ABOUT AUGUSTANA COLLEGE: Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 176 total team championships (137 men and 39 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 141 as of December, 2012. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

After successful debut in 2012, Miedema looks for more heading into 2013

With his first season as the head coach of the Augustana men's tennis team in the books, Jon Miedema is anxiously looking forward to his second season. Miedema got off to a successful start in charge of the Vikings' program, compiling a 16-11 overall dual meet record and a 2-3 mark in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin.

The Vikings came within an eyelash of making it to the championship match of the CCIW tournament for the second year in a row. They dropped a 5-4 heartbreaker to Wheaton in the semi-finals of the conference tourney and then lost 6-3 to Carthage in the third-place match to close out the year.

"I am excited for the upcoming season," said Miedema who watched this past fall as his women's team posted an 8-3 overall record and a 5-1 ledger in the CCIW for second place. "Last year we had a lot of younger players who stepped up and played crucial roles in our season. Now those kids are a year older and will factor into our success even more."

Only one starter graduated from last year's team but the loss will be a big one. Adam DeSimone handled the number one singles position for three years and he graduated with 136 career victories (singles and doubles combined), second on the school's all-time list. He was a three-time team MVP and his 73 career doubles victories set a new school record.

DeSimone's shoes will need to be filled and there are several candidates for the position. Sophomore Lawrence Palmer (**Schiller International School, El Prat de Llobregat**) played number two last year and posted a 9-11 singles record. He would be the logical choice to move up to the number one slot. Junior Andy Wall (**Notre Dame Academy, De Pere, Wis.**) was 17-13 a year ago and played mostly at number three so he will move up as well.

Senior Jack Cullen (**Edgewood HS, Madison, Wis.**) posted an 11-14 record in 2012 while alternating between number three and number four singles. Junior Kevin Bayles (**Homewood-Flossmoor HS, Flossmoor, Ill.**) was 21-7 as a sophomore while seeing action at both number five and number six and junior Colin Arnold (**Sterling HS, Sterling, Ill.**) was 20-9 while switching back and forth between number four and number five. Arnold will miss most of the early portion of the season because he is on an internship in Australia.

Senior Will Palmer (**Schiller International School, Leicester, England**) is a top-notch doubles player who teamed with his brother Lawrence to go 12-10 at number two in 2012. Junior Grant Wick (**Windsor HS, Fort Collins, Wis.**) stepped into the starting lineup late in the year and went 10-4 while playing at number six singles.

"We are happy with our returning players," said Miedema. "They had success last year and have worked hard in the off-season to improve their respective games."

There will be some freshmen who will make an impact as well. Harald Olsson (**Lidingo, Sweden**) had a nice fall and he could end up high in the lineup in singles. Patrick Lenz (**Villanova Prep School, Ojai, Calif.**), John Alexander (**Rockford Guilford HS, Loves Park, Ill.**), Austin Schoeck (**Rock Island Alleman HS, Rock Island, Ill.**) and Ian Deggendorf (**St. James Academy, Liberty, Mo.**) all show promise.

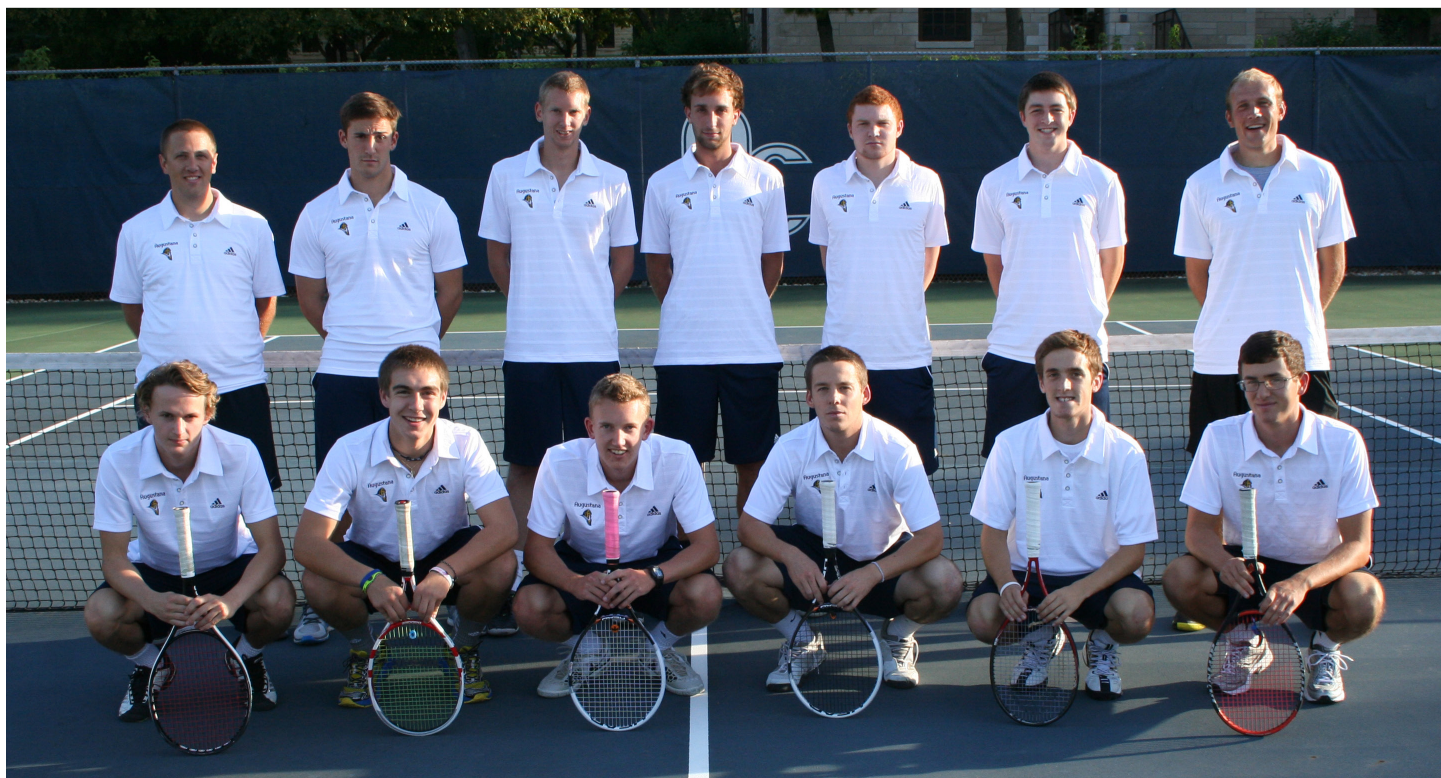
"We have a lot of depth," said Miedema. "On any given day I feel that we could interchange the positions and be just fine. We are looking for consistency from our players and working on stringing back-to-back good days of practice together, which will then lead to better play in matches."

The doubles teams are not set yet and DeSimone's loss will hurt because he was 16-13 at number one while playing with Wall. The Palmer brothers (12-10) were solid at number two last year and Arnold and Cullen went 18-6 at number three.

"We need to get the doubles teams figured out early in the season," said Miedema. "Once we decide on a lineup, the consistency will fall into line. We are anticipating a good year in 2013 and we are looking forward to getting started."

Augustana has a streak of five straight winning seasons, dating back to 2008 and the Vikings are 98-54 during that time frame.

"Once again we think our schedule is tough," said Miedema. "We like to challenge the players and the team in our program to get better and we do it by playing good teams."

HEAD COACH JON MIEDEMA



Jon Miedema stepped into the role as the head coach for men's and women's tennis at Augustana in June of 2011. He replaced Adam Strand, who resigned in May to become the head coach in both sports at Luther, his alma mater. Miedema, the 13th coach in Viking history for the women and the 20th on the men's side of the ledger, enjoyed success with both programs in his first season.

He led the Augustana women to a 15-11 overall mark and a 2-3 record in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin in 2011-12. The Vikings finished fourth in the CCIW Tournament and won 10 of their last 15 matches.

On the men's side, Augustana went 16-11 overall and 2-3 in the CCIW. The Vikings

placed fourth in the conference tournament, dropping a 5-4 heartbreaker to Wheaton in the semi-final round.

Miedema comes to the Vikings after spending one season (2010-11) as the head men's tennis coach at Grace Bible College in Grand Rapids, Michigan. However, he has a wealth of knowledge and experience in the game. He served as the assistant coach for the women's team at Calvin College, his alma mater, during the spring of 2011. He helped lead the Knights to a 19-4 overall record and a second round advancement in the NCAA Division III Championships.

Miedema served as a tennis instructor for three years at the Michigan Athletic Club, noted as one of the top clubs in the Midwest. He also worked as an instructor at the Centennial Country Club in Grand Rapids from 2004 through 2006.

A 2005 graduate of Calvin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business and communications, Miedema worked as a health insurance agent for Kessler and Associates from 2007 until he took the Augustana position. He was also a loan officer for Brickwood Mortgage from 2005 through 2007.

As a player at Calvin he served as team captain during his senior season of 2005. He was a first team all-conference selection in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

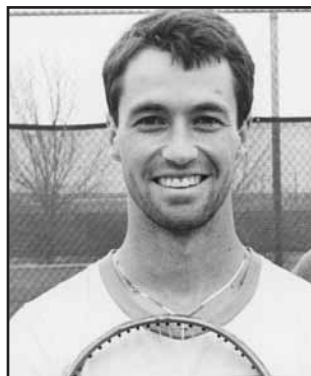

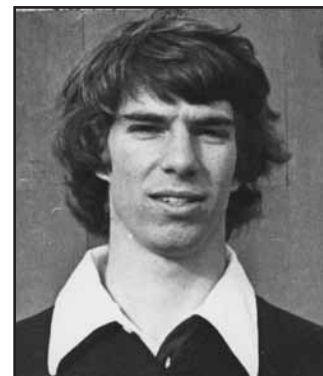

Mike Morkin was a two time NCAA Division III All-American and won National Tennis Coaches Association "Rookie of the Year" in 1984. He is the all-time leader in career singles victories with 58 from 1984-87 when he was 58-33.



Roger Nelsen earned NCAA Division III All-American honors in 1977 and he is tied for the school record in single season victories with 19. He won the 1977 CCIW number one singles title and he won three number one doubles championships in the league when he teamed with Erik Rossing from 1975-77.

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana also sports varsity men's and women's lacrosse teams. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 176 total. Of those 176, the men have won 137 and 39 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in men's tennis in 1946-47, the year the league was formed. Augustana has captured a total of 20 conference titles in men's tennis with the last one coming in 1985.

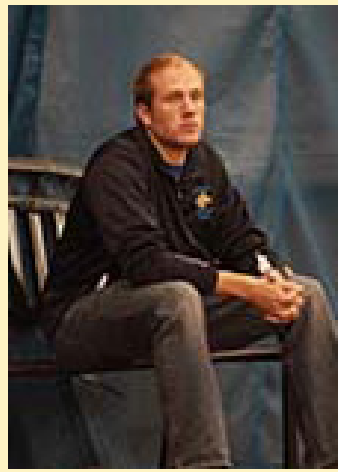
