## About Augustana College

Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college enrolls approximately 2,500 men and women of diverse ethnic, religious and social backgrounds, from across the United States and around the world.

Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 176 total team championships (137 men and 39 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 141 as of December, 2012. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. ## Focused and hard-working Vikings look forward to 2013

Over the past two seasons the Augustana softball team has played with a lot of younger players in the lineup but those two years of going with younger players could pay off in 2013. The Vikings will be able to field a much more veteran lineup this season and that makes veteran head coach Kris Kistler happy and excited for the upcoming campaign.

"This group has been really focused and hard-working," said Kistler, who is entering her 14th season at the Viking helm with a 367-188-2 record. "The leadership, which has been awesome, is hungry and wants to do well and finish on a high-note. The upperclass players have done a great job of leading us."

Augustana was 19-19 in 2011 and 25-13 in 2012, certainly not bad numbers but an 11-17 record in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin during that time frame has Kistler and her team wanting redemption.

"We know that we want to compete at the top of the CCIW and that has been our goal throughout all the fall drills and the early season practices," she said. "That has been the drive for our leaders and they have done a great job of keeping that in front of the entire team."

The Vikings return six position players with starting experience plus a starting pitcher so Kistler has plenty of talent to work with. "I think we are going to be a good fielding team and our baserunning is excellent as well," said Kistler who has been named CCIW "Coach of the Year" three times during her tenure at Augustana. "We will need some of our younger players to step up in pitching as well as hitting but the groundwork is there."

All four positions in the infield return a starter. Between sophomore Christie Wiersema (**Morrison HS, Morrison, Ill.**) at first base, sophomore Jenna Teson (**Jacobs HS, Algonquin, Ill.**) at second base, junior Krista Watson (**Coal City HS, Coal City, Ill.**) at shortstop and junior Chaney Tambling (**Dwight HS, Dwight, Ill.**) at third base, Kistler can point to 144 games started last spring.

Wiersema, who batted .327 with 34 hits in 104 at-bats with 18 runs scored, 22 RBI, four doubles and three home runs, will get challenges from freshman Ashley Anderson (**Sherrard HS, Viola, Ill.**), sophomore Cassie Saufley (**Normal West HS, Normal, Ill.**) and junior Jaime Rehmert (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**). Rehmert, who will also see action as a pitcher, hit three home runs last year in 33 at-bats and had 11 RBI. Saufley played in just four games.

Teson was the second leading hitter on the team with a .345 (39-113) average with 20 runs scored, three doubles and five RBI. Sophomore Chelsea Lavin (**Downers Grove South HS, Downers Grove, Ill.**), who is really an outfielder, could be used here if the need arises. Lavin played in 22 games last year.

Watson is a two-time all conference selection and last year was named to the all-region team after batting .380 (46-121) with 25 runs scored, 18 doubles, one triple, one home run and 22 RBI. She hit nine home runs her freshman year and led the CCIW in three offensive categories in 2011.

Tambling batted .299 with 26 hits in 87 at-bats last year. She scored seven runs with three doubles, one triple, two home runs and 22 RBI. Other candidates at third base will be senior Jenna Nelson (**Orion HS, Orion, Ill.**) freshman Lisa Bartha (**Glenbard South HS, Wheaton, Ill.**). Nelson was an all-region selection in 2011 when she batted .378 but last year she only had 23 at-bats.

The lone starter in the outfield is sophomore Laura Behnke (**Wheaton St. Francis HS, Roselle, Ill.**). She started 25 games and batted .299 with 20 hits in 67 at-bats while scoring 10 runs with eight doubles, a triple and 11 RBI. Lavin and Wiersema might play in the outfield as well as freshmen Cheyenne Burnett (**Rock Falls HS, Rock Falls, Ill.**) and Jennifer Gray (**Lincoln-Way East HS, Mokena, Ill.**). Senior Amanda Johnson (**York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.**) could be used either in the outfield or as a designated hitter after appearing in 21 games last year.

Sophomore Jaclyn Wrona (**Glenbard South HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) should get the nod at catcher after starting 15 games last year and batting .310 with 13 hits in 42 at-bats while scoring eight runs with two doubles and eight RBI. Nelson could also be called on to catch in the need arises.

Junior Sarah Hintz (**LeRoy HS, LeRoy, Ill.**) is the top returning pitcher. She was 15-4 last year with a 1.58 earned run average in 110 2/3 innings of work. She struck out 77 and walked just 25 while appearing in 20 games. She was named the Vikings' MVP. Wiersema, Rehmert and Anderson will form the rest of the mound corps. Wiersema was 1-1 with a 3.20 earned run average in 15 1/3 innings while Rehmert was 0-1 with a 3.08 ERA in 25 innings of work.

## HEAD COACH KRIS KISTLER

Kris Kistler has been the head softball coach at Augustana College for the past 13 years and she has established the Vikings as a legitimate power in both the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and NCAA Division III. She has guided the Blue & Gold to 13 straight non-losing seasons, something that had never happened before around the Augustana campus. The Vikings have also won at least 30 games in five of the last nine years and six times since 2000.

Three times in the last nine years Kistler has led the Vikings to the CCIW tournament championship and four times her teams have qualified for a berth in the NCAA Division III national tournament. In 2004 she guided Augustana to the first conference championship in softball in school history and the Vikings were 36-9 and placed third in the NCAA Great Lakes Regional. Augustana set a total of 10 school records in that historic 2004 campaign. The 2006 team was 33-10 overall, won the CCIW with a 13-1 overall mark, and swept the conference tournament en route to earning a host spot for the NCAA Great Lakes Regional. Eight school records fell in 2006. The 2007 team went 30-14, finished second in the conference regular season and won the CCIW tournament to again advance to the NCAA playoffs. Eight new school records were established in 2007.

Sandwiched between the 2004 and 2006 seasons was a fine 33-12 campaign in which the Vikings were 11-3 in the CCIW and finished second in the conference tournament. The 2008 team went 26-18, finished fourth in the conference regular season, and advanced to the CCIW Tournament title game. In 2009 Augustana was 28-14 overall and 9-5 in the CCIW. 2010 marked another successful season for the Vikings as they compiled a 31-15 record en route to a second place finish in the CCIW tournament and a berth in the NCAA Division III national tournament, their first since 2004. The 2011 Vikings finished the season 19-19 despite losing a majority of their lineup to graduation the previous year. A youthful Augustana team rebounded in 2012 and posted a 25-13 record.

Kistler wasted no time getting the Vikings turned around after inheriting a program that had enjoyed just one winning season in the previous eight years. After being hired in September of 1999 to replace longtime head coach Diane Schumacher, she was left with precious little time to get ready for the 2000 season. It didn't seem to matter as she led her team to a school record for victories in a single season with a 30-15 overall mark. Included in that was an 8-6 record in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and a championship in the Augustana Invitational. That team was loaded with seniors and it looked like 2001 would be a rebuilding year for the Vikings, but Kistler managed to guide them to a 23-20-1 record.

In 2002 her team finished 27-15 and placed third in the CCIW, both in regular season play and in the tournament. At the time the 27 victories tied for the second highest total in school history with teams from 1980 (27-9) and 1996 (27-14). The 2003 squad was 26-14-1 overall and 8-6 record in the conference.

In 12 seasons at Augustana she has compiled a record of 367-188-2 for a winning percentage of .661 and her CCIW mark is 113-69 (.621) in that same time span. Since she started she has coached 42 first team all-conference performers and 43 all-region selections. Twice, in her first season of 2000 and again in 2004, she has been named the CCIW "Coach of the Year" and in 2006 and again in 2007 the Augustana coaching staff was named "Coaching Staff of the Year."

After graduating from Monmouth High School in Monmouth, Illinois, Kistler went on to have a fine collegiate career at Eureka College in Eureka, Illinois where she helped the Red Devils to a career record of 91-57 including a school record 30-7 mark in 1996. Eureka was in the NAIA playoffs three years and Kistler made the 1994 NAIA all-district tournament team. She was named her team's Best Defensive Player in 1996 and she graduated with a career batting average of .346 with a single season high of .394 in 1996.

A multiple sport athlete, she also played basketball for four years at Eureka and was an all-conference selection in 1994-95 in the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference. She was team MVP and co-captain in 1995-96.

After graduation from Eureka she went to Illinois State University where she obtained her master's degree in 1998 in Health, Physical Education and Recreation with a specialization in Exercise Physiology. During that time she served as an assistant softball coach at Illinois Wesleyan University where she helped lead the Titans to a 52-25 overall record and the 1997 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin championship.

Kistler spent the 1998-99 school year as the head coach as Plattsburgh State University in Plattsburgh, New York where she was charged with starting a varsity program. She led her team to a 9-10 season in the Cardinals inaugural campaign. She also served as an assistant coach in basketball. In addition to her duties as head softball coach at Augustana, Kistler also serves as the senior women's administrator for the athletic department.

## ASSISTANT COACH DAVE HEBBELN

Dave Hebbeln, of Davenport, Iowa, will begin his tenth year on the Augustana softball staff. He replaced Denise Wojtkiewicz, who had been Kistler's number one assistant. Hebbeln was the head coach at Marycrest University from 1996 until 2002 until the school closed its doors for good. Prior to serving as the head coach he had two stints as an assistant for the Eagles (1978-80 and 1992-95). He has been involved in coaching the ASA Davenport Blazers in the summer.



## PITCHING COACH JOHN BROKAW

John Brokaw is in his seventh year as the pitching coach for the Vikings. He coached at Orion High School as an assistant from 1991-05 and also served as the pitching coach at Monmouth College for two years. He coached the A.S.A. "Quad City Firebirds" for 16 seasons from 1988-04. A native of Lynn Center, Illinois, Brokaw retired from Case/IH in East Moline in 2001 after a 30 year career as a welder.



## ASSISTANT COACH LEANN BARBER

Leann Barber, who enjoyed an outstanding career with the Vikings, rejoins the program as an assistant coach. She was on the staff during a three year stretch from 2006-08 before taking a year off. This will be in her sixth year as an assistant coach. Barber, a four year letterwinner, was a first team all-conference selection three times, twice as a catcher and once at first base. She was also a three time all-Midwest Region selection. She was on the

top ten career list in four offensive categories when she graduated in the spring of 2005. A standout athlete at Moline High School, Barber has a degree in Sociology from Augustana.

## Vikings finish 25-13 overall and 6-8 in the CCIW; Sarah Hintz named MVP; Krista Watson sets a school record for doubles and earns third team All-Region; Jillian Gibbs named first team All-CCIW

Coach Kris Kistler's Augustana softball team finished the 2012 season with a 25-13 record. The Vikings finished 6-8 and in fifth place in College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin play. It was the 11th time in the last 13 seasons that they've reached the 25-win mark. Sophomore right-hander Sarah Hintz (**LeRoy HS, LeRoy, Ill.**) was selected as the team's Most Valuable Player and classmates Krista Watson (**Coal City HS, Coal City, Ill.**) and Courtney Ledezma (**United Township HS, East Moline, Ill.**) were picked as Best Offensive Players. Senior center fielder Jillian Gibbs (**Rock Island HS, Rock Island, Ill.**) was named Best Defensive Player.

Opening the season in Florida, Augustana dropped its opener to Messiah by a 3-1 score. That proved to be a minor setback though, as the team went on to win the next eight and 10 of the next 11. The Vikings split a doubleheader with St. Ambrose to open the home season and then went on another tear, winning six in a row, including all four at the Augustana Invitational and a doubleheader sweep at Wheaton to open CCIW play.

Augustana looked to be in solid shape in the conference after splitting a home doubleheader with Illinois Wesleyan. The 13th-ranked Titans won the opener to move to 21-3 overall and 5-0 in the league, but the Vikings bounced back to pound IWU 10-6 in the nightcap, marking the only time all year the Titans allowed more than six runs.

Unfortunately, the Vikings couldn't build on that momentum, splitting each of their next two CCIW twinbills against Elmhurst and North Park, although they did manage to sandwich a doubleheader sweep of Knox in between. They were swept at 24th-ranked Carthage to fall to 5-5 in the conference before sweeping Monmouth in another nonconference double dip.

After splitting with North Central to move to 25-11 overall and 6-6 in the league, the team had a chance to play its way into the CCIW tournament, but dropped a season-ending doubleheader against Millikin.

Hintz paced Augustana in the circle this season. She finished the year with a 15-4 record and a 1.58 ERA. Her 15 wins are tied for the sixth-highest single season total in school history. 16 of her 20 appearances were starting assignments and she completed 12 of those starts, including three shutouts. All of those marks led the staff, as did her 110 2/3 innings pitched and 77 strikeouts. In just two seasons, she already ranks in the school's career top ten in wins (tied for ninth with 23), strikeouts (ninth with 155) and ERA (fifth at 1.88).

Watson, the Vikings' shortstop, led the team with a .380 batting average as well as a .570 slugging percentage and .429 on-base percentage. She set a school record with 18 doubles and also led the club with 25 runs scored, 46 hits and 69 total bases and tied for second with 22 RBI. She was a second team All-CCIW and third team NFCA All-Region selection and is currently seventh in career batting average at Augustana with a .379 mark.

Ledezma (.344-2-26) led the team in RBI and triples (four). A second team All-CCIW pick as a utility player, she also posted an 8-6 record with a 2.98 ERA in the circle. Gibbs (.313-6-17), a first team All-CCIW selection, led the Vikings in home runs and freshman Christie Wiersema (**Morrison HS, Morrison, Ill.**) (.327-3-22), who split time with Ledezma at first base, was the team leader with 14 walks.

Other regulars for Augustana included sophomore third baseman Chaney Tambling (**Dwight HS, Dwight, Ill.**) (.299-2-22), who committed just one error in 88 chances for a fielding percentage of .988, and freshman second baseman Jenna Teson (**Jacobs HS, Algonquin, Ill.**) (.345-0-5).

Sophomore Randi Applehans (**Mountain Vista HS, Highlands Ranch, Colo.**) (.200-0-7), who led the CCIW in cutting down potential base stealers, shared catching duties with freshman Jaclyn Wrona (**Glenbard South HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) (.310-0-8).

Kistler, the winningest coach in Augustana softball history, completed her 13th season with the Vikings this year and now has a career record of 367-188-2 (.661). Her overall collegiate record is 376-198-2 (.655), which includes one year at SUNY-Plattsburgh where she was 9-10 in 1999.

# THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana also sports varsity men's and women's lacrosse teams. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 176 total. Of those 176, the men have won 137 and 39 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in softball starting in the 1986-87 school year. Augustana won its first league title in 2004, taking the regular season with an 11-3 record and winning the conference tournament with a 7-1 victory over North Central in the championship game.
