Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

Vikings optimistic about continuing success in Jon Miedema's first year

There will be a new look for the Augustana women's tennis program in 2011 as Jon Miedema takes over the reins from Adam Strand. Miedema was hired in June to replace Strand, who resigned after compiling a record of 71-58 in five seasons, is anxious to continue with the Vikings' recent success.

"I am really impressed with how prepared the players were when we started our pre-season," said Miedema, who was the head coach at Grace Bible College in Grand Rapids, Michigan last year. "There is a lot of depth and I believe that will be our strength this year."

Augustana set a school record in 2010-11 with an overall record of 20-9 and a College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin mark of 4-2. The Vikings finished second in the CCIW tournament with 37 points and placed second in the league's automatic qualifying tournament in May. The runner-up finish in the conference standings is Augustana's highest place finish since 1997. The 20 victories broke the school record of 19 set by Larry Flaherty's 1993-94 unit that finished with a 19-3 mark. At the end of the season the Vikings were ranked 14th in the NCAA Division III Central Region.

"This is a program that has enjoyed a good deal of success recently and our goal as a team is to continue that," said Miedema. "We expect to do well and build on last year. We are anticipating a great season and so far I have seen the kind of effort that is necessary to achieve that."

Sophomore Kim Sawyer (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) should slide into the number one position in 2011-12 after splitting time between number one and number two last year. She was 29-7 overall and set a new school record for victories in a single season. She was also 20-9 in doubles while playing exclusively at number one but she will be working with a new partner this year. Shannen McNamara, who posted a 25-9 record while playing at number one and two singles, decided to transfer heading into her sophomore season.

Senior captain Brittany Reece (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and juniors Meghan Wethington (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**) and Krista Panko (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) should be in line for the next three positions. Reece was 12-7 a year ago in singles while playing mostly at five and six. Wethington was 9-4 in limited action and Panko was 17-14 while splitting time between four and five singles. Reece and Panko combined to go 11-3 in doubles with the majority of that work coming at number three.

Sophomores Mariah Bardo (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**), Emily Kaczmarek (**Glenbard South HS, Lombard, Ill.**) and Caitee Margenthaler (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) have looked good in the pre-season. Kaczmarek was 5-2 in singles last year while Bardo was 1-0 and Margenthaler 1-1. Also in the mix will be seniors Julie Wach (**Marist HS, Chicago, Ill.**) and Alyssa Quitschau (**Jacobs HS, Algonquin, Ill.**). Quitschau was 3-0 in singles while Wach was 1-0 in doubles.

"When a team or an individual has had success, it becomes expected," said Miedema. "One thing we need to be aware of as a team is that we need to continue working and pushing to get better."

Miedema knows that the schedule will be a challenge once again. "We play some very good teams and we will need to be ready each time we take the court," said Miedema. "We did lose a very good player in Shannen McNamara but it is up to the players on the team to step up and help fill the void."

JON MIEDEMA – Head men and women's tennis coach

Jon Miedema was named the head coach for men's and women's tennis at Augustana in June of 2011. He replaced Adam Strand, who resigned in May to become the head coach in both sports at Luther, his alma mater. Miedema will be the 13th coach in Viking history for the women and the 20th on the men's side of the ledger.

"I am excited to be the next head tennis coach at Augustana," said Miedema. "I look forward to building on the great tradition of tennis in both the men's and women's programs."

Miedema comes to the Vikings after spending one season (2010-11) as the head men's tennis coach at Grace Bible College in Grand Rapids, Michigan. However, he has a wealth of knowledge and experience in the game. He served as the assistant coach for the women's team at Calvin College, his alma mater, during the spring of 2011. He helped lead the Knights to a 19-4 overall record and a second round advancement in the NCAA Division III Championships.

Miedema served as a tennis instructor for three years at the Michigan Athletic Club, noted as one of the top clubs in the Midwest. He also worked as an instructor at the Centennial Country Club in Grand Rapids from 2004 through 2006.

A 2005 graduate of Calvin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business and communications, Miedema worked as a health insurance agent for Kessler and Associates from 2007 until he took the Augustana position. He was also a loan officer for Brickwood Mortgage from 2005 through 2007.

As a player at Calvin he served as team captain during his senior season of 2005. He was a first team all-conference selection in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

"Jon's strong tennis background, thorough understanding of NCAA Division III, previous collegiate coaching experience and outstanding communication and people skills were evident throughout the interview process," said Mike Zapolski, Director of Athletics at Augustana.

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 66th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2011-12 season. Augustana will also be welcoming men's lacrosse as its 12th men's varsity sport for the 2012-13 season. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

Football was the first sport contested in the CCIW when the league was formed in 1946. Augustana has won more games (309) and championships (21) than any team in the CCIW during the first 65 years of existence. Not only have the Vikings won 21 league titles, but they have also finished second 11 times. Since 1981 the Blue & Gold own at least a share of 17 of the last 29 championships.
