About Augustana College

Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college enrolls approximately 2,500 men and women of diverse ethnic, religious and social backgrounds, from across the United States and around the world.

Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

After successful first season, Jon Miedema anxious to get started in 2012-13

It is hard to keep the excitement out of Jon Miedema's voice when he talks about the prospects for his 2012-13 women's tennis team at Augustana. After posting a 15-11 record in his first go-around as the Vikings' head coach, Miedema is looking forward to his second season.

"I am really excited about the coming year," said Miedema, who guided the Vikings to a fourth place finish in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in 2011-12. "There was definitely a learning curve last year, both for me as a first year head coach and for the players as they adjusted to a different coaching style. By the end of the fall season and into the spring we were all on the same page and I am anxious to start that way this year."

After posting a 7-6 record in the fall, the Vikings caught fire in the spring and won eight of their final 13 matches, including five of six near the end of the year. The season ended with an 8-1 defeat at the hands of CCIW champion Wheaton in the semi-finals of the CCIW's automatic qualifying tournament in May.

"My philosophy is to put a big emphasis on pushing yourself in practice," said Miedema, who spent one year as the head coach at Grace Bible College in Grand Rapids, Michigan prior to taking the Augustana position. "The harder you push yourself in practice, the easier the matches are. We worked on that a lot last year and I think it paid off at the end of the season."

Junior Kim Sawyer (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) will handle the number one position after putting together a 27-7 record a year ago. She was a first team all-conference selection and was voted the team's Most Valuable Player. She placed second in the CCIW at number one singles. Through two seasons with the Vikings she has accumulated 56 career victories.

Senior Krista Panko (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) has been a solid performer throughout her career and she is just five victories away from joining the 100-win club. She has a 46-38 record in singles and is 49-39 in doubles play. Last year she went 13-14 while playing mostly at number three singles and was 18-11 in doubles. She could move into the number two singles position this season.

Another senior, Meghan Wethington (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**), is a three year letterwinner. She was 11-16 in singles as a junior while playing at number four and she teamed with Sawyer at number one doubles where they were 11-14.

Sophomore Miranda Pence (**Oswego HS, Oswego, Ill.**) missed the fall portion of her freshman year but came on strong in the spring. She was 3-2 in singles and 5-3 in doubles in limited action. She could challenge for a spot in the singles lineup this season. Junior Katie Scharnagle (Wheaton St. Francis HS, Lisle, Ill.) was 11-7 in singles while working in the number five slot. She was 3-0 in doubles.

Juniors Mariah Bardo (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**) and Emily Kaczmarek (**Glenbard South HS, Lombard, Ill.**) both gained valuable experience last year. Bardo was 17-9 in the number six spot while Kaczmarek was 6-6 while playing the majority of her matches at number five. Bardo didn't play any doubles but Kaczmarek was 14-9 in the third position with a variety of partners. Junior Callie Winter (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**) was 3-0 in limited time.

Sophomore Chelsea Lavin (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**) played only in the fall because she was a member of the Vikings' softball team in the spring. She was 8-8 in doubles action in the fall. Junior Caitee Margenthaler (**Moline HS, Moline, Ill.**) was 8-4 in doubles play a year ago.

Miedema thinks that there will be some freshmen who will push for spots in the lineup as well. Aileen MacDonald (**Mundelein HS, Mundelein, Ill.**) caught Miedema's eye during the recruiting process and she could make an immediate impact. Lauren Kaczmarek (**Glenbard South HS, Lombard, Ill.**), Madeline Voss (**Lincoln-Way East HS, Frankfort, Ill.**) and Kersten King (**Union HS, Dysart, Iowa**) all have chances of making contributions throughout the year.

"This group was fun to coach last year and I look forward to working with them again," said Miedema. "We made good progress throughout the season and we hope to pick up where we left off. I am looking forward to starting the year."

JON MIEDEMA – Head men and women’s tennis coach

Jon Miedema stepped into the role as the head coach for men’s and women’s tennis at Augustana in June of 2011. He replaced Adam Strand, who resigned in May to become the head coach in both sports at Luther, his alma mater. Miedema, the 13th coach in Viking history for the women and the 20th on the men’s side of the ledger, enjoyed success with both programs in his first season.

He led the Augustana women to a 15-11 overall mark and a 2-3 record in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in 2011-12. The Vikings finished fourth in the CCIW Tournament and won 10 of their last 15 matches.

On the men’s side, Augustana went 16-11 overall and 2-3 in the CCIW. The Vikings placed fourth in the conference tournament, dropping a 5-4 heartbreaker to Wheaton in the semi-final round.

Miedema comes to the Vikings after spending one season (2010-11) as the head men’s tennis coach at Grace Bible College in Grand Rapids, Michigan. However, he has a wealth of knowledge and experience in the game. He served as the assistant coach for the women’s team at Calvin College, his alma mater, during the spring of 2011. He helped lead the Knights to a 19-4 overall record and a second round advancement in the NCAA Division III Championships.

Miedema served as a tennis instructor for three years at the Michigan Athletic Club, noted as one of the top clubs in the Midwest. He also worked as an instructor at the Centennial Country Club in Grand Rapids from 2004 through 2006.

A 2005 graduate of Calvin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business and communications, Miedema worked as a health insurance agent for Kessler and Associates from 2007 until he took the Augustana position. He was also a loan officer for Brickwood Mortgage from 2005 through 2007.

As a player at Calvin he served as team captain during his senior season of 2005. He was a first team all-conference selection in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

2011-12 WOMEN'S TENNIS REVIEW

Augustana women's tennis team finishes fourth at CCIW Championships; Kim Sawyer named to first team all-conference and Brittany Reece named to second team

In his first season as head coach of the Augustana women's tennis team, Jon Miedema led the 2011-12 Vikings to a 15-11 record and a fourth-place finish at the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin tournament in October. Sophomore Kim Sawyer (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) and senior captain Brittany Reece (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) were All-CCIW selections this year. Sawyer was named to the first team and Reece was a second team selection. The team advanced to the league's automatic qualifier in May, falling to Wheaton to end the season.

Augustana began the year 0-2 after losses to Illinois Wesleyan and Grinnell. However, the Vikings responded to win four of the next five matches with wins over Loras, Millikin, Elmhurst, and St. Norbert and a loss to Carthage to move to 4-3 on the season. After splitting the weekend of September 17th with a loss to Cornell and a win against Lake Forest, the lady Vikings had a 5-4 record. The next two matches pitted Augustana against tough conference opponents in losses to Wheaton and North Central. Miedema's team responded well with two wins to head into conference tournament play with a 7-6 record.

Augustana wrapped up its fall season with a fourth place finish at the College Conference of Illinois Wisconsin tournament on October 7-8 in Kenosha, Wisconsin. The Vikings tallied 33 points in the event while Wheaton led the way with 78 points, Carthage placed second with 45 points and Illinois Wesleyan third with 35 points. Rounding out the group were North Central (30), Elmhurst (10), and Millikin (0).

In the spring, the Vikings put together an 8-5 record, including a four-match winning streak in which they won 35 of 36 individual matches against Monmouth, Dubuque, Loras and Beloit.

While the season didn't bring about many new faces to the team the squad did face playing many players in unfamiliar positions. Sawyer, who was named the team's Most Valuable Player, led the way with a 27-7 record at first singles. That win total is the tied for second-highest in school history, trailing only the 29 she posted as a freshman. Her career singles record of 56-14 is good for a .800 winning percentage that's currently tied for first on the all-time singles winning percentage list. Also, in combination with her doubles wins with partner Meghan Wethington (**Geneseo HS, Geneseo, Ill.**), Sawyer moved to 92 career wins, putting her on pace to join the 100 win club (combined singles and doubles wins) early next fall. This is a feat which only 18 players have accomplished in the history of Augustana women's tennis. Sawyer was named CCIW "Player of the Week" on September 14th and April 18th and was a first team all-conference selection for the second year in a row.

Playing second singles for the Vikings was Reece. She played many matches for the Blue and Gold last season but had to make the adjustment from five singles a year ago to second singles. Despite the 11-18 singles record, Reece played well and her game improved as the year progressed. In the conference tournament she provided a pivotal first round win over North Central and went on to place fourth. In addition, she combined with partner Krista Panko (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) to go 17-10 at number two doubles and earn a third place finish in the conference tournament as they defeated Illinois Wesleyan 8-6 in the third place match. In the semi finals of the tournament the Vikings were edged 6-3, 4-6, 6-4 by Wheaton. Reece finished her career with 108 total wins, 15th on the school's all-time list, and she and Panko combined for 28 career doubles wins, eight-most of any tandem in school history. Reece's 60 total doubles wins are tied for 10th on the Viking career list.

Panko played number three singles as well as number two doubles. Although she moved up to a higher position than last year, she still managed to go 13-14 on the year. She was 0-1 at fourth singles, 8-12 at third singles, 1-0 at two singles and 1-0 at first singles. She saved her best for last in the fall, as she won 8-1 in the third place match to go 3-1 in the conference tournament. Her win also sealed fourth place for the Vikings.

Playing four singles and first doubles for the Blue and Gold was Wethington. A junior this season, she played sparingly in singles last year and had to get accustomed to her new role at fourth singles. She did so admirably as she used tremendous effort to go 11-16 on the season. Wethington also had a key first round win in the CCIW tournament as she defeated Carthage in three sets. Wethington and Sawyer teamed up to go 11-14 on the season at number one doubles, where they lost several well contested matches. However, despite those narrow losses early in the year the duo used a close match of their own to edge North Central 9-8 in a pivotal match on Saturday at the conference tournament.

Fifth singles saw split time between Emily Kaczmarek (**Glenbard South HS, Lombard, Ill.**) and Katie Scharnagle (**St. Francis College Prep, Lisle, Ill.**). Both sophomores also had to get adjusted to brand new roles and did so with tremendous attitudes and hard work. Kaczmarek went 6-6 on the season, going 1-1 at fourth, 4-5 at fifth and 1-0 at sixth singles. She handed the reigns over in the conference tournament, as Scharnagle finished 3-1 to earn a third place finish with key wins over Illinois Wesleyan and Carthage. Scharnagle finished 11-7 in singles play this year. Kaczmarek not only played well in singles but also teamed with freshman partner Chelsea Lavin (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**) to go 6-6 on the year at third doubles. The duo earned a key first round match win in the conference tournament fighting back from down 6-1, 4-1 to pull off the victory in three sets.

Rounding out the top six singles players was sophomore Mariah Bardo (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**). Bardo went 17-9 on the year compiling the second-highest winning percentage of any singles player on the team at .654. Bardo's steady play earned her a fourth-place finish at the conference tournament with a pivotal three set win over North Central in the first round.

Augustana finished the season with an overall winning percentage of .564 in singles and .567 in doubles.

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana also sports varsity men's and women's lacrosse teams. Neither men's nor women's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 172, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

The CCIW sponsored women's tennis for the first time in 1986 and Augustana hosted the league's first championship in the fall of the 1986-87 school year. The Vikings own a total of four CCIW titles and have never finished lower than fourth in the conference tournament.
