Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college enrolls approximately 2,500 men and women of diverse ethnic, religious and social backgrounds, from across the United States and around the world.

Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

Vikings look for continued improvement in 2012

As the 2012 volleyball season gets ready to commence, third year head coach Jamie Walters is looking for continued improvement from her Augustana team. The Vikings were 9-23 a year ago while playing with a squad that had just one senior on the roster.

"Without question we will be more competitive this year, especially in spots one through 12," said Walters who took over the Augustana program prior to the 2010-11 school year. "We are still going to be very young but the talent level has increased, there is no doubt about that."

Last year the Vikings used several freshmen in prominent roles and that experience is bound to pay off heading into the 2012 season.

"Our sophomores now have a year of experience under their belts," she said. "I think that has helped quite a bit with the incoming class. There has been great buy-in amongst our players and that has been great to see."

One of those freshmen from a year ago who is now a sophomore is outside hitter Emily Leazer (**St. Viator HS, Mount Prospect, Ill.**). Leazer was second on the team in kills a year ago with 295 in 114 games. She was tops on the Vikings in service aces with 36 and second in digs with 390. She was named to the all-tournament team in the Viking Classic and the Wisconsin-Stevens Point Tournament.

Three freshmen will be contending for spots on the outside as well. They are Martha Murray (**Evanston HS, Evanston, Ill.**), Emilie Willingham (**Kirkwood HS, Kirkwood, Mo.**) and Sydney Sand (**Burlington Central HS, Elgin, Ill.**).

Sophomores Dory Dudley (**Tremont HS, Tremont, Ill.**) and Blair Theuerkauf (**Batavia HS, Batavia, Ill.**) along with junior Morgan Stittleburg (**Black River Falls HS, Black River Falls, Wis.**) have inside tracks on the right side hitter spot. Dudley played in 62 games last fall and notched 50 kills and 16 blocks while Stittleburg saw action in 73 games while notching 79 kills and 32 blocks as a sophomore. Theuerkauf played in 31 games and had 17 kills and eight blocks.

Senior Sarah Williams (**Rockford Lutheran HS, Loves Park, Ill.**) led the team in games played last year with 115 and she will once again handle the middle hitter position. She was third on the team in kills with 150 (1.30 per game) and was first in total blocks with 86 (0.75 per game). Sophomores Katie Keller (**Addison Trail HS, Addison, Ill.**) and Samantha Kammerman (**Sherrard HS, Milan, Ill.**) will be used here as well. Keller saw limited varsity action a year ago but Kammerman played in 82 games, mostly as an outside hitter and was fourth on the team in kills with 141.

At the setter position, junior Katrina Colclasure (**Tri-Valley HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) will move back here from her libero position. She played setter as a freshman but was the full-time libero a year ago and she led the team in digs with 542 (4.80 per game average). Sophomore Stephanie Petkovsek (**Lisle HS, Lisle, Ill.**) and freshman Jordan Hampel (**Hilliard Davidson HS, Hilliard, Ohio**) will also be in the battle for playing time at setter.

Colclasure could always move back to the libero position and freshman Kylie Siebert (**Kaneland HS, Elburn, Ill.**) has been impressive during the early pre-season practices.

"So far the attitude of our team has been outstanding," said Walters. "We are getting great leadership and we are moving forward, which is nice to see. Our players have a desire to want more and they are learning what it takes for that to happen."

Jamie Walters completed her second season as the head volleyball coach with a 9-23 overall record, experiencing the growing pains of a roster that had just three upperclassmen. The Vikings finished 1-6 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin, finishing seventh place in the league. Her two year record at Augustana now stands at 21-43 overall, with a 5-8 record overall in the CCIW.

Walters, who served as the head coach at Aurora University for three seasons (2007-09), became the 10th head coach in the history of the program. She replaced Janelle Hester, who resigned in May of 2010 after recording a 34-33 record in two years.

"I am honored knowing that I am the next volleyball coach at Augustana," said Walters at the time of her hiring. "The Augustana program has had a tradition of excellence not only on the court but in the classroom as well. That is something we intend to continue. I am looking toward moving forward, not only as a program but as a college as well. With the support that has been shown throughout the entire campus I know that the will have an opportunity to make great strides."

Walters began her coaching career at Aurora in the fall of 2006 when she served as the assistant coach and helped the Spartans to a 19-14 overall record and a perfect 11-0 record in the Northern Athletics Conference. She assumed the head coaching position prior to 2007 and in her first year went 10-21 overall and 4-8 in conference play. In 2008 the Spartans were 7-23 and 6-6 before breaking through last year with a 17-15 overall mark and a 9-3 record in the league. During her time at Aurora she was instrumental in doubling the team's roster size and the Spartans recorded a team cumulative grade point average of 3.00. During her three years as the head coach, Walters compiled a record of 34-59 overall and 19-17 in the Northern Athletics Conference.

"Jamie Walters will be an outstanding addition to our staff due to her previous head coaching experience, thorough understanding of the NCAA Division III philosophy and extensive recruiting contacts in the Chicago-land area," said Augustana director of athletics Mike Zapolski at the time of her hiring. "I am confident that Jamie will be an excellent fit at Augustana. She has a wealth of volleyball experience as both a player and a coach and we look forward to watching her build our program."

Before coming to Aurora, Walters was the head coach at Dominican University for both men's and women's volleyball. The men's team won the National Intramural and Recreation Sports Club championship in 2005-06 and finished the year with a 37-4 overall record. She also served as an assistant coach at both College of DuPage and West Chicago High School.

She has also coached at the club level and worked for nine years for the Side Out Volleyball Association. She assisted with the junior college national team in 2003 and in 2006 was an assistant coach at the World Scholar Athlete Games.

A much decorated player, Walters was a two time junior college All-American at College of DuPage and helped the Chaparrals win back-to-back national titles. She was named MVP of the NJCAA national tournament as a sophomore and both of the DuPage teams she played on have been inducted into the NJCAA "Hall of Fame".

After her career was over at DuPage, she moved to Benedictine University in Lisle, Illinois where she was named to the NCAA Division III all-region team. She helped the Eagles win a pair of Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference championships and qualify for the NCAA Division III national tournament twice.

Walters has a Bachelor of Arts degree in business and economics from Benedictine and an MBA in leadership from Aurora.

Steve Hennings will begin his fifth season as the assistant volleyball coach at Augustana in the fall of 2012. He is a former member of the Augustana men's club team, having played for the Vikings in the 2004-05 school year before transferring to Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa where he played two seasons for the nationally ranked program.

"I think Steve will be a real asset for our program," said head coach Jamie Walters. "He has the knowledge and the experience at many levels of volleyball to have a positive influence on our players."

Hennings, who currently resides in Bettendorf, was a varsity basketball player at Iowa Western Community College in 1997-98 before heading into the private sector. He worked as a carpenter for various construction companies throughout the Quad Cities, eventually owning his own company.

He attended Augustana for one year (2004-05) and eventually transferred to Graceland where he majored in business administration.

Young Vikings go through season of growth in 2011

With just one senior and two juniors on the entire roster, the 2011 Augustana volleyball team was not immune to the predictable growing pains that go with youth. In her second season at the helm of the Vikings, Jamie Walters was playing a lineup that often had three, and sometimes four, freshmen on the floor at the same time. The experience gained during the 9-23 campaign should prove invaluable in the years ahead.

Brianna Skeens (**Vernon Hills HS, Libertyville, Ill.**) was the lone senior on the team this past fall and she was one of three team captains, along with juniors Kelsey Mikula (**Coal City HS, Morris, Ill.**) and Sarah Williams (**Rockford Lutheran HS, Loves Park, Ill.**).

Skeens led the team in kills with 331 in 111 games played for a 2.98 average. She had the highest kill percentage on the team at .220 with 331 kills in 881 total attempts and 137 errors. She was second on the team in total blocks with 76 (24 solo and 52 assists) for a 0.68 per game average. She added 31 digs as well.

Skeens posted 27 kills against Carroll on October 23 at the Wisconsin-Stevens Point Tournament and that is tied for the 10th highest single match performance in Augustana history.

Mikula was the top setter on the team with 916 assists in 112 games for an average of 8.18 per game. She had 60 assists against Carroll on October 23 and that is tied for the 10th best in school history. She now has 1,684 setting assists in her career and that is the sixth highest total ever for the Vikings.

Williams led the team in games played with 115 and she averaged 1.30 kills per game and had a .215 hitting percentage with 150 kills and 46 errors in 483 total attempts. She led the squad in total blocks with 86 (18 solo & 68 assists) for an average of 0.75 per game.

In Walters' second season, her young Vikings certainly didn't shy away from tough competition. They played four nationally ranked opponents (Carthage, Elmhurst, Wisconsin-Platteville and Wisconsin-Stevens Point) a total of five times throughout the year and faced the Iowa Conference champion (Cornell) twice. In addition, Augustana ended the regular season with a thrilling five set victory over Webster, which won the championship of the St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and made an appearance in the NCAA tournament.

Sophomore Katrina Colclasure (**Tri-Valley HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) had a position switch this season, moving from setter to libero/defensive specialist and the move paid off. She led the team in digs with 542 in 113 games for an average of 4.80 per game. She had 41 digs in a thrilling come-from-behind 3-2 win over Hendrix on September 9 at the Rhodes Tournament and that is the eighth highest single match total ever for the Vikings. In addition, her average of 4.80 digs per game is the sixth best single season figure in Augustana history. She earned all-tournament recognition at the Viking Classic at home on September 2-3 and at the Rhodes Tournament in Memphis, Tennessee on September 9-10.

Outside hitter Emily Leazer (**St. Viator HS, Mt. Prospect, Ill.**) played a significant role as a freshman and she was second on the team in kills. She totaled 295 and average 2.59 per game. Leazer topped the team in service aces with 36 and was second in digs with a 3.42 average (390 in 114). She was named to all-tournament teams at the Viking Classic on September 2-3 at home and at the Wisconsin-Stevens Point Invitational on October 21-22 in Stevens Point, Wisconsin.

Skeens was named the team's Most Valuable Player, as voted on by her teammates. The Most Improved Player award had co-winners with freshmen Amber Dalgaard (**Antioch HS, Antioch, Ill.**) and Stephanie Petkovsek (**Lisle HS, Lisle, Ill.**) sharing the honor. Dalgaard, a defensive specialist, saw action in 39 games and had 45 digs while Petkovsek, a setter, played in 29 games and recorded 84 assists and 39 digs.

Leazer was chosen as the "Freshman of the Year" and Williams was given the Augie Award as selected by the coaching staff for spirit, dedication and contributions throughout the program. This is the second time that she has been named the winner of the Augie Award. Freshman Astin Moravek (**Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.**) was the winner of the Augie Award for the junior varsity.

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana also sports varsity men's and women's lacrosse teams. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

Football was the first sport contested in the CCIW when the league was formed in 1946. Augustana has won more games (312) and championships (21) than any team in the CCIW during the first 66 years of existence. Not only have the Vikings won 21 league titles, but they have also finished second 12 times. Since 1981 the Blue & Gold own at least a share of 17 of the last 31 championships.
