Progress continues as Vikings get ready for 2011-12 wrestling season

Eric Juergens knows that his Augustana wrestling team has made progress in each of the first four years of his tenure as the head coach. Although it is hard to predict the future, he feels that the 2011-12 edition of the Vikings will be the best since he took over prior to the 2007-08 season.

"I can tell by the intensity in the room during our practice sessions that this group is ready to take it up a notch," said Juergens, who was a twotime NCAA Division I national champion at the University of Iowa in 2000 & 2001. "We have continued to get better each year and are excited to get started this season."

Last year Augustana went 9-6 in dual meets, placed third in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin tournament and seventh in the NCAA West Regional. It was the first winning record for the Vikings since 2003-04 when they went 15-5 and won the CCIW team title. The 63.5 points scored in the conference tournament were the most during Juergens' tenure and Augustana crowned a pair of individual CCIW champions. The Vikings had not had a league champion since 2006.

Last year eight wrestlers posted winning records and four of those return for the 2011-12 campaign. An outstanding recruiting class has Juergens optimistic about the future.

"You never know what will happen with injuries but if things fall into place, we could be pretty good," said Juergens who has compiled an overall dual meet record of 20-36 since taking over as the Terry & Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach. "We do have some depth issues but our front line guys are all very solid."

WEIGHT CLASS BREAKDOWN

125 – Sophomore Jacob Scholten (**Rockford HS, Grandville, Mich.**) was outstanding as a freshman, winning the CCIW title at this weight class and leading the team with a 38-8 overall record. He won the NCAA Division III West Regional and his 38 victories is tied for the 20th best single season mark in Augustana's history. Freshman Thomas Browne (**Grayslake HS, Hainesville, Ill.**) will either back Scholten up or move up to 133.

133 – Junior Steve Poffenberger (Allegan HS, Paw Paw, Mich.) should be back down at 133 after going 15-17 and finishing third in the CCIW last year at 149 pounds. He was 22-18 and finished second in the CCIW at 133 as a freshman. Freshmen Julian Ochoa (Neuqua Valley HS, Bolingbrook, III.) and Derek Law (Air Academy, Colorado Springs, Colo.) will also be vying for this spot. Browne is a possibility as well if he bumps up from 125.

141 – Junior Greg Gogonas (**Bowie HS, Austin, Texas**) was nationally ranked for a time last season and he finished the year with a 17-15 record at 133 pounds. He placed third in the CCIW at that weight but will probably move up a weight class this year to 141. Law could factor in here as could fellow freshmen Hector Ruiz (**East Aurora HS, Aurora, Ill.**) and Zackary Wheeler (**Seneca HS, Marseilles, Ill.**).

149 – Senior Alberto Quiros (Morton HS, Berwyn, III.) has been a regular for four years and he will move to 149 pounds this winter. Last year he was 31-9 at 141 pounds and placed second in the CCIW. He enters his senior season with a 55-43 career record. There are plenty of challengers at this weight class with senior Jack Richardson (Grandville HS, Wyoming, Mich.), junior Tyler Hernandez (Bloomington HS, Bloomington, III.), sophomore Mitch Musgrove (Orion HS, Andover, III.) and freshman Dave Tessiatore (Downers Grove North HS, Downers Grove, III.). Hernandez and Musgrove are both letter winners from last year. 157 – Freshman Alex Bowers (Noblesville HS, Noblesville, Ind.) has been impressive during the pre-season. Freshman Walter Piech (Lincoln-Way East HS, Mokena, III.) could be used here or move up to 165. Freshmen Kevin Sundberg (Paw Paw HS, Paw Paw, Mich.) and Torey Welch (Valor Christian HS, Littleton, Colo.) will battle Bowers for the top spot.

165 – Junior Matt Burns (Naperville Central HS, Naperville, Ill.), Piech and freshman Thomas Reyhons (Davenport Assumption HS, Davenport, Iowa) are all in the mix for the starting position at 165. Junior Cody Heche (Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.) and freshman Eric Timko (Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.) provide quality depth although Timko could drop to 157.

174 – Two freshmen will handle this weight class. Seth Whan **(Sherrard HS, Viola, III.)** and Connor Cummings **(Downers Grove North HS, Woodridge, III.)** have both done nice work during the pre-season. Freshman Gary Miller **(Columbine HS, Littleton, Colo.)** will join the team once football is over.

184 – Sophomore Jordan Richardson (**Grandville HS, Wyoming, Ill.**) could step into this spot but he will get a fight from Cummings, junior Ian Knepshield (**Shady Side HS, Ford City, Penn.**) and junior Matt Regnier (**Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.**). Both Knepshield and Regnier earned varsity letters in 2010-11.

197 – Junior Hunter Feraco (Gull Lake HS, Battle Creek, Mich.) posted a 24-15 record a year ago and he will be at 197 pounds this year after spending some of his time at 184 a year ago. Freshman Steve Monaco (Stagg HS, Hickory Hills, III.) will back up Feraco.

285 – Sophomore Abe Duran **(East Aurora HS, Aurora, III.)** and freshmen John Schraidt **(Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, III.)** and John Seamen **(Munster HS, Munster, Ind.)** will give Juergens plenty of options at this weight class.

ERIC JUERGENS – Head Wrestling Coach

After serving as Augustana's interim head coach for the 2007-08 season, Eric Juergens, a two time NCAA Division I national champion, was hired as the school's full time wrestling coach on April 4, 2008. He heads into his fifth season at the helm of the Vikings in 2011-12. Juergens has the Vikings coming off their best campaign in eight years, leading them to a 9-6 dual meet record and a third place finish in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW). The 2010-11 season also saw Juergens' team produce Augustana's first two conference

champions (freshmen Jacob Scholten and Jordan Graham) since the 2005-06 season, as well as two Scholar All-Americans in Hunter Feraco and Tim Day.

Augustana went 2-9 in dual meets and finished fourth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin during Juergens' interim season of 2007-08. In his second year (2008-09), the Vikings went 4-11 in dual meets and moved up to third in the CCIW. 2009-2010 brought an improved record of 5-10 in dual meets and another third place conference finish, building up to the success the program experienced during the 2010-11 season.

In September of 2008, the head wrestling coaching position at Augustana was fully endowed thanks to a generous gift from Terry and Sandy Shockley. Juergens becomes the first "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" in school history. Augustana is the first school in the CCIW and one of a select few in NCAA Division III to have an endowed coaching position in its athletic department.

"I want to thank the administration for giving me the chance as a head coach," said Juergens when the interim tag was removed from his title in the spring of 2008. "My intentions and goals will be very simple. I have been coached by some of the greatest names in the sport of wrestling, guys like Dan Gable, Jim Zalesky, Tom and Terry Brands and Lincoln McIlravy just to name a few. I want to take the very methods and techniques that I have learned over the course of my own career and implement them at Augustana."

Juergens had a prolific career as a competitor. Wrestling at the University of Iowa, he won individual national titles both as a junior (1999-00) and as a senior (2000-01). He was third in the NCAA tournament in his freshman (1997-98) and sophomore (1998-99) seasons. As a senior he served as team captain and was the Hawkeye's Most Valuable Performer. He was the Big Ten Wrestler of the Year and selected as the University of Iowa's "Male Athlete of the Year".

During his junior campaign he had an undefeated 33-0 record en route to his first national title. Along the way he won the Big Ten title and was the champion at the Midlands Tournament. He was given the Art Kraft "Champion of Champions" award at the Midlands.

He finished third in the Big Ten both his freshman and sophomore seasons prior to placing third in the national meet each year. He was named the NCAA "Freshman of the Year" at the completion of the 1997-98 season.

His high school career at Maquoketa High School in Maquoketa, Iowa was one of unparalleled success. He was 144-0 during his four year, compiling 100 pins and winning four straight state titles. He was the Northern Plains Regional champion and was first team Amateur Wrestling News All-American. He was a second team Asics Tiger All-American as well. He placed second at Cadet Nationals as a sophomore and was an honor roll student. Juergens graduated from the University of Iowa in 2001 with a B.A. degree in English. He served as a volunteer assistant coach at Augustana in 2006-07 and before that he spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant at Loras. He is the owner of Young Guns Wrestling Club and served as the camp director for the University of Iowa Wrestling Camps from 1998 until 2002.

He leads an Augustana program that has won a total of 36 CCIW titles, more than any other school in the conference.

Scholten and Graham win individual titles at CCIW Tournament; First Vikings to take conference titles since 2006; Augustana places third in team standings with highest point total in five years

Two Augustana freshmen won individual titles at the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin wrestling tournament on Thursday, February 10 at Elmhurst College in Elmhurst, Illinois. Jacob Scholten (Rockford HS, Grandville, Mich.) won the 125 pound weight class and Jordan Graham (Big Rapids HS, Fremont, Mich.) grabbed the 165 pound crown.

Augustana scored 63.5 points to finish in third place in the team standings. Elmhurst won the tournament with 91 points while North Central was a close second with 89. Wheaton was a distant fourth with 20. The 63.5 points is the highest point total for the Vikings in the CCIW meet since 2006 when they scored 74.5.

The Vikings had four finalists in the championship round with junior Alberto Quiros (Morton East HS, Cicero, III.) taking second at 141 pounds and senior Tim Day (Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, III.) placing second at 285.

The titles by Scholten and Graham are significant because it marks the first time since 2006 that Augustana has crowned an individual conference champion. Scholten, the number one seed at 125, had a bye in the first round and then beat Tom Laskowske of Elmhurst in the championship match by a score of 11-1. Scholten is now 35-6 on the season. Graham was also the number one seed at 165 pounds and he won two matches on the way to the title. He beat Cameron Fox of Wheaton on a technical fall in the semi-finals and then handled Jason Bonham of North Central in the championship by a score of 6-1. Graham is now 29-12 this year.

Quiros was the third seed at 141 pounds and he beat second seeded Larry Baca of Elmhurst 6-5 in the semi-finals before falling to top seeded Andrew Zobac of North Central 10-5 in the championship match. Quiros is 31-7 this year. Day was the second seed at 285 and beat third seeded Valente Garza of North Central 7-3 in the semi-finals. He was pinned by top seed Mark Corsello of Elmhurst in the final at 2:05.

Greg Gogonas (Bowie HS, Austin, Texas) at 133, Steve Poffenberger (Allegan HS, Paw Paw, Mich.) at 149, Alex Vavra (Gull Lake HS, Dowling, Mich.) at 174 and Hunter Feraco (Gull Lake HS, Battle Creek, Mich.) at 197 all earned third place finishes.

Augustana will be in action next on February 26 at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional at Lakeland College in Sheboygan, Wisconsin.

2010-11 WRESTLING REVIEW

Freshmen Jacob Scholten and Jordan Graham win individual CCIW titles and qualify for NCAA national tournament; Vikings finish 9-6 in dual meets for best record since 2002-03; Tim Day and Hunter Feraco named to Scholar All-American team by NCAA Division III Wrestling Coaches Association

Youth was served in 2010-11 as the Augustana wrestling program turned in one of its best showings since the mid-2000's. Fourth year head coach Eric Juergens led his team to a 9-6 dual meet record and a third place finish in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings also garnered two individual CCIW champions, two NCAA Division III national meet qualifiers, a pair of Scholar All-Americans and four wrestlers eclipsed the 30 victory plateau.

Clearly, the year was a success for Juergens and it was a pair of newcomers who helped pave the way. Freshmen Jacob Scholten (Rockford HS, Grandville, Mich.) and Jordan Graham (Big Rapids HS, Fremont, Mich.) each won individual titles at the CCIW meet in Elmhurst, Illinois on February 10. Scholten won the 125 pound weight class with an 11-1 win over Tom Laskowske of Elmhurst in the championship match. Graham picked up his championship at 165 pounds when he defeated Jason Bonham of North Central in the title bout. The Vikings had not had an individual CCIW champion since the 2006 season.

Augustana also got second place performances from junior Alberto Quiros (Morton East HS, Cicero, III.) at 141 and senior Tim Day (Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, III.) at 285. Greg Gogonas (Bowie HS, Austin, Texas) at 133, Steve Poffenberger (Allegan HS, Paw Paw, Mich.) at 149, Alex Vavra (Gull Lake HS, Dowling, Mich.) at 174 and Hunter Feraco (Gull Lake HS, Battle Creek, Mich.) at 197 all earned third place finishes. As a team the Vikings scored 63.5 points, their highest point total since scoring 74.5 in 2006.

After the first two meets of the season Scholten had four loses and was 8-4 coming back from the Concordia Open on November 20. He would suffer just four more defeats the rest of the season and wind up with a sparkling 38-8 record. Two of his losses came in the NCAA Division III national meet, meaning that he won 30 of 32 matches from November 23 until February 26. The last time an Augustana wrestler won at least 38 matches in the single season was in 2004-05 when Brian Daly went 40-10.

Not only did he win the CCIW title at 125 be he also captured the NCAA Great Lakes Regional to qualify for the national meet. He is now tied for 20th place on Augustana's single season list of victories. During the season he won the 125 pound weight class as the North Central Invitational and the Central of Iowa Invitational.

Scholten was not alone at the national meet as Graham qualified as well thanks to his third place finish at the Great Lakes Regional. Graham would end the season with a fine 32-15 overall record.

Joining Scholten and Graham in the 30 victory circle were sophomore Vavra and Quiros. Vavra was 35-16 at 174 pounds while Quiros posted a 31-9 mark at 141.

Day and Feraco were named to the Scholar All-American team by the NCAA Division III Wrestling Coaches Association at the end of the season. Feraco was 24-15 overall and sports a 3.70 grade point average as a pre-medicine and computer science major. Day, who did not wrestle during his first three years on campus, was 17-16 at 285 and he has a 3.284 grade point average with a major in business administration.

The 9-6 record in dual meets was the first winning record for the Vikings since 2003-04 when they went 15-5 and won the CCIW team title. Augustana also placed seventh in the NCAA Great Lakes Regional with 54 points.

In all, eight Augustana wrestlers posted winning records during the 2010-11 season and during the course of the year Scholten, Quiros and Gogonas were all nationally ranked.

Under Juergens' leadership the Vikings have made steady progress over the past four years. His first team (2007-08) went 2-9 in dual meets and placed fourth in the CCIW tournament. In 2008-09 Augustana was 4-11 in duals, third in the CCIW and 12th in the regional. Last year (2009-10) the Vikings were 5-10 in duals, third in the CCIW and 10th in the regional. This year the 9-6 dual meet record, third place finish in the CCIW and seventh place in the Great Lakes Regional was accomplished with just two seniors in the starting lineup.

The Vikings started the season by dropping their first six dual meets before picking up their first victory by a score of 31-18 over Truman State on January 9 at the Knox Duals in Galesburg, Illinois. Over the last 10 dual meets of the season, they would win five of those, including a 27-12 victory over Simpson in the final meet before the conference tournament.

After placing third in the CCIW meet, Augustana took 10th in the NCAA Division III West Regional by scoring 29 points. Gogonas' third at 125 was the top finish but Quiros placed fifth at 141 pounds.

Augustana announces the "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" endowment

The tradition-rich Augustana wrestling program received quite a boost from one of its most successful alums recently and the result is the school's first endowed head coaching position. The "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" has been made possible thanks to a generous \$500,000.00 endowment gift from Terry and Sandy (Tweddell) Shockley. The Shockleys are alumni of Augustana, Terry, class of 1962 and Sandy, class of 1965.

"Augustana is deeply grateful to Terry and Sandy for their steadfast support of our wrestling program," said Augustana president Steve Bahls. "Generations of Augustana wrestlers will benefit from their decision to endow a first-class wrestling program."

The Shockley's have been long-time supporters of Augustana in general and the wrestling program in particular. In the fall of 2003 the wrestling room in the Carver PE Center was refurbished and renamed the "Shockley Wrestling Room" after a gift from the Shockley's. Terry had a tremendous career as a wrestler at Augustana. In 1962, after winning the NCAA Mideast Regional, Shockley became a national qualifier at 137 pounds in the NCAA University Division at Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Oklahoma. A year earlier, as a junior, he placed second at the NAIA National Tournament in Golden, Colorado at 130 pounds.

He was a four year letter winner and won three College Conference of Illinois individual titles, two at 130 pounds (1960-61) and one at 137 (1962). He finished second in the CCI at 130 pounds as a freshman in 1959, losing in overtime on a referee's decision. He compiled a career record of 69-9 and had 29 pins. An extremely durable performer, he wrestled in every dual meet and tournament that Augustana competed in during his four year career.

Shockley was the Most Outstanding Wrestler in the CCI in both his junior (1960-61) and senior (1961-62) seasons and in the NCAA Mideast Regional in 1961-62. He was the Vikings' Most Valuable Performer in 1960-61 and again in 1961-62 as well as being named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the Wheaton and Knox Tournament as a senior. Following graduation from Augustana, Shockley competed in many AAU tournaments while serving as the head wrestling coach at the University of Kansas, where he earned a Master's degree in radio-TV film.

"We have been truly blessed in our marriage and broadcasting careers to be in a position to extend our appreciation and loyalty to Augustana. Our sport needs advocates," said Shockley. "Now, at Augustana we can 'press on' under the leadership of Eric Juergens for the sport of wrestling and continue to be one of the outstanding athletic teams in the history of Augustana athletics. Hopefully our support will help Augustana meet and exceed the challenge of supporting a tremendous athletic program."

Eric Juergens, who built quite a name for himself as a competitor while winning a pair of NCAA Division I national titles at the University of Iowa, is the first coach to occupy the position of "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach." He was the interim head coach during the 2007-08 season before shedding that tag in April of 2008. Juergens, a four time NCAA All-American for the Hawkeyes, is understandably honored to be the first person to ascend to this prestigious position.

"The gift of the Shockley's is an outstanding example of how alumni can show their gratitude for the amazing experience they had while at Augustana," said Juergens. "With support such as this, we have built the foundation of turning the Augustana wrestling program back into a program that is consistent with those at the top of NCAA Division III."

With the addition of the "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach", Augustana now has a total of 17 endowed positions on campus. This is not only the first endowed position in Viking athletics, but it is also a first in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and one of the few nationwide at the NCAA Division III level.

Augustana's tradition in wrestling is peppered with success. The Vikings own 36 total College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin team titles, including a stretch from 1982 until 2004 where they won 23 of 24 championships. They won 10 straight from 1963-72, 15 straight from 1982-96 and seven in a row from 1998-2004. A total of 48 Augustana wrestlers have earned All-American honors with eight individual national titles. The program has produced 11 top 15 national team places, four Academic All-Americans, 11 Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar-Athletes, 17 CCIW "Most Outstanding Wrestlers" and 185 individual conference champions.





THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 66th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2011-12 season. Augustana will also be welcoming men's lacrosse as its 12th men's varsity sport for the 2012-13 season. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is not currently a CCIW sport. Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in wrestling in 1957 and since that time Augustana has dominated with a total of 36 out of a possible 51 titles. The Vikings had a streak of 10 straight from 1963 through 1972 and 15 consecutive from 1982 through 1996.


