HEAD COACH BOBBI ENDRESS

Bobbi Endress will begin her sixth year as the head women's basketball coach at Augustana College in 2011-12. Endress is just the sixth coach in Augustana history. After taking over a program that was winless in the CCIW in 2005-06, Endress' Vikings have made steady progress in here five years and look to be improved yet again in 2011-12.

"I am very honored to have this opportunity to lead the Augustana College women's basketball program," said Endress at the time of her hiring after

compiling a record of 36-20 in two seasons as the head coach at Edgewood College in Madison, Wisconsin. "Augustana has a great reputation both academically and athletically and certainly the challenge of coaching in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin was appealing to me."

Endress, a native of Morrison, Illinois, took over the reigns of the Edgewood program prior to the 2004-05 school year. In her first year she guided the Eagles to a 21-8 overall record and a championship in the Lake Michigan Conference with a 12-2 mark. There were a number of firsts at Edgewood that year as the team won the first conference championship, first NCAA Division III tournament berth and compiled the best record in school history.

She was voted the LMC "Coach of the Year" in 2004-05 and also coached the league's "Rookie of the Year". She has coached five all-conference players, one CoSIDA Academic All-American and 16 academic all-conference performers.

Her second team in the 2005-06 season was 15-12 overall and 11-5 in conference play before being eliminated in the LMC tournament semi-finals. During her first year at Augustana the Vikings went 4-21 overall and 1-13 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. They were 5-20 in 2007-08, 3-22 in 2008-09, and 7-18 in both 2009-10 and 2010-11.

She also served as the senior women's administrator and the advisor to S.A.A.C. (Student Athletic Advisory Committee) while at Edgewood.

Besides being the head coach in women's basketball, Endress also served as the head coach in women's golf at Edgewood, leading her team to LMC conference titles in both 2004 and 2005. Twice she has been the conference "Coach of the Year" in golf and she has had one NCAA Division III national qualifier and eight all-conference performers.

Before taking the job at Edgewood, Endress worked at the University of Dubuque, her alma mater, as the head coach in golf, and assistant coach in women's basketball and softball. She was also an assistant women's basketball coach at Clarke College during the 2000-01 season.

A graduate of the University of Dubuque in 2000 with a degree in physical education, Endress received her Master of Arts degree in physical education from Loras in 2003.

She enjoyed a tremendous playing career for the Spartans where she was team captain for three seasons. When she graduated she was second on the school's all-time list in games played and fourth in assists and was named one of the "all-time greatest players" in 2003.

"I have always known that I wanted to be a coach," said Endress, who is a 1995 graduate of Morrison High School and is a member of the Mustangs "Hall of Fame". "I have played and worked for lots of different coaches and I think that went a long way towards making me develop my own philosophy. I believe in playing strong defense and that is what we will stress here at Augustana."

ASSISTANT COACH MARK BEINBORN

Mark Beinborn joined the Augustana athletic department staff as the full-time assistant coach for women's basketball beginning with the 2008-09 school year. Beinborn has a long history with current Viking head coach Bobbi Endress, having served as her assistant for two seasons at Edgewood College in 2004-05 and 2005-06.

"Mark Beinborn is a tremendous asset to our program," said Endress, who will be entering her fifth season as the Augustana head coach. "He has great knowledge of the game, works

well with student-athletes and shares my vision of what we want to accomplish at Augustana."

Beinborn replaced Jessica Cox, who resigned her position following the end of the 2007-08 school year. He was at Edgewood College in Madison, Wisconsin for four seasons, serving two of those as the assistant coach for the women and two (2006-07 and 2007-08) as the assistant coach for the men. He was also the assistant men's coach at the University of Dubuque in Dubuque, Iowa for three years (1998-01).

"I am really excited to be joining Bobbi Endress at Augustana," said Beinborn at the time of his hiring. "We had a great working relationship at Edgewood and I anticipate that same kind of success."

While at Edgewood, Beinborn and Endress combined to post a 36-20 overall record and a 23-7 mark in the Lake Michigan Conference. Included in that stretch was a 21-8 campaign in 2004-05, the school's first ever 20 victory season and a berth in the NCAA Division III national tournament.

Beinborn has a bachelor's degree in physical education from the University of Dubuque (1998) and is currently working on his master's degree in sports psychology from Capella University in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He was an all-conference performer in the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference for two seasons (1996-97 and 1997-98) and was a two time team captain for the Spartans.

He has been active in all facets of basketball, including organizing and conducting summer basketball camps, running city leagues and founding a semi-pro league.

Mark and his wife Jill are the parents of a daughter Macy and a son Kohl.

Senior leadership and experience has Endress excited to get 2011-12 season underway

With a roster that includes eight seniors, Augustana head women's basketball coach Bobbi Endress is eager to get the 2011-12 season underway. Endress and the Vikings will be looking to build on last year's late-season surge that saw the team win three of its last five road contests in conference play.

With those eight seniors, Endress thinks experience and leadership should be a big positive for this year's club. "We're hoping it's huge for us," said the sixth-year Viking head coach. "More was asked out of this senior class, when they were freshmen, than would have been in a more established program. It was hard on them, but as a result, they're more experienced. Many of them have also been forced into expanded roles because of injuries."

Injuries played a role in a 7-18 season a year ago. Augustana lost second-leading scorer and rebounder Natalie Runge (St. Dominic HS, O'Fallon, Mo.) to a knee injury after 15 games and another starter, Dawn Kernich (Mt. Olive HS, Mt. Olive, III.), after just eight games. Endress said Runge, a 5' 10" senior forward who averaged 11.0 points and 6.3 rebounds before the injury, is ready to go. "Natalie looks strong. You wouldn't know she was injured." Kernich, a 5' 7" senior guard, has progressed more slowly but will be cleared to practice on November 3.

The Vikings will have to replace last year's leading scorer and rebounder and second team All-CCIW selection Kristen Fox. Fox, who was the team's MVP, averaged 14.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game in 2010-11. Endress doesn't expect one player to replace those numbers. "We made some tweaks to the offense to make sure it's more of a collective effort."

Runge, 5' 5" sophomore guard Molly Etheridge (Normal Community HS, Bloomington, Ill.) and 5' 6" senior point guard Whitney Miller (Clinton HS, Clinton, Iowa) are the leading returning scorers for the Vikings. Etheridge averaged 8.7 points last year and her 23 successful three-point field goals lead all returnees. Miller averaged 6.4 points per game and led the team in assists with 85 in 2010-11 and "is playing head and shoulders above where she was last year," according to Endress.

A pair of 5' 10" seniors, Elizabeth Phillips (**Grayslake North HS**, **Lake Villa, Ill.**) and Brianna Skeens (**Vernon Hills HS**, **Libertyville, Ill.**), are the other returning starters for the Vikings. Phillips started 21 of 25 contests a year ago, averaged 4.7 points and 4.0 rebounds per game, and won the team's "Most Improved" and "Viking" awards. Skeens was the team's "Defensive Award" winner and will join the basketball team at the conclusion of the volleyball season.

Two other Vikings who Endress hinted could be in for big seasons are Gianna Pecora (**Downers Grove South HS, Darien, Ill.**) and Kristina Howard (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**). Pecora "had a great off-season," according to Endress, who also called the 5' 5" junior guard, "probably our most consistent outside shooter." The 5' 10" Howard is benefiting from senior confidence and Endress said, "We're beginning to see things out of her that we were hoping for."

Sophomore forwards Jessica Baids (West Chicago HS, Carol Stream, III.) and Chaney Tambling (Dwight Township HS, Dwight, III.) also saw considerable playing time last year and should be in the mix up front. Baids started two games and averaged 4.7 points and 3.2 rebounds per game.

Endress expects the Vikings to be stronger defensively with better quickness and more athleticism this year. She says 5' 9" guard Lauren Hoffman **(Wheaton North HS, Winfield, Ill.)**, a junior transfer, has the potential to be "a game-changer on the defensive end."

Another newcomer who could have an impact, once she gets past some injury issues, is freshman Shelby Whigham (Barrington HS, Barrington, Ill.), a 5′ 11″ inside-outside player.

All of this has Endress anxious to get the season started. She summed up this year's team, saying that behind the leadership of the seniors, "They've really come together and understand the concept of accountability."



Senior Natalie Runge averaged 11.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game during the 2010-11 season before suffering a knee injury. She is one of many senior leaders the Vikings will look to this season.

MAKING HISTORY

Famie Gay, a four year letterwinner from 1976-80, made school history when she was drafted by the Chicago "Hustle" of the Women's Professional Basketball League on June 17, 1980...Gay led Augustana in rebounding during her sophomore and junior seasons.

Vikings finish second straight season with seven victories; Fox named to CCIW All-Conference squad as second team selection; Blue & Gold win three CCIW road games

The Augustana women's basketball team wrapped up the 2010-11 campaign with three victories in the final five conference road games, giving the Vikings seven total victories. The seven wins ties the mark for most in a single season under fifth year head coach Bobbi Endress, equaling the number of wins from 2009-10. The Blue & Gold complete 2010-11 with an overall mark of 7-18 and a 3-11 record in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin.

After opening the season with five straight defeats, including close losses to Coe (65-57), Lakeland (63-54), and Webster (62-60), Augustana earned its first win with a 78-65 decision at home against Robert Morris. The positive momentum at the Roy J. Carver P.E. Center continued throughout the next week, as the Vikings picked up a 69-56 victory over Greenville and then defeated Buena Vista 68-59. A narrow loss at Aurora (68-65) followed, but the Vikings won a fourth straight contest at home, edging Knox 75-73, raising the team's overall record to 4-6. The non-conference slate finished up with a loss at Cornell (68-54).

Augustana went on the road for its first CCIW game, dropping a nine point decision to North Park (49-58) and then saw its four game home winning streak come to an end in heart breaking fashion, falling 65-62 to Elmhurst in overtime. Ironically enough, the Blue & Gold won for the first time in league action against the Bluejays, repaying the favor and defeating Elmhurst on the road 70-68 in double overtime. The Vikings also won on the road against Millikin (65-64) and North Central (77-65) late in the

The Vikings continued to struggle on the road, losing twice more and falling to 5-6 before opening CCIW league action. Augustana soared to 5-0 at home with a (50-43) victory against North Park. A difficult stretch in the schedule saw the Blue & Gold hit the road for five of the next contests. Although three of the losses were by 10 points or less including a five point defeat at Millikin and a four point decision at North Central, the Vikings dropped all five of those contests. Augustana fought hard, but also lost its first home game of the year to a strong team from Carthage (78-71).

Along the way, Augustana dealt with injuries to three of its key players. Junior Natalie Runge (St. Dominic HS, O'Fallon, Mo.), senior Dawn Kernich (Mt. Olive HS, Mt. Olive, Ill.), and sophomore Dori Gills (Holy Family HS, Boulder, Colo.) each sustained a knee injury and were all forced out of action during the second half of the season.

Fox led the team in scoring for the third straight season, averaging 14.0 points and starting all 25 contests. She poured in a career-high 34 points in a victory at North Central late in the season and was Augustana's top scorer in 12 games. Fox was also a presence on the glass, averaging 7.0 rebounds per game to lead the Blue & Gold. She had a season-high 13 rebounds in road games against Aurora, Elmhurst, and North Central. Fox knocked down 130 field goals, including 47 from beyond the arc, and led the team in minutes played (778) and steals (36). She was the top free throw shooter at 72.1 percent (44-61) and also added 32 assists.

Runge was Augustana's second leading scorer at 11.0 and started all 15 games that she played before missing the final 10 contests of the year due to injury. She averaged 28.2 minutes and grabbed 6.2 rebounds per game, both second on the team. She also shot well from the field, leading the team with a 45.5 percent (66-145) shooting percentage. Her best game of the year came at Webster where led tallied 27 points and 13 rebounds for the Blue & Gold. Runge led the Vikings in scoring in five of her 15 starts and also added 24 assists in seven steals this season.

Freshman Molly Etheridge (Normal Community HS, Bloomington, Ill.) was a valuable addition to the squad in her first season, providing a spark off the bench with an 8.7 scoring average, third highest on the team. She played in all 25 games and did make five starts while averaging 20.8 minutes per contest. Etheridge scored a career-high 18 points in the final game of the season at Illinois Wesleyan and was also Augustan's leading scorer in conference games at home against North Central and at Millikin. She was second on the team with 82 made field goals and 23 from three point territory. Etheridge also totaled 73 rebounds, 38 assists, and 16 steals.

Junior Whitney Miller (Clinton HS, Clinton, Iowa) was another bright spot in her first year at Augustana, leading the team with 85 assists, more than twice as many as anyone else on the squad. She was third on the team at 27.8 minutes per contest and second on the squad in steals with 27. Miller finished with a 6.4 scoring average and also finished second on the team with 102 total rebounds. She had a seasonhigh 10 assists in a home win over Buena Vista and also led Augustana with 18 points in a double overtime win at Elmhurst that also saw her grab 11 rebounds.

Junior Elizabeth Phillips (**Grayslake North HS, Lake Villa, Ill.**) made positive strides this year and started the final 21 games for the Blue & Gold. She totaled 118 points (4.7 per game), up from 33 a year ago. Phillips also grabbed 100 rebounds, third highest on the squad, and had 14 assists and 14 steals. She tallied a seasonigh 12 points in a home match-up with Wheaton and was also in double figures with 10 points against North Park. Phillips earned her best showing on the boards in the double overtime victory at Elmhurst, snaring nine rebounds.

Freshman Jessica Baids (West Chicago HS, Carol Stream, III.) also finished out the year with a scoring average of 4.7 points per game. She played in all 25 games, mostly as a reserve, and grabbed 80 rebounds. She had the third highest offensive rebounding total on the squad with 30 and also contributed 18 assists and six steals. Baids picked up 15 points in just her second game with the Vikings against Lakeland and was also in double figures against North Park (12 points) and North Central (10 points). Baids also snatched 13 rebounds against Lakeland.

Sophomore Kristin Warnken (Centaurus HS, Erie, Colo.) played in all 25 games and made seven starts for the Blue & Gold. She was third on the team with 22 made field goals from three point territory and also third in assists (33) and steals (25). Warnken grabbed 68 rebounds and shot 68.6 percent (24-35) from the free throw stripe. She scored her season-high of 11 points at Cornell and also at home against North Central. Warnken had five assists in back-to-back home games against Robert Morris and Greenville.

Junior Brianna Skeens (**Vernon Hills HS, Vernon Hills, III.**) also appeared in all 25 games and made 13 starts. She averaged 3.0 rebounds and 2.2 points per contest, also adding 17 assists and 15 steals along the way. Skeens tallied eight points against Carthage and seven against Illinois Wesleyan, both home games for Augustana. She picked up a season best nine rebounds at home in a match-up with Wheaton.

Junior Kristina Howard (Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.) played in 18 games and made two starts while senior Alyssa Neitzel (Providence Catholic HS, Shorewood, III.) had four starts in 17 games of action. Howard finished the season with 42 rebounds and 18 points. She scored six points in Augustana's final win of the year at North Central. Neitzel finished with 39 points and also converted 10 three point field goals. She sparked the Viking attack with 14 points in just 12 minutes of action in a home game with Carthage.

Sophomore Gianna Pecora (**Downers Grove South HS, Darien, III.**) played in sixteen games, averaging 2.7 points, while sophomore Kelsey Mikula (**Coal City HS, Coal City, III.**) totaled 15 points in seven games as a reserve. Pecora finished with 43 points and knocked down nine three point shots. She finished the road game against Wheaton with a career-high of 16 points. Mikula scored nine points at Wheaton and six at North Central.

Kernich started six of her eight games before being injured while Gills came off the bench in her six games of action. Kernich had 18 rebounds, 13 points, and five assists in limited action. Gills finished with four points in her final game of the year against Robert Morris.

Freshman Chaney Tambling (**Dwight Township HS, Dwight, Ill.**) played in 12 games as a reserve and junior Abbi Staples (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**) also made eight appearances. Tambling scored 18 points, grabbed 22 rebounds, and added three steals. She finished with six points and five rebounds at Elmhurst over 29 minutes, her top performance of the year. Staples contributed five points, six rebounds, seven assists, and two steals.

Junior Allie Scaggs (Petersburg Porta HS, Petersburg, III.) played in seven games and finished with four points and six rebounds. Senior Kayla Papish (Rock Island Alleman HS, East Moline, III.) saw action in six games, scoring two points, grabbing four rebounds, and earning an assist and a steal.



THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 66th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2011-12 season. Augustana will also be welcoming men's lacrosse as its 12th men's varsity sport for the 2012-13 season. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 138 and 37 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in women's basketball starting in the 1986-87 school year. Augustana won that first championship under the direction of head coach Diane Schumacher. The Vikings own a total of five conference titles in women's basketball, winning in 1986-87, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1992-93.
