Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college enrolls approximately 2,500 men and women of diverse ethnic, religious and social backgrounds, from across the United States and around the world.

Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

HEAD COACH ROB CUSHMAN



Rob Cushman wrapped up his first season at the helm of the Augustana program in 2011, finishing the campaign with a fifth place finish in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin and a 2-8 (2-5 in CCIW) record overall. His inaugural season was marked by a series of excruciatingly close losses, including five losses of eight points or less.

Cushman served as defensive coordinator for the Vikings in the 2008-2010 seasons. He was named head football coach in November 2010.

During his stint as coordinator, Cushman fashioned the Viking defense into a sound unit and the statistics certainly

prove that. His 2008 unit allowed just 13.4 points per game, which was seventh in NCAA Division III in points allowed and finished first in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in total defense. The 2009 team gave up 16.7 points per game and was second in the CCIW in total defense and the recently concluded 2010 season had the figures at 18.8 points per game and third in the league in total defense.

The Vikings compiled an overall record of 19-11 over the past three years while Cushman was in charge of the defense.

Augustana is Cushman's third head coaching job in a career that began in 1979. He had an 18-31 record in five seasons (1997-01) at Eastern Oregon University, an NCAA Division II/NAIA school in LaGrande, Ore. After his stint at Eastern Oregon, he was tapped to begin the football program at Feather River Community College in Quincy, Calif. In his very first season at Feather River, he guided the Golden Eagles to a 6-5 record and a berth in the CLO Bowl. He posted a 34-21 record in five seasons at Feather River and had his team in five straight bowl games. The best year for the Golden Eagles was a 9-2 mark in 2003.

He left Feather River after the 2006 season and spent one year as the special teams coordinator/defensive backs coach at Ithaca College in Ithaca, N.Y. He helped the Bombers go 8-3 and earn a spot in the NCAA Division III national playoffs.

Cushman has devoted his entire professional life to coaching football. After graduating from the University of Puget Sound in 1978 where he was a four-year letter winner and two-year starter, with a bachelor of arts degree in communications, he began his coaching odyssey at California State University - Chico in 1979.

In 1981 he moved to Butte Community College in Oroville, Calif., where he was the defensive coordinator from 1981-84. His next two stops were head coaching positions in the high school ranks. He was the head coach at Marysville High School in Marysville, Calif., from 1984-85 and had a similar position, although he also added head baseball coach to his resume, at St. Helena High School in St. Helena, Calif., during the 1986-87 school year.

He moved to Eastern Oregon University in time for the 1987-88 school year and began a 15-year association with the Mountaineers' athletic program. From 1987-97 he was the defensive coordinator in football, was the head baseball coach where he led EOU to three post-season appearances, and was an assistant professor of physical education. He was chosen in 2000 to win the Instructional Merit Award, the first faculty/coach to win the honor in the school's history. He was named the head football coach in 1997.

A 1974 graduate of Hood River Valley High School in Hood River, Ore., Cushman also has a master of arts degree in education/physical education from California State University - Chico, which he earned in 1982.

Cushman lives in Davenport with his wife, Jessica, and stepson Roman. He also has a daughter Cassie, a 2008 graduate of Mt. Holyoke College in South Hadley, Mass.

TOM CASEY (Defensive Coordinator)

Tom Casey was named the defensive coordinator for the Vikings in the summer of 2012 after spending seven years in a similar position at NCAA Division I Western Illinois. Casey and Cushman coached together at Feather River College in Quincy, California from 2002-05. A 1995 graduate of Oregon State University in Corvallis, Oregon with a Bachelor of Science degree in history, Casey got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant with the Beavers in 1993. After receiving his Master's of Education degree from Oregon State in 1997, he took a position as assistant coach at the United States Military Academy prep school in 1998. He was there for four years before joining Cushman at Feather River in 2002. He had a brief stint at Tyler

Junior College in Tyler, Texas before joining the Western Illinois staff in 2005. He coached a pair of finalists for the Buck Buchanan Player of the Year award while with the Leathernecks.



ZAC CONNORS (Offensive Coordinator)

The first hire of Rob Cushman's reign as the head football coach at Augustana was to name Zac Connors as the Vikings' new offensive coordinator. Connors, who possesses a wealth of experience in the spread offense, comes to Augustana after a year as an offensive assistant and special teams coordinator at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill, California. Before working at Diablo Valley, Connors was a graduate assistant at the University of Utah where he was involved in four straight bowl games as a member of the Utes' staff. Connors played four years of college football as a quarterback, competing during his final two years at Southern Utah where he served as team captain in 2005. He played his high school ball at Clayton

Valley High School in Concord, California where he was voted co-MVP and team captain as a senior. Connors has a bachelor's degree in physical education from Southern Utah (2006) and he is currently working on his master's degree in sports management from the University of Utah.



JEFF LINDMARK (Special Teams Coordinator/wide receivers)

From ball boy to player to coach, Jeff Lindmark has seen the Augustana program from a variety of angles. When his father worked the chain gang during his boyhood years, Jeff served as a ball boy for the Vikings. After graduating from Pleasant Valley High School in 1988 where he was a multi-sport standout, he played football and baseball at Augustana. During his senior year of 1991 he played an instrumental role in the Vikings 8-1 season that resulted in a CCIW championship. He joined the staff in a full-time capacity in 2005 and is the special teams coordinator after serving a four year stint as offensive coordinator. He spent five years as a teacher for at-risk students at

Pleasant Valley High School in Bettendorf, Iowa. He was an assistant baseball coach at Pleasant Valley from 2001 through the 2005 season. He taught physical education and sociology at Sherrard High School in Sherrard, Illinois from 1994 until 2000. Lindmark was the head football coach at Sherrard from 1995 through 1998. He was the head baseball coach at the school from 1994-00. After graduating from Augustana in February of 1993 with a degree in secondary/physical education he taught in the Riverdale (Illinois) school system and was an assistant football coach in the fall of 1993.



ANTHONY SCOTT (Offensive Line)

Anthony Scott joined the Augustana staff as the offensive line coach in February of 2012, replacing long-time Viking coach Tom Schmulbach, who retired after a 30 year career with the Vikings. Scott came to the Vikings from St. Augustine's College in Raleigh, North Carolina where he held a similar position for four year. During his time at St. Augustine's, the Falcons led the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association in rushing once (2010) and were second once (2008). Scott comes to Augustana from St. Augustine's College in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he held the same position. He also had stints as the offensive line coach at Lenoir-Rhyne and Brevard, like St. August-

tine's, both NCAA Division II institutions. His first coaching position was at East Forsythe High School in Winston-Salem, North Carolina where he was an assistant coach from 2003-06. Scott is a graduate of Georgia Southern University in Statesboro, Georgia, where he was an offensive lineman on the Eagles' 1999 and 2000 NCAA Division I-AA national championship teams. He received his bachelor's degree in broadcasting in 2001.



AARON CALL (Defensive Line)

A native of Wilton, Iowa, Call began coaching the defensive line for the Vikings, a position he has had since 2006. He was a first team all conference performer at defensive end in 2005 and helped lead Augustana to the CCIW title and into the NCAA Division III playoffs.



DICK BLAIR (Tight Ends)

A 1975 Augustana graduate, Dick Blair will be in his 11th year as an assistant coach at his alma mater. A native of Savanna, Illinois, his coaching career spans 28 years, starting in Newton, Iowa in 1975. For 10 years (1989 to 1999) he was the head coach at Riverdale High School in Port Byron, Illinois. He was a volunteer coach at St. Ambrose during the 2000 season before joining the Augustana staff in 2001 as the linebacker coach. He has since moved to the defensive backfield and this year will be working with the tight ends. He was a three year letter winner for the Vikings from 1972-74.



MARK READE (Recruiting Coordinator)

Mark Reade returned to his alma mater in March of 2008 to take on the role of recruiting coordinator. The son of legendary Augustana head coach Bob Reade, Mark brings a plethora of experience to the position. He held coaching positions on the football staffs of Rice, Clemson, Concordia and Eastern Illinois as well as a two year stint at LaSalle-Peru High School. He served as the head men and women's head track & field coach at Concordia for two years. He also spent time in the private sector, working for Country Insurance and The Home Depot. A Phi Beta Kappa student at Augustana who graduated Magna Cum Laude with degrees in business, finance and economics in 1993, Reade has also done graduate work at Clemson, East-

ern Illinois and Rice. He was a two sport standout in track & field and football with the Vikings, serving as team captain of the 1993 track team and qualifying for the national meet in the 400 hurdles.



DICK SKILLETT (Kickers)

Dick Skillett, a familiar name in both Quad City and Augustana circles joined the Augustana staff in 2010 and will help coach the kickers. Skillett, who retired after a 38 year career at Alcoa, has been involved with youth and high school programs and worked with several high school kickers in the area. Most notably was the work he did with his son Jeff, who was a national Punt/Pass/Kick champion and kicked for Iowa in the Rose Bowl. Dick, and his wife Linda are the parents of two sons: Jeff and Kevin. Kevin played one year of basketball at Augustana in 1990-91 and was a first team all-conference performer before transferring to Iowa where he enjoyed a three year career with the Hawkeyes. Both Jeff and Kevin are high school teachers and coaches.



ROB ERWIN (Defensive Backs)

Rob Erwin is back on the Vikings' staff after a two year absence. A 2008 Magna Cum Laude graduate of Augustana with a degree in math, Erwin spent three seasons (2007-08-09) working under then-head coach Jim Barnes. He worked with running backs, wide receivers, tight ends and linebackers during his time at his alma mater. In 2010 he took a position as a graduate assistant at Montana State where he worked with the wide receivers for the Big Sky Conference champions. He moved to Northern Michigan in 2011 and was the wide receivers and quarterbacks coach. He will work with the defensive backs at Augustana.



GARRETT RILEY (Running Backs)

Garrett Riley joined the Augustana staff as a running backs coach in the summer of 2012. He is a 2012 graduate of Texas Tech University with a degree in general business and a minor in exercise science. He played collegiately at both Texas Tech and Stephen F. Austin and was the Texas Class 2A Associated Press "Player of the Year" at Muleshoe High School in 2008. He helped coach quarterbacks at Roosevelt High School in Lubbock, Texas in the fall of 2011.



DREW HAWKEN (Linebackers)

A former three-year starter at fullback in the Big 10 while playing at Michigan State, Drew Hawken was chosen by head coach Rob Cushman to coach linebackers beginning in the summer of 2012. He was a three year recipient of the Big 10's Scholar-Athlete award from 2006-08 and he won the Spartan's Iron Man Award in 2009. He graduated from the Eli Broad College of Business with a Bachelor of Arts degree in supply chain management in 2009. He coached at Grandville High School and Jenison High School, both in Michigan, and he also served as a performance coach at MVP Sports Club in Holland, Michigan.



Linebacker Erik Westerberg returns after a stellar sophomore season to lead the Vikings defense. He was named to the all-conference and all-region teams and was also selected as a CoSIDA Academic All-American last year.

Vikings hope to learn from 2011 experience

When Rob Cushman is asked to assess the Augustana football team's chances for the 2012 season, he gets right to the point.

"Without question we have a lot of change from a year ago," said Cushman whose team went 2-8 overall and 2-5 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in his first year at the Vikings' helm. "It starts with a coaching staff that lost some very valuable and longtime members and it continues with the exciting plans for a new stadium and the fact that we will be playing on a new turf this fall. There is an excitement amongst our players as we start the year. Even with all the changes that have and will happen this program still has the same goals as always. We want to contend for a conference title and be a factor in the national picture."

Cushman's season of change began last winter when longtime assistant (and former Augustana head coach) Tom Schmulbach retired. Part-time assistants Mike Brewers and Jim Sanders decided to hang up their whistles as well after long and distinguished careers. In addition, Kyle Reade, who had a long-time association with the Augustana program, made a career change. In all, it left Cushman with a staff that now has five new assistant coaches, most notably Tom Casey and Anthony Scott. Casey will become the new defensive coordinator, allowing Cushman to focus on the whole program more as he relinquishes his former role of defensive coordinator. Scott will step into Schmulbach's shoes as the offensive line coach.

"Bringing new people on board is exciting because of the type of individuals who we were able to get. There is always a transition period with new staff members but it went smoothly during the off-season," said Cushman. "We are looking forward to getting started and our players have a renewed commitment to getting Augustana football back on track. The returning guys were not happy with what happened last year and you could see that attitude in the off-season."

What happened in 2011 was a plethora of games that were decided in the last minutes of games. Of the eight losses, five were decided by less than eight points and the Vikings trailed CCIW champion North Central on the road by just 10-3 before the Cardinals put up two late scores in the final minutes.

"I have been coaching 30-plus years and I don't think I have ever seen a season like that," said Cushman. "We all know that the ball bounces in funny ways but it sure didn't bounce our way last year. That was quite a learning experience for all of us and I think we learned from it."

Officially the Vikings return 12 starts (five on offense and seven on defense) from a year ago but in this day and age of situation substitutions, the number of players who saw significant action is certainly higher.

One area where the theme of change is paramount is on offense where a new quarterback will be asked to replace David Lee, who graduated after completely rewriting the Augustana record book. Lee erased the name of former NFL MVP Ken Anderson from the single game, season and career ledger in almost every category.

There will be a battle in the pre-season to see who will grab the position. Senior Nick Welch (**Oswego HS, Oswego, Ill.**) and junior Ken Clay (**Waubonsie Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) are the two returnees who will get the first shot at the position. However, there is a talented group of freshmen who could factor in here.

Senior Brett McWilliams (**Rockton Hononegah HS, Roscoe, Ill.**) and junior Eric Chandler (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) both made significant contributions at running back in 2011. McWilliams led the team in rushing with 427 yards on 109 attempts and scored five touchdowns. Chandler added 155 yards on 41 rushes with two scores. An additional boost could come from junior Alex Hembrey (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**), who missed the entire 2011 campaign due to a foot injury. He rushed for 158 yards on 29 carries as a freshman in 2010.

Sophomore Ben Hodges (**St. Charles North HS, Elburn, Ill.**) had a good year on the junior varsity team in 2011 and he could be a factor. Sophomore Antonio Owens (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) was a starter as a freshman in the slot position where he led team in all-purpose yardage with 692. He rushed for 129 yards on 29 attempts, caught 15 passes for 155 yards and added 408 yards on 24 kickoff returns. He will be used both as a running back and as a receiver. Sophomore Kyle Frake (**Clifton Central HS, Clifton, Ill.**) and junior Kyle Snow (**Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) could factor in as well.

Whoever wins the quarterback position will have junior Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) as a reliable target. Krantz snagged 24 passes last year for 299 yards and scored three touchdowns after catching nine for 125 as a freshman. Sophomore Torre Harrell (**Bloomington HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) could be a game breaker. He is an explosive athlete who won the CCIW title in the long jump at the outdoor track & field meet as a freshman. Senior Derek Schneeman (**Streator HS, Streator, Ill.**) will be counted on as well.

The tight end position has senior Marty Resner (**Oswego HS, Montgomery, Ill.**), junior Sean Mulholland (**Clinton HS/Prince of Peace HS, Clinton, Iowa**) and senior Eric Hansen (**Immaculate Conception HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**).

The offensive line was very young a year ago and three full-time starters return. Sophomore Anthony Roome (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**) and senior Mike Kautz (**Rock Island Alleman HS, East Moline, Ill.**) return at the tackle positions and senior Derek King (**Westmer HS, New Boston, Ill.**) is back at one of the guard slots. Junior Eric Link (**Sherrard HS, Aledo, Ill.**) and sophomores Greg Ferguson (**Plainfield South HS, Plainfield, Ill.**) and Alex Anderson (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**) will be battling for starting positions. Junior Eric Dratnol (**Kaneland HS, Kaneland, Ill.**) might have the inside track for the center position.

Since Cushman became the defensive coordinator in 2008, this area has always been strong and he is counting on that once again. He really likes the people who are occupying the "front-end" positions. Junior Carl Hartweg (**Illini West HS, Carthage, Ill.**) will anchor things from his nose guard position where he recorded 29 total tackles last fall, including a sack and two tackles for loss. Junior Will Hass (**Marian Central Catholic HS, Algonquin, Ill.**) will provide backup help.

Two fifth-year seniors occupy the end positions. Shane Holl (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) and Pete Schimeck (**Benet Academy, Naperville, Ill.**) are both experienced and productive. Holl was fifth on the team in tackles last year with 43 with five tackles for loss and two sacks while Schimeck had 18 tackles, four tackles for loss and three quarterback sacks. Senior Luke Anderson (**Lemont HS, Lemont, Ill.**) was also a starter last year and he had 30 tackles while sophomore Sean McIntyre (**Genoa-Kingston HS, Genoa, Ill.**) should get plenty of action.

The linebacking corps is led by junior Erik Westerberg (**York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**), who won Capital One Academic All-America honors as a sophomore. He led the team in total tackles with 106, including 72 solos which was the eight highest in NCAA Division III. He was a first team all-conference selection and made the all-region team. He was also listed on several 2012 pre-season All-American teams. Senior John Draminsky (**Kewanee Wethersfield HS, Kewanee, Ill.**) is coming off a good off-season. Senior Joe Weber (**Marmion Academy, South Elgin, Ill.**) earned all-conference recognition in 2011 and was named to some pre-season all-region teams. He was second on the Vikings in tackles last year with 48 with five tackles for loss and five quarterback sacks. Senior Andrew O'Reilly (**Driscoll Catholic HS, Elgin, Ill.**) and junior James Stratton (**Sherrard HS, Sherrard, Ill.**) lend quality depth.

Senior Robby Mago (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) heads up the outside linebackers. He was third on the squad in total tackles last year with 45 and he had three tackles for loss. Senior Nick Chandler (**Clinton HS, Clinton, Ill.**), junior Mike O'Donoghue (**Mundelein HS, Mundelein, Ill.**) and sophomore Jacob Benner (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) will join Mago.

The leader in the secondary is fifth-year senior Matt Glawe (**Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Winfield, Ill.**) at cornerback. Although he was injured during the latter part of the season, he did record 23 tackles and tied for the team lead in pass breakups with four. Sophomore Bo Goshorn (**Romeoville HS, Romeoville, Ill.**) was a pleasant surprise as a freshman when he totaled 31 tackles and had two interceptions from his safety position. The other safety could be sophomore Tim Maroder (**Burlington Central HS, Elgin, Ill.**). Junior Sean Walker (**Annawan HS, Annawan, Ill.**) and sophomore Ben Fornek (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) will battle for the cornerback slot opposite Glawe.

Senior Arnie Fitzwater (**Waterford Union HS, Waterford, Wis.**) at punter makes the Vikings solid in the special teams area. Fitzwater was the all-conference punter a year ago and finished 12th in the nation with an average of 40.50 yards per punt. He was the Vikings' special teams MVP and was an all-region selection. He was mentioned on several pre-season All-America teams. He set a school record with a 76 yard punt. Sophomore Brady Rogers (**Cherokee Trail HS, Parker, Colo.**) handled the placekicking chores last fall and was second on the team in scoring with 26 points. Fellow sophomore Conner Murray (**Conifer HS, Morrison, Colo.**) will battle Rogers for the kicking duties.

"We know we have to be more productive on offense this year," said Cushman. "We like what we have on defense and some facets of our special teams, especially in the kicking department, are very solid. We just need to come together as a team and I think we will be fine."

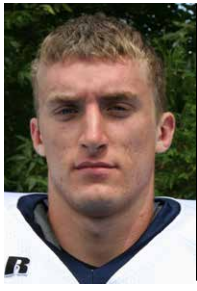

GALLANT EFFORT FALLS JUST SHORT AGAINST WEST GEORGIA

Buoyed by a 9-1 season in 1981 which included the first perfect (9-0) regular season since 1934; the first College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin football title since 1975 and just the second NCAA Division III playoff appearance in school history, hopes were high for the Vikings heading into 1982. A bevy of starters returned and head coach Bob Reade's charges did not disappoint.

With a stifling defense that allowed just 8.1 points per game and 80.1 yards rushing per contest combined with the multiple talents of quarterback Lance Hofer, Augustana won 11 straight games before falling to West Georgia. The Vikings dropped a 14-0 decision to the Braves in a defensive struggle in the 1982 Stagg Bowl for the national title.

Hofer, who had played for Reade at J.D. Darnall High School in Geneseo and led the Maple Leafs

to two state championships, was a rugged left hander. He passed for 945 yards and rushed for 527 during the 1982 season. He ran for 15 touchdowns and threw for nine and was nicked for just two interceptions. He was an easy choice for the CCIW "Offensive Player of the Year".

While Hofer and his mates were moving the ball and scoring points, his teammates on the defensive side of the ball were nearly immovable. With linebackers Jon Kuperus and Pete Kasap leading the way, the Vikings allowed an average of just 2.4 yards per carry rushing. The secondary stepped up and intercepted 27 passes as well. Four times during the season the Blue & Gold shut out opponents and only three times did Augustana allow more than double figures. That defense and an offense that would average 274.7 yards per game rushing carried the Vikings to another perfect 9-0 regular season and into the NCAA Division III playoffs for the second straight year.

Once in the playoffs, the first task was a formidable one as Augustana drew number one ranked Baldwin-Wallace on the Yellow Jackets fabled "Magic Carpet" at George Finnie Stadium in Berea, Ohio. Led by Hofer, junior halfback Craig Allison and sophomore wingback Ron Nelson, the Vikings offense battered what had been the number one ranked defense in the nation for 321 yards. That led the way for a 28-22 victory.

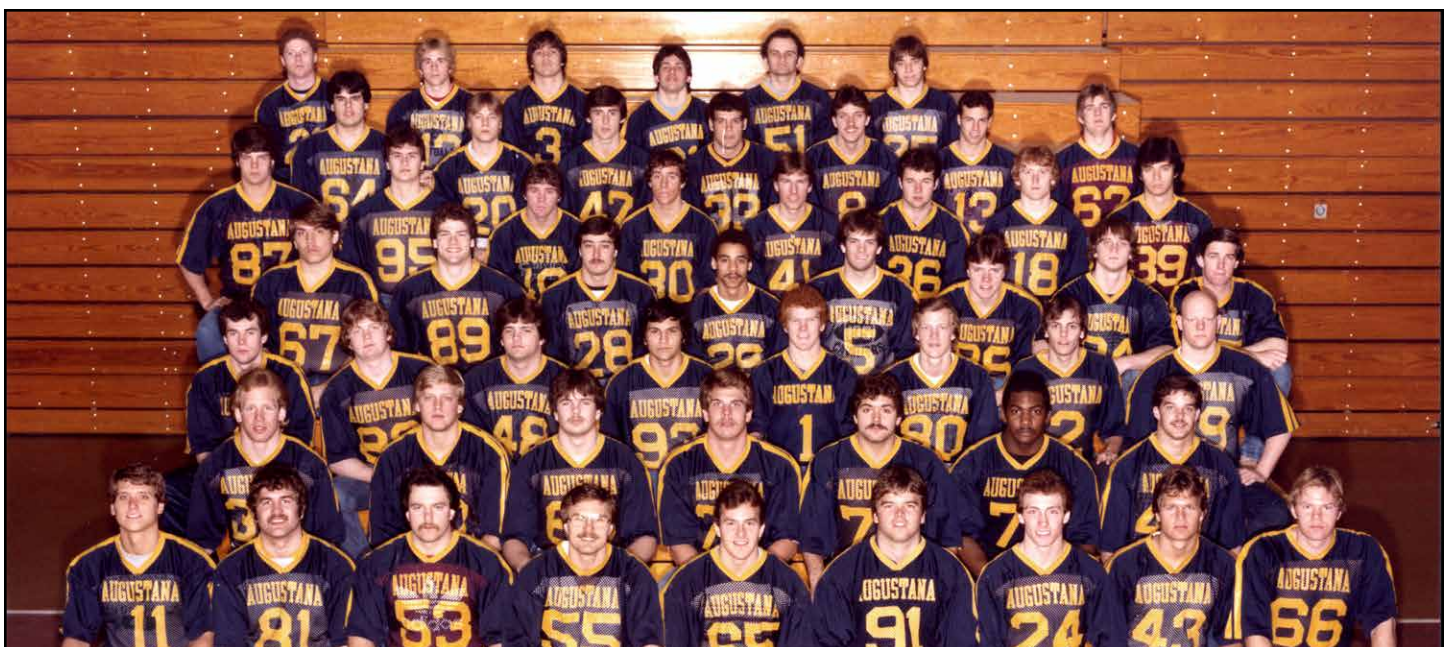
One week later the Vikings hosted St. Lawrence at Rock Island Public Schools Stadium and a large crowd witnessed a hard-hitting defensive struggle. Allison scored on a four yard run early

in the fourth quarter. Later in the stanza, St. Lawrence was driving for what could have been the tying score when cornerback Doug McCoy picked off a pass and returned it 92 yards for a touchdown with less than two minutes remaining to seal the 14-0 victory.

That shutout put Augustana in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl and the largest crowd in NCAA Division III championship history (estimated at 10,000) watched a titanic defensive struggle. West Georgia scored on a 71 yard pass with just :19 left in the second quarter for the first score and then tallied with 1:17 left in the game to seal the 14-0 victory.

THE YEAR OF THE COMEBACK AS PENNEY TO SINGBUSH NETS FIRST TITLE

One thing about that first championship - it wasn't easy.

It wasn't easy when quarterback Jay Penney had to drive his team 54 yards with less than two minutes to play and the Vikings out of timeouts to win a hard-fought 23-16 regular season game against Elmhurst.

It wasn't easy when Penney had to bring his team from behind in the first round of the playoffs on a mud-splattered Ericson Field. The Vikings beat Adrian 22-21 with Penney scoring the decisive two-point conversion with just 3:01 left in the game.

And it certainly wasn't easy when Penney had to rally his team from a 17-7 deficit late in the fourth quarter of the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl. Augustana scored two late touchdowns to secure the NCAA Division III title with a 21-17 win over Union College in Kings Island, Ohio.

While there are a multitude of factors why Augustana won the 1983 national championship, one of the biggest reasons was a passing combination that dated back to junior high school. Penney, the cool, hard-nosed veteran signal caller, hooked up with his former schoolboy teammate Norm Singbush every time things looked bleak.

It was Singbush who caught the seven-yard pass from Penney to pull out the Elmhurst game. It was Singbush who caught the seven-yard scoring toss from Penney to win the Adrian game. And yes, it was Singbush who hauled in the two-yard pass from Penney to win the Union game.

On a team that averaged 300 yards per game on the ground and boasted two 1,000 yard rushers (halfback Craig Allison and wingback George Velasquez), it was a quarterback who would pass for less than 600 yards and a tight end who would catch absolutely anything thrown his way that eventually made the 1983

Augustana Vikings the champions of NCAA Division III.

Reade's team went 12-0 on the year and for the third straight season put together an undefeated regular season. Reade was chosen national Coach of the Year and tackle Kurt Kapischke, linebacker Pete Kasap, runningback Craig Allison and defensive back Doug McCoy all earned All-American honors.

THE KIDS WIN A TITLE WITH SEVEN SOPHOMORES IN THE STARTING LINEUP

There was no logical reason why Augustana should have repeated its national title in 1984. Head coach Bob Reade started seven sophomores and had 11 first year starters in the lineup when the season kicked off in September.

Win the national championship is exactly what the Vikings did, however. They compiled a perfect 12-0 record for the second consecutive season.

They did it with a fearsome defense despite the fact that seven of the starters on that unit were new.

They did it with a bruising, ball control offense despite the fact that four of the starters were sophomores.

But mostly they did it because they had fun playing the game as Reade so succinctly pointed out. "We were just a bunch of young kids who listened well and played hard all of the time."

Oh, there were some veterans like All-Americans Greg King, Norm Singbush, Ron Nelson and Joe Wheeler, but mostly it was the performance of sophomores Brad Price, Kirk Bednar, Mike Gray, Lynn Thomson and Troy Westerman who spearheaded the charge.

The new faces in the lineup proved to be invaluable in keeping the rest of the team from resting on its laurels of a year before.

It took a while for the defense to get the hang of things but in the last six games the Vikings allowed just 38 points. After breezing through the regular season with a 9-0 record, the Blue & Gold beat Dayton 14-13 in a slugfest in the first round of the playoffs. In the second round the Union Dutchmen came into Rock Island looking for revenge from the 1983 championship game. Instead of revenge, Union got a 23-6 dismantling as an aroused Augustana defense intercepted a school record seven passes.

In the Stagg Bowl, Nelson gained 155 yards and scored three touchdowns. The defense allowed just 18 yards rushing as

Augustana defeated Central of Iowa 21-12 and the Vikings were champions once again.

Nelson was the workhorse of the offense from his fullback position and Price added a breakaway threat from his halfback position. They both wen over 1,000 yards on the season. Senior Joe Wheeler was the leader from his linebacker position and won the CCIW Most Valuable Defensive Player award. Center Greg King was selected as the CCIW's Most Valuable Offensive Player despite playing on the offensive line.

THE LUCKY THIRTEEN - VIKINGS PUSH WIN STREAK TO 37 STRAIGHT

The NCAA expanded the division III play-offs to 16 teams in 1985, instead of the previous total of eight. It didn't really make any difference to veteran head coach Bob Reade, however, as his Augustana Vikings ripped off a perfect 13-0 record en route to a third straight national championship. In the process the Vikings moved their winning streak to 37 in a row.

That is not to say that 1985 did not have its anxious moments. The most nerve-wracking occurred on September 28 at McCully Field in Wheaton, Illinois when starting quarterback Kirk Bednar went

down with a season ending knee injury.

The Vikings won that game 26-14 and left the field not knowing what they would do at the quarterback position. After two games of tinkering, Reade finally tapped little known sophomore Greg Wallace to handle the signal calling duties. Wallace had not even gone out for football in 1984, concentrating instead on basketball and baseball. He was not big nor did he possess the strongest throwing arm. He did have the one ability that Reade always put first when searching for quarterbacks. What he could do, and do very well, was win football games. He proved his worth immediately as he threw a touchdown pass in a 9-3 Homecoming win over Millikin in just his second start and then proceeded to get better each week.

With a new quarterback, Reade relied on his vaunted ground game and the Viking runners went wild. Junior Brad Price went over the 1,000 yard mark for the second season in a row and fullback Shane McCormick and wingbacks Bob Guerrieri and Dennis Fraikes all picked up yardage in big chunks.

The defense was once again outstanding as senior strong safety Mark Long led the

way en route to an All-American season.

In the NCAA Playoffs, Augustana beat Albion 26-10 in the first round and then survived a scare by Mount Union in the second round before winning 21-14. In the semifinals the Vikings held off revenge minded Central of Iowa 14-7 and then dusted off Ithaca 20-7 for the title.



Just one year earlier Greg Wallace had not even gone out for football. When returning starter Kirk Bednar went down for the season with a knee injury in the third game, however, Wallace took over and went on to lead the Vikings to a 13-0 record and the 1985 NCAA Division III national title.

SIMPLY PUT - THE BEST EVER AS SENIORS END CAREER UNBEATEN WITH FOUR RINGS

As the final gun sounded to end the 1986 Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl the seniors on the Augustana College football team became a part of history. They walked off the field at Phenix City Municipal Stadium in Phenix City, Alabama knowing that they accomplished a feat that can never be topped.

When tri-captains Troy Westerman, Lynn Thomsen and Brad Price picked up the NCAA Division III national championship trophy, it marked the first time collegiate football history that one class had a hand in four straight national titles. The Vikings lost in the 1982 Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl to West Georgia by a score of 14-0. That would be the last time that Augustana would taste defeat until November 28, 1987.

In 1983 the Vikings went 12-0 and beat Union

of New York 21-17 for the title. In 1984 Augustana went 12-0 once again and this time beat Central of Iowa 21-12 for the title. The record moved to 13-0 in 1985 as the Vikings beat Ithaca of New York by a score of 20-7 for the crown. In 1986 Augie smashed Salisbury State 31-3 in the championship game to cap a 12-0-1 season.

The seniors totaled 14 on the 1986 team and they had a hand in a record that can only grow in magnitude. A shocking 0-0 tie to Elmhurst to open the 1985 season was the difference between a 50 game winning streak and a 50 game unbeaten string. No school in college football history has ever sent an entire class through all four years with national championships.

Once again head coach Bob Reade used his usual combination of a punishing rushing attack mixed with a smothering defense to lead the Vikings to a sixth straight undefeated regular season. Price led the Augustana offense for the third year in a row from his halfback position. He picked up 1,218 yards on 226 carries and scored 18 touchdowns for a total of 108 points. His rushing total was his third straight year over 1,000 yards and he finished his career as the school's second leading rusher with 3,399 yards and second leading scorer with 210 points.

A young offensive line continued to jell as the season went along and by year's end the Vikings were averaging 286.3 yards per game rushing and 33.9 points per game. While it took the offense a few games to get into the groove, the defense never missed a beat. Starting a total of seven seniors, this unit allowed a total of just 37 points, which averaged out to 5.6 per game.

In four playoff games against the finest teams in

the nation, Augustana allowed a total of just 27 points. Running against the Vikings was virtually impossible as opponents could gain just 331 yards on 398 attempts for an average of 0.8 yards per carry. Passing was equally dangerous as Augustana defenders intercepted 42 passes.

Tackle Lynn Thomsen anchored the defense as he had been doing for four years. Thomsen started all 50 games of his Augustana career and came away with a career record of 49-0-1 as a starter.



Brad Price ended his career with over 3,000 yards and was the Most Valuable Player in the 1986 Stagg Bowl after he rushed for 169 yards and scored three touchdowns in a 31-3 win over Salisbury State.

THE PLAYOFF YEARS

1976

Although Joe Thompson had one of the greatest seasons in Augustana school history, rushing for a still standing school record of 1,290 yards on 274 attempts, it was a 39 yard field goal by a kicker who was not even used on extra points which may have provided the margin for this first ever playoff appearance for the Vikings. Ben Newcomb was in his eighth year as the Augustana head coach and his team went 7-2 in the regular season and placed second in the CCIW after winning the title a year earlier.

Although the season ended with a crushing 46-7 defeat to eventual champion St. John's in the first round of the NCAA Division III playoffs, it was still a historic first for the Blue & Gold. Sophomore place-kicker Dave Johnson scored his only three points of the entire season when he connected on a 39-yard field goal against Illinois Wesleyan in the season finale in Bloomington. The Vikings beat the Titans 16-13 and it was Johnson's field goal, which came with 10:25 left in the third quarter, which gave his team its first lead of the game at 10-7. Thompson scored with 5:44 left to make it 16-7 and then Wesleyan tallied with 1:06 left in the game to make it 16-13.

That victory was enough to allow Newcomb's team to make the playoffs for the first time in school history but offensively this year belonged to Thompson. Thompson scored 16 touchdowns and led the team in kickoff returns and was second in pass receiving as well. He was selected as the CCIW's Most Outstanding Offensive Player and was chosen to the NCAA Division III All-America team as well.

1981

An undefeated regular season ended with a 19-7 loss to defending NCAA Division III national champion Dayton on a frozen astro-turf at the Flyers Welcome Stadium but the stage was set for Augustana greatness.

This was Bob Reade's third year at the Viking helm and his team just got better and better as the season progressed. The Blue & Gold turned in only the second undefeated regular season in school history - Shorty Almqvist's 1934 team was the first - and won the first

of what would be a string of eight straight CCIW titles.

Reade alternated backfields constantly during the year with seven different rushers totaling over 210 yards on the season. While Craig Allison led all rushers with 648 yards, it was quarterback Lance Hofer who led the team in scoring with 48 points. Because of a NCAA transfer rule, Hofer was ineligible to participate in the playoffs but sophomore Jay Penney was no slouch. He had started four games the year before and he would lead the Vikings to the NCAA Division III title as a senior in 1983.

Defense was the key to this team as middle guard Tom Losby, linebackers Jon Kuperus and Pete Kasap and defensive backs Pete Vernon and Doug McCoy helped limit opponents to a mere 55.5 yards per game rushing.

1987

The longest unbeaten streak in NCAA Division III history ended in a pulsating 38-36 loss to Dayton at Welcome Stadium and with it went Augustana's hopes of capturing a fifth straight national title. Despite the heroics of the passing combination of quarterback Greg Wallace and wide receiver Eric Welgat, the Vikings fell to the Flyers. The loss ended what had been a perfect 10-0 season up until that point and it also snapped the Vikings unbeaten streak at 60 games - dating back to a loss to West Georgia in the 1982 Stagg Bowl.

This was the year of the offense as Wallace spearheaded the charge for an offensive team that averaged 346.5 yards per game rushing

Wingback Dennis Fraikes led the team in rushing with 1,134 yards - averaging an unheard of 8.3 yards per carry while Bob Reade's son - freshman Barry Reade - led the team in scoring with 79 points. Wallace threw for 835 yards, mostly to Welgat (25 catches for 605 yards and 11 touchdowns) and tight end Tom Kula (12 receptions for 164 yards). The defense got All-American seasons from defensive end Carleton Beasley and linebacker Mike Ricketts.

1988

The Vikings came within a whisker of playing in a sixth Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, falling to Central of Iowa by a score of 23-17 in a game played in Pella, Iowa in the NCAA division III semifinals. Instead of going to back to Phenix City, Alabama, Bob Reade's Vikings made the trip home to Rock Island but this was a very good season. This team came back from adversity, becoming the first Augustana team to suffer defeat in the regular season since 1980 when Carroll picked up a 24-21 victory in Waukesha, Wisconsin in the fourth week of the season.

That loss snapped a 70 game unbeaten regular season streak, which started on October 18, 1980. From that point on the Vikings were playing for their playoff lives but they came through every week. Senior fullback Erik Burgwald (1,275 yards on 250 attempts) and sophomore wingback Rick Papke (1,087 yards on 148 attempts) formed a 1,000 yard duo and senior center John Bothe was named the CCIW's Most Valuable Offensive Player. The defense, which was tested early in the year, allowed just 24 total points over the final four regular season games.

1989

Only one team was able to defeat the Vikings in this year but it was the same one - twice. Millikin bounced Augustana 33-8 at home on November 4, which snapped a 52 game home winning streak spanning nine years. That came in the eighth week of the season and left the Vikings streak of eight straight NCAA Division III Playoff appearances in jeopardy. In the ninth week of

the season, however, Augustana beat North Central 17-6 while two teams ranked ahead of the Vikings in the North Region were losing. That series of events gave Bob Reade's crew the fourth and final spot in the playoffs.

The playoff opponent was Millikin and although the game was much closer, the Big Blue prevailed 21-12 in a game played in Decatur, Illinois.

Junior wingback Rick Papke, although he did not approach his 1,000 yard season of 1988, still managed to lead the Vikings in rushing with 763 yards on 147 attempts while scoring three touchdowns. Barry Reade, Bob's son who handled the quarterbacking and place-kicking chores, led the team in scoring with 64 points.

1990

Battling uphill odds all year long, the Augustana Vikings ended up surprising all the "experts" during the 1990 season. Coming off a year in which they failed to win the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin for the first time since 1980, and overcoming a potentially crushing mid-season defeat at the hands of Carroll College, veteran head coach Bob Reade's team seemed to thrive on confounding the experts.

In 1989 Augustana ended up 8-2 with both defeats coming to Millikin. The Vikings had been second in the league in 1989 but still managed to make the NCAA Division III playoffs for a record ninth straight year.

In 1990 the NCAA playoff streak climbed to 10 straight years but this time Augustana did it from its familiar perch atop the CCIW. Reade's Vikings finished with an overall record of 8-2 and a 7-1 mark in the CCIW, good enough for the team's ninth league title in the past 10 years and 13th conference title since the CCIW was formed in 1946. The season, which began with a 37-12 win over North Central, ended with a 24-14 defeat at Dayton in the first round of the NCAA playoffs.

with Wisconsin-Platteville. Obviously the Vikings learned their lessons of the past two years as they defeated the Pioneers 34-24, coming from 10 points down in the second quarter. That set off a fine season, one which resulted in Augustana winning the CCIW title for the 16th time in school history - a

league record - and saw the Vikings advance to the NCAA Division III playoffs for the 12th time. Juniors Scott Tumilty at runningback and Rusty Van-Wetzinga at linebacker were named CCIW's MVPs on offense and defense respectively for a team which lost in the first round of the NCAA Division III playoffs to eventual national champion Albion by a score of 28-21.

1999

In one of the most emotional seasons in Augustana history, the Vikings finished 9-2 and won the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin for the 18th time. For the first time ever, the NCAA awarded automatic playoff berths to league champions and the Blue & Gold snatched that up as well. It was the 13th playoff appearance since 1976.

Through it all, the Vikings had to cope with the fact that head coach Tom Schmulbach was sidelined with throat cancer. Longtime defensive coordinator Larry Johnsen took over while Schmulbach was recovering from his mid-August surgery.

It was vintage Augustana football as the rushing attack, led by quarterback Joe Schmulbach - Tom's son and fullback Ben Nelson, finished second in NCAA Division III with an average of 337.7 yards per game. All-American guard Mack Hay and tackle J.D. Sheldon helped pave the way with two freshmen in the offensive line.

Defensively, cornerback Jason Fosdick earned All-American honors and finished second in the nation in inter-

ceptions with 10. Linebacker Jeremy Drish and tackle Josh Johnson also were named to All-American teams.

In the playoffs, Augustana beat St. Norberts 39-32 in the first round before falling at three time defending NCAA champion Mount Union in the semifinals by a score of 42-33.

2001

It was business as usual for Augustana as the 2001 squad won the CCIW title for the 19th time and earned the school's 14th trip to the NCAA Playoffs. The Vikings finished the season 10-2 overall and 6-1 in the conference and set eight new school records along the way.

The Vikings led the nation in rushing with an average of 370.4 yards per game, the highest average in school history. All-Americans J.D. Sheldon and Bob Paulin anchored a powerful offensive line which paved the way for another All-American, Dave Chorney. Chorney set Augustana records with 1,486 rushing yards and 20 touchdowns and was named CCIW Offensive Player of the Year.

Defensively, the Vikings pitched three shutouts and held opponents to only 12.9 points per game. They were led by end Tim Williams, who earned All-American honors and finished the season with 15.5 sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss.

The biggest win of the season came in week seven as the eighth ranked Vikings took on ninth ranked Millikin. With Big Blue leading 17-14 and less than three minutes remaining, safety Matt Furlong recovered a huge fumble to set up the winning drive. After four straight running plays, quarterback Brad Wendell threw a 19 yard strike to All-American tight-end Jim Triveri in the back of end zone to give Augustana the lead with just 1:08 remaining. The defense then held Millikin to give the Vikings a 21-17 win.

Augustana stumbled a bit to close out the season with a heart stopping 34-32 loss at Wheaton, but the

Vikings bounced back with a resounding 54-14 win over Defiance in the first round of the playoffs before falling to eventual national champion Mount Union 32-7 in the second round.

Heading into the 2005 season the Vikings of head coach Jim Barnes garnered little respect. Questions abounded about the defense and the lack of any kind of passing game. For the first time since 1982 Augustana was not included in any preseason top 20 poll and the Vikings were picked for fourth in the CCIW coaches poll.

Confounding the experts, the Blue & Gold shook off a season opening 25-24 overtime loss to Central of Iowa and roared through the CCIW undefeated. With an offense that pounded out 346.3 yards per game rushing, the concerns about the lack of a passing game proved moot. In fact, the Vikings set an NCAA Division III national record for fewest pass attempts in a single season with 33. The 2.75 attempts per game shattered the old mark of 4.00 per game set by Wisconsin-River Falls in 1988.

Fullback Mike Guzman led the team in rushing with 1,089 yards, halfback Aaron Kuzniar chipped in with 932 and quarterback Matt Roe worked his option wizardry to the tune of 692 yards and a team leading 12 touchdowns. All-American tackle Mike Zeifert helped pave the way up front.

A defense that was much maligned in the preseason came of age quickly and after allowing 51 points in the first two games, surrendered just 35 over the next five. Included in that stretch were road shutouts over Carthage (7-0 on October 8) and Millikin (23-0 on October 22). Cornerback Tom Anthony led the nation in interceptions with 13. Anthony was the "Defensive Player of the Year in the CCIW and was a first team NCAA Division III All-America selection. Safety Travis Shea, who had seven interceptions, was also named to the All-America team.

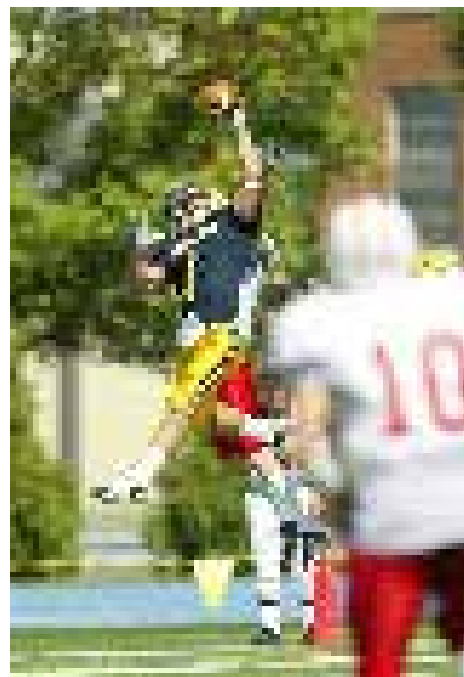
Josh Patterson kicked a field goal with no time on the clock to defeat North Central 20-17 on November 5. That win clinched the 20 conference title in Augustana history and propelled the Vikings into the NCAA Division III playoffs for the 15th time.

After defeating Lakeland 49-22 in the first round, the season ended with a 44-7 loss at eventual national champion Mount Union in the round of 16.

Barnes was named the CCIW "Coach of the Year" after guiding his team to a 10-2 overall record and a 7-0 mark in the conference. It was also the 27th consecutive winning season for Augustana.

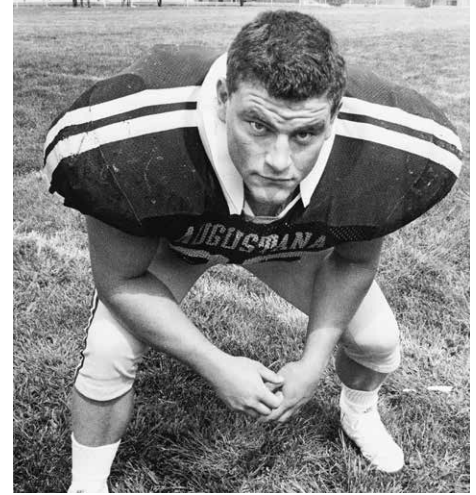

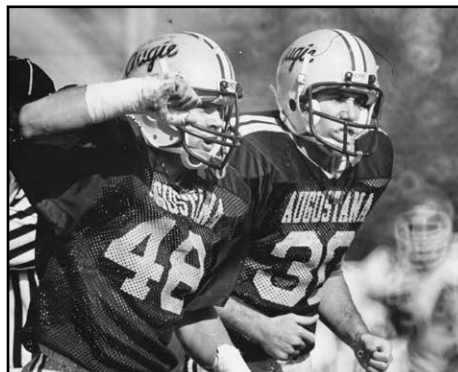

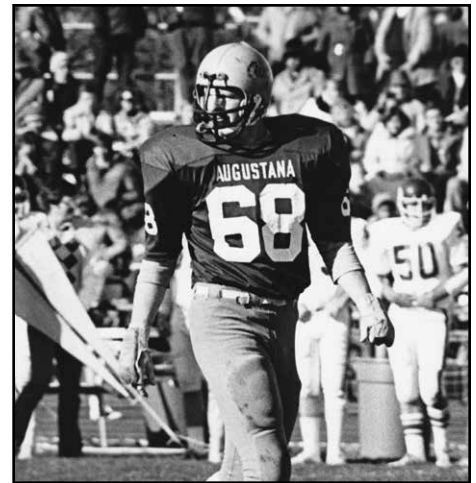

Rob Cushman's first year at Augustana filled with exciting finishes

The Augustana football team finished the 2011 season 2-8 overall and tied for fifth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin at 2-5. Three of the team's losses were to NCAA playoff qualifiers and a fourth came at the hands of an 8-2 Adrian team. Senior Quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) closed the book on a record-setting career and long-time Viking assistant and former head coach Tom Schmulbach wrapped up a remarkable 30-year stint on the Augustana sidelines.

Despite a tough season which included several excruciatingly narrow defeats, the Vikings continued traditions of academic and athletic excellence. Lee was named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Sophomore linebacker Erik Westerberg (**York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**) earned first team academic all-district and second team academic All-America honors from Capital One and CoSIDA. In addition, seniors Lee, Kelly Clennon (**Joliet Catholic HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and Ben Hall (**University HS, Normal, Ill.**) were chosen to play in the 2011 Tazon de Estrellas (Bowl of the Stars) on Saturday, December 17 in Puebla, Mexico. Clennon was the Vikings' starting center this season and Hall started the year at free safety before injuries in the secondary forced a move to cornerback.

Augustana opened the season with a rare Thursday night contest at Ericson Field against a Dubuque team that would go on to finish 9-2, win the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and reach the NCAA Division III playoffs. A pair of fourth-quarter turnovers proved costly as the Vikings fell to the Spartans 18-13. The Augustana defense held the high-powered Dubuque offense to 18 points and 373 total yards. In their other 10 games this season, the Spartans averaged almost 44 points and over 500 yards of total offense per contest.

The Vikings dropped a 31-23 decision on the road at Central before returning home to face Adrian. The Bulldogs got a 45-yard Logan Mitseff field goal with no time on the clock to hand Augustana a 17-14 defeat. The Viking opened CCIW play the following week by hosting Millikin. Again, a late field goal resulted in an Augustana loss. This time it was Austin Brettschneider hitting a 37-yarder with one second left to lift the Big Blue to a 30-27 win.

Coach Rob Cushman's club then hit the road for Naperville, Illinois and a date with the nation's 6th-ranked team and eventual CCIW champion, North Central. In one of their best performances of the year, the Vikings trailed the Cardinals just 10-3 with under six minutes to go. They had North Central pinned at its own two-yard line and facing third-and-13. Unfortunately, the Cardinals converted and went on to complete a 95-yard touchdown drive to make it 17-3. An interception return for a touchdown in the last minute made the final 24-3.

The Vikings got their first win of the season, 19-13 over Carthage at Ericson Field and followed that up with a 27-24 homecoming win over North Park. In that game, Augustana was decked out in special gold jerseys, the first time since 1983 the Vikings had sported gold tops. Westerberg made 14 tackles, including 13 solo, against North Park to earn CCIW Defensive Player of the Week honors.

After a 36-7 loss at Wheaton, Augustana dropped another heartbreaker to Elmhurst at home. Trailing 28-21 late in the fourth quarter, Lee led the Vikings on a 95-yard drive that was capped off when he connected with senior A.J. Hoger (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) for a touchdown from two yards out and 41 seconds remaining. However, on the ensuing two-point conversion, Danny Hess' (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) pass fell incomplete in the end zone, allowing the Bluejays to escape with a 28-27 win.

Augustana wrapped up the season with a 34-12 loss at Illinois Wesleyan.

Statistically, the Vikings averaged 17.2 points and 286.1 total yards per game in 2011, while allowing 25.5 points and 390.1 yards per contest.

This year's defense was led by Westerberg, a first team All-CCIW honoree, who recorded a team-high 106 tackles—72 of which were solo stops. He finished eighth in the nation in solo tackles and tied for 34th in total tackles. In CCIW play, he led the conference in both total and solo stops with 72 and 51, respectively. Seniors Hess and Shane Holl (**Batavia HS, North Aurora, Ill.**) and junior Joe Weber (**Marmion Academy, South Elgin, Ill.**) tied for the team lead in tackles for loss with five each. Weber, a second team All-CCIW selection, was the Vikings' leader with five sacks and three fumble recoveries. Hall and freshman Bo Goshorn (**Romeoville HS, Romeoville, Ill.**) each intercepted a pair of passes to tie for the team lead.

On offense, Lee finished the year with 165 completions in 282 attempts (58.5%) for 1,713 yards, giving him three of the top four single-season passing yardage totals in Augustana history. He threw for nine touchdowns and was intercepted seven times. He finished his career as a holder of eight school passing and total offense records. He set career records for pass completions (515) and attempts (839) as well as single-season marks for passing yards (2,411), pass completions (195), pass attempts (317) and total offense (2,665). Each of the season records was set in 2010. In addition, Lee holds single-game standards for pass completions, with 28 (achieved on three occasions) and passing yards, with 429.

Senior wide receiver Zachary McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) was the team's leading receiver this season with 34 catches for 409 yards. His 2011 reception total is tied for the 10th-best single season mark in school history and he finished sixth in career receptions with 81 and fifth in career receiving yards with 1,329. He was a second team All-CCIW selection this year. Senior tight end Keith Abbey (**Rich East HS, Park Forest, Ill.**), with 26 catches for 285 yards and four touchdowns and sophomore Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**), with 24 grabs for 299 yards and three scores, were Lee's other top targets.

The running game was led by junior Brett McWilliams (**Hononegah HS, Roscoe, Ill.**), who carried 109 times for 427 yards and five touchdowns. Hoger was next with 161 yards on 36 carries, followed by sophomore Eric Chandler (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) (41-155-2 TD's), Lee (67-154-4) and freshman Antonio Owens (**Naper-ville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) (29-129).

Junior Arnie Fitzwater (**Union HS, Waterford, Wis.**), a first team All-CCIW pick, led the conference in punting with a gross average of 41.0 yards per kick in league play and a net average of 36.9. Overall this season, Fitzwater posted averages of 40.5 yards gross (12th in the nation) and 36.0 net (which placed Augustana sixth in the nation as a team).

Schmulbach closed the book this year on a tremendous 30-year career at Augustana. He joined coach Bob Reade's staff in 1982 and helped guide the Vikings to five consecutive appearances in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl and an unmatched four straight NCAA Division III national championships. He took over as head coach in 1995 after Reade's retirement and led the team to a 34-13 (.723) record and two conference championships in five years. A bout with cancer forced him to step away from coaching in 1999, but he returned to the Viking staff as an assistant in 2002. In 28 seasons on the Augustana sidelines, Schmulbach was a part of 15 CCIW championships and 223 wins against just 66 losses and one tie.

DUBUQUE 18, AUGUSTANA 13 on September 1 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill.—A valiant second-half comeback came up just short Thursday night as Augustana dropped an 18-13 decision to Dubuque in Rob Cushman's Viking head coaching debut. The Spartans jumped out to a 18-0 halftime lead before Augustana came back to cut the lead to 18-13 early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings had a chance to take the lead on four possessions in the final period, but couldn't come up with the winning score.

The Augustana defense forced the Spartans into a three-and-out on the first possession of the game, but the Dubuque offense got on a roll after that, scoring touchdowns on three of its next four possessions and rolling up 303 yards of total offense in the first half. Running back Justin Spaulding capped an eight-play, 80-yard drive, scoring from 13 yards out to make it 6-0 Spartans with 8:01 left in the first quarter. The point after was no good.

After forcing an Augustana punt, the Spartans got on the board again. This time it was quarterback Wyatt Hanus hooking up with Miles Hookstead on a four-yard scoring pass just before the end of the first period. That drive also covered 80 yards—this time in 10 plays. Dubuque went for two but was denied by the Viking defense, leaving the score at 12-0.

After the Vikings stopped one Dubuque drive by recovering a fumble, the visitors put together yet another 80-yard march, culminated in a four-yard touchdown pass from Hanus to Kevin MacCudden with 3:12 left in the half. The Spartans failed to convert a PAT for the third time and the score was 18-0 at intermission.

The second half was an entirely different story as the Vikings took the kickoff and ran off an 18-play, 79-yard scoring drive which consumed 10 minutes. Junior running back Brett McWilliams (**Hononegah HS, Roscoe, Ill.**) capped it off with a one-yard touchdown run to get the home team on the scoreboard.

A well-rested Augustana defensive unit allowed Dubuque just three plays for minus five yards on its opening possession of the second half and the Vikings got the ball back at the Spartan 38 with three minutes left in the third quarter. Nine plays and three-and-a-half minutes later junior running back Nate Pena (**Neuqua Valley HS, Bolingbrook, Ill.**) went in from five yards out to cut the margin to 18-13, where it stayed when the attempt at a two-point conversion failed.

After the Vikings stopped a Dubuque drive on downs at the Augustana 34, the hosts looked to continue their momentum by striking quickly. Senior quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) found Zachary McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) wide open behind the Spartan secondary. However, McCullough couldn't reel in the toss and Augustana went three-and-out on the series.

The Viking defense continued to come up with stops, but the offense couldn't capitalize, committing turnovers on its next two possessions. The hosts had one final gasp after a Steve Jones punt pinned them at their own one-yard line with 1:01 left, but four plays couldn't produce a first down and the Spartans were able to take a knee to end the game.

McWilliams carried 17 times for 68 yards to lead the Viking ground game. Lee connected on 18 of 32 passes for 146 yards with one interception. McCullough caught six passes for 40 yards and senior tight end Keith Abbey (Rich East HS, Park Forest, Ill.) had five grabs for 32 yards. Sophomore Erik Westerberg (**York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**) was the leading Viking tackler with 10 total tackles on six solo stops and four assists.

Spaulding ran for 147 yards on 24 carries, but the Vikings limited him to just 21 yards on 10 carries in the second half. Hanus completed 20 of 26 passes for 168 yards and two scores.

A week from this Saturday, on September 10, the 0-1 Vikings head to Pella, Iowa to face the Central Dutch. Game time for that contest is scheduled for 1:00 p.m.

CENTRAL OF IOWA 31 , AUGUSTANA 23 on September 10 in Pella, Iowa

PELLA, Iowa—Senior quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) threw for two touchdowns and ran for another, but it wasn't enough to prevent Augustana from going down to defeat against Central 31-23 Saturday at Schipper Stadium. The Dutch duo of Nate and Jeremy Snead were keys to the home team's victory.

The game started off well for the Vikings as they took the opening kickoff and went 78 yards in 12 plays. The drive took six minutes off the clock and was culminated with a seven-yard Lee to Jack Gilleland (**Marian Central HS, McHenry, Ill.**) touchdown pass. Freshman Antonio Owens (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) caught a 24-yard toss from Lee to start the drive and also had jet sweep runs of six and 11 yards on the march. Lee completed 4-of-4 passes for 42 yards.

Central responded by going 56 yards in 12 plays, but its drive was thwarted when Augustana's Danny Hess (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) stripped the Dutch's Ross Doehrmann of the ball and Ben Hall (**University HS, Normal, Ill.**) recovered at the Viking 19-yard line.

A seven-yard touchdown pass from Central's Nate Snead to Jeremy Wilkin on the second play of the second quarter, along with Kevin Sheldon's PAT, evened the score at seven. The Vikings retook the lead less than five minutes later when freshman Brady Rogers (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) capped an 11-play, 67-yard drive by drilling a 42-yard field goal with yardage to spare.

A pair of Augustana penalties on the next possession helped Central go 81 yards in 10 plays to grab its first lead of the game at 14-10. That's the way the half would end as Rogers 48-yard attempt at the gun missed wide left.

After each team went three-and-out on its first possessions of the second half, the Snead brothers team up for what may have been the game's key play. From the Central 36-yard line, Nate found Jeremy in a seam just past midfield and the senior wideout weaved his way through the Viking secondary for a 64-yard touchdown. Sheldon's extra point made it 21-10 Dutch at the 10:00 mark of the third quarter.

This time it was Augustana's turn to respond. Lee connected for a key 34-yard pass play to Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) on third-and-seven to keep the drive alive. He then hit Zachary McCullough for 17 yards on the next play and finished off the drive with a 14-yard keeper to cut the Central lead to 21-16. The point after was no good.

A 37-yard Sheldon field goal made it 24-16 and then the Dutch's Adam Petz picked off a Lee pass and returned it to the Viking three. Doehrmann went in one play later from four yards out to make the score 31-16. It stayed that way when Central came up with a goal line stand on Augustana's next drive, stopping Owens at the two-yard line on a fourth-and-goal with 7:55 remaining in the game.

Lee and Krantz combined on a five-yard touchdown pass with 18 seconds left to make the final 31-23 after Rogers' PAT.

Lee completed 25 of 41 pass attempts for 299 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Krantz snared eight of those passes for 102 yards and a score. Owens was the Vikings' leading rusher with 48 yards on seven carries and he caught four passes for 46 yards as well. Augustana outgained Central 416 total yards to 358, but turned the ball over twice while only being able to recover one of four Dutch fumbles on the day. Erik Westerberg (York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.) led the defense with 14 tackles and Mitch McGilliard (Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.) added 10. Hess had three tackles for loss and a forced fumble. Nate Snead rushed for 105 yards and a touchdown and threw for another 188 and two scores. Jeremy Snead caught four passes for 78 yards and a touchdown.

Now 0-2 on the year, the Vikings are at home on Saturday, September 17 against Adrian. The Bulldogs visit Ericson Field for a noon contest.

ADRIAN 17, AUGUSTANA 14 on September 17 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill.—Logan Mitseff's 45-yard field goal at the final gun Saturday gave Adrian a 17-14 win over Augustana at Ericson Field. The loss drops the Vikings to 0-3 on the season while the Bulldogs improve to 3-0.

Mitseff's kick was set up by a 36-yard Brandon Miller to Justin Hemm catch-and-run. With just 11 seconds on the clock when the play started, Hemm made a heady play by going down on his own at the Viking 28-yard line with four seconds left. Adrian quickly called timeout and with a slight breeze at his back, Mitseff nailed the game-winner.

After forcing an Adrian punt on the game's opening possession, the Vikings drove 73 yards in nine plays with junior running back Brett McWilliams (**Hononegah HS, Roscoe, Ill.**) taking it the final six yards to paydirt and a 7-0 Augustana lead. McWilliams and quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) busted off runs of 15 and 28 yards on the march. The game looked like it might be a shootout when Adrian responded with a nine-play, 73 drive of its own. On a fourth-and-four from the Viking 30, Miller lofted a pass which Hemm corralled in the end zone to even the score at 7-7.

From there, the defenses took over though, as neither team scored for over 40 minutes, although not without some opportunities. Augustana drove to the Adrian 31 early in the second quarter, but was stopped on downs by the Bulldogs. The visitors missed a golden opportunity two possessions later when they drove from their own 23 to the Augustana 27, where Miller connected with Shaun Hladki, who looked like he was going in for the go-ahead score, only to fumble the ball through the end zone for a touchback. Augustana answered by driving to the Bulldog 16-yard line at the end of the half, but Brad Rogers' (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) 34-yard field goal attempt at the gun went wide right.

The defensive domination peaked in the third quarter, which saw nine consecutive possessions fail to yield a first down. Each team went three-and-out four times in the period and the Vikings turned it over once on an interception on an attempted flea-flicker.

With just under 10 minutes left in the game, an Arnie Fitzwater (**Waterford Union HS, Waterford, Wis.**) punt pinned Adrian at its own seven-yard line. On the first play, Pete Schimeck (**Benet Academy, Naperville, Ill.**) sacked Miller and separated him from the ball at the one, where Joe Weber (**Marmion Academy, South Elgin, Ill.**) recovered. McWilliams took it into the end zone on the next play but was assessed an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty after the score.

After Rogers' PAT made it 14-7 Augustana, Fitzwater kicked off from his own 15 and after briefly bobbling the ball, Adrian's Danny Cobb picked it up and went 73 yards down the right sideline to tie the game with 8:53 remaining.

The Bulldogs missed another opportunity when Mitseff pushed a 19-yard field goal attempt wide right with 2:35 left. Each team had two more possessions and on its final one, Augustana drove to Adrian's 25-yard line with under 20 seconds left, but coughed up the ball on a screen pass, setting up Adrian's winning drive.

The Bulldogs outgained Augustana 289 to 252 in the contest, but committed 11 penalties for 84 yards and lost three fumbles. McWilliams ran for 105 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Viking offense. Lee completed 15 of 28 passes for 100 yards and Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) led with four catches for 25 yards. Erik Westerberg had 10 tackles, including eight solo stops and Schimeck has a pair of sacks and a forced fumble to spearhead a solid effort by the Augustana defense.

After a week off, the Vikings head into CCIW play on October 1 when they host Millikin at Ericson Field. The game will be part of Family Weekend festivities and is scheduled to kick off at 6:00 p.m.

MILLIKIN 30, AUGUSTANA 27 on October 1 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill.—Austin Brettschneider's 37-yard field goal with :00.9 seconds left Saturday provided the margin of victory as Millikin defeated Augustana at Ericson Field by a score of 30-27. Augustana is now 0-4 on the year and 0-1 in the CCIW, while the Big Blue improves to 3-1 and 1-0 in the league.

With 23 seconds left in the game and Augustana trailing 27-21, David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) hooked up with Keith Abbey (**Rick East, Park Forest, Ill.**) on a 12-yard touchdown pass on third and goal to tie the contest. The Vikings had a chance to take the lead, but Brady Rogers' (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) point after attempt hit the right upright to leave the score deadlocked. After returning the ensuing kickoff to its own 41, Millikin got a 38-yard completion from Matt Holmes to Jake Palmer to set up Brettschneider's game-winner.

Millikin had the Vikings on their heels early, going 74 yards in 10 plays on the game's opening drive to take a 7-0 lead. Holmes took it in from the three to cap the drive. The Big Blue then recovered an onside kick and drove to the Augustana 19 before freshman Bo Goshorn (**Romeoville HS, Romeoville, Ill.**) picked off a deflected Homes pass to end the threat.

Early in the second period, the Vikings put together an 86-yard, 16-play scoring drive. Brett McWilliams (**Hononegah HS, Roscoe, Ill.**) capped the march with a three-yard touchdown run. NORTH CENTRAL 24, AUGUSTANA 3 on October 8 in Naperville, Illinois

NAPERVILLE, Ill.—With seven minutes to go in Saturday’s game at North Central, Augustana trailed just 10-3 and was driving with the ball near midfield. Unfortunately, the Vikings couldn’t convert a third-and-six from their own 49-yard line and had to punt the ball away. The sixth-ranked Cardinals went on to score two touchdowns in the game’s final 1:20 to claim a 24-3 victory.

Despite holding the Vikings to just one first down--and that via penalty--in the first half, North Central led just 7-0 at intermission. The Cardinals missed a 25-yard field goal attempt on their first possession and Augustana forced them to punt on their second. A 38-yard Tyler Dicken to Jeff Stolzenburg completion set up a one-yard touchdown run by Nick Kukuc on North Central’s third possession and the Cardinals led 7-0. The drive covered 40 yards in just three plays.

The Vikings forced North Central to punt on its next two possessions and then came up with a big stop on fourth and four from the Augustana 43 with just over three minutes left in the half. The Cardinals got the ball back one more time, moving from their own five-yard line to their own 30 before time ran out.

On the opening play of the second half, senior quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) hooked up with senior Jordan Peart (**Marion Central HS, Bull Valley, Ill.**) on a 24-yard completion for the Vikings’ first non-penalty first down of the night. From there, the Cardinal defense stiffened again and forced one of 10 Arnie Fitzwater (**Union HS, Waterford, Wis.**) punts on the evening. North Central then went 58 yards in 11 plays and took a 10-0 lead on a 34-yard Nick Dace field goal. The key play in the drive was a 23-yard Dicken-to-Nick Hicks pass on third-and-16 from their own 19-yard line.

After forcing another Viking punt, which Joe Antonacci returned 47 yards to the Augustana 36, the Cardinals were in position to put another field goal on the board with four minutes left in the third. However, senior Matt Glawe (**Wheaton Warrenville South HS, Winfield, Ill.**) got a hand on Dace’s 43-yard attempt and Augustana’s Rob Mago (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) recovered to end the threat.

The Vikings responded with their only scoring drive of the night, going 65 yards in eight plays to set up a 25-yard Brady Rogers (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) field goal. Lee started the march with back-to-back nine-yard connections with freshman Antonio Owens (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and then finding senior Zachary McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) for a 28-yard completion. Lee rushed for 12 yards to the Cardinal 15-yard line and hit Jack Gilleland (**Marian Central HS, McHenry, Ill.**) to the eight before and incompletion and a one-yard rushing loss forced the Vikings to settle for the field goal and a 10-3 deficit.

Each team punted on its next two possessions, with the last coming after the Vikings’ inability to convert that third-and-six near midfield with seven minutes left. North Central took over at its own five-yard line with 6:40 remaining. On one of the game’s key plays, Dicken, facing a third-and-13 from his own two, found Chad O’Kane for a 24-yard gain to keep the drive alive. From there, the Cardinals finished off the nine-play, 95-yard march, capping it with a 42-yard touchdown run by Dicken for a 17-3 lead.

The Viking looked like they might at least make it interesting when sophomore Sean Walker (**Annawan HS, Annawan, Ill.**) brought the ensuing kickoff back 46 yards into Cardinal territory. Now 0-5 on the year and 0-2 in CCIW play, the Vikings return to Ericson Field next Saturday, October 15, hosting Carthage at 6:00 p.m.

AUGUSTANA 19, CARTHAGE 13 on October 15 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill.—Defense and special teams were the keys Saturday night at Ericson Field as Augustana defeated Carthage 19-13 in College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin play. The win snaps a string of heartbreaking setbacks for the Vikings and improves the team's record to 1-5 on the year and 1-2 in conference action. Carthage falls to 4-2 overall and 1-2 in the league.

The Viking defense intercepted a pair of Carthage passes and recorded a safety, while the special teams unit blocked a Red Men punt, averaged 30 yards per kickoff return and got another big night from the CCIW's leading punter, Arnie Fitzwater (**Union HS, Warterford, Wis.**).

Carthage got on the board first, driving 63 yards in nine plays before Kurt Krause's 31-yard field goal put the Red Men on top 3-0. Augustana's Sean Walker (Annawan HS, Annawan, Ill.) returned the ensuing kickoff 36 yards to the Viking 45-yard line but coughed the ball up and the Red Men were back in business. Six plays later, quarterback T.J. Trepanier took it in from one yard out to make it 10-0. Trepanier accounted for 43 of the 45 yards on the drive, 35 of them on the ground.

After freshman Antonio Owens (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) had brought the ensuing kickoff back 46 yards into Red Men territory, Carthage stuffed the Vikings on fourth-and-two from the 36-yard line to retake possession. That's when Ben Hall (**University HS, Normal, Ill.**) came up with the first big defensive play of the night, stepping in front of a Trepanier pass at midfield and returning it to the Carthage 11-yard line to set up Augustana's first score. Brady Rogers (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) knocked through a 24-yard field goal to make the score 10-3.

Another interception followed by a penalty set the tying score. Carthage had driven to the Viking 40-yard line and on third-and-nine Trepanier attempted to hit Chris Schulz inside the Viking 20. However Augustana freshman Bo Goshorn (**Romeoville HS, Romeoville, Ill.**) was able to wrestle the ball away and return the interception to the Viking 34. The officials tacked on another 15 yards for a let hit and Augustana was able to start a yard shy of midfield.

Senior quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) went right to work, finding tight end Jack Gilleland (**Marian Central, McHenry, Ill.**) for 16 yards, then keeping it and busting off a 20-yard run on the next play. Two plays later, Zachary McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) went in from 13 yards out on a reverse off of a jet sweep. Rogers' PAT tied it at 10 and that's how the half ended.

After blocking a first half Carthage punt, special teams came up big again on the opening possession of the second half. On fourth-and-nine from his own 31, Schulz attempted to run for the first down out of punt formation and the Vikings stopped him a yard short. Lee found Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) for gains of nine and seven yards, rushed for 15 himself and then hit Krantz again in the right corner of the end zone for a 17-10 lead.

Two possessions later, a 42-yard Fitzwater punt pinned the Red men at their own one-yard line. After Pete Schimeck (**Benet Academy, Naperville, Ill.**) knocked down a Trepanier pass on first down, the Carthage quarterback bobbled the snap on second down and was tackled in the end zone by Kyle Voda (**Plainfield South HS, Plainfield, Ill.**) for a safety and a 19-10 Viking lead with 6:13 left in the third quarter.

From there, the defenses took over. Carthage missed an opportunity early in the fourth quarter when Krause's 44-yard field goal attempt hooked left. However, he got another chance with 4:08 left in the game. This time, his 42-yarder hit the right upright and bounced through to cut the Viking lead to 19-13.

The Red Men got one last chance. Taking over at their own 34-yard line with 2:33 left, they drove to the Augustana 18, but Trepanier's fourth-and-six pass attempt to Mike Koeneman in the end zone was broken up by Rob Mago (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) to lock up the Vikings' first win of the season and Rob Cushman's first win as Augustana's head coach.

The win was Augustana's 62nd against just 14 losses in the series, which has also seen five ties. The Red Men have not won in Rock Island since a 1970 win at Rock Island Public Schools Stadium and not since 1962 at Ericson Field, a span 24 games.

Lee led the offense with 124 passing yards and another hard-fought 39 on the ground. McCullough, Krantz and A.J. Hoyer (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) each had three catches.

Carl Hartweg (**Illini West HS, Carthage, Ill.**) led the Viking defense with eight tackles, all of the solo variety. Defensive end Matt Franzen (**Niles Notre Dame HS, Chicago, Ill.**) came off the bench and had two big second-half sacks.

Next Saturday, October 22, Augustana hosts North Park as part of Homecoming festivities. That game is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. at Ericson Field.

AUGUSTANA 27, NORTH PARK 24 on October 22 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill.—A pair of long David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) touchdown passes less than five minutes apart in the second half spelled the difference Saturday as Augustana came away with a 27-24 Homecoming win over North Park at Ericson Field. With the win, the Vikings improve to 2-5 on the year and 2-2 in the CCIW, while North Park falls to 3-4 overall and 0-4 in the conference.

With 3:30 left in the third quarter and Augustana trailing 17-14 and facing a third-and-four at its own 39-yard line, Lee connected over the middle with tight end Keith Abbey (**Rich East HS, Park Forest, Ill.**), who crossed the field and outran the North Park secondary down the sideline for a 61-yard touchdown. A missed extra point left the score at 20-17.

Augustana stopped North Park on the next series, but gave the visitors another chance with a roughing the kicker penalty. The call was one of eight for 85 yards against the hosts on the day. The defense came through and stopped North Park again and Augustana took over at its own 20 following a punt. From there, it took Lee just one play to find Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) along the south sideline. Krantz made a nice adjustment on the catch and outran the defender for an 80-yard touchdown and a 27-17 lead.

After a scoreless first quarter, Augustana got on the board first when Eric Chandler (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) fought his way into the end zone from five yards out on the second play of the second period. Chandler's run capped a 12-play, 80-yard march. The visitors answered with a 13-play, 77-yard drive of their own, finished off with a one-yard Drew Walkington touchdown run.

The hosts went 61 yards in seven plays on their next possession to retake the lead 14-7. The drive was kept alive by a fake field goal on fourth-and-three from the North Park 16-yard line. Freshman placekicker Brady Rogers (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) took a pitch from holder Danny Hess (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and got around left end for a gain of nine yards and a first down. Lee scrambled seven yards for the go ahead touchdown two plays later.

Not to be outdone, North Park again responded, this time going 76 yard on nine plays for the tying score. Quarterback Tyler Krebs found receiver De' Marien Hampton in the right corner of the end zone with a 37-yard touchdown heave with 32 seconds remaining until halftime.

After Augustana misplayed the second half kickoff and went three-and-out deep in its own territory, the visitors took over at the Augustana 49-yard line following the punt. From there, they put together their third straight scoring drive, going 42 yards on 14 plays over eight minutes and taking a 17-14 lead on a 24-yard Tony Kebede field goal. Lee connected with Abbey to regain the lead for the hosts just three plays later.

The visitors had one last gasp, narrowing the lead to 27-24 with 1:21 left in the game. Flanker Sam Cochiaro took a pitch on a reverse and found Hampton in the end zone for a 6-yard touchdown pass. That play capped a 72-yard, nine-play drive. The hosts sealed it however, when Zachary McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) corralled Bryn Nottoli's onside kick attempt and Lee was able to take a knee twice to end the game.

Lee finished the day 10 of 13 for 199 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Krantz was his most frequent target, with three catches for 96 yards including the 80-yarder. The Viking running game produced 169 yards on 29 carries, spread among nine ball carriers. Freshman Antonio Owens (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) led the way with 51 yards on four carries and A.J. Hoger (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) added 49 on four carries.

Linebacker Erik Westerberg (**York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**) added 14 tackles, including 13 of the solo variety, to his league-leading totals. Defensive end Luke Anderson (**Lemont HS, Lemont, Ill.**) had eight stops and Sean Walker (**Annawan HS, Annawan, Ill.**) came up with a big interception and batted away another pass in the end zone.

The Vikings will attempt to extend their winning streak when they go on the road to Wheaton, Illinois to face the Wheaton Thunder on Saturday, October 29 at 1:00 p.m.

ELHURST 28, AUGUSTANA 27 on November 5 in Rock Island, Illinois

ROCK ISLAND, Ill.—Senior quarterback David Lee (**Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.**) led Augustana on a 95-yard touchdown march in the final four minutes Saturday to draw the Vikings to within one point of visiting Elmhurst, but the ensuing two-point conversion attempt failed, allowing the Bluejays to escape with a 28-27 win at Ericson Field. The Loss drops Augustana to 2-7 on the year and 2-4 in CCIW play, while Elmhurst improves to 5-4 overall and 3-3- in the league.

Trailing 28-21 with 3:45 remaining, the Vikings took over at their own five yard-line following an Elmhurst punt. Lee completed five of his first six passes on the drive and added a run of six yards to move the team into Bluejay territory. On third and 10 from the Elmhurst 44, he connected with fellow senior Zachary McCullough (**St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.**) for 34 yards down the right sideline to give the Viking first-and-goal at the Elmhurst 10. The Bluejays were called for pass interference penalty in the end zone and on the next play Lee fired a two-yard touchdown pass to senior A.J. Hoger (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) to cut the deficit to 28-27 with 41 seconds on the clock.

Freshman Brady Rogers (**Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.**) came on as the Vikings line up in kick formation on the extra point, but holder Danny Hess (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) took the snap and rolled around right end looking for a receiver in the end zone. Elmhurst defended the play well and Hess' pass fell incomplete.

After forcing a Bluejay three-and-out on the game's opening possession, Augustana went 57 yards in five plays to take a 7-0 lead. Lee connected with freshman Antonio Owens (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) for 38 yards on the team's first play from scrimmage and Hoger went 15 yards around left end on the next play to reach the Elmhurst four-yard line. Two plays later, Lee went the final three yards on a quarterback draw. Rogers' PAT gave the Vikings a 7-0 lead.

A school-record tying 76-yard punt by junior Arnie Fitzwater (**Union HS, Waterford, Wis.**) forced Elmhurst to start at its own 20, but the Bluejays went 80 yards in 12 plays for the tying score. CCIW rushing leader Scottie Williams scored from nine yards out with 1:19 left in the first period to even the score at 7-7.

On the first play after Rogers missed a 26-yard field goal wide right, Bluejay quarterback Joe Furco went up top and found Joe St. Peter all alone behind the Augustana secondary for an 80-yard touchdown pass and a 14-7 Elmhurst lead with 7:14 to go in the second quarter.

It looked like the Bluejays would extend the lead with the ball on the Augustana one-yard line and six second left in the half, but the Viking defensive line stuffed Williams and knocked the ball loose. Senior defensive end Pete Schmeck (**Benet Academy, Naperville, Ill.**) scooped up the ball with a potential game-tying touchdown in front of him, but Furco made a saving tackle and the score remained 14-7 as the teams went to halftime.

The Vikings took the second half kickoff and went 61 yards in 10 plays to tie the game. Sophomore Nick Krantz (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) went in from the one-yard line on a jet sweep to cap the march.

The hosts then went ahead 21-14 on their next possession. After forcing a Bluejay three-and-out, Augustana went 50 yards in eight plays for the go-ahead touchdown. Lee connected with McCullough for a key 20-yard completion on third-and-seven. And sophomore running back Eric Chandler (**Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.**) carried for 15 yards on the last three plays of the drive, going in from four yards out for the score with 5:28 left in the third quarter.

Three and a half minutes later, Bluejay back Andrew Tubek answered with a one-yard touchdown run to finish off a 51-yard, 10-play march and tie the game at 21.

Elmhurst took a 28-21 lead with 10:19 left in the game. Again it was Tubek doing the honors from a yard out.

Lee completed 21 of 34 passes in his final game at Ericson Field for 218 yards and a touchdown. McCullough hauled in eight of Lee's throws for 112 yards. Chandler was the Vikings' leading ground gainer with 65 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries. Linebackers Joe Weber (**Marmion Academy, South Elgin, Ill.**) and Erik Westerberg (**York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**) led the team in tackles with 11 each. Both players recorded seven solo stops and four assists.

Augustana wraps up the 2011 season with a road date at Illinois Wesleyan on Saturday, November 12. Game time in Bloomington, Illinois is set for 1:00 p.m.

ILLINOIS WESLEYAN 34, AUGUSTANA 12 on November 12 in Bloomington, Illinois

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.—Augustana closed out the 2011 football season Saturday, dropping a 34-12 decision to Illinois Wesleyan at Tucci Field. The Vikings finish the year 2-8 overall and 2-5 in the CCIW. The Titans improve to 9-1 overall and 6-1 in the CCIW.

Augustana missed a scoring opportunity early. The Vikings took the opening kickoff and went 59 yards in 10 plays before the drive stalled at the IWU 15-yard line. Brady Rogers (Cherokee Trail HS, Aurora, Colo.) came on, but his 32-yard field goal attempt was wide left and left the game scoreless.

The Titans responded by going 80 yards in 11 plays, capped by a one-yard touchdown run by quarterback Rob Gallik to put the hosts ahead 6-0. Tony Angelos' point after attempt failed. Illinois Wesleyan intercepted quarterback David Lee (Springfield HS, Springfield, Ill.) on the Vikings' next possession and went 38 yard in eight plays to extend the lead to 13-0. Gallik went in from three yards out for the score. The key play on the drive was a 15-yard personal foul call against Augustana.

Wesleyan pushed the lead to 20-0 early in the second quarter. After forcing a Viking three-and-out, Gallik took the Titans 75 yards in six plays, this time aided by defensive holding and personal foul calls against the defense. Gallik connected with Joey Driver from 11 yards out and Angelos' kick made it 20-0.

IWU made it 27-0 with 3:23 left in the half when Cameron Blossom scored on a three-yard run, capping an 18-play, 79-yard drive.

Freshman safety Tim Maroder (Burlington Central HS, Elgin, Ill.) picked off a Gallik pass on the first possession of the second half to set up Augustana's first score. Lee completed seven of eight passes on a 13-play 99-yard march, with the final one going to tight end Keith Abbey (Rich East HS, Park Forest, Ill.) for 42 yards and a touchdown.

Illinois Wesleyan extended the lead to 34-6 early in the fourth quarter when Gallik found Parker Carroll for an 18-yard touchdown pass. Lee finished the scoring with a four-yard touchdown run with 4:14 remaining.

In his final game, Lee finished 21 of 32 for 228 passing yards, one touchdown and one interception. In addition, he had 19 yards and a touchdown rushing. Abbey, also a senior, caught three passes for 53 yards and a touchdown and classmate Zachary McCullough (St. Charles North HS, St. Charles, Ill.) caught three for 45 yards. Junior running back Brett McWilliams (Hononegah HS, Roscoe, Ill.) was the Vikings' leading rusher with 42 yards on 11 carries and caught three passes for 36 yards as well.

Sophomore linebacker Erik Westerberg (York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.) led the defense with 13 total tackles—three solo and 10 assists. CCIW punting leader Arnie Fitzwater (Union HS, Waterford, Wis.) kicked four times for a 42.5-yard average.

AUGUSTANA COLLEGE AND BOB READE

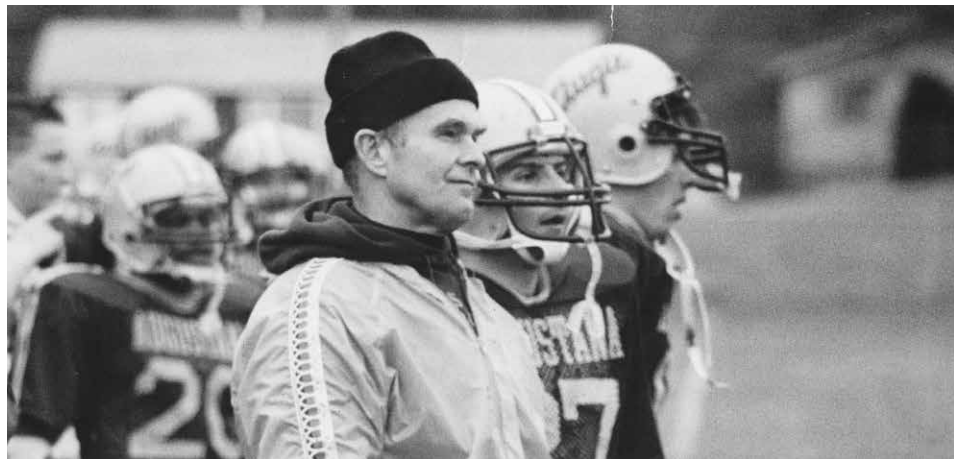
When Bob Reade assumed the reins of the Augustana College football program in the spring of 1979 few people in the administration of the Lutheran school near the banks of the Mississippi River in Rock Island, Illinois could have predicted the success which was going to become synonymous with the Vikings on the gridiron. A look at his past history, however, would have given a pretty good indication that the father of 11 children - he had nine when he took the job - knew how to build a powerful program.

He left behind a powerhouse at J.D. Darnall High School in Geneseo, Illinois where he compiled a record of 146-21-4 in 17 years with the Maple Leafs. His teams had just won three straight Illinois Class 3A championships from 1976-78 and from 1965-71 the Leafs rolled up what was then a state record 52 game unbeaten streak.

In 16 years at Augustana, the success never stopped as Reade compiled a record of 146-21-1 overall and 112-12-1 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. His teams were in the NCAA Division III playoffs 11 times, including a national record 10 straight appearances from 1981-90. The Vikings won four straight NCAA Division III national titles from 1983-86. His legendary senior class of 1987 that was anchored by College Football Hall of Famer Lynn Thomsen on defense and spearheaded by Brad Price on offense, went through its entire career without a loss. That bunch compiled a record of 49-0-1 and had a hand in all four national championships. Augustana won 12 CCIW titles during Reade's time on the sidelines, including eight straight from 1981-88.

In January of 1998 he was awarded the prestigious Amos Alonzo Stagg Award by the American Football Coaches Association and in August of that same year was enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Indiana.

He won four straight national "Kodak Coach of the Year" awards as picked by the AFCA and was chosen CCIW "Coach of the Year" nine times. Starting with the first game of the 1983 season and ending with the second round of the 1987 playoffs, Augustana put together a streak of 60 games in a row without a loss (there was a 0-0 tie with Elmhurst to open the 1986 sea-

son) which still is an NCAA Division III record. It is also the second longest in NCAA history, regardless of division. His teams won 37 games in a row from the start of 1983 until that tie with Elmhurst and that winning streak was an NCAA Division III record until Mount Union broke it in 1999. It still is the sixth longest in NCAA history, again regardless of division.

His success with the Vikings football program put the Augustana name in front of the national media in an unheard of fashion for a Division III institution. The Vikings appeared on network television seven straight years from 1981-87 and nearly every major newspaper in the country from the Dallas Morning News to the New York Times ran features on the team's exploits. At the 1986 homecoming game the small and cramped press box at Ericson Field had reporters from USA Today, the Dallas Morning News and New York Newsday covering the Vikings and their remarkable run of success. The Wall Street Journal and Rolling Stone Magazine both ran features on the Vikings and Reade also managed to find time to write a book "Coaching Football Successfully" that was completed in the fall of 1983.

His formula for success was simple, but effective. Run the football and play good, hard-nosed defense. A reporter for the Detroit News once wrote this about the Vikings following a 34-10 blowout of Hope in the 1986 playoffs. "Run down to the railroad tracks and wait for the 7:15 train heading into the city and then step in front of it. You would have about as good a chance as the Dutchmen did yesterday as the steamrolling express that is known as the Augustana Vikings football team ran roughshod over Hope here in Holland."

During his career the Blue & Gold - wearing the trademark jerseys with the long vertical stripes down the sleeves - would routinely average 300 yards per game rushing and give up less than 10 points per contest. His Vikings compiled a 76-7 record at home during his career, with three of those losses coming in the first season back in 1979. 11 times during his tenure Reade's team went undefeated at home. He retired in 1995 with a CCIW home field-winning streak of 18 straight dating back to a 33-8 loss to Millikin on November 4, 1989.

A total of 37 Vikings earned NCAA Division III All-American honors since Reade took over prior to the 1979 season, compared to just 11 in the school's previous years of football that began in 1893. He coached 10 Academic All-Americans and 106 players earned CCIW first team honors in his 16 years. 13 times a Viking was named the league's MVP.

He became the first coach in college football history to win 100 games in his first 10 years as a head coach when the Vikings beat Adrian 25-7 in the first round of the 1988 NCAA playoffs. During the decade of the 1980's, Augustana put together a remarkable record of 103-10-1 for a winning percentage of .908 which is the best single decade mark ever recorded in college football. His teams were always known for playing better as the season progressed, as evidenced by his record of 44-6 during the month of November.

THE VIKINGS RECORD IN THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF ERICSON FIELD

Located in the far northeast corner of the Augustana College campus, Ericson Field is the football and track home of the Vikings. The stadium is named after Senator Charles J.A. Ericson who died in Boone, Iowa in 1910.

Charles Ericson was born in the Province of Calmer, Sweden, and moved to America (and Moline) when he was 12. Although he went to school in Moline, Charles hunted and fished in the area where the stadium that bears his name now stands. After moving from the Quad Cities when he was 19, he moved to Mineral Ridge, Iowa where he opened a general store and eventually helped organize the First National Bank of Boone in 1872.

He became interested in politics and in 1895 was elected as a state senator in Iowa. When he died in 1910, Ericson left Augustana College with 260 acres of farmland in Iowa that was also rich in coal. Then he added \$13,000.00 to help the school buy land for an athletic field.

He placed three conditions on his gift. The land was priced at \$26,000.00 and Mr. Ericson stipulated that Augustana College should raise the other \$13,000.00; that the tract of land at Fifth Avenue and 38th Street be purchased since he played there as a boy and that the field be named Ericson Athletic Field.

The school still uses the site as the home of its athletic teams. The stadium has seating for 3,500 spectators and there are locker room facilities under the south grandstand. During the summer of 1992, a new bright blue nine-lane track was installed from money raised mostly by donations from the Augustana College track alumni. The track was redone in the summer of 2008 and dedicated to longtime cross country and track coach, Paul V. Olson.

In the summer of 2002 a new synthetic turf was installed on the playing field and lights were added. The Ericson Stadium lockerrooms underwent an extensive renovation in the summer of 2003. In the summer of 2012 the synthetic turf was replaced as part of a new stadium construction project. By the start of the 2013 season, the Vikings will have a new outdoor athletic complex.

Obviously, the football Vikings enjoy playing at home as a 260-89-6 overall record down through the years indicates. That mark does include nine NCAA playoff games that were played at Rock Island Public Schools Stadium during the 1980's.

Ultimately, graduates of Augustana and Augie football are exceptionally well prepared for life after college and enjoy an advantage in the competitive marketplace of job placement as well as graduate and professional school admission.

Academically, in the competitive arena of nationally rated and selective liberal arts colleges, Augustana has earned an outstanding reputation. Ranked a Liberal Arts I Institution by the Carnegie Foundation, Augustana is among the top 70 undergraduate colleges and universities in the entire United States, and among the top 50 liberal arts colleges in the sciences. In addition to its fine reputation and high standards, the cost of Augustana remains a good value and is listed as one of Barron's Best Buys in Education (1998).

Athletically, Augie football ranks as one of the winningest football programs in all of college football over the last two decades. The Vikings have made 15 trips to the NCAA Division III national playoffs, including five straight appearances in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl from 1982-86. Augustana owns four NCAA Division III national championships. The Blue & Gold have captured 21 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin titles, including six during the 1990's and one in each 2001 and 2005. The Vikings have been the winningest team in the league for each of the last three decades.

Through the years a total of 80 Vikings have earned All-American status and 22 times the CCIW's MVP wore an Augustana uniform. Also, 28 players have been named to the prestigious Academic All-American team. In terms of producing overall Academic All-Americans, the Augustana athletic department ranks sixth heading into the 2012-13 school year with 139 in all sports. Ahead of the Vikings on the list are such institutions as Notre Dame and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

In addition, the unique educational support programs for Augie football players are comprehensive and specifically designed to meet the academic rigors of the challenging academic environment that is Augustana College. Football participants benefit from the seminar and monitoring system that is Augustana Football's Academic Game Plan (AGP). The seminar series teaches young men time-management, organizational and college-level study skills that will help them to achieve success in college and will aid them throughout their professional careers.

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana also sports varsity men's and women's lacrosse teams. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

Football was the first sport contested in the CCIW when the league was formed in 1946. Augustana has won more games (312) and championships (21) than any team in the CCIW during the first 66 years of existence. Not only have the Vikings won 21 league titles, but they have also finished second 12 times. Since 1981 the Blue & Gold own at least a share of 17 of the last 31 championships.
