The latest additions in the Finest Under Forty category bring to 23 the number of young alumni honored by the award since its inception in 1984. Lighting the way

As the Class of 2004 entered the rolls of the Augustana Alumni Association, the new graduates heralded their arrival with the announcement of a class gift. To date, 111 pledges totaling \$12,700 have been made to the initiative, which includes two components. First is lighted signage for the College's academic buildings, which will make use of a unified design theme in marking Old Main, Denkmann Memorial Hall, the Science Building and other structures.

The second part of the gift is also illuminating, but more in the sense of shining a well-deserved spotlight. The class intends to create a special scholarship award to recognize leadership on the part of sophomore, junior or senior students in service to both the Augustana and Quad Cities communities. Leaders of the class gift effort—including co-chairs Erin Priestly, Erin Rakoczy and Kelly Sabo—say they were inspired by President Steve Bahls' challenge to students to become engaged in servant-leadership both on- and off-campus.

Pledges toward the class gift are payable over a five-year period, with plans to augment the funds during future reunions. Rakoczy made the announcement of the class gift at Commencement. Priestly will serve as Class Representative.

Should you read this book? Yes.

When Dr. **Timothy Johnson** '58 spoke at Augustana's 1998 Commencement Convocation, he told the graduates to pay attention to their hearts as they went forward with their lives...and with the publication of a new book, he's continuing to follow his own advice. *Finding God in the Questions: A Personal Journey* (InterVarsity, 2004) is the product of a sustained and fruitful conversation between the author's mind and heart. It is also—true to its title—filled with challenging questions.

As a physician, Johnson—who is medical editor for ABC News—might be expected to focus more on providing answers than questions. But he's a graduate of seminary as well as medical school, and in addition to informing the nation on medical matters, he serves as assisting pastor of a church in the Boston area. This combination of callings results in an engaging writing style. As the *Wall Street Journal* said in its review, Johnson's probing of deep theological questions contains "the sophistication of thoughts examined with honesty and great thoroughness."

Each section and chapter in the book is built around a question—from "Does God exist?" and "Where do we come from?" to "Who was Jesus?" and "Is God in control?"—and each is filled with pro-

vocative questions designed to stimulate the reader's own journey. While providing perspective on the most widely-held answers to the big questions, such as those on cosmology, Johnson also offers insight into his own personal answers, developed over a lifetime of questioning.

For example, rather than taking the view that every event in our lives is part of a pre-ordained plan, Johnson holds that moments of providence occur in which we have free choice; these choices, and the extent to which they are informed by one's faith, add up over time. As he told graduates six years ago, it was a sequence of such decisions which led him, along with his wife, Nancy, to Indonesia on a medical service mission, where they met and adopted their son, Nolden, in the mid-1960s.


Another series of decisions—this one spread out over five decades—provides a fundamental theme for Johnson's book. Entering his junior year at Augustana, Johnson was asked by the debate coach to join the College's storied team. Unsure of the time commitment, Johnson instead took the coach's back-up suggestion of doing oratory. He then proceeded

to write and memorize a speech about one of his childhood heroes, Dr. Albert Schweitzer, which took him—much to his own surprise—all the way to the 1957 national collegiate championship, which he won.

Johnson has maintained his interest in the life of Schweitzer, which—in addition to the medical work in Africa which helped earn him the Nobel Peace Prize in 1952—included a spiritual pursuit of Christology that resulted in Schweitzer's book, *The Quest for the Historical Jesus*. Johnson says Schweitzer's life illustrates his own book's main thesis: "that even in the midst of many difficult intellectual and spiritual questions, it is possible to find enough answers to get on with our spiritual life."

"In my experience, finding God in the questions does not mean finding complete answers," Johnson writes. "In fact, you may discover that along the path of faith, you pick up more questions than you started with. But you might also discover that you need fewer answers, and those you *do* find are enough to live on."

In the book's preface, Johnson notes





that “some who admire my secular achievements will be turned off by this spiritual exploration—and some who admire my spiritual stance will be disappointed in my conclusions.” Interviewed shortly after the book’s release in May, Johnson reported, “So far, all of the responses have been positive, even from agnostic or atheistic friends. I am sure there will be negative reactions from those who think *any* religious faith is intellectually soft and indefensible.”

But at the same time, Johnson concedes those aren’t the people for whom he wrote *Finding God in the Questions*. “Right from the start, I had two groups especially in mind: those turned off by bad intellectual and emotional experiences with the church growing up, and those whose only knowledge of the church comes from media reports suggesting that all the church seems to care about these days are issues like abortion and homosexuality and far-out faith-healing. Part of my reason for writing the book was to give an account of my own faith development, which has always started with the evidence for a Creator God versus a totally accidental universe.”

For all readers, Johnson prescribes healthy doses of further reading and investigation. This includes reading the four Gospels straight through, and with a critical eye for what Jesus is—and is not—talking about. “For me it was a stunning experience...a spiritually ‘eye-opening’ experience,” Johnson says.

Cardinalia

If you fancy yourself a St. Louis Cardinals fan, there are three women whose stories you ought to get to know. The first is a woman whose name is lost to history, but who gets the credit for the team’s name. In 1899, the St. Louis Perfectos took the field in brand new uniforms boasting brash red trim. Willie McHale, a sportswriter covering opening day, overheard the lady say, “What a lovely shade of cardinal,” and soon began referring to the team by a name which has stood the test of time, perhaps better than “Perfectos” might have done.

The second is Allie May Schmidt, whose church hosted a dinner in February 1922 featuring a speech by Cardinals manager and baseball legend Branch Rickey. Schmidt was in charge of table decorations and—inspired by the sight of cardinals against a snowy background—adorned the white-clothed tables with the simple device of two redbirds at either end of a snippet of brown yarn. Rickey was impressed, and Schmidt’s father—who just happened to be a commercial artist—soon had a new logo to his credit, which has been showing up on Cardinals’ uniforms ever since.

Keeping such stories alive is the job of the third woman, **Paula Stinson '75 Homan**, curator of the St. Louis Cardinals Hall of Fame Museum. The official repository of more than a century of St. Louis baseball history, the museum is located right next to Busch Stadium.

Begun as the brainchild of August A. Busch, Jr., the museum evolved from a catch-all compendium of St. Louis sports history to a baseball-only format following a major gift of memorabilia from one of the all-time Cardinal greats, Stan Musial. Fed by numerous contributions from Cardinals players, player families and devoted fans, as well as members of the current ownership group—which includes inveterate collectors Bill DeWitt, Jr., and Bill DeWitt III—the museum has a rich mix of memories not just of the Cardinals, but of the old St. Louis Browns and the St. Louis Stars Negro League team.

Among the first items to greet the visitor’s eye is a parade of National League and World Series pennants that—unlike those with which Cubs fans might be familiar—mostly post-date the cessation of hostilities in the last World War. >

But such treasures as Joe Medwick's Babe Ruth Batting Crown, a jersey worn by Rogers Hornsby, George Sisler's first-baseman's glove, or a ball used by James "Cool Papa" Bell aren't the only one-of-a-kind items which followed an interesting path to the museum. Homan's own journey there began in—of all places—Augustana's Fryxell Geology Museum.

"I was studying art with Ben Jasper during my senior year when Mick Hager [then director of the Fryxell] called needing someone to paint plaster and fiberglass casts of fossils to look like the rock of the matrix in the originals," Homan says. "After that year, he worked on a grant to help keep me working the following year, and then helped me land a job at the Putnam Museum in

Davenport." The extra work was a boon for Homan, who needed employment after her graduation and marriage while her husband, **Michael Homan '76**, completed his studies.

She continued working in museums in the Quad Cities until 1986, when Michael earned a master's in social work and the family moved to Alton, Ill., where Homan worked at a local museum of history and art. She joined the Cardinals museum in 1993, a year after the museum went to the all-baseball format during the centennial of St. Louis's affiliation with the National League in 1992.

The Cardinals Hall of Fame moved to new quarters inside the International Bowling Hall of Fame in 1997. That building is located immediately north-

west of the stadium, and provides a much more amenable and inviting space for the museum's displays—so much so that tours of Busch Stadium actually begin from the museum building.

Her already-considerable skills in museum work helped Homan make up for the fact that she previously hadn't been much of a baseball aficionado. But with the help of consummate Cardinals fan and historian Erv Fischer—not to mention having an office which is all of 20 paces away from the lower deck at Busch Stadium—today you'd be hard-pressed to find many people with a more encyclopedic knowledge of St. Louis baseball than Paula Homan.

The Cardinals are currently anticipating the completion of a new stadium in 2006, after which the foot-print of the current Busch Stadium will be replaced by "Ballpark Village," a planned mixed-use redevelopment which, Homan says, is expected to become the new home of the Hall of Fame Museum. Road trip


A question about the history of an Augustana fraternity served as the catalyst to melt a great span of miles and years, and bring a group of students to Arizona last fall for a service project. Nick Stafford '04 wanted to learn more about the origins of his Delta Omega Nu fraternity and, with help from the Alumni Office, his search led to a correspondence with the Rev. Dr. Russell Swanson '50. Swanson had been one of a group of students who'd come to Augustana on the G.I. Bill after service in World War II and founded the DONs in 1947.

As the correspondence continued, Stafford sent Swanson his DON pin, so that the latter could give it to his wife, Donna Rein '52 Swanson, for their 50th anniversary. Years earlier, Stafford learned, Swanson had likewise given his own pin to a friend in need. Then last summer, Stafford and fellow DON Phil Christman '05 started kicking around ideas for a service project that could be conducted over Thanksgiving break—preferably, 'someplace warm.'

Swanson, who lives in Sun City West, Ariz., helped spread the word among pastors and congregations in the Grand Canyon Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and soon ideas started pouring in from across the Southwest. But in hopes of getting the chance to meet Swanson during the service project, the two settled on Mount of Olives Lutheran Church in Phoenix. Next they approached the Delta Chi Theta sorority to help fill out the ranks, and contributions were solicited to help offset transportation costs.

Then just after fall-term finals, eight DONs and seven Delta Chis set out for Phoenix, where Pastor Janice Meier of Mount of Olives led them in repainting the church's music room, assisting with some major landscaping, and even helping serve a pre-Thanksgiving meal to residents of the church's neighborhood. The group slept in the church and caught showers as they were able at the homes of church members.

A highlight of the trip was being hosted for dinner by the Swansons and fellow alumni the Rev. Dr. Donovan '50 and Dorothy Johnson '53 Palmquist at the Swansons' home. Two Augustana Choir members on the trip, Becca Caliendo and A.J. Dela Cruz, both '05, got to swap notes with Dr. Palmquist, who'd sung with Augustana Choir founder Henry Veld. Sadly, Dr. Palmquist—who had been head of the Augustana Heritage Association—passed away in May [see *Deaths*].

A Fulbright follow-up

When **Ann Arnold '69 Burbridge** traveled to Japan last year as part of a remarkable program of cultural and educational exchange, she hadn't expected that part of what she'd leave behind were some of her own preconceptions. To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the U.S. government's Fulbright Program and its far-reaching impact on post-World War II Japan, that nation's government offered a select group of U.S. educators the chance to visit Japan to hear from past Fulbright recipients and visit schools which are now in the midst of sweeping nationwide reforms.

Burbridge, administrator for secondary choral and elementary music in the San Antonio (Tex.) Independent School District, was one of 200 educators from across the U.S. chosen to participate in the Fulbright Memorial Fund Teacher Program. As part of her three-week stay, she met with numerous Japanese artists, authors and high-ranking government officials, many of whom are among the 6,000 Japanese citizens who have studied in the U.S. during the past half-century under the auspices of the Fulbright Program.

"Our most fun day was a visit to Daiichi Elementary School in Shimbara, where the kids treated us like movie stars," says Burbridge of the second phase of her trip, which brought her group to Nagasaki Prefecture for visits to several primary and secondary schools. "When we walked into the auditorium, a music teacher played the theme to the Mickey Mouse Club as we entered. We spent the day

giving autographs and having English 'conversations' such as, 'hello,' 'how are you,' and 'how old are you,'" she says.

As different as Burbridge had expected to find things in Japan, she was struck by similarities. "The children there were every bit as exciting and buoyant as you'd find in any American elementary school." She was also somewhat surprised to learn that Japanese schools—like some in this country—still have considerable technological needs. "The schools we visited were low-tech compared with what I'm used to," she says. "There were few computers in the elementary schools, and only one high school math class we visited had computers—one for every two students."

While staying in elegant hotels and being treated to Kabuki and Kyogen performances during her time in Tokyo, Burbridge also lived with a Japanese family for her week in Shimbara. "The Nakamuras treated me as if I were one of their family, except the mother was afraid to let me see the room her two boys shared because she was afraid it would be too messy." No worries, there: Burbridge has two sons of her own—now grown—in addition to her daughter, **Capt. Britt Burbridge '93**, who's now serving with the U.S. Air Force in Alabama.

The magazine as match-maker?

We know (and like to say) that Augustana continues to have an impact on the lives of its graduates long after they leave the Mississippi's rocky shore. Now we can say that *Augustana* (the magazine) does, too.

The *New York Times* found fit to print the news of this publication's role in the romance of **Suzanne Bradbeer '84** and **Kyle Pasewark '81** as part of its Sunday, May 16, 2004 edition's "Style" section, in the form of a ten-paragraph announcement of their wedding.

Bradbeer says in hindsight it wasn't the most conducive setting for their first encounter, since shortly after meeting they had to refrain from chatting until after the service ended.

As the *New York Times* article concluded its description of the first meeting, "There was plenty of talk afterward, however. First there was lunch, and after lunch, coffee, and after coffee, dinner. The meeting between Augustana graduates was a date after all, confirmed with a 'smooch' 14 hours after it began, Bradbeer recalled."

As seen on TV

If you happened to catch the broadcasts of this year's Oscars or Grammys, chances are very good that you got a glimpse of what **Seng Rimpakone '93** does for a living. A freelance producer in television advertising, Rimpakone worked on a spot for Budweiser beer which showed people drinking the product at a café in Prague, then the scene morphed into similar café settings in Japan, Italy and France. Although much of the whirlwind tour was accomplished through special effects, Rimpakone traveled to the Czech capital for the location-work there.

In Illinois, viewers might be familiar with a very effective anti-tobacco campaign for which Rimpakone was able to return to her hometown of Rockford. The "All-Smoke High" ads were built around an imaginary high school where smoking is mandatory, and used dark humor (a constant din of hacking coughs, a principal who uses a voice-box) to drive home messages about the manifold health problems tied to tobacco use. She helped secure the location for the commercials, which were shot in a Rockford high school.

Rimpakone loves her freelance production work, but in order to get there, she faced a critical decision some years back. After graduating with a business administration major she entered a management track which—though it provided her a good job—still left something lacking. "I thought back to what I really enjoyed doing at school and thought of advertising," she says. "Mr. [Jim] Strickland had given us the opportunity to do some creative work as part of his advertising classes, and I realized that's where my heart was. But I had to take a step back in terms of money in order to move from managing accounts to production...I had to learn the process from the ground up."

Today, doing what she loves and traveling to interesting locales are matters of course. But growing up in Rockford, that future wasn't in such sharp focus for Rimpakone, whose family came to this country from Thailand when she was nine years old. "We didn't have a lot of money, and if it hadn't been for the scholarship I received from Augustana, I don't think I'd have been able to attend such a fantastic school," says Rimpakone, who still vividly recalls her scholarship interview with Dr. Roald Tweet, now-retired professor of English at Augustana.

"I owe so much for the opportunity to be there, meet the people I did, have the education I received and the interaction I enjoyed with professors—my sister went to a big school, and she just didn't have the same experience. I had the chance to know my professors and friends really well," Rimpakone says.

Among the many connections she made at Augustana were those formed with a tight-knit group who came to call themselves the "Beagle Babes." Centered around an off-campus house known as the Regal Beagle, Rimpakone and classmates **Lisa Kahler Doman, Jodi Keller Johansen, Juliana Mead Nielsen, Jodi Shields Dastur, Jodi Simenec Medinger** and **Kara Wenberg Dirst** formed a bond which continues today in the form of the round-robin Beagle Letter. The friends have also opened a money market account—to which each contributes monthly—to fund a "families-not-eligible" joint 40th-birthday excursion sometime in 2011.

Kate, meet Oscar

Growing up in Vernon Hills, Ill., **Kate Killinger '02** remembers watching the Oscars every year, enthralled by the glamour of Hollywood's annual showcase. This past year was a little different, thanks to Killinger's job at New Line Cinema, the company behind the monumental *Lord of the Rings* film trilogy.

"My favorite moment was arriving at New Line's Oscar party just as *The Lord of the Rings: The Return of the King* won the final award for Best Picture," Killinger says. "The room just exploded. There was a plasma-screen set up every ten feet just to

ensure everyone could see the awards show no matter where they were standing." But what happened shortly after, when the film's honorees arrived at the party, merits equal billing. "When Peter Jackson [the films' director] and the other winners brushed past me holding their Oscars, it seemed completely surreal."

Killinger is the assistant to New Line's senior vice president of distribution, Bob Kaplowitz. In addition to coordinating his considerable travel schedule, Killinger estimates box-office grosses for New Line and the other Hollywood studios.

"On top of this I set up security for our trade screenings—'sneak previews' for the exhibitors—around the country. For these screenings we

hire security to protect our films from being pirated. Guards wand-down all the theater owners and others attending, check bags, and once in the theater—for movies as large as *Return of the King*—they wear night-vision goggles to detect any recording devices." Killinger says piracy has become a huge problem for Hollywood. "People will attempt to bring children into the theaters and place cameras in their book-bags, or carry a pen in their shirt pocket with a camera on the end of it to try and copy the film."

After graduating with majors in studio art and speech communications, Killinger landed a job with a Chicago-based movie promotions and advertising firm based on a tip from her mother, **Janet Chandler '72 Killinger**, who's in advertising. It was such a great job that within a year she knew she had to move to L.A. to expand on her industry experience. It took two months of "sending resumes and waiting" before Killinger landed the job at New Line.

And although 'show business' started early for Killinger—her dad, **Bill Killinger '72**, is a high school choral musical director who would sometimes cast Kate (and her brother Jeff) when children's roles needed to be filled—it may still be some time before the novelty of working in the world's entertainment capital wears off. "Growing up, I always read every issue of my mom's *People* magazine," Killinger says. "Now I see the celebrities from my *People* magazine and don't have to read about them. Watching the stars and directors stroll into the office is something I am still adjusting to, but it becomes more routine as time passes."

In memoriam

Lloyd Schwiebert

Were you to look at the early history of the Augustana Research Foundation, you would expect to find the names of scientists writ large. But while such figures as professors Edwin Erickson, Edward Hill and Robert Berntsen [see below] are prominent in the foundation's history, equally indispensable to its creation in 1947 was an attorney.

Lloyd Schwiebert '34, who died January 22, 2004, at the age of 90, is considered one of the visionaries without whom the Foundation could not have been established. That's according to Dr. Douglas Nelson '66, who now serves as director of the Foundation, one of only three such institutions in the nation affiliated with a small liberal arts college.



Schwiebert's legacy both at Augustana and within the Quad Cities community includes service on the College's Board of Trustees and Alumni Board, the Moline School Board, Lutheran Hospital Board, the Quad City Estate Planning Council, and the Moline Kiwanis, in which past presidency was part of his 50-plus years of membership.

After graduating from Augustana, he studied law at Iowa and began practicing as an attorney in 1937. Ten years later, he married Olive Johnson, who survives him, as do their children, Peter '70, Mark '72, Sarah and John, and four grandchildren. As Mark Schwiebert—who has served as mayor of Rock Island since 1989—told the *Rock Island Argus*, “Some people grow wiser, gentler and more involved as they grow older. That was him.” In addition to several local charities and Schwiebert's home congregation, Trinity Lutheran Church, Moline, memorials can be made to the Lloyd and Olive Schwiebert Endowed Scholarship Fund at Augustana College.

Dr. Robert Berntsen

When you speak to people who knew Dr. Robert Berntsen—either as a professor, a researcher or a colleague—one word repeatedly enters the conversation: patient. “Bob started teaching at Augustana shortly before I came here as a freshman,” says Dr. Mel Peterson '53, professor emeritus of chemistry. “So I had the opportunity to know him both as a student and a colleague. I remember he was a good teacher who had the ability to have great patience with both students and fellow faculty members.”



His patience extended to many aspects of his life beyond campus. Jim Horstmann '55, a former member of the College's administration, says Berntsen was a wonderful caregiver for his late wife, Betty, during times of illness. “Bob was always patient, kind and caring,” Horstmann says.

Berntsen, who passed away May 22, 2004, at the age of 87, began teaching chemistry at Augustana in 1948, a boom-time for science as the nation's energies, heightened by war, now sought new outlets. He was greeted not only by G.I. Bill-bolstered enrollments, but by the new Augustana Research Foundation, which would become a major conduit for his own work in science. As one example, Berntsen's work related to the refining of corn syrup contributed to today's economical use of the substance as a sweetener in a huge array of food products.

Berntsen retired in 1985. In addition to the Robert Berntsen Family Endowment Fund, his legacy on campus includes the Research Foundation's Berntsen Award, presented to an outstanding first-year or sophomore student. (The first recipient, Alan Gishlick '95, went on to earn a Ph.D. from Yale in paleontology.) His survivors include sons Dr. Jon Berntsen '67 and Mark Berntsen '70.
