough about how important it is to have kids who have both the physical ability and the desire to get better," said Juergens who was a two time NCAA Division I national champion at the University of Iowa. "We are going to have great competition in the wrestling room and that will only help us improve. We are going to be relying on some younger kids so it might take us a while to grow up."

A total of 10 letterwinners dot the Augustana roster and that group will mix with an outstanding freshman class that has Juergens optimistic about the growth of the program. "We have been getting better each year and I think that we have the best group, collectively, since I have been here. This could be an exciting season for us."

WEIGHT CLASS BREAKDOWN

125 – Senior George Gogonas (**Bowie HS, Austin, Texas**) will hold things down at 125 pounds. He was 13-10 a year ago and led the team in victories as a sophomore in 2007-08 when he went 28-13. He has compiled 59 career victories entering his senior year and twice he has been third in the CCIW at 125.

133 – Freshman Steve Poffenberger (**Allegan HS, Paw Paw, Michigan**) has been impressive in the early workouts and along with Gogonas he will give the Vikings a solid punch in the lower weight classes.

141 – There are plenty of bodies to choose from here as sophomores Alberto Quiros (**Morton HS, Cicero, Ill.**) and Andrew Krcatovich (**Allegan HS, Allegan, Mich.**) along with junior Alec Rizzo (**Fremd HS, Palatine, Ill.**) will all be contesting for mat time. Quiros was 9-17 as a freshman while Krcatovich posted a 4-10 mark. Rizzo was 1-4 in limited action. Another possibility at this weight class is senior Andrew Randone (**Davenport Assumption HS, Davenport, Iowa**), who was 8-4 last year but must first be awarded a medical hardship from the NCAA from earlier in his career. Randone was the runner-up in the CCIW at 133 pounds in 2009.

149 – Three freshmen will battle for the starting spot at 149. Tyler Dempsey (**Grant HS, Ingleside, Ill.**), James Passarelli (**Carl Sandburg HS, Orland Park, Ill.**) and Tyler Hernandez (**Bloomington HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) are all in the mix.

157 – Senior Zac Holland (**West Des Moines Dowling HS, Pleasant Hill, Iowa**) has been a four year regular at a variety of weight classes. He was 19-20 as a junior and placed third in the CCIW at 149 pounds last year. Behind Holland will be freshman Ian Kneppshield (**Shady Side Academy, Ford City, Pa.**).

165 – Kneppshield could bump up to 165 where he will join freshman Matt Burns (**Naperville Central HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and sophomore Matt McIntyre (**West Carroll HS, Savanna, Ill.**).

174 – A pair of freshmen, Alejandro Vavra (**Gull Lake HS, Dowling, Mich.**) and Konner Pemberton (**Fremont HS, Fremont, Neb.**) will tangle at 174 pounds.

184 – Junior Matt Nykaza (**Brother Rice HS, Oak Lawn, Ill.**) and freshman Hunter Feraco (**Gull Lake HS, Battle Creek, Mich.**) will handle the 184 pound weight class. Nykaza was 7-17 last year but placed second in the CCIW at 197 pounds. He saw action at 174, 184 and 197 as a sophomore.

197 – Senior Pat Kilroy (**Lisle HS, Lisle, Ill.**) and freshman Matt Regnier (**Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.**) will share time at 197.

285 – Freshman George Papandreou (**Waukegan HS, Waukegan, Ill.**) will join the team after football season ends and he will be at 285 pounds.

ERIC JUERGENS – Head Wrestling Coach

After serving as Augustana's interim head coach for the 2007-08 season, Eric Juergens, a two time NCAA Division I national champion, was hired as the school's full time wrestling coach on April 4, 2008. He heads into his third season at the helm of the Vikings in 2009-10. Augustana went 2-9 in dual meets and finished fourth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin during his interim season of 2007-08. In his second year (2008-09), the Vikings went 4-11 in dual meets and moved up to third in the CCIW. Augustana is confident with his knowledge, energy and name recognition, Juergens will quickly have the program turned around.

He replaced Pat Marsh, who resigned his position at the end of September, 2007, to become the city administrator in Monona, Wisconsin. Marsh was the head coach for seven seasons, compiling a record of 66-45-1 and leading the Vikings to four College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin team championships.

In September of 2008 the head wrestling coaching position at Augustana was fully endowed thanks to a generous gift from Terry and Sandy Shockley. Juergens becomes the first "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" in school history. Augustana is the first school in the CCIW and one of a select few in NCAA Division III to have an endowed coaching position in its athletic department.

"I want to thank the administration for giving me the chance as a head coach," said Juergens when the interim tag was removed from his title in the spring of 2008. "My intentions and goals will be very simple. I have been coached by some of the greatest names in the sport of wrestling, guys like Dan Gable, Jim Zalesky, Tom and Terry Brands and Lincoln McIlravy just to name a few. I want to take the very methods and techniques that I have learned over the course of my own career and implement them at Augustana."

Juergens had a prolific career as a competitor. Wrestling at the University of Iowa, he won individual national titles both as a junior (1999-00) and as a senior (2000-01). He was third in the NCAA tournament in his freshman (1997-98) and sophomore (1998-99) seasons. As a senior he served as team captain and was the Hawkeye's Most Valuable Performer. He was the Big Ten Wrestler of the Year and selected as the University of Iowa's "Male Athlete of the Year".

During his junior campaign he had an undefeated 33-0 record en route to his first national title. Along the way he won the Big Ten title and was the champion at the Midlands Tournament. He was given the Art Kraft "Champion of Champions" award at the Midlands.

He finished third in the Big Ten both his freshman and sophomore seasons prior to placing third in the national meet each year. He was named the NCAA "Freshman of the Year" at the completion of the 1997-98 season.

His high school career at Maquoketa High School in Maquoketa, Iowa was one of unparalleled success. He was 144-0 during his four year, compiling 100 pins and winning four straight state titles. He was the Northern Plains Regional champion and was first team Amateur Wrestling News All-American. He was a second team Asics Tiger All-American as well. He placed second at Cadet Nationals as a sophomore and was an honor roll student.

Juergens graduated from the University of Iowa in 2001 with a B.A. degree in English. He served as a volunteer assistant coach at Augustana in 2006-07 and before that he spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant at Loras.

He is the owner of Young Guns Wrestling Club and served as the camp director for the University of Iowa Wrestling Camps from 1998 until 2002.

He takes over an Augustana program that has won a total of 36 CCIW titles, more than any other school in the conference.

Vikings grab third in CCIW wrestling tournament; Kyle Brodwater (125), Andrew Randone (133) and Matt Nykaza (197) all earn second place finishes

WHEATON, Illinois – Fueled by three individual runner-up finishes, the Augustana Vikings placed third in the 2009 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin wrestling tournament on Saturday, February 14 at Wheaton College. North Central won the team title with 98.5 points while Elmhurst was second with 85. Augustana was third with 48.5 and Wheaton placed fourth with 33.5.

The Vikings continue to show improvement as they were fourth in 2008 with 34.5 points and fifth in 2007 with 33.5 points. Second year head coach Eric Juergens' team was led by the second place finishes of junior Kyle Brodwater (**St. Joseph Hamm HS, Medford, New Jersey**), senior Andrew Randone (**Davenport Assumption HS, Davenport, Iowa**) and sophomore Matt Nykaza (**Brother Rice HS, Oak Lawn, Ill.**). In addition, Augustana also had four third place finishes in the tournament.

Brodwater, who leads the team with a 20-10 overall record, was pinned in the championship match at 125 pounds by Jake Oster of Elmhurst at 4:59. Brodwater, the third seed in the tournament, knocked off second seeded Joe Norton of North Central 6-4 in the semi finals.

Randone, the second seed at 133 pounds, beat Sean Tomas of North Central 3-1 in the semi finals before being pinned by Jake Denhof of Elmhurst in the finals at 6:22. Randone is now 8-4 on the season.

8 - AUGUSTANA VIKINGS

Nykaza, who has improved as the season has progressed, scored a 6-2 upset of second seeded Bernie Vazquez of Elmhurst in the semi finals at 197 pounds. He lost in the championship match to Vinnie Sapienza of North Central by a count of 16-5. Nykaza is now 6-15 on the year.

Freshman Alberto Quiros (**Morton HS, Cicero, Ill.**) at 141, sophomore Zac Holland (**West Des Moines Dowling HS, Pleasant Hill, Iowa**) at 149, freshman Matt McIntyre (**West Carroll HS, Savanna, Ill.**) at 157 and senior Brian Kerr (**United Township HS, East Moline, Ill.**) at 197 all recorded third place finishes.

Quiros lost a tough 2-0 decision to top seeded Jamie Devine of North Central in the semi final before bouncing back to pin Jeff Coners of Wheaton at 3:42 for third place. Holland fell to second seeded Charlie Curran of Elmhurst 12-2 in the semi finals but destroyed Matt Cordell of Wheaton 12-2 in the third place match. McIntyre lost to second seeded Nick Parrish of Elmhurst 21-7 in the semi finals. Kerr dropped his semi final match to second seeded Gabe Yoel of North Central 4-1 but came back to beat Garrett Washington of Elmhurst 4-1 in the third place match.

Sophomores Kris Kovach (**Oswego HS, Oswego, Ill.**) at 165 and Gabe Gardner (**Air Academy, Colorado Springs, Colo.**) at 174 finished fourth for the Vikings.

Vikings show improvement in second year under Eric Juergens; Kyle Brodwater, Andrew Randone and Matt Nykaza all place second in CCIW

In his second year at the helm of the Augustana wrestling program, Eric Juergens guided his charges to a third place finish in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. For a program that has won a total of 36 conference titles, the third place finish might not seem like much. A closer examination of the numbers, however, tells a different story.

The Vikings' last league crown came in 2004 and they were fifth in 2007 and fourth in 2008. In 2007 they scored 33.5 points and in 2008 they tallied 34.5. This year they totaled 48.5 points to place third behind North Central (98.5) and Elmhurst (85). Wheaton was fourth with 33.5 points.

Three Augustana wrestlers recorded second place finishes in the CCIW tournament, which was held on Saturday, February 14 at Wheaton College. Junior Kyle Brodwater (**St. Joseph Hamm HS, Medford, New Jersey**) at 125, senior Andrew Randone (**Davenport Assumption HS, Davenport, Iowa**) at 133 and sophomore Matt Nykaza (**Brother Rice HS, Oak Lawn, Ill.**) at 197 all made it to the championship matches in their respective weight classes.

In addition to the three runners-up, four Vikings placed third in the conference tournament. Freshman Alberto Quiros (Morton HS, Cicero, Ill.) at 141, junior Zac Holland (**West Des Moines Dowling HS, Pleasant Hill, Iowa**) at 149, freshman Matt McIntyre (**West Carroll HS, Savanna, Ill.**) at 157 and senior Brian Kerr (**United Township HS, East Moline, Ill.**) at 197 all recorded third place finishes.

The Vikings were 4-11 in dual meets, winning three of their final five matches of the season after beginning the campaign with a 1-9 mark.

Kerr led the team in victories with a record of 21-15 while Brodwater also eclipsed the 20 win mark with a 20-12 record. Holland was 19-20 and George Gogonas (**Bowie HS, Austin, Texas**) finished up 13-10.

Augustana announces the "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" endowment

The tradition-rich Augustana wrestling program received quite a boost from one of its most successful alums recently and the result is the school's first endowed head coaching position. The "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" has been made possible thanks to a generous \$500,000.00 endowment gift from Terry and Sandy (Tweddell) Shockley. The Shockleys are alumni of Augustana, Terry, class of 1962 and Sandy, class of 1965.

"Augustana is deeply grateful to Terry and Sandy for their steadfast support of our wrestling program," said Augustana president Steve Bahls. "Generations of Augustana wrestlers will benefit from their decision to endow a first-class wrestling program."

The Shockley's have been long-time supporters of Augustana in general and the wrestling program in particular. In the fall of 2003 the wrestling room in the Carver PE Center was refurbished and renamed the "Shockley Wrestling Room" after a gift from the Shockley's. Terry had a tremendous career as a wrestler at Augustana. In 1962, after winning the NCAA Midwest Regional, Shockley became a national qualifier at 137 pounds in the NCAA University Division at Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Oklahoma. A year earlier, as a junior, he placed second at the NAIA National Tournament in Golden, Colorado at 130 pounds.

He was a four year letter winner and won three College Conference of Illinois individual titles, two at 130 pounds (1960-61) and one at 137 (1962). He finished second in the CCI at 130 pounds as a freshman in 1959, losing in overtime on a referee's decision. He compiled a career record of 69-9 and had 29 pins. An extremely durable performer, he wrestled in every dual meet and tournament that Augustana competed in during his four year career.

Shockley was the Most Outstanding Wrestler in the CCI in both his junior (1960-61) and senior (1961-62) seasons and in the NCAA Midwest Regional in 1961-62. He was the Vikings' Most Valuable Performer in 1960-61 and again in 1961-62 as well as being named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the Wheaton and Knox Tournament as a senior. Following graduation from Augustana, Shockley competed in many AAU tournaments while serving as the head wrestling coach at the University of Kansas, where he earned a Master's degree in radio-TV film.

"We have been truly blessed in our marriage and broadcasting careers to be in a position to extend our appreciation and loyalty to Augustana.

Our sport needs advocates," said Shockley. "Now, at Augustana we can 'press on' under the leadership of Eric Juergens for the sport of wrestling and continue to be one of the outstanding athletic teams in the history of Augustana athletics. Hopefully our support will help Augustana meet and exceed the challenge of supporting a tremendous athletic program."

Eric Juergens, who built quite a name for himself as a competitor while winning a pair of NCAA Division I national titles at the University of Iowa, is the first coach to occupy the position of "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach." He was the interim head coach during the 2007-08 season before shedding that tag in April of 2008. Juergens, a four time NCAA All-American for the Hawkeyes, is understandably honored to be the first person to ascend to this prestigious position.

"The gift of the Shockley's is an outstanding example of how alumni can show their gratitude for the amazing experience they had while at Augustana," said Juergens. "With support such as this, we have built the foundation of turning the Augustana wrestling program back into a program that is consistent with those at the top of NCAA Division III."

With the addition of the "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach", Augustana now has a total of 17 endowed positions on campus. This is not only the first endowed position in Viking athletics, but it is also a first in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and one of the few nationwide at the NCAA Division III level.

Augustana's tradition in wrestling is peppered with success. The Vikings own 36 total College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin team titles, including a stretch from 1982 until 2004 where they won 23 of 24 championships. They won 10 straight from 1963-72, 15 straight from 1982-96 and seven in a row from 1998-2004. A total of 48 Augustana wrestlers have earned All-American honors with eight individual national titles. The program has produced 11 top 15 national team places, four Academic All-Americans, 11 Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar-Athletes, 17 CCIW "Most Outstanding Wrestlers" and 185 individual conference champions.

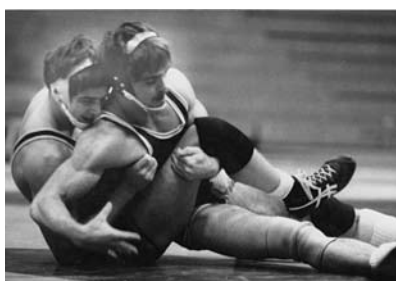

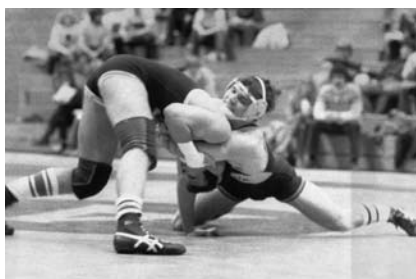

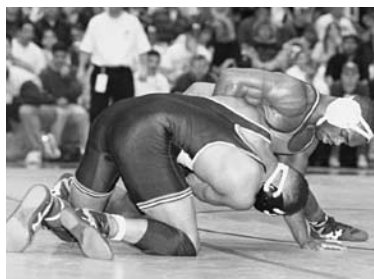

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 64th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 172 total. Of those 172, the men have won 135 and 37 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in wrestling in 1957 and since that time Augustana has dominated with a total of 36 out of a possible 51 titles. The Vikings had a streak of 10 straight from 1963 through 1972 and 15 consecutive from 1982 through 1996.

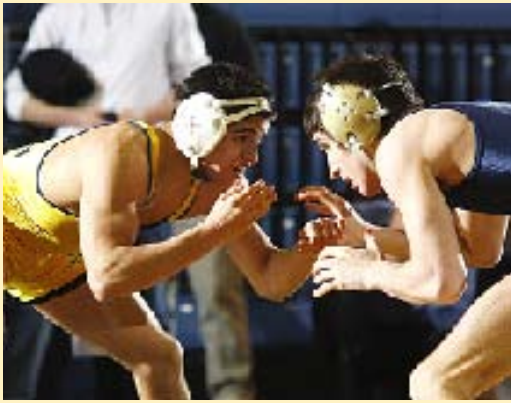
