After tremendous season in 2011-12, Vikings look for more in 2012-13

There is no hiding the optimism in Eric Juergens' voice when he talks about his Augustana wrestling team's chances for the 2012-13 season. Juergens, who is entering his sixth season as the Vikings head coach, has good reason to be excited as his team is coming off a tremendous 2011-12 campaign.

"This could turn out to be a pretty good year," said Juergens who has fashioned a 31-40 dual meet record in five years but has watched his Vikings go 20-10 over the past two seasons. "For the first time since I have been here every single wrestler in the room is somebody we recruited and that makes a huge difference. We are all on the same page as we continue to make progress."

There is no doubt that the Vikings have made progress during Juergens' tenure. His first season was in 2007-08 and Augustana went 2-9 in dual meets and place fourth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and 12th in the NCAA Division III West Regional. Last year the Vikings were 11-4 in dual meets, took second in the CCIW with three individual champions and placed sixth in the West Regional. In addition, his team flirted with the top 25 in the NCAA Division III national rankings and came away with the program's first All-American since 2003 when Jordan Richardson (Grandville HS, Wyoming, Mich.) placed eighth at 174 pounds.

Heading into 2012-13, Juergens can point to 25 returning letter winners, seven of them starters, on his 37-man roster.

"Our roster is bigger and that certainly helps with depth and competition in the room," said Juergens who was a two-time NCAA Division I national champion at the University of Iowa. "I was a little surprised by our success last year and that is a tip of the hat to the kids on the team. They made that happen and are looking for more this season."

The Vikings recent success has caught the attention of the national scene as they are ranked 17th in the NCAA Division III pre-season national ranking according to the National Wrestling Coaches Association.

WEIGHT CLASS BREAKDOWN

125 – Junior Jacob Scholten (Rockford HS, Grandville, Mich.) is back in the mix after sitting out his sophomore season. He was the Vikings' co-MVP as a freshman when he won the CCIW title at this weight class and posted a 38-8 overall record. He won the NCAA Division III West Regional and his 38 victories are tied for the 20th best single season mark in Augustana's history. He will get backup help from a trio of talented freshmen: Anthony Desanto (St. Joseph HS, Westchester, Ill.), Austin Nusbaum (Sturgis HS, Sturgis, Mich.) and Jimmy Panozzo (Carl Sandburg HS, Orland Park, Ill.).

133 – There will be two freshmen handling things at 133 with Cody Weitzel (Valor Christian HS, Littleton, Colo.) and Justin Smiley (Plainfield North HS, Plainfield, III.) currently battling for the starting position.

141 – Freshman Isaiah Schaub (St. Francis HS, Traverse City, Mich.) is a guy who Juergens says "just goes and goes and goes" and he could end up with the starting spot at 141. Sophomores Hector Ruiz (Aurora East HS, Aurora, III.) and Zackary Wheeler (Seneca HS, Marseilles, III.) along with freshman Kadmiel Smith (Wilton HS, Wilton, Iowa) make this a fairly deep weight class.

149 – Sophomore David Tessiatore (Downers Grove North HS, Downers Grove, Ill.) will move down from 157 pounds where he was 13-21 a year ago. Sophomore Walter Piech (Lincoln-Way East HS, Mokena, Ill.) was injured most of last year but he has great potential. Freshman Ben Deig (Limestone HS, Bartonville, Ill.) and sophomore Thomas Browne (Gray-slake HS, Hainesville, Ill.), the regular at 125 a year ago, will be at this weight class as well.

157 – There is plenty of talent at this weight class. Sophomore Alex Bowers (Noblesville HS, Noblesville, Ind.) was 9-9 a year ago and sophomore

Kevin Sundberg (Paw Paw HS, Paw Paw, Mich.) finished 8-7. Sophomore Thomas Reyhons (Davenport Assumption HS, Davenport, Iowa) missed last year but could make some noise in 2012-13. Junior Mitch Musgrove (Orion HS, Andover, III.) posted a 7-8 mark as a sophomore and freshmen Seth Hardcastle (Arapahoe HS, Centennial, Colo.) and Khaled Almousa (Reavis HS, Burbank, III.) will provide plenty of depth.

165 – Sophomores Connor Cummings (Downers Grove North HS, Woodridge, Ill.) and Torey Welch (Valor Christian HS, Littleton, Colo.) both saw significant action a year ago. Cummings was 8-10 while Welch finished 9-9.

174 – Senior Matt Burns (Naperville Central HS, Naperville, Ill.) is coming off a great junior season where he went 28-17, won the CCIW title at 165 and qualified for the NCAA Division III national tournament. Senior Cody Heche (Cary-Grove HS, Cary, Ill.) and sophomore Erik Timko (Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.) are also available at 174.

184 – Junior Jordan Richardson (Grandville HS, Wyoming, Ill.) started last year at 184 but dropped down to 174 and finished 38-11. He won the CCIW title at 174 and was named the league's Most Outstanding Wrestler and went on to earn NCAA Division III All-American honors. Senior Ian Knepshield (Shady Side HS, Ford City, Penn.) is a veteran who will be a capable backup.

197 – Plenty of bodies here and Juergens is waiting for somebody to take charge of this weight class. Sophomore Seth Whan (Sherrard HS, Viola, Ill.) finished his freshman year with a 12-18 record and senior Matt Regnier (Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.) was 5-9. Freshmen Frank Hollo (Litchfield HS, Litchfield, Ill.) and Jake Melik (Pleasant Valley HS, Bettendorf, Iowa) and sophomore Steve Monaco (Stagg HS, Hickory Hills, Ill.) should be in the mix as well.

285 – The Vikings have the luxury of three quality wrestlers at this weight class. Junior Abe Duran (East Aurora HS, Aurora, Ill.) was 13-6 last year while sophomore John Schraidt (Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.) finished 26-9 and sophomore John Seamen (Munster HS, Munster, Ind.) was 16-8.



Junior Jordan Richardson will wrestle at 184 pounds this year. As a sophomore, he finished with a record of 38-11, was the CCIW individual champion at 174 pounds and finished 8th at Nationals. Richardson was also selected as an All-American for his efforts

ERIC JUERGENS – Head Wrestling Coach

After serving as Augustana's interim head coach for the 2007-08 season, Eric Juergens, a two time NCAA Division I national champion, was hired as the school's full time wrestling coach on April 4, 2008. He heads into his sixth season at the helm of the Vikings in 2012-13. Juergens has the Vikings coming off their best campaign in eight years, leading them to a 11-4 dual meet record and a second place finish in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW). The 2011-12 season also saw Juergens' team produce Augustana's first All-American (Jordan Richardson) since the 2002-03

season, as well as three individual conference champions (Alberto Quiros, Richardson, and Matt Burns).

Augustana went 2-9 in dual meets and finished fourth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin during Juergens' interim season of 2007-08. In his second year (2008-09), the Vikings went 4-11 in dual meets and moved up to third in the CCIW. 2009-2010 brought an improved record of 5-10 in dual meets and another third place conference finish, building up to the success the program experienced during the 2010-11 season. The 2010-11 season saw Juergens' team achieve a new high, producing Augustana's first two conference champions (freshmen Jacob Scholten and Jordan Graham) since the 2005-06 season, as well as two Scholar All-Americans in Hunter Feraco and Tim Day.

In September of 2008, the head wrestling coaching position at Augustana was fully endowed thanks to a generous gift from Terry and Sandy Shockley. Juergens becomes the first "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" in school history. Augustana is the first school in the CCIW and one of a select few in NCAA Division III to have an endowed coaching position in its athletic department.

"I want to thank the administration for giving me the chance as a head coach," said Juergens when the interim tag was removed from his title in the spring of 2008. "My intentions and goals will be very simple. I have been coached by some of the greatest names in the sport of wrestling, guys like Dan Gable, Jim Zalesky, Tom and Terry Brands and Lincoln McIl-ravy just to name a few. I want to take the very methods and techniques that I have learned over the course of my own career and implement them at Augustana."

Juergens had a prolific career as a competitor. Wrestling at the University of Iowa, he won individual national titles both as a junior (1999-00) and as a senior (2000-01). He was third in the NCAA tournament in his freshman (1997-98) and sophomore (1998-99) seasons. As a senior he served as team captain and was the Hawkeye's Most Valuable Performer. He was the Big Ten Wrestler of the Year and selected as the University of Iowa's "Male Athlete of the Year".

During his junior campaign he had an undefeated 33-0 record en route to his first national title. Along the way he won the Big Ten title and was the champion at the Midlands Tournament. He was given the Art Kraft "Champion of Champions" award at the Midlands.

He finished third in the Big Ten both his freshman and sophomore seasons prior to placing third in the national meet each year. He was named the NCAA "Freshman of the Year" at the completion of the 1997-98 season.

His high school career at Maquoketa High School in Maquoketa, Iowa was one of unparalleled success. He was 144-0 during his four year, compiling 100 pins and winning four straight state titles. He was the Northern Plains Regional champion and was first team Amateur Wrestling News All-American. He was a second team Asics Tiger All-American as well. He placed second at Cadet Nationals as a sophomore and was an honor roll student. Juergens graduated from the University of Iowa in 2001 with a B.A. degree in English. He served as a volunteer assistant coach at Augustana in 2006-07 and before that he spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant at Loras. He is the owner of Young Guns Wrestling Club and served as the camp director for the University of Iowa Wrestling Camps from 1998 until 2002.

He leads an Augustana program that has won a total of 36 CCIW titles, more than any other school in the conference.

Augustana announces the "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" endowment

The tradition-rich Augustana wrestling program received quite a boost from one of its most successful alums recently and the result is the school's first endowed head coaching position. The "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach" has been made possible thanks to a generous \$500,000.00 endowment gift from Terry and Sandy (Tweddell) Shockley. The Shockleys are alumni of Augustana, Terry, class of 1962 and Sandy, class of 1965.

"Augustana is deeply grateful to Terry and Sandy for their steadfast support of our wrestling program," said Augustana president Steve Bahls. "Generations of Augustana wrestlers will benefit from their decision to endow a first-class wrestling program."

The Shockley's have been long-time supporters of Augustana in general and the wrestling program in particular. In the fall of 2003 the wrestling room in the Carver PE Center was refurbished and renamed the "Shockley Wrestling Room" after a gift from the Shockley's. Terry had a tremendous career as a wrestler at Augustana. In 1962, after winning the NCAA Mideast Regional, Shockley became a national qualifier at 137 pounds in the NCAA University Division at Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Oklahoma. A year earlier, as a junior, he placed second at the NAIA National Tournament in Golden, Colorado at 130 pounds.

He was a four year letter winner and won three College Conference of Illinois individual titles, two at 130 pounds (1960-61) and one at 137 (1962). He finished second in the CCI at 130 pounds as a freshman in 1959, losing in overtime on a referee's decision. He compiled a career record of 69-9 and had 29 pins. An extremely durable performer, he wrestled in every dual meet and tournament that Augustana competed in during his four year career.

Shockley was the Most Outstanding Wrestler in the CCI in both his junior (1960-61) and senior (1961-62) seasons and in the NCAA Mideast Regional in 1961-62. He was the Vikings' Most Valuable Performer in 1960-61 and again in 1961-62 as well as being named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the Wheaton and Knox Tournament as a senior. Following graduation from Augustana, Shockley competed in many AAU tournaments while serving as the head wrestling coach at the University of Kansas, where he earned a Master's degree in radio-TV film.

"We have been truly blessed in our marriage and broadcasting careers to be in a position to extend our appreciation and loyalty to Augustana. Our sport needs advocates," said Shockley. "Now, at Augustana we can 'press on' under the leadership of Eric Juergens for the sport of wrestling and continue to be one of the outstanding athletic teams in the history of Augustana athletics. Hopefully our support will help Augustana meet and exceed the challenge of supporting a tremendous athletic program."

Eric Juergens, who built quite a name for himself as a competitor while winning a pair of NCAA Division I national titles at the University of Iowa, is the first coach to occupy the position of "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach." He was the interim head coach during the 2007-08 season before shedding that tag in April of 2008. Juergens, a four time NCAA All-American for the Hawkeyes, is understandably honored to be the first person to ascend to this prestigious position.

"The gift of the Shockley's is an outstanding example of how alumni can show their gratitude for the amazing experience they had while at Augustana," said Juergens. "With support such as this, we have built the foundation of turning the Augustana wrestling program back into a program that is consistent with those at the top of NCAA Division III."

With the addition of the "Terry and Sandy Shockley Head Wrestling Coach", Augustana now has a total of 17 endowed positions on campus. This is not only the first endowed position in Viking athletics, but it is also a first in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and one of the few nationwide at the NCAA Division III level.

Augustana's tradition in wrestling is peppered with success. The Vikings own 36 total College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin team titles, including a stretch from 1982 until 2004 where they won 23 of 24 championships. They won 10 straight from 1963-72, 15 straight from 1982-96 and seven in a row from 1998-2004. A total of 49 Augustana wrestlers have earned All-American honors with eight individual national titles. The program has produced 11 top 15 national team places, four Academic All-Americans, 11 Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar-Athletes, 18 CCIW "Most Outstanding Wrestlers" and 188 individual conference champions.

Jordan Richardson becomes first Viking All-American in nine years; Richardson, Alberto Quiros & Matt Burns win CCIW championships; Vikings finish 11-4 in dual meets for best record since 2002-03

For the fifth consecutive season under head coach Eric Juergens, the Augustana wrestling team improved its dual meet record and regional finish in 2011-12. Behind sophomore All-American Jordan Richardson (Grandville HS, Wyoming, Mich.) and fellow College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin champions senior Alberto Quiros (J. Sterling Morton HS, Cicero, Ill.) and junior Matt Burns (Naperville Central HS, Naperville, Ill.), this year's Vikings went 11-4 in dual meet competition for their best record since the 2003-04 team went 15-5. The team's second-place finish in the CCIW was the program's best since Augustana won the conference title in 2004. Juergens' crew was sixth at the Great Lakes Regional and 36th at the national meet.

Richardson finished eighth in the 174-pound weight class at the NCAA Division III meet in La Crosse, Wisconsin to become the first Augustana wrestler to earn All-America status since Matt Kapraun in 2003. Quiros and Burns also qualified for the national meet. Burns knocked off the fifth seed at 165 pounds, but lost to the fourth and third seeds. Quiros was eliminated at 149 pounds on a pair of one-point decisions, including one to the eighth seed.

Although Richardson and Quiros shared Most Outstanding Wrestler honors at the CCIW meet held at Carver Center, Burns' title at 165 pounds may have been the most impressive. Seeded fourth, he handled top-seeded Mike Ryan of Elmhurst 7-2 in the semifinals before topping North Central's second-seeded Devin Milheim 16-5 in the final. Richardson, seeded second at 174, pinned North Central's Andrew Hiller and won the title with an 8-1 decision over top-seeded Danny Balderas of Elmhurst. Quiros was also seeded second at 149 and beat North Central's Eric Oyster 8-5 and Elmhurst's top-seeded Ryan Earley 6-5 for his championship. Augustana finished second in the team standings with 77 points. Elmhurst was the team champion with 101 points.

In addition, Richardson won the 184-pound title at the Knox Open in Galesburg, Illinois and the 174-pound championship at the Central Tournament in Pella, Iowa. Quiros was also a champion at Central—winning at 149 pounds—as was freshman John Schraidt (Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.), who bested the field at 285 pounds. Quiros' performance at Pella, which included five straight wins including two by fall, earned him CCIW Wrestler of the Week honors.

The team's dual meet ledger included wins over Knox (48-6), Central (21-10), Simpson (28-12), Loras (25-14), UW-Platteville (36-6), Hannibal-LaGrange (49-3), Trine (26-24), Chicago (22-18), Wheaton (26-15), Manchester (25-16) and Concordia (Wis.) (36-12). Its losses came to Elmhurst (27-12), Cornell (34-6), Luther (27-11) and North Central (27-18).

The Vikings finished fourth among 13 teams at the North Central Invitational on December 10 and 12th in a field of 31 teams at Wheaton's Pete Willson Invitational on January 28.

Individually, Richardson finished the season 38-11, putting him in a tie for 20th on Augustana's single-season wins list. Quiros ended his career with a 36-11 senior season. Junior Steve Poffenberger (Allegan HS, Paw Paw, Mich.), the CCIW's 133-pound runner-up, fashioned a 30-13 record this year. Burns finished 28-17.

Schraidt (Riverside-Brookfield HS, Riverside, Ill.) led a trio of successful 285-pounders for the Vikings, finishing the year 26-9 and

taking second place at the conference meet. Freshman John Seaman (Munster HS, Munster, Ind.) went 16-8 and sophomore Abe Duran (East Aurora HS, Aurora, III.) was 13-6.

Junior Hunter Feraco (Gull Lake HS, Battle Creek, Mich.) repeated as a CCIW third-place finisher at 197 pounds and finished the year with a 22-15 record. Junior 141-pounder Greg Gogonas (James Bowie HS, Austin, Texas) went 18-18 this year and was a runner-up in the CCIW. Freshman David Tessiatore (Downers Grove North HS, Downers Grove, Ill.), who finished fourth in the conference at 157 pounds, posted a 13-21 record and classmate Seth Whan (Sherrard HS, Viola, Ill.), CCIW runner-up at 184 pounds, was 12-18 this season.



Alberto Quiros finished his senior season with an impressive 36-11 record while wrestling at 149 pounds. Quiros was alos able to take home the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin individual championship in the 149 pound weight class.







THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 67th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling. The latest sports added at Augustana were men's and women's lacrosse and neither of those are sponsored by the CCIW.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 176 total. Of those 176, the men have won 137 and 39 belong to the women.

The CCIW began to award championships in wrestling in 1957 and since that time Augustana has dominated with a total of 36 out of a possible 51 titles. The Vikings had a streak of 10 straight from 1963 through 1972 and 15 consecutive from 1982 through 1996.


