Different look but same expectations for Vikings in 2011

One of the first things that jump out when assessing the 2011 Augustana softball prospects is the amount of production missing the 2010 season. Six seniors who were significant in helping the Vikings compile a record of 115-61 between 2007 and 2010, have graduated. While their collective loss will be felt, veteran head coach Kris Kistler is once again optimistic heading into the new season.

She has every reason to be because the Augustana softball program has compiled an enviable record of 323-156-2 overall and 102-52 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in the 11 years since Kistler became head coach in time for the 2000 season. The Vikings have made four NCAA Division III tournament appearances (2004, 2006, 2007 and 2010) and have won two CCIW titles and three CCIW tournament championships during that time frame.

"There is no question that we lost an awful lot from last year," said Kistler about her senior class that included such stalwarts as Missy Fobert, Jackie Gill, Karlee Quaritsch, Chrissy Rosin, Brittany Snoreck and Andi Walker. "There are some huge holes to fill but I have really been impressed with the work ethic of this team."

Augustana went 31-15 a year ago and earned an at-large berth in the NCAA Division III national tournament. The Vikings were 8-6 in the CCIW and advanced to the championship game of the conference tournament before losing twice to Illinois Wesleyan. A total of nine letter winners return, including four starting position players and one pitcher.

While filling the gaps left from graduation is a priority, Kistler has been extremely pleased about the leadership her team has received from senior captains Melissa Nelson (**West Aurora HS, Aurora, Ill.**), Rachel Perry (**Illinois Valley Central HS, Chillicothe, Ill.**) and Stephanie Sarb (**Lisle HS, Lisle, Ill.**).

"I can't say enough good things about how our senior leadership group, specifically our captains, has stepped up," said Kistler. "They did a good job in the fall and throughout our off-season conditioning."

The pitching staff shows good versatility, starting with seniors Sheldon Ritzheimer (**Wesclin HS, Trenton, Ill.**) and Perry. Ritzheimer was 12-5 last year with a 2.47 earned run average and a team high 55 strikeouts in 93 2/3 innings of work. She started 19 times and had three complete games. Perry made 17 appearances and logged 43 1/3 innings while finishing with a 3-1 record and a 3.07 earned run average. Three freshmen: Ashley Yaros (**Stagg HS, Palos Hills, Ill.**), Sarah Hintz (**LeRoy HS, LeRoy, Ill.**) and Jaime Rehmert (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**) will also be given long look. Kistler figures that one of those three will emerge and take a prominent role.



Senior Stephanie Sarb batted .307 as a junior and was second on the team in home runs (10) and runs batted in (32). Voted to be a team captain as a senior, Sarb was named the Vikings' Best Defensive Player. She also collected first team All-CCIW and second team all-region honors.

The catching position right now is a battle between sophomore Jenna Nelson (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**), and freshmen Emma Thompson (**Riverdale HS, Port Byron, Ill.**) and Randi Applehans (**Mountain Vista HS, Highland Ranch, Colo.**).

At the beginning of the season there appears to be stability at the corners in the infield. Sarb returns at third base and senior Christina Trojanowski (**Evergreen Park HS, Evergreen Park, Ill.**) is the returnee at first base. Sarb was named to both the all-conference and all-region teams last year when she batted .307 with 42 hits in 127 at-bats with nine doubles, 10 home runs, 32 runs-batted-in and 22 runs scored. She also committed just three errors in 123 chances in the field. Trojanowski hit .341 with 42 hits in 121 at-bats with 20 doubles, three triples, 14 RBI and 20 runs scored.

There is the possibility that Trojanowski could move to right field to replace Dawn Kernich (**Mt. Olive HS, Mt. Olive, Ill.**), who will miss the 2011 season due to an injury suffered while playing basketball for the Vikings. Jenna Nelson could back up Sarb at third base and the first base candidates will be Thompson, Rehmert and sophomore Dege Abate (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**).

The middle of the infield will see sophomore Jessica Peterson (**Marian Catholic HS, Lansing, Ill.**) slide from second base, where she hit .350 as a freshman, to shortstop. Freshman Allyssa Powles (**Zion-Benton HS, Wadsworth, Ill.**) will probably take over at second base.

Trojanowski could move to right field but senior Emilee Goad (**Galesburg HS, Galesburg, Ill.**), junior Jillian Gibbs (**Rock Island HS, Rock Island, Ill.**) and sophomore Rachel Russell (**Hinsdale South HS, Willowbrook, Ill.**) will be in contention as well. Freshman Lauren Schneiderbauer (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**) seems to have the inside track in center field. Melissa Nelson has been a fixture in left field since her freshman year. In 2011 she hit .354 with 52 hits in 147 at-bats while scoring 28 runs. She had eight doubles, three triples, seven home runs and a team-leading 36 runs-batted-in.

"Once again our schedule will be tough," said Kistler, who has been the CCIW's "Coach of the Year" four times in her career. "We will be ready for the challenge and, as always, are looking toward the start of the season."



Senior captain Melissa Nelson drove in 36 runs as a junior, which was tied for the team lead and is the fourth best single season mark in school history. Her seven home runs last year are the eighth most in a single season in school history. She was named second team All-CCIW.



HEAD COACH KRIS KISTLER

Kris Kistler has been the head softball coach at Augustana College for the past 11 years and she has established the Vikings as a legitimate power in both the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and NCAA Division III. She has guided the Blue & Gold to 11 straight winning seasons, something that had never happened before around the Augustana campus. The Vikings have also won at least 30 games in five of the last seven years and six times since 2000.

Three times in the last seven years Kistler has led the Vikings to the CCIW tournament championship and four times her teams have qualified for a berth in the NCAA Division III national tournament. In 2004 she guided Augustana to the first conference championship in softball in school history and the Vikings were 36-9 and placed third in the NCAA Great Lakes Regional. Augustana set a total of 10 school records in that historic 2004 campaign. The 2006 team was 33-10 overall, won the CCIW with a 13-1 overall mark, and swept the conference tournament en route to earning a host spot for the NCAA Great Lakes Regional. Eight school records fell in 2006. The 2007 team went 30-14, finished second in the conference regular season and won the CCIW tournament to again advance to the NCAA playoffs. Eight new school records were established in 2007.

Sandwiched between the 2004 and 2006 seasons was a fine 33-12 campaign in which the Vikings were 11-3 in the CCIW and finished second in the conference tournament. The 2008 team went 26-18, finished fourth in the conference regular season, and advanced to the CCIW Tournament title game. In 2009 Augustana was 28-14 overall and 9-5 in the CCIW. 2010 marked another successful season for the Vikings as they compiled a 31-15 record en route to a second place finish in the CCIW tournament and a berth in the NCAA Division III national tournament. In 2010 the Vikings were 31-15 and made it to the NCAA tournament for the fourth time since 2004.

Kistler wasted no time getting the Vikings turned around after inheriting a program that had enjoyed just one winning season in the previous eight years. After being hired in September of 1999 to replace longtime head coach Diane Schumacher, she was left with precious little time to get ready for the 2000 season. It didn't seem to matter as she led her team to a school record for victories in a single season with a 30-15 overall mark. Included in that was an 8-6 record in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and a championship in the Augustana Invitational. That team was loaded with seniors and it looked like 2001 would be a rebuilding year for the Vikings, but Kistler managed to guide them to a 23-20-1 record.

In 2002 her team finished 27-15 and placed third in the CCIW, both in regular season play and in the tournament. At the time the 27 victories tied for the second highest total in school history with teams from 1980 (27-9) and 1996 (27-14). The 2003 squad was 26-14-1 overall and 8-6 record in the conference.

In 11 seasons at Augustana she has compiled a record of 323-156-2 for a winning percentage of .672 and her CCIW mark is 102-52 (.662) in that same time span. Since she started she has coached 39 first team all-conference performers and 41 all-region selections. Twice, in her first season of 2000 and again in 2004, she has been named the CCIW "Coach of the Year" and in 2006 and again in 2007 the Augustana coaching staff was named "Coaching Staff of the Year."

After graduating from Monmouth High School in Monmouth, Illinois, Kistler went on to have a fine collegiate career at Eureka College in Eureka, Illinois where she helped the Red Devils to a career record of 91-57 including a school record 30-7 mark in 1996. Eureka was in the NAIA playoffs three years and Kistler made the 1994 NAIA all-district tournament team. She was named her team's Best Defensive Player in 1996 and she graduated with a career batting average of .346 with a single season high of .394 in 1996.

A multiple sport athlete, she also played basketball for four years at Eureka and was an all-conference selection in 1994-95 in the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference. She was team MVP and co-captain in 1995-96.

After graduation from Eureka she went to Illinois State University where she obtained her master's degree in 1998 in Health, Physical Education and Recreation with a specialization in Exercise Physiology. During that time she served as an assistant softball coach at Illinois Wesleyan University where she helped

lead the Titans to a 52-25 overall record and the 1997 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin championship.

Kistler spent the 1998-99 school year as the head coach as Plattsburgh State University in Plattsburgh, New York where she was charged with starting a varsity program. She led her team to a 9-10 season in the Cardinals inaugural campaign. She also served as an assistant coach in basketball. In addition to her duties as head softball coach at Augustana, Kistler also serves as the senior women's administrator for the athletic department.

ASSISTANT COACH DAVE HEBBELN

Dave Hebbeln, of Davenport, Iowa, will begin his ninth year on the Augustana softball staff. He replaced Denise Wojtkiewicz, who had been Kistler's number one assistant. Hebbeln was the head coach at Marycrest University from 1996 until 2002 until the school closed its doors for good. Prior to serving as the head coach he had two stints as an assistant for the Eagles (1978-80 and 1992-95). He has been involved in coaching the ASA Davenport Blazers in the summer.



PITCHING COACH JOHN BROKAW

John Brokaw is in his sixth year as the pitching coach for the Vikings. He coached at Orion High School as an assistant from 1991-05 and also served as the pitching coach at Monmouth College for two years. He coached the A.S.A. "Quad City Firebirds" for 16 seasons from 1988-04. A native of Lynn Center, Illinois, Brokaw retired from Case/IH in East Moline in 2001 after a 30 year career as a welder.



ASSISTANT COACH LEANN BARBER

Leann Barber, who enjoyed an outstanding career with the Vikings, rejoins the program as an assistant coach. She was on the staff during a three year stretch from 2006-08 before taking a year off. This will be in her fifth year as an assistant coach. Barber, a four year letterwinner, was a first team all-conference selection three times, twice as a catcher and once at first base. She was also a three time all-Midwest Region selection. She was on the

top ten career list in four offensive categories when she graduated in the spring of 2005. A standout athlete at Moline High School, Barber has a degree in Sociology from Augustana.



ASSISTANT COACH SARA BROKAW

Sara Brokaw, who enjoyed an outstanding playing career with the Vikings, will serve as an assistant coach in 2011. She graduated from Augustana in 2008 before going to St. Ambrose University for her Master's degree and a stint as an assistant coach for the Queen Bees. Brokaw was a two time first team all-conference selection for the Vikings in 2007 and 2008 and was a two time all-Midwest Region performer. She is on Augustana's top ten

single season list in five different offensive categories and on two career top-ten listings.

5 - AUGUSTANA VIKINGS

Vikings make their fourth NCAA tournament appearance in the last seven years; finish 31-15; Karlee Quaritsch named CCIW Player of the Year and second team All-American

Behind an offensive attack that produced three team and two individual school records, the Augustana softball team put together a 31-15 season in 2010 and made their fourth NCAA tournament appearance in the last seven years. Along the way, Viking head coach Kris Kistler won her 300th game at Augustana and senior catcher Karlee Quaritsch (**Palatine HS, Palatine, Ill.**) earned CCIW Player of the Year honors along with second team All-America and third team academic all-region recognition.

Augustana opened the season by winning seven of nine games in Florida, including a 16-0 win over Hiram in which junior third baseman Stephanie Sarb (**Lisle HS, Lisle, Ill.**) hit two grand slams, as well as a 2-1 win over second-ranked Ohio Northern. The Vikings returned to the Midwest and earned Kistler her 300th Augustana win with an 8-0 victory over Washington University at the Marriott West Invitational in St. Louis, Mo. Junior pitcher Sheldon Ritzheimer (**Wesclin HS, Trenton, Ill.**) fired a one-hitter to improve to 4-0 on the season. The Vikings dropped their final three games of the tournament, but rebounded with 10 straight wins, including a doubleheader sweep of Wheaton to start the CCIW portion of the schedule.

Although Augustana continued to dominate non-conference competition, winning its final 12 regular season games outside the league, the team bounced around the .500 mark in the CCIW. A 9-4 loss to Elmhurst in the first game of an April 24 doubleheader left the Vikings' record at 24-10 overall, but just 4-5 in the league. They bounced back to win the nightcap though, and also won three of their final four conference games to finish 8-6 and claim the fourth and final spot in the CCIW tournament.

There, the Vikings continued their hot play with wins over regular season champ Carthage and second-seeded North Central to advance to the title game. Third-seeded Illinois Wesleyan needed to defeat Augustana twice to win the tournament and the Titans got the first win by a score of 7-4. In the winner-take-all second game, the Vikings had a 2-0 lead after 3½ innings, but couldn't maintain it, dropping a 3-2 heartbreaker.

The team's strong finish was enough to earn it the school's fourth NCAA tournament appearance in the last seven seasons. The NCAA sent Kistler's club to Whitewater, Wisconsin for regional play.

The University of Redlands was Augustana's first round opponent. The Bulldogs took a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the fifth and looked to be in great shape. Olivia Ellis had retired fifteen straight Vikings after a game-opening walk. However, two walks and an error to start the Augustana sixth brought Quaritsch to the plate with the bases loaded and she delivered a grand slam to give the Vikings a 4-3 lead. The blast was not only the team's only hit of the game, but also the 31st and final homer of Quaritsch's record-setting career. Junior Kelli Humbert (**Dwight HS, Dwight, Ill.**) shut the Bulldogs out over the final two innings to secure the win.

The Vikings' tournament run and season ended two days later when they dropped a 9-5 decision to Aurora and a 3-0 setback at the hands of St. Norbert.

Quaritsch was the unquestioned leader of an offense that set school records for runs (269), hits (417) and home runs (42). She led the team with a .409 batting average, 35 runs scored, 54 hits, 11 home runs, 36 RBI, 96 total bases and slugging and on-base percentages of .727 and .470, respectively. The 11 round-trippers tied her own single-season school record and her 31 career homers are a dozen more than anyone else in Augustana history. She ranks high on the career lists in several other categories as well, including second in RBI with 111 and fifth in runs scored with 108. She's also eighth in hits (157) and doubles (28), ninth in at-bats (418) and tenth in batting (.376).

Sarb, who joined Quaritsch on the All-CCIW first team, was second on the team with 10 home runs—the third-highest season total in school history. She was also third on the team with 32 runs batted in and hit .307. Junior left fielder Melissa Nelson (**West Aurora HS, Aurora, Ill.**) tied Quaritsch for the team lead in RBI with 36 and hit .354 with seven home runs. She was a second team All-CCIW selection.

Joining Nelson on the all-conference second team were seniors Chrissy Rosin (**Niles West HS, Morton Grove, Ill.**) and Missy Fobert (**Alleman HS, Rock Island, Ill.**). Rosin, a shortstop, set school records for at-bats in a season (157) and career (531). She hit .331 with four homers and 27 RBI. She scored 31 runs and stole nine bases as well. Fobert, the Vikings' center fielder, hit .379 with five homers and 24 RBI. She scored 24 runs, had seven stolen bases in as many attempts and shared the team's "Best Defensive Player" award with Sarb.

Senior designated player Brittany Snoreck (**Sandburg HS, Orland Park, Ill.**) hit .278 with one homer, 21 RBI and 12 doubles, finishing an outstanding career that saw her rank in the school's top ten in six statistical categories. She was second in doubles (40), fourth in RBI (94), fifth in at-bats (470), seventh in walks (44), ninth in hits (156) and 10th in home runs (10). She was a .332 career hitter.

Other key offensive contributors included freshman Jessica Peterson (**Marian Catholic HS, Lansing, Ill.**), who hit .351 with nine stolen bases and senior Andi Walker (**Plainfield South HS, Plainfield, Ill.**), with whom she split time at second base. Walker hit .304 with two homers and 13 RBI. Sophomore first baseman Christina Trojanowski (**Evergreen Park HS, Evergreen Park, Ill.**) hit .347 with 10 doubles, three triples and 14 RBI and junior outfielder Dawn Kernich (**Mt. Olive HS, Mt. Olive, Ill.**) hit .302 and led the team with 11 stolen bases.

Ritzheimer led the Viking pitching staff, going 12-5 with a 2.47 earn run average. She led the team in wins, starts (19), innings pitched (93 2/3) and strikeouts (55). Sophomore Erica Aten (**Moline HS, Coal Valley, Ill.**) was 8-3 with a 2.90 ERA and a team-high four complete games. Humbert led the Vikings with 23 appearances, four saves and a 2.16 ERA. The staff was rounded out by junior Rachel Perry (**Illinois Valley Central HS, Chillicothe, Ill.**) (3-1, 3.07) and senior Jackie Gill (**Heyworth HS, Heyworth, Ill.**) (6-3, 3.39). Despite battling injuries as a senior, Gill finished her career 22-12 with a 2.51 ERA, ranking 10th on Augustana's career wins list.

This season was Kistler's 11th at Augustana and her record at the school now stands at 323-156-2 (.674), including 102-52 (.662) in CCIW play.

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 65th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the “Best Small-College Conference in the Nation.” The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league’s inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women’s sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women’s competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men’s and women’s basketball, men’s and women’s cross country, football, men’s and women’s golf, men’s and women’s soccer, softball, men’s and women’s swimming, men’s and women’s tennis, men’s and women’s indoor track & field, men’s and women’s outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana will welcome its 11th women’s varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2010-11 season. Augustana will also be welcoming men’s lacrosse as its 12th men’s varsity sport for the 2011-12 season. Neither women’s nor men’s lacrosse is not currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 174 total. Of those 174, the men have won 136 and 38 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in wrestling in 1957 and since that time Augustana has dominated with a total of 36 out of a possible 51 titles. The Vikings had a streak of 10 straight from 1963 through 1972 and 15 consecutive from 1982 through 1996.
