Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college enrolls approximately 2,500 men and women of diverse ethnic, religious and social backgrounds, from across the United States and around the world.

Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

HEAD COACH MARK BEINBORN

Mark Beinborn will begin his first season as the head basketball coach at Augustana in the 2012-13 season. Beinborn, who has been the Vikings assistant coach since the 2008 season, becomes the seventh coach in Augustana history. He replaces Bobbi Endress, who resigned in February after six seasons at the helm.

"I am extremely proud and happy to be the new head women's basketball coach at Augustana," said Beinborn. "This is a program where the ground work has been laid. The players are on

board and I am thrilled with this opportunity to lead them. Augustana is a great school and we are looking forward to taking the next step."

Beinborn has been the junior varsity coach for the Vikings the last two years, compiling an 8-3 record in 2011-12 and a 7-5 mark in 2010-11. He was reunited with Endress in June of 2008 after serving as her assistant at Edgewood College in Madison, Wisconsin from 2004 until 2006. He served as the assistant men's coach at Edgewood from 2006 through 2008 before taking the position at Augustana. While at Edgewood, he helped direct the women's team to a conference championship and NCAA tournament berth. Before arriving at Edgewood, Beinborn also assisted with the men's team at his alma mater, University of Dubuque. He also coaches Moline/Rock Island girls' AAU team during the off season.

Augustana director of athletics Mike Zapolski had this to say about the Vikings' new head coach. "Working through the search process, it became clear that our women's basketball program needed a strong personality at the top - someone who was decisive, genuine, passionate and willing to work hard to build relationships with a wide range of prospects."

Beinborn is a 1998 graduate of the University of Dubuque with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. He will receive his Master of Arts in human services from Liberty University in May of 2012. He was a two-time all-conference performer in the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic conference while playing at Dubuque, where he was a two-time team captain. While at Dubuque he twice won the "Student Leadership Award". Following his collegiate days, Beinborn competed in a semi-pro league in Wisconsin.

Beinborn lives in Davenport with his wife Jill, and their kids; sons Marcus and Cole and daughter Macy.



ASSISTANT COACH MAURICE WOODS

Maurice Woods is a former teammate of Mark Beinborn's when the two played together at the University of Dubuque. Woods is a 2001 graduate of Dubuque with a degree in sociology with a concentration in criminal justice. He served as both a player and a student-assistant coach with the Spartans and was active in the Student Athletic Advisory Committee, Diversity Council, Mission Statement Team, and Earth Summit and was awarded the Leadership Award in 1997. He recently completed

his degree in chiropractic medicine from Palmer College. He currently works full-time at Augustana where he is in the offices of student services and residential life.



ASSISTANT COACH ABBI STAPLES

After finishing a four year career in both basketball and softball in 2012, Abbi Staples joins the Augustana staff as an assistant coach. A native of Sterling, Illinois, Staples was a three year letter winner in both basketball, as a guard, and softball, as an outfielder. She was an elementary education major.



ASSISTANT COACH MICHELLE BAILEY

Michelle Bailey joined the Augustana women's basketball staff in the fall of 2012. She brings a wealth of educational experience to the Viking bench, having served as a school counselor at the elementary, high school and college levels throughout her professional career. She had a stint as the head women's basketball coach at Clark State Community College in Springfield, Ohio in the mid-1990's. A graduate of Wittenberg University with a degree in psychology, Bailey has her master's degree from the

University of South Carolina.

ASSISTANT COACH BRIAN CARMEN

Brian Carmen is in his first year as an assistant on Mark Beinborn's staff. He graduated from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville in 2001 with a degree in physical education. He is currently the Summer Youth Coordinator for River's Edge in Davenport, Iowa. He helped with the men's basketball program at SIUE in 2010-11 and has had several other coaching positions in his career.



Beinborn looking forward to first season as head coach of the Vikings

Mark Beinborn spent four seasons as the assistant coach for the Augustana women's basketball team and he is anxiously looking forward to the 2012-13 campaign as his first as the head coach. He will welcome back six letter winners and three starters from a team that compiled a record of 11-14 a year ago.

"I am really excited to get started," said Beinborn, who joined the Viking staff prior to the 2008-09 season. "We have good veteran leadership along with some talented young players and it will be interesting to see how it all meshes as the season unfolds."

A year ago Augustana compiled its most wins since the 2003-04 season and the Vikings led the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in both free throw percentage and offensive rebounds per game. Beinborn is looking at his three returning starters: senior Gianna Pecora (**Downers Grove South HS, Darien, Ill.**) and juniors Chaney Tambling (**Dwight HS, Dwight, Ill.**) and Molly Etheridge (**Normal Community HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) to help ease the transition with a new coaching staff.

"We are approaching things a little differently and having Gianna, Molly and Chaney on board to help show the way we want things done has been a big help," he remarked. "We are going to have to have some of our young kids step up and it helps to have veterans who can show how we want things done."

Etheridge was the team's second leading scorer a year ago with an 11.1 points-per-game average and she pulled down 4.5 rebounds per game. She also shot .800 (80-100) from the free throw line and was second on the team in three point field goals made with 25 and in assists with 62. She will handle the point guard position this season.

Pecora was the third leading scorer on the team in 2011-12 at 8.3 per game and she averaged 4.0 rebounds per contest. She sank a team leading 31 three point field goals and shot .727 (48-66) from the free throw line. She had 52 assists and 22 steals as well. She will be at one of the wing positions and will be joined by junior Amy Hicks (**Rockford Christian HS, Rockford, Ill.**), who averaged 5.2 points and 2.6 rebounds last year, and freshman Natalie Tomerlin (**Hinsdale South HS, Darien, Ill.**).

Tambling will lend some stability to the front court after she started 22 of 25 games last year and averaged 4.7 points and 3.5 rebounds. Junior Jessica Baidis (**West Chicago HS, West Chicago, Ill.**) played in 12 games last season and will be attempting to get back to her freshman year production when she averaged 4.7 points and 3.2 rebounds and appeared in all 25 games. Senior Devon DiIorio (**Glenbard South HS, Glen Ellyn, Ill.**) has been in the program for four years and Beinborn thinks she can contribute in her final season.

Sophomore Kayla Boers (**Oswego East HS, Oswego, Ill.**) and freshman Marissa Pezzopane (**Addison Trail HS, Wood Dale, Ill.**) bring some athleticism to the front line. Sophomore Julia Panozzo (**Morgan Park HS, Chicago, Ill.**) and freshman Alexandria Lee (**Elgin St. Edwards Catholic HS, West Dundee, Ill.**) will lend depth.

Others who could contribute to the Vikings cause this season include senior Lauren Hoffman (**Wheaton North HS, Winfield, Ill.**), sophomore Valerie VanRoeyen (**Libertyville HS, Grayslake, Ill.**) and freshman Maddie Kerr (**Elgin St. Edwards Catholic HS, Streamwood, Ill.**) at the two-guard and freshmen Andrea McNally (**Hinsdale South HS, Burr Ridge, Ill.**) and Dominique Hartsfield (**Plainfield East HS, Romeoville, Ill.**) at the point guard.

"We are looking for improvement each time we take the court," said Beinborn. "This has been a good group to coach so far and they have worked hard at what we have asked them to do."



Senior Gianna Pecora will be looked upon to provide veteran leadership for the Augustana women's basketball team in 2012-13. Last year she averaged 8.3 points per game in addition to 4.0 rebounds per game.

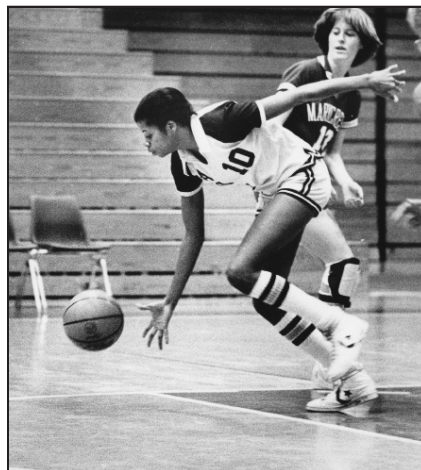

MAKING HISTORY

Famie Gay, a four year letterwinner from 1976-80, made school history when she was drafted by the Chicago "Hustle" of the Women's Professional Basketball League on June 17, 1980...Gay led Augustana in rebounding during her sophomore and junior seasons.

Vikings finish 11-14; most wins since 2003-04 season; Natalie Runge named to All-CCIW second team

Led by a seven-player senior class, coach Bobbi Endress' Augustana basketball team completed the 2011-12 season with an 11-14 record, winning the most games since the 2003-04 team finished 15-9. The Vikings went 3-11 in College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin play, finishing seventh. 5-10 senior forward Natalie Runge (**St. Dominic HS, O'Fallon, Mo.**), the team's leading scorer and rebounder, was a second team selection to the all-conference team.

This year's club started off 4-0 with wins over Monmouth (78-73), Presentation (72-45), Colorado College (60-56) and Webster (70-62). The middle two of those occurred at the Colorado College Tip-Off Classic in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Wisconsin-Platteville stopped the Vikings' season-opening winning streak with a 59-56 win on a 30-foot desperation three-pointer at the buzzer.

After a loss to the nationally-ranked hosts at the Washington University's McWilliams Classic, the Vikings rebounded with a 61-46 win over Agnes Scott. They closed out non-conference play by winning three of four, defeating Robert Morris-Springfield (61-38), Aurora (69-36) and Dubuque (63-55) and falling to Central (84-76).

In addition to Runge, seniors Whitney Miller (**Clinton HS, Clinton, Iowa**), Elizabeth Phillips (**Grayslake North HS, Lake Villa, Ill.**), Kristina Howard (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**), Allison Scaggs (**Porta HS, Petersburg, Ill.**), Brianna Skeens (**Vernon Hills HS, Libertyville, Ill.**) and Abbi Staples (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**), wrapped up their Augustana careers this season.

Runge led the Vikings in scoring and rebounding this season with averages of 12.6 points and 5.0 boards per game. She shot .466 from the field and her .806 free throw percentage this season is fifth best in school history. Miller, the team's 5-5 point guard, paced the team in assists (72) and steals (36) and her .803 mark from the free throw line is the seventh best single-season mark in Viking history. Sophomore guard Molly Etheridge (**Normal University HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) was Augustana's second-leading scorer at 11.1 points per game. She was also second in three-point field goals (25), assists (62) and steals (26) and tied Howard for second in rebounding with an average of 4.5 per game. Her .800 percentage from the free throw line in 2011-12 ranks as the ninth best in the annals of Augustana. Junior guard Gianna Pecora (**Downers Grove South HS, Darien, Ill.**) averaged 8.3 points and 4.0 rebounds and was the team's top three-point shooter with 31 made (tied for 8th most in school history) and a .304 percentage.

With four starters at 80 percent or better from the free throw line, Augustana led the CCIW in that category with a .741 mark. The Vikings were also the league's top offensive rebounding team, grabbing an average of 12.5 per game.

Runge finished her career in ninth place on Augustana's all-time scoring list with 965 career points. With a career scoring average of 10.8 points per game, she almost certainly would have eclipsed the 1000-point mark had she not missed 10 games of her junior season due to a knee injury. She finished just outside Augustana's top ten in career field goal percentage (.470) and rebounds (491). Miller also cracked Augustana's career top ten, finishing with a .735 free throw percentage—eighth-best all time.

Pecora and Etheridge are also working their way up the career charts at Augustana. Pecora's 31 three-point field goals this season push her career total to 49—sixth on Augustana's all-time list and one ahead of Etheridge, who ranks seventh. Pecora's career three-point percentage of .285 ranks ninth in school history. The pair is currently tied for sixth on the school's career list with 172 three-point attempts each.

After six years on the sidelines for Augustana, Endress decided to step down at season's end.

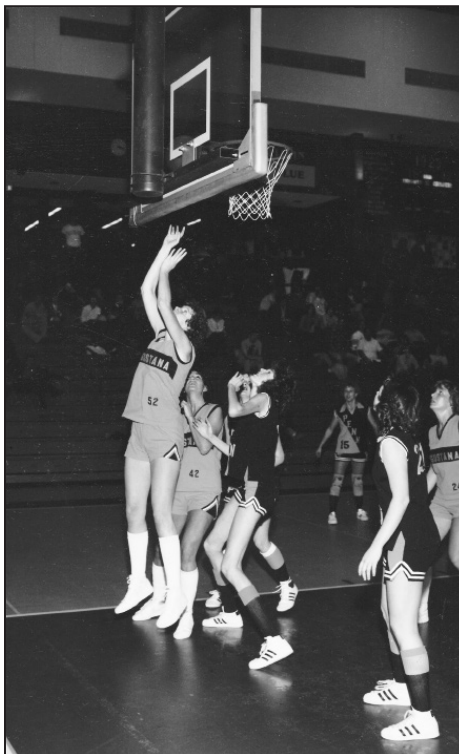

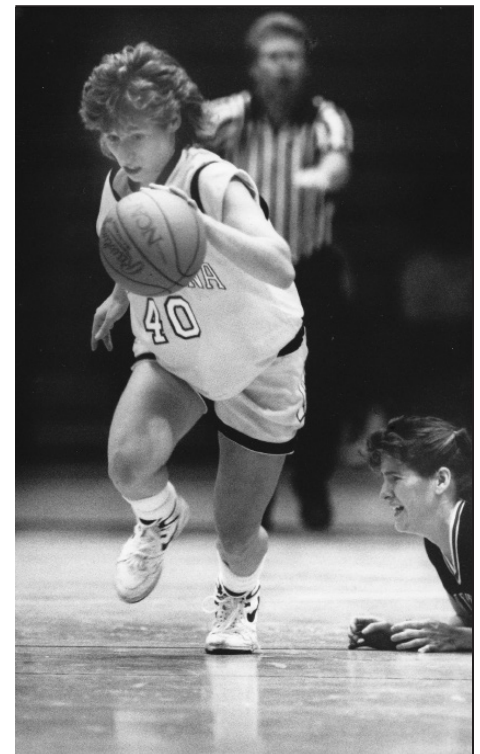

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana also sports varsity men's and women's lacrosse teams. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 176 total. Of those 176, the men have won 137 and 39 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in women's basketball starting in the 1986-87 school year. Augustana won that first championship under the direction of head coach Diane Schumacher. The Vikings own a total of five conference titles in women's basketball, winning in 1986-87, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1992-93.
