## About Augustana College

Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 173 total team championships (135 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports, with 131 as of December, 2009. During the 1990s the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. # Young Vikings have talent and work ethic to continue with recent success

Despite absorbing some fairly heavy losses from the 2009 season, veteran Augustana head coach Greg Wallace is optimistic heading into the 2010 baseball campaign. He is looking at a team that he calls "fundamentally sound" and he believes that his young Vikings will be able to hold their own once again. Past history says that he should be correct in his assessment as he has accumulated a record of 356-162 in his previous 12 seasons at the helm of his alma mater. "We will have the same expectations as we have when we start every year," said Wallace, who has guided Augustana to three NCAA tournament appearances since 1999. "We are a little younger, no question about that, and we will work hard to get this team to come around quickly."

Last year the Vikings went 23-17 overall and were 10-10 in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. That snapped a four year run of 30-plus victories per season. During his tenure as the Augustana head coach, Wallace's teams have won at least 30 games a total of seven times and have never won less than 23 games in a single season.

"This is a very talented group and they worked hard in the fall and have been very committed in the off-season," he said. "Fundamentally, we are very sound and that will carry us to a lot of success. We also have some depth in some key positions and that is always a plus."

The top four pitchers in terms of innings logged are back to take the hill for the Vikings. Senior Matt Erickson (**Marmion Academy, Channahon, Ill.**) saw the most action in 2009 with 11 starts and 66 2/3 innings worked. He posted a 4-4 record and a 6.48 earned run average and led the team in strikeouts with 57. He is 17-7 during his career at Augustana with an ERA of 4.57. Currently he is fourth on the school's career strikeout list with 162 and he is 10th in both victories (17) and innings pitched (181 1/3). Fellow senior Mike Pagano (**Niles Notre Dame HS, Chicago, Ill.**) struggled with some arm trouble last year but still managed to go 5-2 with a 4.33 earned run average in 35 1/3 innings. He posted 30 strikeouts and logged 10 appearances.

Junior Grant Loiselle (**Bloomington Central Catholic HS, Normal, Ill.**) was 3-0 with a 4.10 earned run average in 37 1/3 innings last year. He struck out 42 and had a team high three complete games. Sophomore Mike Trotta (**Niles Notre Dame HS, Chicago, Ill.**) earned a spot in the starting rotation midway through the season and he finished the year with a 1-3 record and a 5.01 ERA.

He had 27 strikeouts in 41 1/3 innings of work.

Another who will be counted on to handle some innings will be junior Vince Frede (**St. Charles East HS, St. Charles, Ill.**). Frede was 1-1 with a 0.46 ERA in 19 2/3 innings last year and 17 strikeouts before his season ended early due to injury.

"We also will be relying on some younger guys to handle some innings for us," said Wallace. "We have confidence in guys like Erickson, Pagano, Loiselle, Trotta and Frede to do the bulk of the work but we have some talented others who will be asked to contribute as well."

Junior T.J. O'Donnell (**New Trier HS, Northbrook, Ill.**), senior Jarl Dahlgren (**Rockford Auburn HS, Rockford, Ill.**) and freshman Jim Sandberg (**J.K. Mullen HS, Littleton, Colo.**) will battle for the catching position. O'Donnell appeared in 24 games last year and batted .310 with 22 hits in 71 at-bats and had five doubles, five home runs and 25 runs-batted-in. He also threw out three of seven base runners attempting to steal. Dahlgren appeared in six games last year and had two hits in five at-bats.

There will be some new faces in the infield as only sophomore Joe Moran (**Niles Notre Dame HS, Chicago, Ill.**) and junior Dave Hoffman (**Cary Grove HS, Fox River Grove, Ill.**) return. Moran should handle things at second base while Hoffman will be at third base. Moran broke into the lineup late last year and hit .392 with 20 hits in 51 at-bats while scoring 17 runs. Hoffman has been a three year regular and he was a first team all-conference performer last year after he batted .363 (58-160) with 13 doubles, one triple, two home runs and 31 RBI. He was third on the team in runs scored with 34. There is a collection of younger player who are vying for playing time at shortstop and first base.

In the outfield junior Mike Lamb (**Ottawa Township HS, Ottawa, Ill.**) and sophomores Mike Barker (**Grandview HS, Centennial, Colo. – now resides in Marina Del Rey, Calif.**), Kevin Serna (**Rolling Meadows HS, Arlington Heights, Ill.**) and Anthony Concialdi (**Fremd HS, Barrington, Ill.**) will battle for the three open positions. Lamb hit .375 with 21 hits in 56 at-bats and had five doubles, one triple and one home run. He scored 20 runs and had 16 RBI. Barker played in 29 games and hit .232 while Serna played in 15 games and Concialdi did not see any varsity action on 2009.

"I like this group," said Wallace. "They have been very easy to work with and have been very attentive. We are going to get tested early in the season as six of our first 11 games are against teams that were in the NCAA tournament last year."



## HEAD COACH GREG WALLACE

Greg Wallace enters his 13th season as the head baseball coach at his alma mater and it has been an era of unprecedented success. Since assuming the reigns of the Vikings prior to the 1997-98 school year, he has guided the Vikings to two school record seasons in terms of victories and 12 of the top 13 single season win totals in Augustana history. In seven of his 12 years, Augustana has won at least 30 games, including four in a row from 2005 through 2008.

In his very first year he took the Vikings to a 22-16 record, the second highest victory total in school history at the time, trailing only the then-existing school mark of 25 wins compiled in 1996. He eclipsed that record in 1999 when he led Augustana to a sterling 32-13 season. Included among those 32 wins was the first College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin baseball tournament championship in school history and first ever NCAA Division III tournament appearance. In 2000 the Blue & Gold went 38-8, establishing a new school record and were an impressive 17-4 in CCIW play. The 2001 season saw the Vikings finish with a 30-14 record and place second in the CCIW and in 2002 Augustana went 25-16 and finished third in the CCIW. The Vikings compiled a mark of 28-15 and placed third in the conference in 2003 and established seven new school records. In 2004 Wallace's crew went 25-15 overall and 10-11 in the conference and in 2005 Augustana was 33-11 overall and 15-6 in the CCIW. The 2006 campaign finished with a 31-10 overall record and a 15-6 record in conference action.

In a two year span from 2007 through 2008 the Vikings had a combined record of 69-27 and have qualified for the NCAA Division III national tournament each season. In 2007 they were 35-14, the second highest win total in school history and second place finishes in both the CCIW and NCAA Regional tournaments. His team set 10 new school records during the year. The 2008 team went 34-13, the third highest victory total in Augustana history and was third in both the conference and regional tournament. Last year the Vikings went 23-17 overall to secure a 12th straight year over the 20 win plateau.

In just 12 years Wallace has a record of 356-162 (.687) at Augustana and his overall collegiate record is 434-211 (.673). He currently ranks 24th in NCAA Division III in terms of winning percentage among active coaches with at least five years experience. He was also the CCIW "Coach of the Year" in 2005.

Wallace, who grew up in Belvidere, Illinois and was a three sport (football - basketball - baseball) star at Belvidere High School before graduating in 1984, was outstanding in both baseball and football during his undergraduate days at Augustana. He was a three-year starter at quarterback

for the Vikings and served as team captain as a senior during the 1987 season. During his football career he led Augustana to NCAA Division III titles in 1985 and 1986 and the Vikings won three straight CCIW championships under his control. As a baseball player he was a four-time letterwinner and a four-year starter at second base and center field and was named to the All-conference team in 1986 and 1987.



Wallace graduated from Augustana in the spring of 1988 with a degree in business with concentrations in marketing and management. After serving as the head baseball coach at Rock Valley Community College for one year in 1989, he moved on to graduate school at Frostburg State University in Maryland. At Frostburg he served as both an assistant football and baseball coach while he earned his Master's Degree in education. He later became the defensive backs coach for the Bobcat football team before being named head baseball coach in 1992. During his four year tenure (1992-95) as head baseball coach at Frostburg State, Wallace compiled a record of 78-49-1. In his first year his Bobcat team won the Eastern States Athletic Conference and Wallace was named the ESAC "Coach of the Year". While under the direction of Wallace, Frostburg State qualified for the ECAC (East Coast Athletic Conference) playoffs three times.

In the summer of 1995 Wallace came back to Augustana and quickly moved up the chain of command. In 1995 he assumed the duties of assistant football and assistant baseball coach, in 1996 he became the offensive coordinator for the Vikings football team, in 1997 he became the head baseball coach, and finally in 1998 he was named the men's athletic director, replacing John Farwell, who retired after 16 years at the position. He held that position until the spring of 2004. Wallace and his wife Rona currently live in Rock Island, Illinois with their two sons Cayton and Trenton.

## THE VIKING ASSISTANTS



**TIM MCCHESENEY...**McChesney will begin his sixth season as the pitching coach at Augustana. McChesney, who had been the head coach at Black Hawk Junior College since 1995, joined the Vikings in the summer of 2004. He compiled a record of 279-174 in nine seasons at Black Hawk, winning five Arrowhead Conference championships. He coached 41 all-conference players, 27 all-region honorees and 49 academic all-conference selections during that time frame. He also led Black Hawk to second place in the Illinois Region IV tournament twice (1996 and 2002). He served as the head coach of the Rock Island

Legion Post #200 team for three seasons (2000-02) winning the district in 2000 and 2002. Prior to that he was an assistant coach from 1997-99, helping Post #200 place third in the American Legion World Series in 1997 after winning the district, state and regional titles. He also worked as an assistant coach at Davenport Assumption in 1995 and Rock Island High School from 1992-95. McChesney played collegiately at Lincoln College in Lincoln, Illinois and Western Illinois. He was team captain twice at Western and was the Leathernecks "Pitcher of the Year" in 1990. He was the "Pitcher of the Year" at Lincoln in 1989 and served as team captain and was named to the all-state team.



**JOHN FURLONG...**John Furlong is in his 12th year as an assistant coach for the Vikings in baseball. Furlong, who at one time was both the head baseball and football coach at St. Ambrose University in Davenport, Iowa, has been a fixture at Augustana since 1990. He coached the defensive backs and was the recruiting coordinator for the football team from 1993 until 2003. He now serves as the athletics department recruiting coordinator and is the junior varsity baseball coach. Furlong is a graduate of Central College in Pella, Iowa and during his eight year stint as the head football coach at St. Ambrose he had the Fighting Bees in the NAIA playoffs three times.



**JORGE ACOSTA...**Jorge Acosta will begin his fifth season as an assistant coach for the Vikings. Acosta is a 2005 graduate of Augustana where he played under Coach Wallace. He was a four time letterwinner for the Vikings and was a team captain his senior season. He finished his career with the most at-bats (550) in school history as well as finishing in the top ten career list in stolen bases, walks, runs-batted-in and triples. Jorge currently resides in Rock Island, Illinois where he acts as an admissions counselor here at Augustana. He is a native of Rock Falls, Illinois where he attended Rock Falls High School.



**MIKE MEYERS...**Mike Meyers will be in his third year as an assistant coach on the Augustana baseball staff. Meyers, who 11 years in professional baseball with a variety of clubs, will work with the Viking pitchers. A native of Tillsonburg, Ontario, Canada, Meyers pitched for current Augustana pitching coach Tim McChesney at Black Hawk College in Moline during the 1996 and 1997 seasons. He was drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the 26th round of the 1997 draft and in 2000 he was added to the Cubs' 40 man roster. He pitched two seasons for the AAA Des Moines Cubs, with his last year coming in 2003. He signed with the New York Mets as a free agent in 2004 and inked with the Milwaukee Brewers in 2005. Meyers played several seasons as a member of Canadian National team and was in several Olympic qualifying tournaments. He is currently a student at Western Illinois where is earning his degree in recreation, park and tourism administration.

After being the proverbial baseball nomads for nearly 40 years, the Augustana Vikings baseball team finally found a home. For years Augustana jumped around the Quad Cities, playing home games at a number of different locations. In the summer of 2003 construction began on a new complex at 43rd Avenue in Moline with plans for the field to be ready for the first home game of the 2004 season. It was completed on time and on March 20, 2004 Duane R. Swanson Stadium/Brunner Field saw its first action when the Fighting Scots of Monmouth College and the Augustana Vikings matched up for a Saturday doubleheader. The Vikings and the Fighting Scots each claimed victory on that day with Augustana winning by a score of 13-5 and Monmouth winning 4-2. Augustana finished that 2004 season with a 15-4 home record. The Vikings are 82-29 overall at Swanson Stadium/Brunner Field and 48-21 in conference play.

# Vikings finish season 23-17; Mark Ramos and John Wagle set career school records for triples and RBI

Seniors Mark Ramos (**United Township HS, East Moline, Ill.\*\*) and John Wagle (**Rock Island HS, Rock Island, Ill.\*\*) put the finishing touches on stellar careers for the Augustana Vikings in 2009. The duo each notched a career school record and helped veteran head coach Greg Wallace's team compiled a 23-17 overall record.****

Ramos belted 13 triples and took down the existing mark of 11 set by Mike Gray from 1984-87 while Wagle drove in 154 runs to break the previous RBI record of 142 set by Bryan Phillips from 2003-06.

The Vikings were an extremely productive offensive unit throughout the season, batting .319 as a team and averaging 8.5 runs per contest. Ramos and Wagle were in the middle of most of that run production, as they have been throughout their successful run with the Augustana baseball program. An ankle injury slowed Ramos at the end of the season but he still managed to hit .378 with 56 hits in 148 at-bats while scoring 36 runs with seven doubles, five triples, four home runs and 41 runs-batted-in. He has been a fixture at shortstop for the last four years. Wagle, who split time at second base and third bases before finally settling in as the designated hitter, batted .330 with 58 hits in 176 at-bats with 32 runs scored, eight doubles, two triples, three home runs and 33 RBI.

In addition to the school records, Wagle and Ramos leave Augustana with their names peppered throughout the school's top-ten lists. On the career list Wagle is second in at-bats (653), fifth in runs scored (142), second in hits (243), third in doubles (43), second in triples (12), eighth in home runs (17), first in runs-batted-in (154) and eighth in stolen bases (38). Ramos is third in at-bats (593), fourth in runs scored (147), fourth in hits (212), first in triples (13), sixth in runs-batted-in (114) and ninth in stolen bases (37).

Veteran head coach Greg Wallace has put together quite a program at his alma mater and the 23-17 record in 2009 marks the 12th straight year that the Vikings have won at least 20 games under his tutelage. Wallace took over prior to the 1998 campaign and during that time frame the Blue & Gold has compiled a record of 356-162 for a winning percentage of .687. In College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin action Wallace's team has gone 149-98 (.603). Prior to Wallace's arrival, the Vikings had only reached the 20 victory plateau twice in school history dating back to 1912. Since 1999 Augustana has won at least 30 games in a single season on seven different occasions.

Injuries hampered the Vikings in 2009, especially down the stretch. Three starting pitchers went down to arm trouble and several position players were missing for various reasons as well. After completing a sweep of Millikin in a three game series at home on April 12, Augustana was 21-7 and looked poised for another 30 victory season. Over the final 12 games of the season, however, the Vikings were able to garner just two more victories. They made it into the CCIW tournament for fifth consecutive season and the 10th time in the last 12 seasons. A loss to eventual champion Carthage dropped Augustana into the loser's bracket and the season ended there with a 14-12 loss to Wheaton.

Sophomore Dave Hoffman (**Cary Grove HS, Cary, Ill.\*\*) and Wagle were named first team all-conference while senior Myles Kurnick (**Buffalo Grove HS, Arlington Heights, Ill.\*\*) and Eric Izzo (**Lockport HS, Lockport, Ill.\*\*) were second team picks. Hoffman batted .363 with 58 hits in 160 at-bats while scoring 34 runs with 13 doubles, one triple, two home runs and 31 runs-batted-in. He hit .420 in conference play. Wagle led the CCIW in at-bats (94) and total plate appearances (101) in conference games only. He was also a second team academic all-district Kurnick hit .317 overall with 32 hits in 101 at-bats with 27 runs scored, five doubles, one home run and 16 RBI. In the conference season he went .345 in 18 games. Izzo played in 35 games on the season and batted .319 with 43 hits in 135 at-bats. He scored 36 runs and had 12 doubles, one triple, three home runs and 25 RBI. He batted .338 in 18 CCIW contests.******

The Vikings led the conference in a total of eight offensive categories: at-bats (737), plate appearances (857), total bases (334), doubles (51), runs-batted-in (159), hits (237), runs scored (172) and batting average (.322).

Mike Pagano (**Niles Notre Dame HS, Chicago, Ill.\*\*) led the team in pitching victories with a 5-2 record despite being injured for the last half of the season. He had a 4.32 earned run average with 30 strikeouts in 35 1/3 innings of work. Matt Erickson (**Marmion Academy, Channahon, Ill.\*\*) went 4-4 with a 6.48 earned run average and led the team in strikeouts with 57 and in innings pitched with 66 2/3. Grant Loiselle (**Bloomington Central Catholic HS, Normal, Ill.\*\*) was 3-0 with a 4.10 ERA in 37 1/3 innings of work while posting 42 strikeouts.******

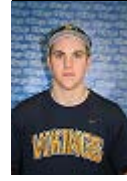

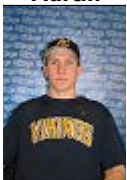

# The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 64th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling. Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2010-11 season. Women's lacrosse is not currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 173 total. Of those 173, the men have won 135 and 38 belong to the women.

Baseball has been a conference sports since the beginning with the CCIW crowning its first champion (Millikin) in the 1946-47 school year. Augustana has four CCIW titles in baseball (1952, 1965, 1968, 1974), two CCIW South Division championships (1989, 1996) and one CCIW tournament crown (1999).
