AUGUSTANA FACTS

WHO WE ARE: A selective, private liberal arts and sciences college affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

LOCATION: A 115-acre wooded campus in Rock Island, Illinois on the Mississippi River in the Quad Cities, a metropolitan area of about 375,000.

HISTORY: Founded in 1860 by Swedish graduates of the universities of Uppsala and Lund.

ACADEMICS: More than 70 majors and related academic programs.

STUDENT BODY: 2,500 students

STUDENT-TO-FACULTY RATIO: 11-to-1, with an average class size of 22 students.

TRADITION: Four team and 32 NCAA Championships in men's tennis. 175 CCIW championships in all sports. 139 Academic All-American selections, which ranks sixth among all NCAA member schools, in all divisions.

HEAD COACH JON MIEDEMA

Jon Miedema led Augustana to a 16-11 overall record and 2-3 in the CCIW in his first year as head coach. The Vikings placed fourth in the conference tournament. Miedema served as the assistant coach for the women's team at Calvin College during the spring of 2011 helping lead the Knights to a 19-4 overall record and a second round appearance in the NCAA Division III Championships. He served as a tennis instructor for three years at the Michigan Athletic Club as well as at the Centennial Country Club in Grand Rapids from 2004 through 2006. Miedema is a 2005 graduate of Calvin, where he earned a degree in business and communications and served as tennis captain during his senior season of 2005 when he was a first team all-conference selection in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association.
