Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. HEAD COACH GREY GIOVANINE

Entering his 13th year at the helm of Augustana Vikings men's basketball, head coach Grey Giovanine has firmly established his program as one of the best in all of NCAA Division III. In his first twelve years he has compiled a record of 226-93 (.708) and a CCIW mark of 114-54 (.679) including conference championships in 2003, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2011. The three year run from 2006-08 marked the first time in 28 years that any CCIW program captured three straight outright titles.

The 2010-11 season marked one of the many highlights in Giovanine's coaching

career. The Vikings posted a 27-4 record, which is the second highest win total in school history. The Vikings were ranked seventh in the final D3hoops.com poll for the season after advancing to the Elite 8 of the NCAA Division III basketball tournament where they lost to St. Thomas, the eventual national champion. The Vikings opened the season with 20 straight wins, the longest winning streak in school history. They also won a share of the CCIW regular season championship for the fifth time since 2003, and they won the conference tournament for the third time since 2007.

Giovanine's 2007-08 team finished the year with a 23-6 record and ranked fifth in the nation. Over the three year stretch from 2005-06 through 2007-08, his record was 68-18, a winning percentage of .791. In addition to the three consecutive conference championships, the Vikings also made three straight NCAA Division III Tournament appearances, the first time that's been accomplished at Augustana since 1980-83. In the same time frame his teams won 20 of 21 games at home against CCIW competition. His 2005-06 and 2006-07 teams both finished the season ranked 11th in the nation and Augustana was ranked in the top 25 in every poll since the first week of the 2005-06 season through the middle of 2008-09, a stretch of 56 straight weeks.

Giovanine was named the 14th head men's basketball coach at Augustana College in April of 1999. Energetic as a coach and a recruiter, he put down a foundation during his first year in 1999-2000 when the Vikings were 10-15 overall and 4-10 in the CCIW but opened eyes all over the league with their hard-nosed defense and a tenacious, never quit attitude. During his second year things fell into place and the result was a 17-8 overall record and a 9-5 mark in the CCIW, good for fourth place in the standings. The Blue & Gold were tremendous at home in 2000-01, compiling a 10-1 record in the Carver PE Center. It was excitement all around as Giovanine's second Augustana team ended the season ranked 26th in the nation in the final NCAA Division III national poll. The Vikings defeated three teams that participated in the NCAA Division III national tournament and also took the measure of division one school Western Illinois.

In his third year, 2001-02, there was more of the same as Augustana once again compiled records of 17-8 overall and 9-5 in the CCIW, this time finishing second in the league. The Vikings once again brought back the "Carver Magic", going 11-1 at home and spending three weeks in the top 25 national polls. In addition, sophomore Drew Carstens was named to the d3hoops.com NCAA Division III All-American team.

After the 2001-02 season Giovanine was selected as the Illinois NCAA Division III "Coach of the Year" by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association.

Those first three seasons were just a prelude for a huge year in 2002-03 as the Vikings won the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin with an 11-3 league mark and a 20-5 overall record. At home Augustana was 10-1, making the Vikings 31-3 in the Carver Center over a three year stretch. The success continued in 2003-04, his fifth year, when he led his team to a 16-9 overall record and a 10-4 mark in the CCIW, good for second place in the league. They were also 9-3 at home.

When six seniors who made up his first recruiting class graduated in the spring of 2004, there was uncertainty heading into the 2004-05 season. Instead, the Vikings went 17-8 overall and 9-5 in the CCIW, including a mark of 11-2 at home. The 2005-06 campaign was Giovanine's best so far as he led his team to a 23-6 record and the outright championship in the CCIW. Ranked as high as third in the nation at one time during the season, Augustana advanced to the "Sweet Sixteen" of the NCAA Division III national tournament for the first time since 1992-93. He was named CCIW "Coach of the Year" and won the same honor from the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association for all NCAA Division III coaches in the state.

The success continued in 2006-07 as the Vikings went 22-6, won the CCIW title for the second straight year and third time in the last four. They also won the CCIW tournament and participated in the NCAA tournament for the second straight year. Giovanine was selected as the conference "Coach of the Year" and the NCAA Division III "Coach of the Year" by the IBCA for the second consecutive season. They were 15-2 at home.

In 2007-08 Giovanine captured his third straight CCIW "Coach of the Year" award and garnered IBCA honors for the third season in a row as well. The 2008-09 season marked the ninth straight winning season for the Vikings under Giovanine's leadership. His 2009-10 team went 16-10 overall and 9-5 in the CCIW, good for fourth place in the CCIW.

Since 2000-01 Giovanine's teams are 189-74 (.719) overall and 99-41 (.707) mark in conference play and have fashioned a 124-21 (.855) overall mark at home and a 66-11 (.857) record in the CCIW at Carver PE Center.

Giovanine (GEE-O-VON-EE), who compiled a record of 80-85 while rebuilding the NCAA Division I Lamar Cardinals from 1993-99, also serves as the Vikings head men's golf coach in the spring. When his team defeated Wisconsin-Stout on March 4, 2006 in the NCAA Division III regional championship, it was his 200th victory as a college coach.

Giovanine came to Augustana after leading Lamar to three straight winning seasons for the first time in over a decade, including a 17-11 overall record in the 1998-99 campaign. It was the Cardinal's best record since a 20-11 season in 1987-88. He has an overall collegiate coaching record of 279-174 in 15 seasons (six at Lamar & eleven at Augustana).

The native of Sheffield, Illinois, where he played for his father "Chips", a member of the Illinois Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame, at Western High School, Grey was excited about coming back to the Midwest.

When Giovanine went to Lamar, an NCAA Division I school located in Beaumont, Texas with an enrollment of 8,194 students, the Cardinals needed a jump start and that is exactly what he provided. In his first year of 1993-94 Lamar went 10-17 overall (6-12 in the Sun Belt Conference) and had an average attendance of 2,987. By 1998-99 Giovanine had the Cardinals at 17-11 overall (11-7 in the Sun Belt) and led the conference in attendance at 4,551 per game.

He guided Lamar to its first ever wins over Baylor, LSU, Ole Miss, Houston, USC and Western Kentucky and he was instrumental in initiating such events as the "Cardinal Connection" – an innovative reading program which was featured in the January 26, 1998 issue of the NCAA News.

Under his tenure, the first two GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-Americans in Lamar history were produced, including Matt Sundblad who was named Academic All-America of the Year in 1998-99. That emphasis fit in well at Augustana where the school currently ranks sixth in the nation on the list of Academic All-Americans produced all-time.

Prior to coming to Lamar, Giovanine was an assistant coach at Wichita State University for a year from April of 1992 until June of 1993. He was the recruiting coordinator and his first recruiting class was rated as the best class in the Missouri Valley Conference and was ranked in the top 25 nationally. For the five years before that (1987-92), he was the assistant coach at Rice where the Owls put together the school's first 20 win season in 40 years. At both Wichita State and Rice he worked under head coach Scott Thompson, who has Quad City ties. Thompson played at Moline High School where his father Herb was the highly successful head coach.

Giovanine was an assistant coach at Oral Roberts from 1985-87 and was also an assistant at Valparaiso from 1982-85. He served as a graduate assistant coach at Central Missouri in Warrensburg, Missouri during the 1981-82 season.

He has a degree in psychology from Central Missouri State where he graduated in 1982. Prior to that he received an associate degree from Highland Community College in Freeport, Illinois. He enjoyed tremendous careers at both institutions. He is the all-time leading scorer at Highland with 1,024 points in his two year career. At Central Missouri he captained a team that finished 26-2 and was ranked number one in NCAA Division II for five straight weeks. He was also the leading free throw shooter in the nation with a percentage of .904. Grey and his wife Kelly live in Moline with their sons Grey, Reid and Luke.

ASSISTANT COACH TOM JESSEE

Tom Jessee is starting his 19th year as an assistant men's basketball coach at Augustana College. Jessee was retained by Grey Giovanine when Giovanine was hired in April of 1999. It was one of the first things Giovanine did and the move has proven to be a wise one. Jessee handles the junior varsity program and has an instrumental role in the recruiting process.

Jessee was a four year letterwinner for the Vikings and is a 1991 graduate of Augustana. He spent one year as an assistant coach at Rosary College and he has a degree in Biology and Secondary Education from Augustana. He also has a master's degree from Western Illinois

University in physical education.

He served as a part-time assistant for four years before he took over the full-time assistant's position prior to the 1997-98 season, replacing Cecil Youngblood, who left to become the head coach at Beloit College.

A native of Lake Zurich, Illinois (Lake Zurich High School class of 1987), Jessee was instrumental in the Vikings posting a 19-7 record in his senior season of 1990-91.

Tom and his wife Bonnie have three sons: Ryan, Billy and Drew and they reside in Coal Valley, Illinois. He currently serves as the director of the Roy J. Carver Physical Education Center.



ASSISTANT COACH DALLAS DUWA

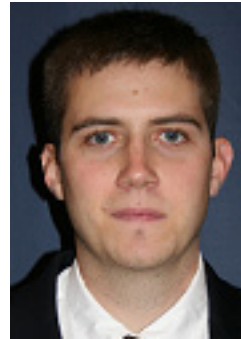
Dallas Duwa, former head basketball coach at Pleasant Valley High School in Bettendorf, Iowa, joined head coach Grey Giovanine's Viking staff as an assistant coach for the 2008-09 season. He will be in his fourth season with the Vikings this year.

Duwa guided the Pleasant Valley boy's team for 12 seasons, posting a 195-114 (.631) record, including a mark of 102-37 in the last six years. His 2005-06 Spartans won the Mississippi Athletic Conference with a 16-0 record and went on to take second place at the Iowa Class 4A state tournament, finishing 24-2 overall. He won the MAC's "Coach of the Year" award that

year and also coached the conference's Player of the Year, Brian Larson, who played for Augustana from 2006-08. Duwa also coached 2007-08 Viking senior Dain Swetalla at Pleasant Valley.

He was the Southeast Iowa 3A-4A district "Coach of the Year" twice (2000-01 and 2005-06) during his tenure with the Spartans. His 2000-01 team qualified for the Iowa Class 4A state tournament and his 2002-03 squad won the MAC title.

Duwa, currently president of the Iowa Basketball Coaches Association, replaced Ray Swetalla on the Viking staff. Duwa was the IBCA Southeast Iowa's at-large director from 2000-04. He has been the state-wide president since 2006. He graduated from Northeast Missouri State University (now Truman State) in 1986 with a degree in physical education and he received his master's degree in curriculum and instruction from Nova Southeastern in 2005.



ASSISTANT COACH RICK HARRIGAN

Rick Harrigan, the former Viking who was the 2006 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin Player of the Year, joins the Augustana coaching staff for 2011-12 season.

In addition to winning CCIW and D3Hoops.com Midwest Region Player of the Year honors as a senior at Augustana, Harrigan was an All-America selection by both D3Hoops.com and the National Association of Basketball Coaches. He averaged 22.2 points per game that season and the 621 points he scored are tied for the third-highest total in school history. Although he was a starter for less than two full seasons, he's tied for 17th on Augustana's career scoring

list with 1,063 points. He was a second team All-CCIW selection as a junior, despite coming off the bench for most of the year.

After his graduation, Harrigan played a year of professional basketball in Ireland, averaging 26.1 points per game for the Limerick Lions in 2006-07. He also enjoyed the experience of playing for the New York Nationals and touring as an opponent for the Harlem Globetrotters.

In 2008, Harrigan accepted a graduate assistant coaching job at Gallaudet University in Washington D.C. He spent two years at the school for the deaf and hearing impaired while pursuing his master's degree. As a result of his involvement with Gallaudet, he earned an assistant coaching position with the U.S. Under 21 team that brought home the gold medal from the 2010 Deaf International World Basketball Championships played in Lublin, Poland. He spent the 2010-11 season as an assistant coach at Augustana's CCIW rival, Elmhurst.



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COACH-DARREN PHELPS

Darren Phelps is beginning his seventh season as the strength and conditioning coach for the Augustana College men's basketball program. He is in charge of designing and implementing a speed, agility, power, and strength program for the Vikings. Phelps is also employed by Geneseo High School in Geneseo, Illinois as the strength and conditioning coach for the athletic programs. He has worked in this capacity with the football program at Geneseo High School since January of 2004.

Previously, Phelps spent three and a half years as the sport performance program coordinator at Quad City Sports Performance in Moline, Illinois. He finished his work there in March of 2005 after coordinating and implementing strength and conditioning programs for several local high schools. Phelps has also worked as the strength and conditioning coach for Rock Island Alleman Catholic High School (June 2003 – March 2005) and the minor league system of the Anaheim Angels (March – September 2001).

Earlier in his career, Phelps spent time as a graduate assistant at Western Illinois University, working first as a teacher in the areas of weight training, relaxation, and personal fitness from August 1999 to May 2000 before serving as strength coach for the school from August to December of 2000. He has interned with the Chicago Bulls through Vermeil's Sports and Fitness in Deerfield, Illinois, assisting in the training of professional athletes from May – August of 2000 and worked as the strength specialist for The Spine Institute of Utah in Salt Lake City, Utah from January 1998 – August 1999.

Phelps received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Health Promotion and Wellness from New Mexico Highlands University in December of 1997. He earned a Master's of Science degree in Exercise Science from Western Illinois University in December of 2000. Darren and his wife Jackie live in Moline with their two children.

Lofty expectations for 2011-12 Viking men

Coming off a 27-4 season a year ago, the expectations are high for the Augustana men's basketball team in 2011-12. The Vikings have already garnered a number two ranking in D3hoops.com's preseason Top 25 and a preseason number three national ranking from The Sporting News as well as the favorite's role in the CCIW preseason coaches' poll.

13th-year Augustana head coach Grey Giovanine returns four starters and 11 letter winners from last year's squad, which won a share of the CCIW regular season title. The Vikings then claimed the conference tournament championship, recording the two biggest margins of victory in the six-year history of the event, and went on to reach the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division III tournament.

The 2011-12 Vikings will be looking to capture the program's sixth CCIW regular season championship in 10 years and its fourth conference tournament title since the event was first held in 2006.

While returning a good portion of last year's team, Giovanine will have to find replacements for center Kyle Nelson and guards Drew Croegaert and Mike Avallone, who were lost to graduation. Nelson was a two-time first team All-CCIW selection and led the Vikings with averages of 13.7 points and 6.6 rebounds per game last season. Giovanine, who has compiled a 226-93 (.708) record in 12 seasons at Augustana, thinks Nelson will be missed most on the defensive end. "He was a great defender. All of our championship teams have had good defensive centers." The loss of Croegaert, the team's backup point guard, also leaves a conspicuous void.

Among the returnees is a trio of seniors who'll share the team captaincy. Bryant Voiles (**Byron HS, Byron, Ill.**), Brian DeSimone (**Buffalo Grove HS, Wheeling, Ill.**) and Troy Rorer (**Bettendorf HS, Bettendorf, Ill.**) give this year's team a wealth of experience and leadership.

Voiles, a 6' 9" wing player, was a second team All-CCIW selection a year ago and earned 2011-12 preseason All-America honorable mention from The Sporting News. He's the club's leading returning scorer and rebounder with averages of 12.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game a year ago. He was also the Vikings' top three-point shooter, making 58 of 140 (.414).

The 6' 1" DeSimone will be in his third season as Augustana's starting point guard. He averaged 9.5 points per game last year and led the team with 86 assists and 37 steals. He was a third team All-CCIW selection. The 6' 2" Rorer, who alternates between starter and super-sub, is the team's top defender and averaged 6.2 points and 3.9 rebounds a game a year ago.

Another senior, 6' 4" Chris Anderson (**West Carroll HS, Mt. Carroll, Ill.**), who started 18 of 31 games in 2010-11, will be in the mix at a wing spot. Anderson was fourth on the team with an average of 8.1 points per game last year and third with 34 three-point field goals.

In trying to replace Nelson, Giovanine will take advantage of plenty of depth up front. Juniors Kameron Norton (**Downers Grove North HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**), George Dexter (**Bettendorf HS, Bettendorf, Iowa**) and Brandon Kunz (**Lake Zurich HS, Lake Zurich, Ill.**) split time at power forward last year and Kunz also saw minutes at center along with classmate Luke Scarlata (**JS Morton HS, Berwyn, Ill.**). The 6' 6" Norton started nine games and averaged 4.8 points and 3.6 rebounds per game while shooting .590 from the field. Dexter and Kunz, both 6' 7", started 19 and three games, respectively and the 6' 9" Scarlata came off the bench and shot .667 from the field. 6' 7" junior Kevin Waibel (**Morton HS, Morton, Ill.**) and 6' 8" sophomore Kevin Schlitter (**Maine South HS, Park Ridge, Ill.**), last year's junior varsity MVP, could crack that rotation as well.

After DeSimone, Rorer and Anderson, there's less experience at the guard spots and who'll replace Croegaert "remains to be seen," according to Giovanine. He said, "We're having an ongoing competition," with 6' 0" senior Eric Safranski (**Putnam County HS, Peru, Ill.**), 5' 9" sophomore Sam Calcagno (**Mayo HS, Rochester, Minn.**) and 6' 0" freshman Danielius Jurgutis (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**) among the candidates. Senior Griffin Dwyer (**Hersey HS, Arlington Heights, Ill.**) and sophomore Austin Lusson (**Lyons Township HS, Lyons, Ill.**) could see time at shooting guard.

All of this year's high expectations are just fine with Giovanine. "There's no downside. We embrace it, welcome it. National recognition is great for enthusiasm surrounding the program and great for recruiting."



Senior captain Bryant Voiles will provide leadership for the 2011-12 Viking men's basketball team. In 2010-11, Voiles was named team MVP and second team all-conference while averaging 12.4 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. He also connected on 58 of 140 (.414) three point attempts to lead the team.

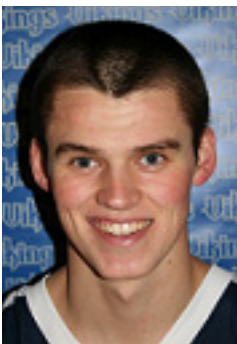

Vikings grab fifth CCIW title in last nine years; Advance to Elite Eight in NCAA Division III national tournament; Tie second highest win total in school history with 27-4 record

Outside the Augustana campus, expectations weren't particularly high for the Vikings coming into the 2010-11 campaign. Coach Grey Giovanine's crew was coming off the program's first 10-loss season in a decade and picked a distant third behind Carthage and Illinois Wesleyan in the CCIW pre-season coaches' poll. Those around the program however, were optimistic that the return of everyone but Matt Pelton from last year's squad along with the addition of Bryant Voiles (**Byron HS, Byron, Ill.**), who missed all but three games in 2009-10 with an injury, would yield better than expected results.

The team's summer trip to Asia was a sign of things to come. The Vikings won four of five contests in China, falling only to the Chinese Junior National team—which featured four players 6'10" or taller—by a single point. Little did anyone know that loss—on August 13—would be the last the Vikings would suffer until February. Augustana went on to win its first 20 games of the season, breaking the school record for longest winning streak. The Vikings finished 27-4 overall—the second highest win total in school history—and won a share of their fifth CCIW title in the last nine seasons before capturing their third CCIW tournament championship in the six-year history of the event. Giovanine's squad reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division III tournament before falling to eventual national champion St. Thomas and was ranked seventh in the nation in the final D3Hoops.com poll.

The team's 2010-11 schedule didn't look very conducive to putting together a long winning streak. Augustana would play 11 games against teams ranked 21st or higher in the D3Hoops.com pre-season poll and 15 against teams that had reached the 2010 NCAA tournament.

After opening the season with an 85-66 win over Simpson on the road, the Vikings returned home for back-to-back games against 2010 NCAA tournament teams Washington University and Anderson. Augustana took care of the 20th-ranked Bears—national champions in 2008 and 2009—by a score of 78-55 and then beat 14th-ranked Anderson 74-69 behind a season-high 27 points from senior co-captain Kyle Nelson (**Deerfield HS, Deerfield, Ill.**).

Following a lackluster 66-59 road win over Monmouth, the Vikings came out winners in the Quad-Cities rivalry game against St. Ambrose. Augustana defeated the NAIA Division II 13th-ranked Bees by a score of 80-73. Home wins over Buena Vista (71-63) and pre-season 21st-ranked and 2010 NCAA tournament participant Wisconsin-Whitewater (70-64) followed, along with a 53-50 win at MacMurray as the Vikings improved to 8-0.

The winning streak reached 10 in DePere, Wisconsin, at the Nicolet National Bank Holiday Tournament with wins over Wisconsin-Stout (81-75) and host St. Norbert (57-56). Augustana knocked off the 12th-ranked Green Knights on their home court despite not having a single player reach double figures in scoring. Voiles was named the tournament MVP and was joined on the all-tournament team by Nelson and Kameron Norton (**Downers Grove North HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**). The Vikings finished the non-conference portion of the schedule with a come-from-behind 63-56 win at the University of Chicago to improve to 11-0.

There was no let up when the CCIW season started, as the team completed the first half of the conference slate 7-0. Included in those seven wins were an impressive 70-57 defeat of Wheaton—another 2010 NCAA tournament team—in a game which the Vikings led by 20 at the half, and a 58-54 win on the road against defending league champ and pre-season conference favorite Carthage. A 66-50 win over a surprising North Central team, which would go on to share the regular season title with the Vikings, pushed Augustana's record to 17-0—the best start to a season in school history. The 1935-36 club won its first 16 games. The Vikings wrapped up the first half of the conference schedule by coming from 16 points down at home to defeat Illinois Wesleyan 69-67 on Nelson's put-back with 2.8 seconds left.

After playing five of its first seven CCIW games at the friendly confines of Carver Center, Augustana faced a gauntlet of road contests in the second half, including four straight away from home to end the regular season. Ironically, after moving to 20-0 with wins over Elmhurst (73-49) and North Park (76-66), it was the final home date of the year when the streak finally ended. Carthage handed the Vikings their first loss, a 65-58 setback in front of 2,400 fans on senior night.

The Vikings rebounded to start that final four-game stretch with wins at Wheaton (80-77) and Millikin (71-51) to set up a showdown at North Central. The young Cardinals prevented Augustana from winning the outright title by grinding out a 50-46 win. The Vikings still had a chance to claim sole ownership of the regular season championship with a win in the finale at Illinois Wesleyan, but a bucket with one second left gave the Titans a 70-68 lead and the hosts survived when Nelson's three-point attempt at the buzzer bounced off the back iron.

Three days later those two setbacks seemed like ancient history as the Vikings rolled to a 73-58 win over Wheaton in the first round of the CCIW tournament in Naperville, Illinois. The 15-point margin of victory was the largest in the six-year history of the tournament. It was a record that lasted only one day however, as Augustana avenged the loss to Illinois Wesleyan four days earlier with a 76-52 win over the Titans in Saturday's championship game. The team's third CCIW tournament championship earned it the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III tournament.

Carver Center hosted the first two rounds of play and the Vikings handled St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference champ Webster 76-51 in their opener to advance to face Hope in the second round. The Flying Dutchmen were champions of the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association and entered the game with a 23-6 record after a first round win over Hanover. Augustana shot .667 from the field in the first half and jumped to a 10-point lead at intermission, but Hope staged a furious rally and led 74-71 before a Brian DeSimone (**Buffalo Grove HS, Wheeling, Ill.**) three-pointer with 4.1 seconds left tied it. With momentum on their side, the Vikings pulled away to an 88-80 win in overtime.

Augustana was chosen as a sectional site as well, with Carver Center hosting an Elite Eight game for the first time since 1981. The sectional opener matched third-ranked and 26-3 Wisconsin Stevens Point against eighth-rated and 26-3 St. Thomas. Augustana, 26-3 and ranked seventh in the nation, met 23-7 Mary Hardin-Baylor in the second sectional semifinal. St. Thomas edged UWSP 66-64 in the first game Friday night and the Vikings held UMHB to .295 shooting from the field in a 70-57 win in the nightcap. In the sectional final, St. Thomas put together an impressive performance on both ends of the court to end the Vikings' spectacular season by a score of 72-56.

Statistically, Nelson was the Vikings' leading scorer and rebounder throughout the season with averages of 13.7 points and 6.6 boards per game. He converted .514 of his field goal attempts and also ranked third on the team with 29 steals and fourth with 56 assists. He was a first team All-CCIW pick for the second straight year and D3Hoops.com had him on its pre-season All-America fifth team and named him first team All-Midwest Region following the season. He was a first team all-region selection by the National Association of Basketball Coaches as well. Nelson was also one of 10 finalists for the prestigious Jostens Trophy, a national award to honor the most outstanding men's and women's Division III basketball players of the year.

The 6-9 junior Voiles—a second team All-CCIW performer—returned from last year's injury to finish right behind Nelson in both scoring and rebounding, dropping 12.4 points and grabbing 5.8 caroms per contest. He was the Vikings' most proficient three-point shooter, connecting on 58 in 140 attempts (.414) and led the team in blocked shots as well with 24. For good measure, he finished third on the team with 71 assists. Junior point guard DeSimone, who earned third team all-conference honors, was tremendous during Augustana's post-season run and finished as the team's third-leading scorer at 9.5 points per game. He led the team in steals (37) and assists (86) and hit 47 of 127 (.370) three-point attempts.

Junior Chris Anderson (**West Carroll HS, Mt. Carroll, Ill.**) was the team's fourth-leading scorer at 8.1 points a game and third on the team with 34 three-point field goals. Junior guard Troy Rorer (**Bettendorf HS, Bettendorf, Iowa**) was the Vikings' super-sub for most of the year, averaging 6.2 points, 3.9 rebounds and hitting .347 from beyond the arc. He finished second on the team with 73 assists and 34 steals. Norton, a 6-6 sophomore forward, started nine games including the final seven and averaged 4.8 point and 3.6 rebounds while converting .590 from the floor. Senior Drew Croegaert (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**) averaged 3.9 points and connected on .357 from three-point range and .763 at the free throw line while backing up DeSimone at the point.

The rest of coach Grey Giovanine's 11-man rotation consisted of 6-4 senior guard Mike Avallone (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) (1.8 ppg, .364 3p%, .800 ft%) and three more sophomore big men. 6-7 George Dexter (Bettendorf HS, Bettendorf, Iowa) started 19 games and averaged 4.4 points and 2.7 rebounds with shooting percentages of .544 from the field and .736 from the line. 6-9 Luke Scarlata (**Morton HS, Berwyn, Ill.**) (2.9 ppg, 2.1 rpg) shot .667 from the field and was second on the team with 15 blocked shots and 6-7 Brandon Kunz (**Lake Zurich HS, Lake Zurich, Ill.**) averaged 2.4 points and 2.5 rebounds a game, shooting .542 from the floor.

As a team, rebounding and defense carried the Vikings all season. They finished among the nation's leaders in field goal percentage defense (.408) and scoring defense (60.1 ppg) as well as rebound margin (+8.4 per game). Offensively, Augustana averaged 69.5 points per game on shooting percentages of .455 from the floor, .364 from three-point range and .679 from the free throw line.

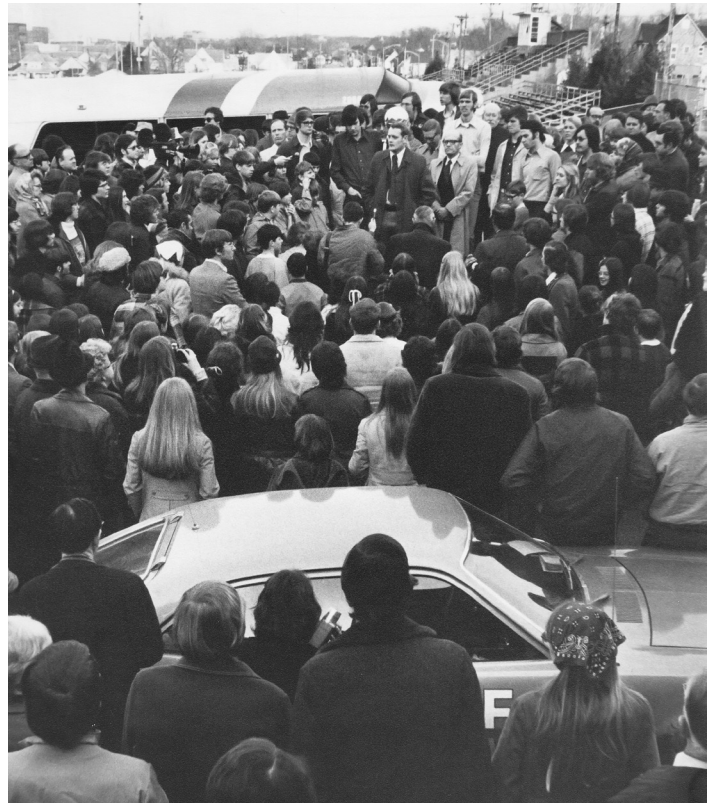

But while the enthusiastic and vocal Borcharding was not willing to say which of his teams was the best, it would be hard to argue that any team accomplished more than his 1972-73. This was a senior dominated team which came in with Borcharding and he guided this unit from a 15-9 squad as freshmen to a powerhouse 29-2 team as seniors.

The center position was patrolled by John Laing who would leave Augustana as the school's all-time leading scorer and as a senior the 6-11 Laing averaged 20.0 points per game. The other senior starters were Chuck Menzer, a terrific shooter, at forward and guards Drew Boster and Mark Brooks. Boster was a heady veteran who ran things from the point and to this day still holds the school assist records for both season and career while Brooks was an underrated player who is sixth on Augustana's all-time scoring list. Still another senior, Jim VanDeCastele, played the role of the sixth man and he averaged 7.6 points per game. The lone starter who was not a senior was sophomore Bruce Hamming, a 6-11 giant who teamed with Laing to give Borcharding a two pronged inside attack which few teams could match up with.

During the regular season only Sam Houston State was able to defeat the Vikings and that was by a score of 64-63 in the championship game of the Quincy Holiday Tournament. Augustana ran off 19 straight victories following the loss to Sam Houston with the only other loss in the season coming at the hands of Guilford College in the semi-finals of the NAIA national tournament.

Led by Laing and his buddies, the team blitzed the CCIW with a perfect 16-0 season and the entire campus and most of the Quad City area got caught up in the excitement of this magical season. In the District 20 playoffs the Vikings blasted Quincy 87-59 and McKendree 109-61 to earn a second trip to Kansas City and the NAIA national tournament where they were quarterfinal losers a year ago.

The week long tournament in the now-defunct Municipal Auditorium was quite a spectacle as 32 teams converged to see who was the best small college team in the country. School was shut down and the downtown of Kansas City was teeming with Augustana fans. In the opening round the Vikings survived a scare against Hanover before pulling out a 66-65 win behind Laing's 17 points. Menzer hit for 18 points in a 64-61 win over Defiance in the second round and in the quarterfinals Laing exploded for 27 points and 17 rebounds in a 63-46 pasting of Oklahoma Baptist. It was into the Final Four and the opponent was Guilford College with future NBA stars Lloyd Free and M.L. Carr. Despite 16 points from Menzer and 15 rebounds from Hamming, Augustana fell 77-69 before rallying the next night with a 96-93 win over Slippery Rock in the third place game as Hamming had 32 points.

HAMMING'S BIG YEAR LEADS TO THIRD PLACE IN FIRST NCAA III TOURNAMENT

He battled injuries for most of his senior year but that didn't stop Bruce Hamming from turning in a tremendous performance. He led the Vikings to a 22-8 overall record and a third place finish in the first ever NCAA Division III national tournament.

Hamming, a 6-11 giant with a sweet shooting touch, averaged 17.6 points and 11.0 rebounds per game as he was named to the Final Four all-tournament team and the NCAA Division III All-America squad. Although he was the focal point in the Augustana offense, Hamming was hardly the only weapon for Jim Borcherding as forwards Mike Michalski (12.4) and Tom Miler (11.8) joined him in double figures in scoring.

The Vikings were a perfect 13-0 in the friendly confines of the Roy J. Carver PE Center but away from home they struggled to a 9-8 mark which was part of the reason they relinquished a four year stranglehold on the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin championship.

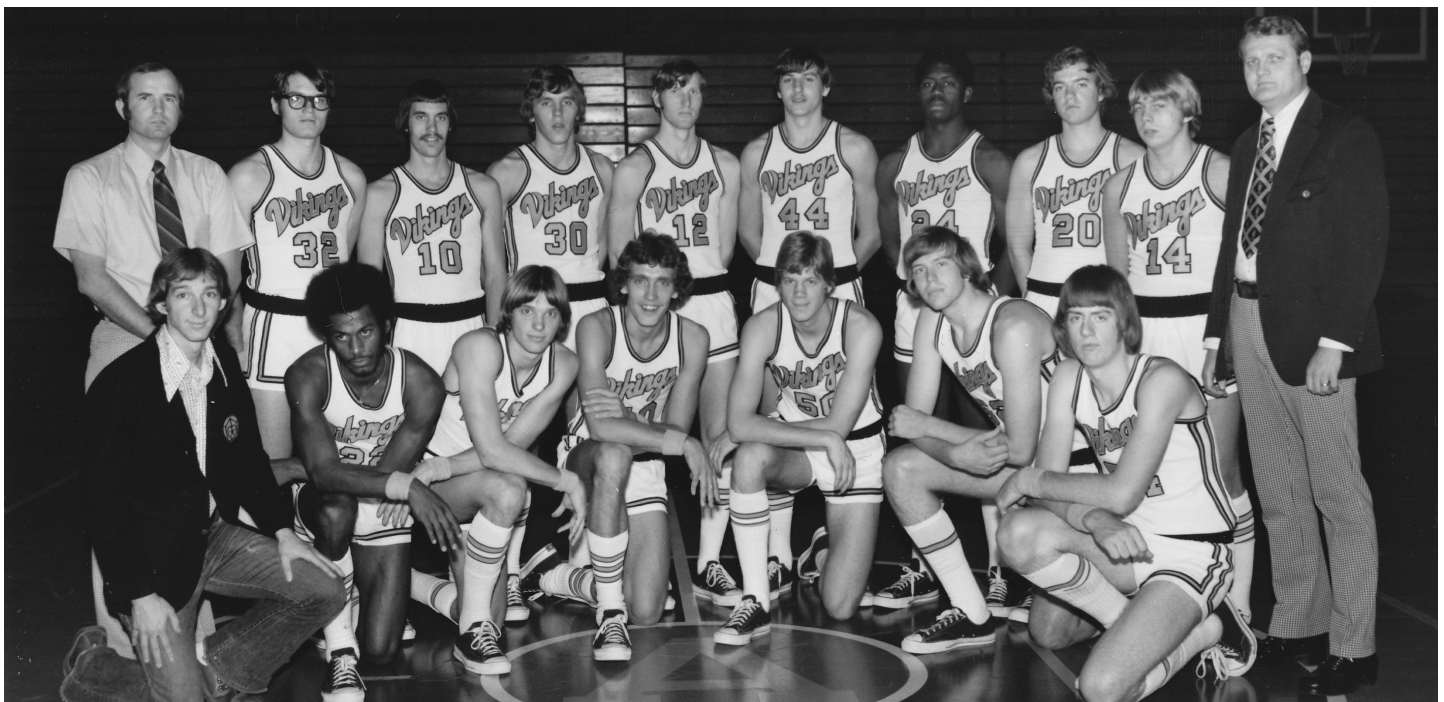
After a 75-68 loss at Illinois Wesleyan late in the season which left the record at 15-7, wins over Wheaton (105-86), Millikin (78-74) and Carroll (89-77) - with Hamming pouring in 34 points and snaring 18 rebounds - pushed Augustana into the first ever NCAA Division III national playoffs. This was uncharted territory for Borcherding and his team which had been a fixture in the NAIA national tournament for the past three years but the Vikings made the most of their appearance into the inaugural NCAA Division III affair.

In the first round of the tournament it was a solid Knox College team which was the opponent. Michalski and junior Dan Hillesland split the scoring honors with 16 points apiece and Michalski grabbed 13 rebounds as the Siwash fell 67-64.

The next game in the tournament provided one of the classic games in Augustana history as Tom Miler nailed a long jumper just as the buzzer sounded to nip Wartburg 62-61 in a game played in Waverly, Iowa. The Knights had scored with just seconds to play to take what seemed like a final 61-60 lead but the Vikings were able to get a time out. In the huddle Borcherding designed the play and Miler took a perfect pass from Al Weir, turned and shot and hit nothing but net which propelled the team into the next round. In a defensive struggle against Hamline the Vikings prevailed 49-42 as Hamming had 19 points and Michalski ripped down 14 rebounds.

In the first round of the Final Four, eventual champion LeMoyne-Owen stopped Augustana by a score of 84-71 despite 18 points and 15 rebounds from Hamming. In the third place game Hamming scored 28 points and grabbed 15 rebounds to lead the way in a 78-71 win over Brockport State.

Hamming ended the year as the second leading scorer in school history with 1,668 points and he was an NCAA Division III All-American and an Academic All-American. He was also named a "Top Five" student-athlete by the NCAA.

SOLID LATE SEASON TOURNAMENT RUN NETS THIRD PLACE NATIONAL FINISH

As was usually the case with Jim Borcharding teams, the Vikings caught fire down the stretch and the result was a third place finish in the NCAA Division III national tournament in a year when Augustana did not win the conference championship. Borcharding coaxed this team to a 21-7 record despite the fact that he didn't have a big time scorer, relying instead on scoring balance and defense.

Senior Terry Lawrence led the team in scoring with a 13.6 average while junior center Rick Kestner checked in a 12.7 and junior forward Greg Stivers was at 12.5. The Vikings were 13-5 following a 63-61 loss to Elmhurst on January 31. They would lose just twice more for the rest of the year - once to CCIW champion Illinois Wesleyan which had future NBA star Jack Sikma and once to Scranton in the Final Four semifinals.

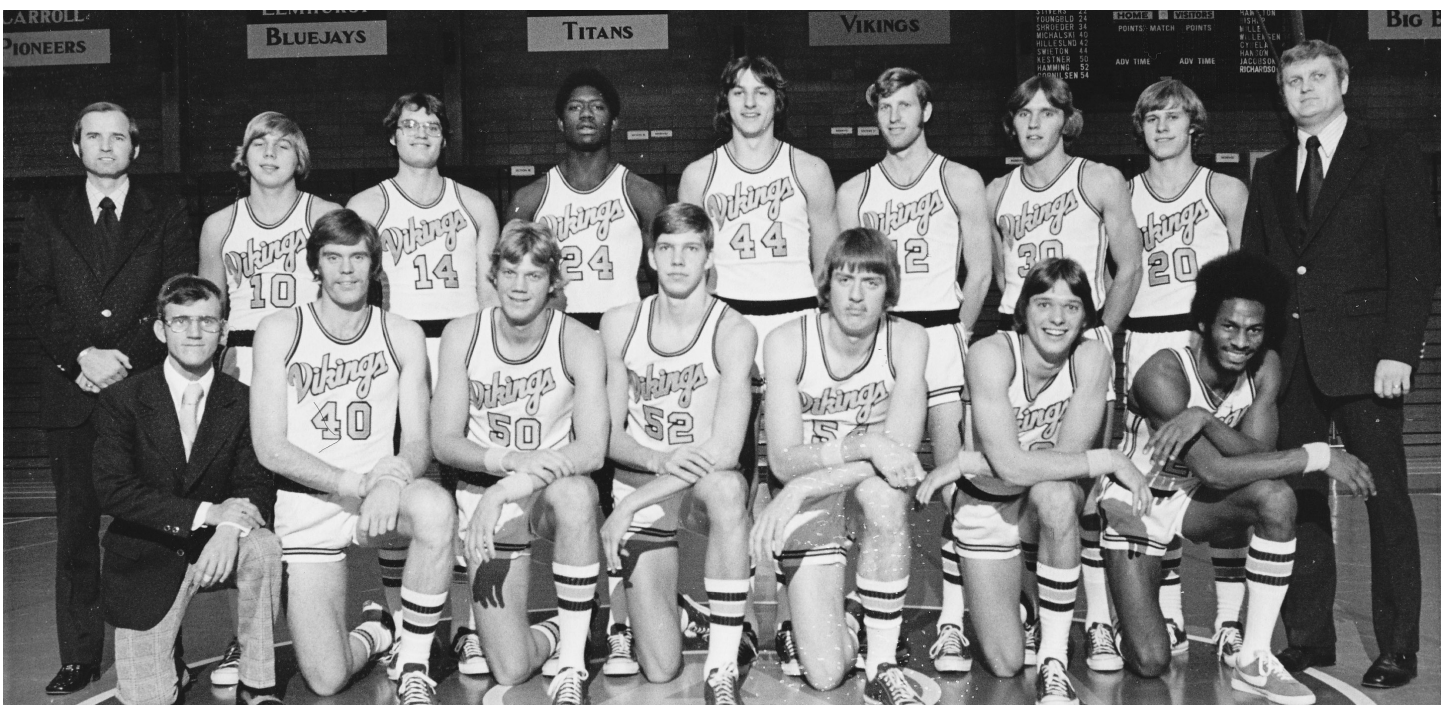
Following the loss to Elmhurst the Vikings picked up a pair of crucial wins over Carroll (59-57) and Carthage (72-71) on the always tough "Winter Wonderland" trip to Wisconsin and then destroyed Elmhurst 75-56 to avenge the earlier defeat. A win over North Park by a point (63-62) preceded the loss to Illinois Wesleyan but the Blue & Gold finished the year with a 75-69 overtime win over Carthage.

That propelled Borcharding's team into post-season and in the first round the Vikings rode Terry Lawrence's (26 points) hot shooting to an 83-77 win over Cornell. A 79-70 win over number one ranked Coe was fueled by 22 points from Kestner and Lawrence and 10 rebounds from junior Bill Swieton.

In the first round of the Final Four the Vikings could not match up with the Scranton Royals and fell 76-65 despite 19 points from Lawrence. In the third place game, Augustana blasted Plattsburgh State 93-69 to put the cap on a fine season.

Balance was the key all season long as Borcharding shuffled players around to find the right combination. Eight players averaged more than 4.5 points per game and seven different players led the team in scoring at some time during the season. Lawrence was the key down the stretch, leading the team in scoring eight times in the final 15 games.

This team bounced back from adversity all season long, including the first conference loss in the Carver PE Center in the building's history - actually the Vikings lost twice at home this year in the league.

LAST SECOND SHOT DOOMS TITLE HOPES AS VIKINGS FALL IN OVERTIME

Only a last second shot prevented the Vikings and veteran coach Jim Borcherding from winning the NCAA Division III national championship on the Carver PE Center floor in front of 5,000 wild and vocal Augustana faithful. A freshman by the name of Leroy Witherspoon sank a 30 foot jumper as the horn sounded in regulation which allowed Potsdam State to tie the game at 57. It was a shocking end to a season and a game which looked as if the Vikings were finally going to give Borcherding his long sought after national title.

Maxwell Artis, the splendid shooting guard for Augustana, hit two free throws with just four seconds remaining in the game which gave the Vikings a 57-55 lead and it looked like the title was secure. However, Witherspoon had a different idea and he took the inbound pass and hustled down the court, launching a shot just as the buzzer was sounding. In the overtime the Bears outscored the Vikings 10-8 to claim the national title.

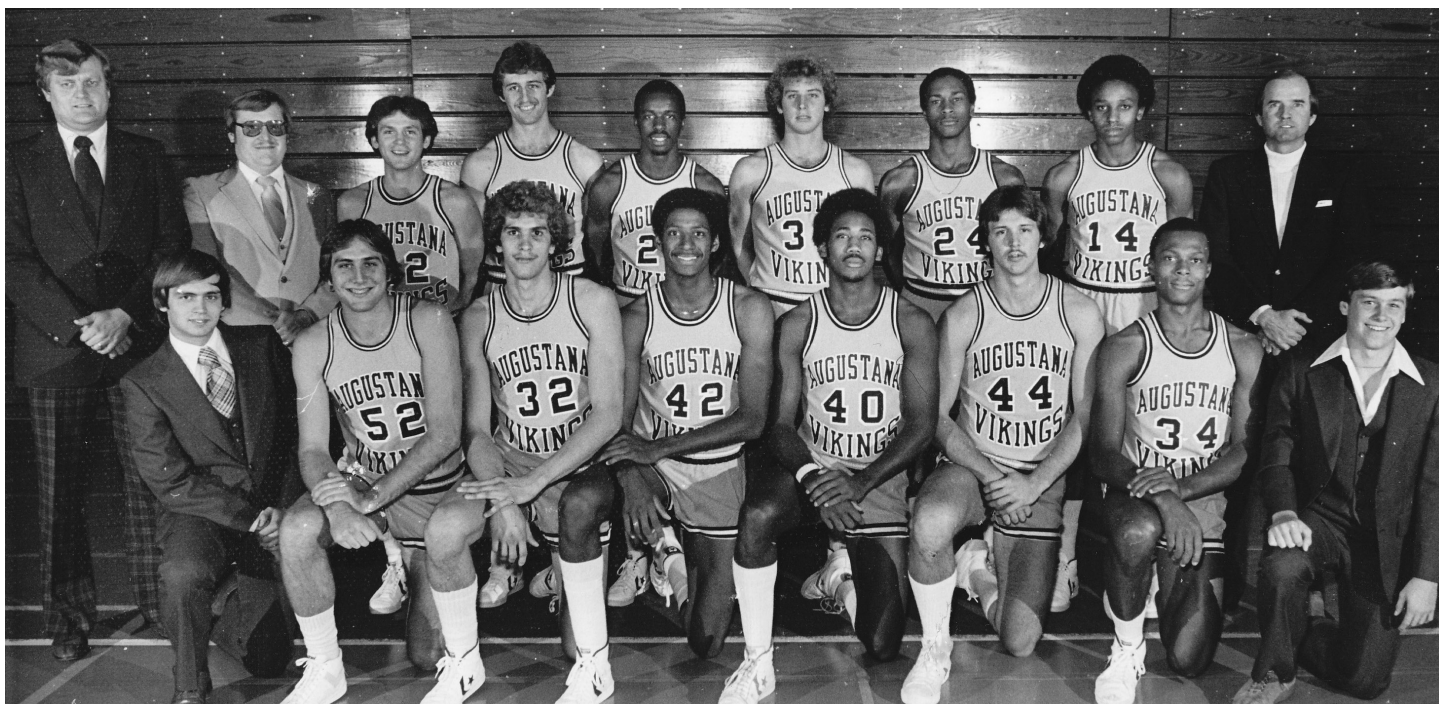
The Vikings finished the year with a tremendous 25-6 overall record - including a 15-1 mark in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin. Borcherding's team was teeming with quickness as Artis was matched up in the backcourt with junior Billy Schneider, a feisty point guard who had 234 assists on the year. The forwards were smooth shooting junior Craig Brittnum and tenacious senior captain Bill Rapier - maybe the toughest competitor to ever wear an Augustana uniform. At center was junior Shane Price, a silent contributor who shot .589 from the field in the season.

Borcherding turned his team loose and the result was a team which averaged 80.1 points per game and shot .520 from the field. Led by the ball-hawking efforts of Artis and the pesky Schneider, the Vikings pressed constantly and the Carver PE Center rocked with thunderous dunks from the high flying Brittnum, Rapier and Price.

The Vikings were forced to travel in the first round of the playoffs and the site of the Midwest Regional was Beloit, Wisconsin. The first round opponent was North Park - a conference rival and the three time defending NCAA champion. Behind 17 points from Schneider, the only time all season he would led the team in scoring, Augustana handled North Park 81-68. The next night the opponent was the host Buccaneers who came into the game ranked number one in the nation. Brittnum scored 16 points and Price grabbed eight rebounds as the Vikings won 56-53.

It was back home to Carver for the quarterfinal and Brittnum scored 22 points and Price had 16 rebounds as Augustana turned back a good Whittier team 69-67 with Schneider contributing a key steal late in the game to seal the victory. In the first round of the semifinal the Vikings came from 14 points down in the first half to defeat Otterbein 93-81 as Artis poured in 27 points.

Brittnum led the team in scoring that year with a 17.1 points per game average while Artis (13.5), Rapier (12.9) and Price (12.9) were all in double figures. Rapier was an NCAA Division III All-America selection, capping a tremendous career for a guy who did not play high school basketball.

Kirk Anderson, Aben Cooper, Josh Thompson, Eric Rowell, Cardenal Collins and Brian Moe were members of a team which suffered through a 7-19 season in 1989-90 when that group was in its freshman year.

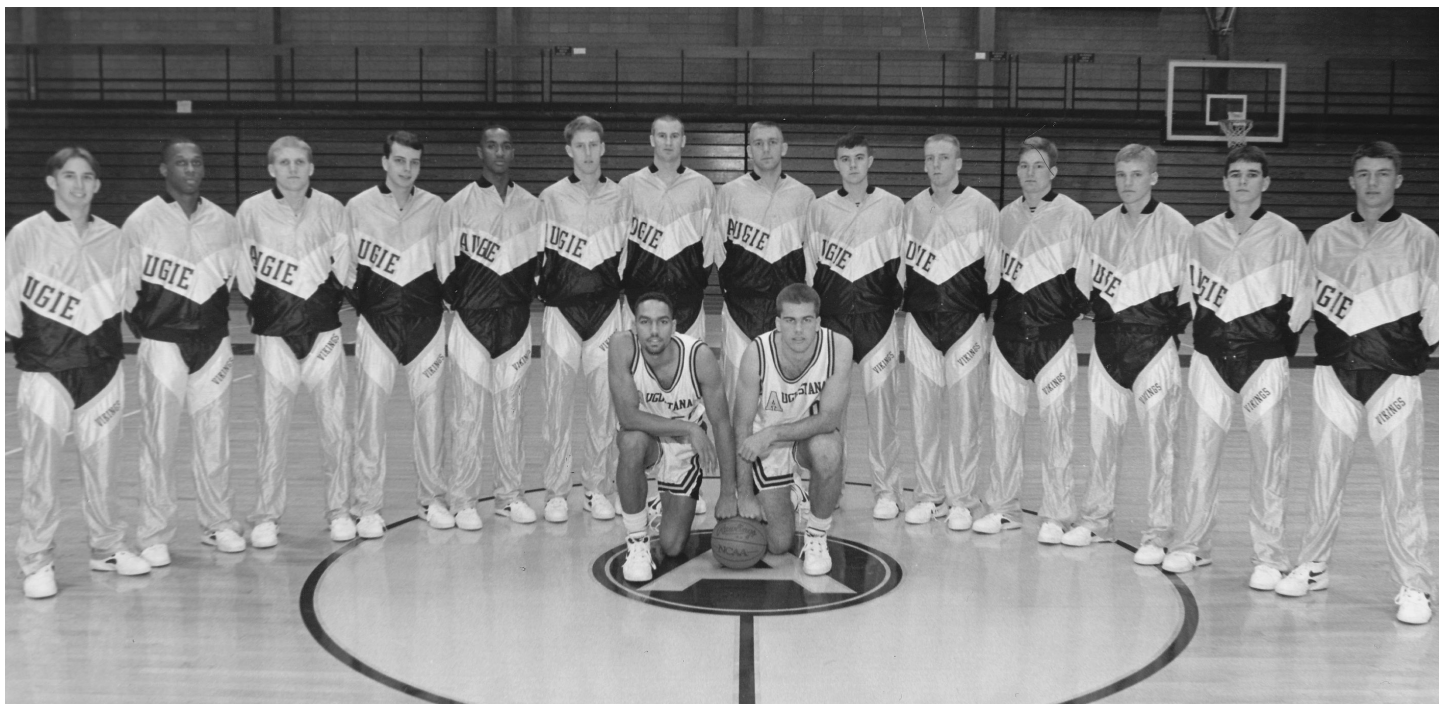
Just three years later those six players were standing on the awards platform in the Sports Arena in Buffalo, New York after the Vikings dropped a tough 71-68 decision to Ohio Northern in the NCAA Division III title game.

It was a remarkable turnaround for Augustana and it started when former Viking captain Steve Yount took over the reigns prior to the 1990-91 season. When Anderson, Cooper, Thompson, Rowell, Collins and Moe were sophomores the team was 19-7 in Yount's first year. The next year it was 18-8 and finally came the glorious 24-7 run in 1992-93 which included the school's first College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin championship since 1982 and the first Final Four trip since the 1981 team placed second.

Anderson, Cooper and Thompson were the top three leading scorers on the team and Moe, Collins and Rowell came off the bench to provide invaluable experience and depth.

It was Anderson, the sweet shooting blonde who drew most of the attention and deservedly so. He was the CCIW "Player of the Year" and was a first team NCAA Division III All-America selection and the Most Outstanding Player in the Final Four. Anderson, who set a new Augustana school record with 734 points, had the green light to shoot as often as he liked in Yount's free wheeling offense and he was not bashful about putting it up. He made 123 three pointers throughout the year and in the 100-86 victory over Wisconsin-Platteville which put the Vikings in the Final Four he scored 41 points - including 12 three pointers - to spearhead the Augustana attack. Cooper was a superb inside player who was both an NCAA Division III All-American and a GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America selection while Thompson was an effective passer who could shoot well from the perimeter and score on the inside. Junior Rick Kelley at point guard and sophomore Tom Wise at forward rounded out the starting lineup.

"I am so proud of what this team accomplished," said Yount in the press room immediately following the title game loss. "These seniors have stuck with this program and been rewarded with a tremendous season. I am so very proud of them. They will be missed, no doubt ."

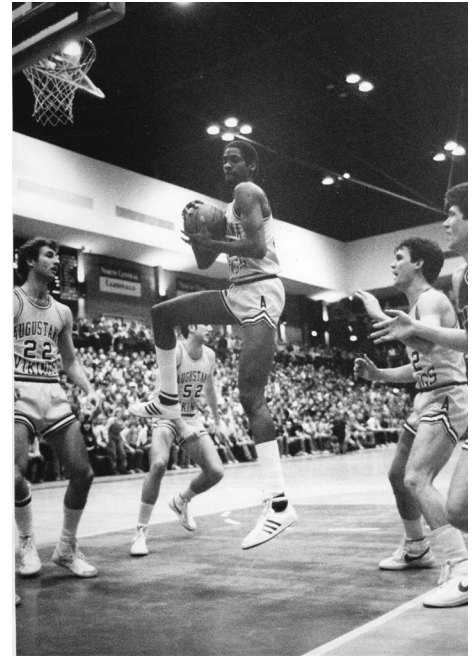

John Laing, who wore the Blue & Gold between 1969 and 1973, ended his career as the Vikings all-time leading scorer with 2,035 points...He was an NAIA All-American selection and led the Vikings to a third place finish in the 1973 NAIA national tournament.

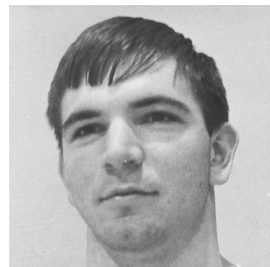

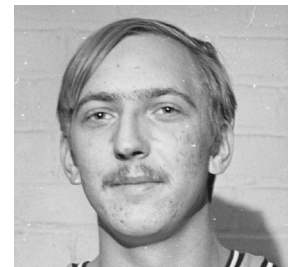

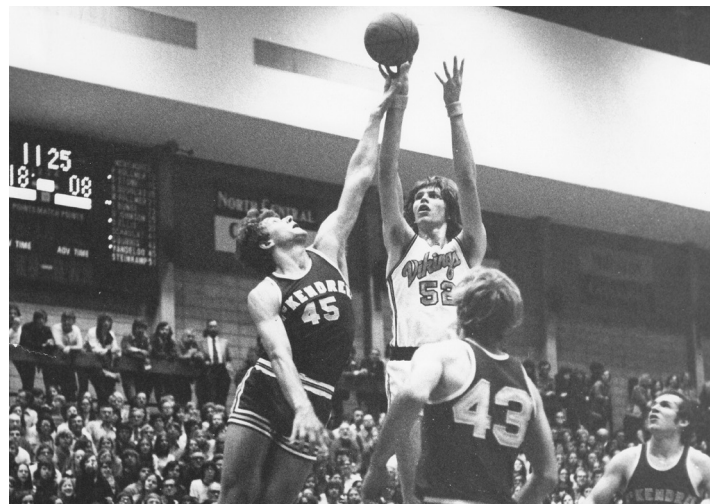

THE ROY J. CARVER PHYSICAL EDUCATION CENTER

Ever Since the Roy J. Carver Physical Education Center opened in 1971, the Augustana Vikings have had incredible success in the building. Viking losses have been few and far between as they are 411-102 for a winning percentage of .801. In the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, Augustana is 234-67 for a winning percentage of .777.

The Carver Center seating was reduced to 1,900 from 3,200 in summer of 2008, when it was renovated with new bleachers throughout the building and chair-back seating was added on the north side of the gym. The old scoreboards were also replaced with a center-hung score board. In the summer of 1991 the original caramel colored tartan was pulled up and a brand new wooden floor was installed. That wooden floor was resurfaced in the summer of 2000. The floor was repainted in the summer of 2011. The Vikings played their first game in the building on December 1, 1971 and beat St. Ambrose by a score of 83-75 behind 23 points by Chuck Menzer.

During the first 11 years of the building's existence, the Augustana record was unbelievable. From the 1971-72 season until the 1981-82 campaign, the Vikings were 136-12 for a winning percentage of .919.

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 66th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2011-12 season. Augustana will also be welcoming men's lacrosse as its 12th men's varsity sport for the 2012-2013 season. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

Men's basketball has been a league sport ever since the CCIW was formed in time for the 1946-47 season. Augustana owns a total of 13 conference championships, including four in the last five years. The Vikings shared the 2003 title and won three consecutive championships outright between 2006 and 2008. In 2010, the Vikings shared the conference title again. Augustana's first CCIW title came in 1963 under the direction of head coach Lenny Kallis.
